You may have noticed that construction has begun on our Clubhouse to repair the soffits as well as the new coat of paint on the Clubhouse. Many thanks to Friendswood Development for helping with the repairs to the soffits! We have a new trash can enclosure outside the Clubhouse to hide the unsightly trash cans near the street courtesy of the carpentry skills of Board of Director Ed Hofer. Tell him what a great job he did! All the play ground equipment has either been inspected or is undergoing inspection to ensure the safety of our kids. Additionally there has been replacement of some of the playground equipment on our various play areas a new trash containers ordered. We have new rugs ordered for the entrances inside the Clubhouse to help alleviate any slippage from the pool areas. A bicycle rack has been ordered and will be installed on a concrete pad soon.

The pool will be opening in early May. Pool tags have already been mailed out, so be looking for those. We have refurbished the pool house restrooms with a new epoxy floor. There are also new chaise lounges in the

Now on to more serious matters. There have been and continue to be problems with vandalism at the Fitness Center. In particular, kids are climbing over the tennis court fences and playing, roller blading, destroying equipment and the nets. Steps are being initiated to help prevent this kind of behavior, but your help needed also. This area belongs to everyone. Please bring this and any other matters of destruction or vandalism to the attention of personnel at the Fitness Center as appropriate or to our patrolling security.

Lastly, the Outlet Mall. At the time of this writing the Outlet has been opened three weeks. We all know what a headache the Grand Opening was with traffic, and particularly for those that live nearby. Many, many e-mails were circulated about the problems and comments made about how the Association had let this happen. Most people know the history of the ownership of that property, but I will repeat it. The property on which the mall was built was sold by Friendswood Development over fifteen years ago to another developer who in turn sold it to the Chelsea group for construction of the mall. Neither Friendswood nor the Association had or have any control over that development. I spoke to the Regional Operations Manager for Chelsea on Monday following the opening concerning the problems encountered. There are currently no plans for construction of additional parking lots. I suggested they consider a parking garage on site. It is Chelsea's belief that they have enough parking for the number of stores, based on calculations they use. However, after discussion about the development of the surrounding new housing areas and the accessibility of the mall to residents much further northwest of us, the manager said she would discuss the same with the corporate offices. AMI stepped in and had "No Parking" signs made and placed in the yards and on streets where the biggest parking problems occurred. Thank you Lynn and folks at AMI. From my observation, this seemed to be working and the crowds were less over the past weekend. Please remember that the County owns our streets. The streets are not private property and you cannot take matters into your own hands if people do ever choose to park in the subdivision again. There were instances of vandalism to some cars parked in the subdivision on the opening day weekend. Such actions constitute criminal mischief. I too hope that we will not half to deal with such crowds again. The developer has opened up parking on the surrounding fields for any overflow to serve as regular parking spaces for the time being. If there are continuing problems please e-mail the Board of Directors so we can contact the appropriate authorities to address the issues.

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

Cy-Fair CERT now has about 200 team members in your neigh-borhood. The team members are not only from Cypress/Fairfield area, but Alief, Katy, Bear Creek, Copperfield, Tomball, and Sugarland. More trained CERT members will be needed in each of these areas to form neighborhood teams.

CERT training is designed to prepare you to help yourself, your family, and your neighbors in the event of a catastrophic disaster. Because emergency services personnel will not be able to help every-one immediately, you can make a difference by using this training to save lives and protect property.

The 8-week course (24 hours of training) covers basic skills that are important to know in a disaster when emergency services are not available. You are taught skills about disaster preparedness, small fire suppression, urban search & rescue, medical operations and more. With training, practice and working as a team you will be able to do the greatest good for the greatest number of people after a disaster, while protecting yourself from becoming a victim.

In 2003, President Bush asked Americans to volunteer to serve oth¬ers. The Harris County Citizen Corps www.harriscountycitizencorps.com was created to help our citizens find volunteer and training opportunities. CERT training is just one of the programs created.

CERT training courses are provided throughout Harris County. There is no cost for this course. A backpack of supplies is provided to all CERT team members during training. This program is brought to you by Harris County Judge Emmett. The next CERT training class (Class #9) for the Cy-Fair area will begin on March 26, 2008 at the Lone Star College (Barker-Cypress campus).

Did You Know?

On the night before Jesus was crucified he celebrated the Passover meal with his disciples. They took bread and drank wine (Matt. 26:26-29; 1 Cor. 11:23-26). This meal commemorated the night the Israelites made their exodus from Egypt in 1446 BC under Moses.

