





LIMON ADDED TO INAUGURAL CYPRESS RANCH COACHING STAFF

Former Sam Houston High School head football coach and campus athletic coordinator Anthony Limon will be joining the coaching staff at Cypress Ranch High School. Limon will help lead four Mustang teams this fall as the school opens with 9th and 10th grade students. The Mustangs will field two freshmen teams and two junior varsity teams for the next two years before beginning varsity play in the fall of 2010. Limon graduated from Austin Johnston High School where he was a two-year letterman in football and track. After wrapping up his high school career with all-district honors, Limon moved on to Texas Lutheran to continue his playing career where he was a part of a nationally ranked NAIA Divison I Texas Lutheran squad. Coach Limon eventually moved on Southwest Texas State University (now Texas State) to earn his degree in Physical Education with a minor in Biology. He began his move into the coaching profession as a student at Southwest by serving as a student assistant coach and the video coordinator for the Bobcat football team. Coach Limon left Southwest Texas in 1990 to begin his high school coaching career and has had stops in the Laredo, Edinburg, Santa Fe, Bastrop and Aldine Independent School Districts before most recently becoming the head football coach at Houston Sam Houston High School. John 3:3-5... "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God... unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God."

When Christians speak of being "born again" they speak of the doctrine of regeneration. Regeneration can be defined as the sole work of God by which He imparts spiritual life into His elect children in order that they might respond by faith to the gospel call and be saved. God actually promised this to His people through the OT prophet Ezekiel: "I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes and be careful to obey my rules" (36:25-27; cf. Jer. 31:31-34). Note that this promise from God is His intention to impart spiritual life to His people.

Now Jesus, in John 3:3-8, chastised Nicodemus for being a teacher in Israel and yet not knowing the truth of Ezekiel's prophecy and what it meant to be born again. Jesus asked him, "You are a teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things?" Jesus spoke of the same "water" that Ezekiel did – the spiritual cleansing from sin – and the new heart that was needed to be reborn spiritually. Both of which are given by the Holy Spirit.

It is important to note that regeneration occurs prior to saving faith, for no one can respond with faith to Christ's call without having previously been regenerated. Jesus speaks of this phenomenon in John 6:44 saying, "No one can come to me unless the Father, who sent me, draws him." There is a sequence, therefore, in salvation whereby God the Father draws one to Christ, and then after they hear the good news preached to them about Christ (Eph. 1:13; 1 Pet. 1:23, 25; James 1:18), they respond in faith. They must hear the preached word however. Now though many may hear the gospel call, only those chosen by God will respond in faith (Matt. 22:14). But they must be born again through the work of God before they are able to respond with faith. The Spirit washes and regenerates, then faith follows immediately after God's word is preached. Note Cornelius in Acts 10:44. As Peter preached the gospel to he and his household, "the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word" on that day. Note also the case of Lydia in Acts 16:14: "And the Lord opened her heart to the respond to the things spoken by Paul." It is God's work, therefore, that reaches into the hearts of His elect children to summon their response, and it is an instantaneous event that occurs only once for all believers in Christ. So, regeneration occurs before saving faith, although to the Christian they are practically simultaneous.

God is working in His people, and in His time He calls His own to Himself through the preached word of God – the Bible. Bible teaching, therefore, is essential for all, for it is the means through which God calls His children to faith in Jesus Christ. 



WORK OUT CHRONIC FATIGUE

Chronic fatigue is more than just feeling tired all the time. For those who suffer from this mysterious syndrome, it can be a constant battle simply to get out of bed in the morning. Symptoms of chronic fatigue syndrome (CFS) include unexplained fatigue lasting 30 days or more; flu-like symptoms such as a sore throat, generalized muscle pains, head-aches and swollen lymph nodes; diffi-culty concentrating and sensitivity to bright light. CFS was dubbed the yuppie flu in the '80s and, despite the fact that it has been recognized as a legitimate, often debilitating illness, it is still met with scorn and disbelief.



There is no cure for CFS. For some people, it simply goes away, while others are debilitated by it for many years. Because the cause is largely unexplainable, treatment for CFS focuses primarily on relieving symptoms.

LOW BLOOD PRESSURE CAN BRING YOU DOWN

One of the latest theories proposed to explain CFS is that individuals who suffer from this condition also may have extremely low blood pressure. Researchers at Johns Hopkins University found that 22 of 23 CFS patients also had a disorder called

neurally mediated hypotension (NMH). People with NMH get dizzy from standing up too quickly or from standing for extended periods of time, signaling that not enough blood is reaching the brain. When treated for NMH for six months (either with medication or by increasing salt and fluid intake), nine of the 22 CFS patients said that all or nearly all of their CFS symptoms had disappeared; another seven said that their symptoms had improved.

A NOVEL APPROACH

But what about those who have normal blood pressure, but still fight persistent fatigue? Here's an interesting proposition: Is it possible to treat chronic fatigue with exercise?

