Dear Homeowners:

Last month, two residents of Lakes on Eldridge North were victims of a home burglary. One of the thoughts about this burglary was that the criminals entered by tailgating at the subdivision's back gate on Little York. Though this event did not occur in our own neighborhood, it brings to mind that it has happened here, and could happen again.

The Board stresses very strongly how important it is that you not let anyone tailgate you as you come in through the Tanner Road gates unless that vehicle clearly belongs to an LOE resident, or to let a vehicle waiting outside enter when you leave through these gates. On numerous occasions, residents have reported cars sitting off to the side of one of our back gates waiting for a resident to drive through, so they can gain access, sometimes with the engine idling. Why would someone be prepared to waste time and fuel waiting there for an indeterminate length of time to come through one of these gates rather than simply going to the main gate and identifying themselves to the gate attendant to secure admission? If someone does not have an LOE sticker and their own access clicker, they have no business coming into our neighborhood through the back gate. Would you let an unidentified stranger come through the back door of

your home? Well, this is home for over 700 of us. If something like this happens to you, just pull through the gate and stop until it closes. No exceptions. The Board asks that everyone be very vigilant about this.

The Board has again reminded our gate attendants that they must strictly enforce the requirements for allowing non-residents to enter LOE. This may result in some inconvenience for your visitors, but we urge you to understand the reasons. We hope you will continue to let us know, through AMI, of incidents where the procedures are not being followed.

NOTES FROM THE FEBRUARY BOARD MEETING

The Board of Directors of Lakes on Eldridge Community Association met on Tuesday, February 19, 2008. The following is a summary of what was discussed. **HOMEOWNER/GUEST FORUM**

A representative from ISSC reported that the two gate attendants about whom there had been complaints had been replaced and the new personnel appeared to be adhering to post orders. Various equipment requirements were reviewed and approved. Forms and procedures were also reviewed and new information forms were to be distributed via the newsletter and contact with new homeowners by the managing agent. A board member was to work on obtaining a wall map of the community for the gatehouse and the managing agent was to obtain a quote to install a second opener button for the visitors' gate.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Financial Statements: The Board reviewed the financial statements for the month ended January 31, 2008. The Association had cash balances of \$512,936 in the Operating Fund and \$295,873 in the Replacement Fund. Operating income for the month ended January 31, 2008 was \$70,179, Operating Expenses were \$155,767 and the Deficit was \$85,588. The Operating Deficit was the result of the \$80,000 transfer to Reserves and the payment of two month's electricity in January. The managing agent reported that the payment of the insurance premium in February would add to the apparent deficit but that the Deficit will otherwise dissipate over the course of 2008.

2007 Audit: The Board engaged the auditors to perform the 2007 audit of the financial statements for \$3,485 plus \$375 for the Association's federal tax return.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Architectural Control: It was reported that an application for installation of a pool patio was approved. The committee denied an application for painting a garage door on the grounds that the proposed color was too dark. The following letters were issued by AMI: 2 letters of approval for patio covers and 1 letter of approval for painting a home.

Access Control: The managing agent reported that the new vehicle decals were being actively distributed. The managing agent was to arrange to have reflective tape placed on the gates to enhance nighttime visibility, to have the controller covers painted a light color to reduce heat build-up and to arrange an on site meeting with the gate contractor and LOE Access Control members to review the gate systems. Following recent problems with the Ginger Ponds gate, the board agreed that in the event repairs could not be made during a single service visit that the gates were to be locked open to avoid traffic problems.

Parks & Pool: It was reported that the following pool furniture was ordered on February 15 for a total purchase price of \$7,152: 24 Kahana Cross Strap Dining chairs, 4 48" Round Dining Table with Acrylic tops, 4 Portifino II Aluminum Umbrellas, 8' Hexagon with Double Vent to allow the wind to blow thru the top and not push it over, 4 Cement Filled Aluminum Base

15" tall, and 8 Kahana Cross Strap Chaise Lounge. We hope to have delivery before the start of the swim season.

Work was delayed on cementing in the ground for the tables due to the recent rain. This project should start back up in the next week. Follow up was also needed on repair work from last month's report to fix the park bench and get bids for pressure washing and repainting of the park gazebos.

Landscape: It reported that a very productive meeting was held February 7, 2008 with the landscaping contractor, Landscaping Committee chairperson and managing agent. They reviewed the following agenda items: Transition from Terra Nova and commitment to quality for LOE, Major Immediate Improvement Areas, Major Maintenance Issues, Tanner Entrance Gates Rock Beautification Plan, and Coordination with Homeowner Properties.

Lakes & Wildlife: A meeting was held with Betty Burkett to discuss the swans and ducks at LOE. She stated the swans were starting to get fat and the males were starting to get aggressive. This is the time of year where the swans pair up which will cause some problems as we have a three-some on one lake. This will probably cause Betty to look at selling this bird. The nesting season is quickly approaching and both male and females will be more aggressive. It was suggested that we look at re-running last years article in the next newsletter.