Now just as the bread represented Israel's exodus from Egypt, it also came to represent the body of Jesus Christ, who said, "This is my body which is for you." In the same way the cup which symbolized the blood of the lamb that had been smeared on the doorposts the night of the exodus, it now represented the blood of Christ. Blood had always ratified covenants in the Old Testament (old covenant), and now the NEW covenant would also be ratified in blood, Christ's blood. Except that the blood of Jesus Christ was shed "once for all" (Hebrews 9:28), and it didn't just set Jews free from Egypt, it set all peoples and nations free from the curse of sin.

Partaking of the Lord's Supper is now done "in remembrance" of Christ's death on the cross, and it looks forward to the day when He will come again and eat the marriage supper with all believers. They, until the time of Christ's second coming, were to "remember" Christ's sacrifice for them in the Supper. In so doing, Christ's death was proclaimed "until he comes."

The Apostle Paul, in 1 Corinthians 11:27-30, warned the early Christians not to partake of the Lord's Supper in an unworthy manner because many had come to abuse the meal. In its proper context the word refers to partaking of the Lord's Supper as a simple common meal without attributing to it and its elements their proper value. The proper value of the elements signified salvation, for the bread and wine represented the body and blood of Jesus which purchased salvation for sinners who trusted in Christ. To attribute this meal as a simple meal with no significance was to make oneself "guilty of the body and blood of the Lord." The sin of all humanity that Christ took

upon himself while on the cross was actually being mocked by those who abused the Lord's Supper. Their gathering to honor the Lord was slandering him

Many believe today that they have to be "prayed up" before taking Communion (i.e., the Lord's Supper) and/or make sure they have forgiven anyone they remember as having wronged them. Now though this is commendable, this isn't necessarily what partaking of the Lord's Supper in an unworthy way means. Having a proper reverence for the true meaning of the Supper is what's important. An improper reverence for it made one liable for Christ's death, for by profaning the meal they profaned the message of the cross.

The solution to staying far away from the guilt we can incur upon ourselves is to "examine" ourselves before partaking of Communion (1 Cor. 11:28). Examine means "to put to the test for the purpose of approving." In other words, each person, prior to partaking of the Communion must decide for himself if his sole motive for eating is to proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. Taking it for any other reason is to do so in an unworthy way. In the first century those who did so were eating and drinking judgment upon themselves, and some were "weak" – a word signifying spiritual flaws; some were "sick" – a word describing physical illness; and some were "sleeping" – a euphemism for death. The bottom line in Communion, then, is solemn reverence for the death of Jesus Christ. After all, it is what grants Christians salvation.

You hear a lot about living a healthy lifestyle, but what does that mean? In general, a healthy person doesn't smoke, is at a healthy weight, eats healthy and exercises. Sounds simple, doesn't it? The trick to healthy living is making small changes...taking more steps, adding fruit to your cereal, having an extra glass of water...these are just a few ways you can start living healthy without drastic changes. One of the biggest problems in America today is lack of activity.

We know it's good for us but avoid it like the plague either because we're used to being sedentary or afraid that exercise has to be vigorous to be worth our time. The truth is, movement is movement and the more you do, the healthier you'll be. Even moderate activities like chores, gardening and walking can make a difference.

Just adding a little movement to your life can: Reduce the risk of heart disease, stroke and diabetes. Improve joint stability. Increase and improve range of movement. Help maintain flexibility as you age. Maintain bone mass. Prevent osteoporosis and fractures. Improve mood and reduce symptoms of anxiety and depression. Enhance self esteem. Improve memory in elderly people. Reduce stress. So, even if you opt for small changes and a more modest weight loss, you can see the benefits are still pretty good.

One study has found that just a 10% weight reduction helped obese patients reduce blood pressure, cholesterol and increase longevity. You can start the process of weight loss now by adding a little more activity to your life. If you're not ready for a structured program, start small. Every little bit counts and it all adds up to burning more calories. Turn off the TV. Once a week, turn off the TV and do something a little more physical with your family. Play games, take a walk...almost anything will be more active than sitting on the couch. Walk more. Look for small ways to walk more.

When you get the mail, take a walk around the block, take the dog for an extra outing each day or walk on your treadmill for 5 minutes before getting ready for work. Do some chores. Shoveling snow, working in the garden, raking leaves, sweeping the floor...these kinds of activities may not be 'vigorous' exercise, but they can keep you moving while getting your house in order. Pace while you talk. When you're on the

phone, pace around or even do some cleaning while gabbing. This is a great way to stay moving while doing something you enjoy.

