### LANDSCAPING UPDATE

Recently LIOT, our landscape contractor, was re-purchased by a previous owner. They have committed to us to improve the quality of their service. In late February and early March, broad applications of weed killer and ant control will be applied. The weed killer will cause the rye grass to die off. This is necessary to prevent an outbreak of weeds throughout the summer. Also once the ant control/prevention is applied, current ants will seek areas without protection. It is therefore highly recommended that you apply ant/pest control on your personal lawn in early March. These steps will be important for all of us to enjoy our beautiful community.

Additionally we are evaluating overly wet or dry areas in our community. We are also seeking a couple of people to serve as additional "eyes" regarding landscaping. # SPRING IS AROUND THE CORNER!

Here are some garden tips to help you get the most enjoyment out of your outdoor living space!

- Prepare beds for planting flowers.
- When purchasing perennials, try to buy them while not in bloom.
- Fertilize newly planted perennials with a slow-release product in spring or fall.
- Newly planted perennials should receive one inch of water a week during the growth season, either from rain or through irrigation.
- Mulch garden beds 2 to 3 inches deep with an organic mulch.
- Mulch around trees to reduce mower injury and conserve moisture, but be sure to keep mulch pulled back from the base of the tree.
- Newly planted trees and shrubs will need a total of one inch of water a week during the growing season. During periods of drought, water trees deeply every 10 days.

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## Lakes on Eldridge Swans can be dangerous



This time of the year, Mother Nature provides our LOE swans with some common sense. It is mating, nesting, and egg-laying season and they feel the need to protect their territory against predators including humans, dogs, and waterfowl. Most of the swans in our neighborhood are not old enough to mate but some will go through the motions of even building a nest. The pairs of swans that are old enough to produce young (cygnets) are normally gentle and can be hand fed while posing no threat. However, our cobs (males) will become aggressive and territorial in trying to protect his pen (female) and nest. This is usually temporary until mating season is over. If you are walking past a lake and a swan swims to your side and follows you, BEWARE! If you see a swan with his neck back and feathers up such as the one in the picture, please stay away, do not attempt to feed him, and walk on the other side of the street as he is in his ATTACK position. Please warn your nannies and sitters not to stroll babies around the swans. We must try to remember that the swans are merely protecting their territory and readying the area for their young. We need to be as cautious of them as they are of us. Thank you for your cooperation.

### MINUTES FROM THE JANUARY BOARD MEETING

The Board of Directors of Lakes on Eldridge Community Association met on Tuesday, January 24, 2008. The following is a summary of what was discussed.

#### HOMEOWNER/GUEST FORUM

Lee Mueller reported on the M.U.D. board meeting held January 14, 2008 including:

- 41.4% of 2008 taxes had been collected as of December 31, 2007.
- A survey of all fire hydrants is being conducted.
- The back slope drainage project in Lakes on Eldridge will begin soon.
- The M.U.D. is awaiting state approval to commence work on converting to surface water from groundwater.
- The new tax rate was approved at 45 cents per \$100 valuation.
- Amendment of the detention pond agreement awaited a meeting with Lakes on Eldridge representatives.
- Annual elections were to be held in May 2008 and two positions were expiring.

The managing agent submitted an owner's request to remove five or six pine trees from the common area because pine needles from the trees were landing in his yard and pool. The Board denied the request on the basis that the owner knew the trees were there before purchasing his home and because the community has a policy of protecting and maintaining common area trees. The managing agent was to so notify the owner.

#### FINANCIAL REPORT

<u>Financial Statements:</u> The Board reviewed the financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2007. The Association had cash balances of \$223,891 in the Operating Fund and \$216,717 in the Replacement Fund. Operating income for the year ended December 31, 2007 was \$922,128, Operating Expenses were \$885,585 and the Surplus was \$36,543. The Association operated \$33,783 ahead of budget for the year.

During December 2007 \$180,495 was received toward the 2008 assessment.

<u>Collections:</u> The Board reviewed current delinquent accounts and the legal status report from the community's legal counsel. \$5,346 was collected during December 2007.

<u>2006 Audit:</u> The Board reviewed the 2006 draft audit report from the auditors and was to notify the managing agent of its approval via email.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

<u>Access Control:</u> The managing agent reported that the new vehicle decals were being actively distributed. The managing agent was to arrange to have reflective tape placed on the gates to enhance nighttime visibility, to have the controller covers painted a light color to reduce heat build-up and to arrange a meeting with Meyer-Smith and members of the Access Control Committee on-site to review the gate systems.