Website: A lot of progress has been made on the new LOE public page. This upcoming month will be used to test the site for bugs and add photographs to the slideshow.

Social/Events: A Quiz Night penciled for May 3rd was discussed and is in the planning. This will be an event for 13 years and up in age. To try to attract more members the Social Committee will be meeting monthly on the first Wednesday of each month.

MANAGEMENT REPORT

The managing agent reported that the defunct computer from the storage room had been disposed of, the gouges in the Beach club floor had been repaired and three new storage containers were delivered. He also advised that the last of the Eldridge Parkway wall had been power washed.

Park Benches: On a motion duly made the Board approved the purchase and installation of three park benches in the total amount of \$2,130.54. A board member was to assist in the placement of the three benches. The Board also authorized placement of a memorial plaque on a park bench at the main lake.

Deed Restrictions: The Board reviewed the deed restrictions at February 18, 2008 and instructed the managing agent accordingly. There were 475 open items being pursued.

SCHEDULE NEXT MEETING

The next regular meeting of the Board of Directors was scheduled to be held at 6:30 p.m. on March 18, 2008.

March 24 - The Life and Times of the Thunderbolt Kid by Bill Bryson. From one of the most beloved and bestselling authors in the English language, a vivid, nostalgic, and utterly hilarious memoir of growing up in the 1950s. Bill Bryson was born in the middle of the American century-1951-in the middle of the United States-Des Moines, Iowa-in the middle of the largest generation in American history-the baby boomers. As one of the best and funniest writers alive, he is perfectly positioned to mine his memories of a totally all-American childhood for 24-carat memoir gold. Like millions of his generational peers, Bill Bryson grew up with a rich fantasy life as a superhero. In his case, he ran around his house and neighborhood with an old football jersey with a thunderbolt on it and a towel about his neck that served as his cape, leaping tall buildings in a single bound and vanquishing awful evildoers (and morons)-in his head-as "The Thunderbolt Kid.

April 28 - Still Life by Louise Penny. Chief Inspector Armand Gamache of the Sûreté du Québec and his team of investigators are called in to the scene of a suspicious death in a rural village south of Montréal and yet a world away. Jane Neal, a long-time resident of Three Pines, has been found dead in the woods. The locals are certain it's a tragic hunting accident and nothing more but Gamache smells something foul this holiday season...and is soon certain that Jane died at the hands of someone much more sinister than a careless bow hunter.

Next date to be determined (4th Monday is Memorial Day) - My Sister's Keeper by Jodi Picoult. Anna is not sick, but she might as well be. By age thirteen, she has undergone countless surgeries, transfusions, and shots so that her older sister, Kate, can somehow fight the leukemia that has plagued her since childhood. The product of preimplantation genetic diagnosis, Anna was conceived as a bone marrow match for Kate -- a life and a role that she has never challenged...until now. Like most teenagers, Anna is beginning to question who she truly is. But unlike most teenagers, she has always been defined in terms of her sister -- and so Anna makes a decision that for most would be unthinkable, a decision that will tear her family apart and have perhaps fatal consequences for the sister she loves. My Sister's Keeper examines what it means

to be a good parent, a good sister, and a good person. Is it morally correct to do whatever it takes to save a child's life, even if that means infringing upon the rights of another? Is it worth trying to discover who you really are, if that quest makes you like yourself less? Should you follow your own heart, or let others lead you? Once again, in My Sister's Keeper, Jodi Picoult tackles a controversial real-life subject with grace, wisdom, and sensitivity.

How To Start Playing Tennis By Fernando M. Velasco

In past issues, we have discussed on how to start taking lessons, purchasing rackets, shoes and giving you some tips to begin playing.

Now that you are ready to start playing the game, in this issue, we will discuss on how to become "mentally prepared" when competing and playing socially with spouses, friends and children.

Game of "Mistakes" - Tennis, unlike other sports, is based on minimizing mistakes. Even the tournament players, will make mistakes. We will hit balls long, short, into the net, into the parking lot and sometimes even hit our own partners, if playing doubles.

Three basis rules that I have my students follow when making an error are the three "R's" that I learned from Dr. Karl Slaikeu in his book "Focused for Tennis":

- 1. "Release" The mistake is done. There is nothing to get the point back.
- "Review" Think of what you could have done to avoid the 2. mistake
- 3. "Reset" - Start the next point refreshed and with your mind clear.

Tennis is a game where, unless the opponent hit the last shot to win the match, that you still have plenty of opportunities to get your "rhythm" and confidence back.

In order to hit "winner" shots, one must take chances. On critical points, I ask my students to review the following "awareness points":

- "Own awareness" Hit the shot that you have and can depend 1. on it.
- 2. "Opponent awareness" - Hit the shot to the opponent's weak area.
- 3. "Court awareness" - Plan your shot according to where the sun is and where the wind is coming from.
- 4. "Score awareness" – If ahead in the score, take chances, if behind or even, be more conservative.