Be aware. Make a list of all the physical activities you do on a typical day. If you find that the bulk of your time is spent sitting, make another list of all the ways you could move more--getting up each hour to stretch or walk, walk the stairs at work, etc. By Paige Waehner.

The Top Ten Fun Fitness Summer Activities for Kids

SUMMER IS HERE AND CHILDREN

need to stay active, healthy and busy during their break from school. Parents need to encourage their children to warm up properly and stretch before each activity and teach them never to play through any type of pain or make winning the reason for playing any sport. Let them choose the activity and keep the focus on having fun. To keep kids moving, the American Council on Exercise suggests ten, fun fitness summer activities.

- 1. Soccer: This highly active game involving both agility and teamwork has grown increasingly popular in the U.S. in recent years. To keep kids injury free, be sure they are geared up in appropriate protective equipment, such as shin guards. Soccer players should also wear shoes with cleats or ribbed soles to prevent slipping.
- 2. Martial Arts: With a variety of forms to choose from, martial arts are a great way to get kids involved in a sport that involves strength, coordination and mental discipline. Proper training and equipment to prevent injury are a must.
- 3. Bike Riding: Bicycle riding is a fun activity for the whole family. Experts suggest children ride on sidewalks and paths until they are at least 10 years old, show good riding skills and are able to follow the rules of the road. Helmets, of course, are a necessity for both children and adults.
- 4. Swimming: Nothing beats splashing around a pool with friends, and swimming offers the benefits of a full-body workout for both young and old. The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends swimming lessons for children ages 4 and up, although classes are available for babies and toddlers as well.

5. Basketball: Whether it's a round of HORSE, a game of one on one, or a full-court competition, basketball is ideal for developing hand/eye coordination and teamwork. Encourage children under the age of seven to use a smaller foam or rubber ball, and lower the height of the basket if possible.



- 6. Obstacle courses: Challenge kids to use a variety of different skills by setting up an obstacle course at the park using playground equipment or other items, such as jump ropes, balls and cones.
- 7. Dancing: Whether your kids like ballet or hip-hop, dancing encourages them to be creative and move their bodies freely. For video arcade fans, an innovative new game challenges opponents to follow a dance routine while watching the video. Kids can spend time learning new moves while also getting a great workout.

- 8. Board Sports: Whether snowboarding in the winter, surfing in the summer, or skateboarding year-round, kids love to be on the board. Injury risk, however, is higher for these sports. For both snowboarding and skateboarding, kids should wear helmets to prevent head injuries, and surfers or boogieboarders should always be accompanied by an adult.
- Jumping rope: Jumping rope is still a favorite on most playgrounds. Whether alone or in a group, jumping rope challenges both coordination and stamina.
- 10. Ice-skating/Inline-skating: Ice-skating, inline-skating and hockey can be both fun and safe as long as appropriate protective gear such as a helmet, wrist guards and kneepads are worn. Hockey players should wear a helmet with foam lining and a full-face mask, a mouth guard, pads for shoulders, knees, elbows and shins, as well as gloves.

May Landscaping

By Ron Kerwin

May is a great month to get full usage of our outdoor areas. The morning temps are nice and it has not yet become really hot in the afternoons. Continue to freely plant shrubs, trees, flowers and vegetables. Remember to put down a minimum of 2 inches of new mulch in all your beds. A good layer of mulch keeps the plant roots cooler, helps with weed control, and helps slow the water you apply from evaporating from the root zone.

Water your lawns less frequently and more deeply. Frequent short duration watering leads to shallow root systems. Less frequent longer duration watering leads to deeper root systems. Deeper root systems are more healthy and better for your lawns. They will hold up better in the extreme heat. Our lawns need one inch of water per week. Put out a container with straight sides and catch the water as you irrigate, you can easily measure the result. Two watering times at ½ inch each are better than 4 times at ½ inch, the water penetrates further and this will force the roots down to find it. Regular mowing is critical for good lawn health. Mow only the top 1/3 of the total length. Letting the grass grow long and then cutting off more than the 1/3 is damaging to the grass, and makes the mulching process less efficient and less attractive.

There is a new soil disease coming into our area that I was made aware of late last year. It reveals itself in St Augustine grasses. It is not cinch bugs, it is not grubs although it does resemble their grass

damages. The grass blades die and fall off the runners. The runners remain in place, but somewhat resemble a cobweb. It is NOT a grass disease, it IS a soil disease. The big chemical companies do have chemicals to treat it. This is a Gulf Coast epidemic that is moving North. Homeowners with no foot traffic and do their own yard work still get it. Its origins are a guess at this point. I am trying to be proactive and let you know your turf may get the problem and to watch out for it.