Following recent problems with the Ginger Ponds gate the board agreed that in the event repairs could not be made during a single service visit that the gates were to be locked open to avoid traffic problems.

<u>Parks & Pool:</u> It was reported that Beach Club decorations were purchased and installed. Lots of greenery, table decorations, two palm trees, and decorated pots were added. He also reported as follows:

- Beach Club Park: One bench has a broken 1x4 slat that needs replacing. Also the slide has two sections that have split due to exposure to the elements. Recommend replacing the plastic pieces and all hardware on the slide. Again pressure washing and paint is needed for the remaining pieces.
- Beach Club Pool: Broken water fountain needs repair or replacement. Please quote options for both. Bathrooms also need cleaning. Also it is now time to get pricing for the extra pool furniture that was not ordered in 2007. Lastly, the LOE Swim Team has requested we add a "shade structure" to the end of the pool by the baby pool. This will be a convenience to residents and the swim team for the timers and swimmers. As with the pool furniture, this is a carry over of a 2007 request.
- Auburn Shores Park (on greenbelt): The Gazebo is in dire need for pressure washing and fresh paint. The wood and columns have lots of mold.
- Gazebo on Lake at Lake Center Run & Summer Falls: The Gazebo is in dire need for pressure washing and fresh paint. The wood and columns have lots of mold.

Lakes & Wildlife: It was reported that the committee received another email from a resident regarding the rye grass over seeding of

the common areas and around the pool. The resident is requesting we stop this practice on the basis of it adding additional costs for mowing and watering during the winter months. Since Houston winters are relatively mild, the St. Augustine grass does not stay dormant for long and as in the case of my lawn still maintains a mostly green appearance. This request was to be forwarded to the Landscape Committee.

#### MANAGEMENT REPORT

On motions duly made the Board approved the following:

- A contract to make covers to board up all windows and doors in the Beach Club for use in event of a hurricane.
- Renewal of the lake management agreement with Lake Pro.
- Renewal of the mosquito spraying agreement.
- Renewal of the pool management agreement with Greater Houston Pool Management for 2008.
- A contract to replace the gravel around the concrete furniture by the tennis courts with a concrete pad.

<u>Deed Restrictions:</u> The Board reviewed the deed restrictions at January 7, 2008. There were 198 open items being pursued. During December 2007 36 new letters were sent and 12 items were resolved.

#### SCHEDULE NEXT MEETING

The next regular meeting of the Board of Directors was scheduled to be held at 6:30 p.m. on February 19, 2008.

February 25th – They Poured Fire on Us from the Sky: The True Story of Three Lost Boys from Sudan by Alephonsion Deng, Benson Deng. Across Sudan, between 1987 and 1989, tens of thousands of young boys took flight from the massacres of Sudan's civil war. They became known as the Lost Boys. With little more than the clothes on their backs, sometimes not even that, they streamed out over Sudan in search of refuge. Their journey led them first to Ethiopia and then, driven back into Sudan, toward Kenya. They walked nearly one thousand miles, sustained only by the sheer will to live.

Perhaps you read the article in the Chronicle in December about a "Lost Boy" from Sudan who graduated from the University of Portland and intends to go to law school to help find justice for others. This book is the actual account of three other Lost Boys and how they survived the violence in their homeland.

March 24 - The Life and Times of the Thunderbolt Kid by Bill Bryson. From one of the most beloved and bestselling authors in the English language, a vivid, nostalgic, and utterly hilarious memoir of growing up in the 1950s. Bill Bryson was born in the middle of the American century-1951-in the middle of the United States-Des Moines, Iowa—in the middle of the largest generation in American history-the baby boomers. As one of the best and funniest writers alive, he is perfectly positioned to mine his memories of a totally all-American childhood for 24-carat memoir gold. Like millions of his generational peers, Bill Bryson grew up with a rich fantasy life as a superhero. In his case, he ran around his house and neighborhood with an old football jersev with a thunderbolt on it and a towel about his neck that served as his cape, leaping tall buildings in a single bound and vanquishing awful evildoers (and morons)-in his head-as "The Thunderbolt Kid

Chief Inspector Armand Gamache of the Sûreté du Québec and his team of investigators are called in to the scene of a suspicious death in a rural village south of Montréal and yet a world away. Jane Neal, a long-time resident of Three Pines, has been found dead in the woods. The locals are certain it's a tragic hunting accident

and nothing more but Gamache smells something foul this holiday season...and is soon certain that Jane died at the hands of someone much more sinister than a careless bow hunter....