Long Term Care: Something to Think About

A recent Long Term Care National Poll revealed what people are thinking and doing about long term care. Genworth Financial reports from this poll that many people believe long term care is only for the very old and therefore are prone to ignoring the issues. But what are the important things to know about long term care?

The bottom line: Americans are not planning for possible long term care needs but are concerned about how they will pay for it. The vast majority of Americans are not prepared for the costs of long term care:

- Nearly 6 in 10 Americans (59% of survey respondents) are worried about being able to pay for long term care for themselves.
- 75% (3 out of 4) have made no preparations for their own or a loved one's long term care needs in case it is needed.
- Even if it meant saving \$25,000 a year, only 9% of respondents said they would place a loved one in a nursing home in another part of the state or in a neighboring state.

But the possibility of developing Alzheimer's disease motivates people to plan for LTC. 72% of respondents said that the possibility of developing Alzheimer's disease or another form of dementia is an important motivating factor in planning for long term care.

The growing incidence of Alzheimer's disease is a motivating factor for long term care planning, especially for senior citizens. When informed of a new report that found Alzheimer's disease prevalence has increased 10% in the last few years and that someone in America is diagnosed every 72 seconds, roughly half (49%) of survey respondents age 65 or older said the disease was a VERY important motivating factor in planning for long term care. In comparison, only 24% of seniors who were not informed of the recent Alzheimer's disease report were very concerned about being able to pay for long term care.

Consumers incorrectly believe the federal government or their health insurance will pay for their long term care needs

Almost half of survey respondents (44%) incorrectly believe that Medicare or their private health insurance will pay for their long term care needs. Actually, health insurance and the federal Medicare program do not generally cover long term care.

People would prefer long term care in their home

- If given the choice between care in a facility such as a nursing home or an assisted living facility and care at home, 75% (3 out of 4) of respondents would prefer care at home.
- However, 43% of respondents incorrectly believe Medicare or their health insurance will pay for a home health aide.

Survey Information: The survey was conducted March 25-27, 2007 by Public Opinion Strategies. The poll of 800 registered voters across the country and has a margin of error of +3.46% in 95 out of 100



10 Ideas to Help You Get Organized this Spring!

Computer: Examine your desktop for icons or shortcuts you no longer use. Delete those and organize the remaining ones on the desktop in an order that makes sense for how you use them. Then add any extra icons of frequently used programs.

Pantry: On a pantry door, place a clear shoe organizer. It can be a useful place to store gravy/soup/sauce mixes, flavored rice and pasta packs, dry marinades and sauces, Jell-O, extra utensils, spices, or other small items. Shoeboxes are also great to use as inexpensive organizers for small pantry items.

Refrigerator: Before grocery shopping, examine your fridge. Discard any stale food & clean shelves with a damp cloth. Upon return, the new groceries can go right in.

Freezer/Fridge: For food in the freezer/refrigerator, rotate the oldest to the front and newest in back. Use adhesive labels to date items in storage containers.

Laundry: Before putting small articles of clothing into the washing machine, get a few inexpensive mesh bags (used for hosiery) and separate each family member's socks, undergarments, and other small items into them. When washing is complete, these bags can be tossed into the dryer and dropped in everyone's room to put away.

Cleaning Supplies: Use a caddy with a handle to carry around cleaning products (sprays, rags, wipes, sponges) from room to room with ease. Also, items stay in one place and are quick to locate when needed.

Drawers: Use ice-cube trays and empty check boxes as drawer organizers to hold loose coin, pins, buttons, earrings, rubber-bands,

Paper Data: Information on Post-It Notes and business cards with important names, numbers, and addresses should be transferred to vour electronic database or address book.

Garage: Use a tall trashcan or umbrella stand for holding long items such as baseball bats, fishing rods, etc.

Games: Use Ziploc bags to store small game pieces, and then put those bags back in their correct boxes.

COMPOST & AERATION: Keys to a Healthy Lawn

By David Hunsaker

Compost and Aeration are key ingredients to a healthy, vibrant green turf. The combination of both Compost and Aeration help to improve the lawn's root system, soil compaction and soil composition.

The first key ingredient is Aeration. This is the process of perforating the soil with small holes that allow water, air and fertilizer to get closer to the roots. This enables the roots to grow more deeply producing a healthier, greener turf. The aeration process removes thin, cigar-shaped plugs of dirt and then deposits them on the surface of the lawn. These plugs are left on the lawn in order to get oxygen to the root system.



When lawns are not aerated, air gets squeezed out of the soil and roots cannot grow as efficiently. "The soil under the lawn tends to compact readily because, unlike garden soil, it is virtually never worked or turned. For the lawn, aerating is the alternative to tilling."*

The second key ingredient is the compost or top soil. Compost is an all natural, organic fertilizer that dispenses nutrients into your soil. The lawn is top dressed with compost after aerating. As it slowly decomposes throughout the year, it leaves you with a strong, green and lush lawn. Compost also has more of a significant amount of additional nutrients than any "brand name" fertilizer you can buy at your local home and garden center.

The process of Aerating and applying compost decreases the soil compaction, allows nutrients into the soil and strengthens your lawn root system during the stresses of summer. Both Aerating and Composting are key factors to a healthy lawn.

Kicking Kidney Stones: Are at Risk and What Can Be Done?

It's a common condition that can cause uncommon pain. Kidney stones can be as small as a grain of sand, the size of a pearl or even, for an unlucky few, larger than a golf ball. No matter what their size, kidney stones are considered to be one of the most uncomfortable of urological disorders—just ask someone who's passed one.

Every year, more than three million visits are made to health care providers and more than half a million men and women end up in the emergency room for problems related to kidney stones, according to the National Kidney and Urologic Diseases Information Clearinghouse.

Kidney stones are more prevalent in certain parts of the United States—including Central Texas. "There is an area sometimes called the "stone belt" that stretches from coast to coast along the mid- and lower south states where kidney stone rates are higher," says Dr. Koushik Shaw, a board certified urologist with The Austin Diagnostic Clinic. "There are many theories on why that is, including higher temperatures or the possibility of higher mineral content in the water supply."

No matter where you live, kidney stones develop when waste materials in the urine don't completely dissolve. "Sometimes a stone will stay in the kidney and you won't even know it's there," says Dr. Shaw. "Other times, it will travel from the kidney and travel down the ureter, the tube that carries urine from the kidney to the bladder. Eventually, it may come out when you urinate."

But a stone can cause intense pain as it moves into the bladder.

Sometimes it can get stuck as it travels. "The most common symptom of a kidney stone is sharp pain in the back, side or in the lower abdomen," explains Dr. Shaw. "Other signs of a stone include nausea and vomiting, blood in the urine, cloudy urine, the need to urinate more often, and fever and chills."

Despite the discomfort—for which doctors can prescribe pain medication—many stones can pass through your body if you stay adequately hydrated. If the stone doesn't pass promptly, or causes severe pain or an infection, your doctor may recommend medical treatment.

"Not too long ago, open surgery was a major option for removing kidney stones," says Dr. Shaw. "Today, there are new, less invasive methods that can be performed in an outpatient setting. Your doctor will choose a treatment after considering the size of your stone, the stone's location and any medical conditions you might have."

If you've had a kidney stone, you may develop them again. Know your family history as well; if someone in your family has had stones, you're more likely to form them and should take steps toward preven-

"If you want to avoid any type of kidney stone, the best thing you can do is drink water and lots of it," says Dr. Shaw. "Drink six to eight full glasses each day. Drinking lemonade can also be helpful because it has high levels of citrate, which is a powerful reducer of stone formation. Stay as active as possible and eat a healthy, balanced diet as well."

Is Overwhitening a Concern?

Dear Friends,

Many folks that are teeth whitening are aiming for an unnaturally white shade by overusing the products. Excessive use of bleaching products can damage tooth structure and gums. Some overly enthusiastic patients experience tooth sensitivity, blisters and discoloration on teeth and gums.

Custom-fitted trays are used to hold the gel, reducing risk of hydrogen peroxide leakage; with overthe-counter products, the trays are usually not form-fitting. But even under ideal conditions, studies show that often less than 50% of the whitener is still in the trays one hour after application, indicating a lot of leakage

I do caution against buying tooth whitening products over the counter. The ingredients may be correct but the balance of the ingredients may be improper, resulting in a low pH, thus damaging the enamel of the teeth.

Make sure whatever whitening product you get, it has an ADA (American Dental Association) seal of acceptance. Most over the counter products do not have that seal, thus may cause an unknown harm. If you have any questions, feel free to email me at sundranidds@yahoo.com.