Some researchers think so. A recent review of existing research on CFS explored the possibility of using physical activity programs to treat this puzzling condition. The findings are intriguing, if not conclusive.

Many people with CFS claim that they are too tired to exercise. Measurements of strength, exercise capacity and muscle function, however, suggest that CFS patients are not much weaker than the controls (people without CFS) they are compared to in research studies. This suggests that their capacity to exercise is greater than they may perceive. But telling someone who feels unable to get out of bed to exercise is probably an exercise in futility.

EXERCISE FOR ENERGY

Still, physicians such as Dr. Neil Gordon, author of Chronic Fatigue: Your Complete Exercise Guide, view exercise as a form of medication and an integral part of rehabilitation from CFS. Exercise programs for people with CFS are not much different than any other comprehensive exercise program: Cardiovascular, strengthening and range-of-motion training should all be addressed. The primary difference is the pace and degree of progression: CFS patients need time to build their strength

and adapt to the increased demands of exercise. And, as with any other physical condition, CFS patients should consult with their physicians before beginning an exercise program.

EXERCISE YOUR OPTIONS

People with CFS feel limited by their condition to enjoy the benefits of an active life. But as anyone who exercises will tell you, expending energy brings about increased energy in return. The same may hold true for individuals who are plagued by the unexplained tiredness of CFS.

HOUSTON – (June 23, 2008) – For about one-fourth of people with an inherited heart problem called long QT syndrome, the source of their problem was a mystery – until researchers at Baylor College of Medicine, the Texas Heart Institute and Texas Children's Hospital in Houston pinpointed a defect in a structural protein in a report in current edition of the journal Circulation: Arrhythmia and Electrophysiology.

A mutation in a cytoskeletal protein called alpha-1-synotrophin, one of the molecules that helps heart cells maintain their shape, changes the functioning of a tiny pore called a sodium ion channel, resulting in long QT syndrome in at least a portion of these patients, said Dr. Matteo Vatta, assistant professor of pediatrics - cardiology at BCM and associate director of pediatric cardiac research. Vatta is senior author of the report.

Until now, defects in genes for particular ion channels have been blamed for inherited long QT syndrome, said Vatta. However, experts could identify no defects in about 25 percent of people with the problem.

Ions are charged chemicals such as sodium or potassium that flow in and out of pores called channels in the cell membranes. The channels open and close in a specific sequence, letting the chemicals in and out of cell in a manner that prompts them to beat in synchrony. When the cells can beat in unison, the heart pumps blood. If the ion channels are defective, it affects the beating of the cells and the heart – often with devastating effects. Untreated long QT syndrome can cause the heart to stop suddenly.

"The mutation in this kind of protein called alpha-1-syntrophin is the first associated with long QT syndrome," said Vatta. Previously, he and colleagues had identified a link between long QT syndrome and a defect in caveolin-3, a scaffolding protein.


"I am interested in the connection between the structural and the electrical part of the heart," said Vatta, whose lab is based in the Feigin Center of Texas Children's. "It could have everything to do with susceptibility to arrhythmias (heart rhythm disruptions) in patients with heart disease. First, we had to prove that the structural part of the heart could be involved in electrical problems."

The caveolin-3 finding led to studies of syntrophin, a protein connected to dystrophin, which when mutated causes Duchenne and Becker muscular dystrophy as well as the X-linked form of cardiomyopathy. As people with Duchenne and Becker muscle-wasting disease age, they develop cardiomyopathy, a weakening of the heart muscle, with heart rhythm disruptions called arrhythmias. This leads to heart failure and an increased risk of sudden cardiac death (sudden heart stoppage) caused by the arrhythmias.

"Syntrophin is the bridge that connects dystrophin to the sodium channel," said Vatta. Dystrophin is critical in the binding of syntrophin



to the sodium channel, he said. A mutation in syntrophin disrupts the proper functioning of the sodium channel.

That leads to an electrical problem that disrupts the normal beating of the heart, he said. The finding is proof of the concept that patients with mutations in the structural part of the heart muscle cells also have a problem with how the electrical system of the heart works, leading to dysrhythmias.

"Once you screen all the ion channels and do not find changes that can lead to a pathological effect such as long QT syndrome, then you have to think about all the proteins that interact with the ion channels," Vatta said.

Kim, Bhagyalaxmi Mohapatra, Zhaohui Li, Enkhsaikhan Purevjav and Jeffrey A. Towbin, all of BCM and Texas Children's; Michael J. Ackerman of the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota, and Ming Qi and Arthur J. Moss of the University of Rochester Medical Center in New York.



August Landscaping

August is a great month to stay inside and make your plans for this fall's plantings. Browse the catalogs for ideas and bulbs to order now to plant in November and December for next spring's display. If you are going to work in the lawn or garden, plan it around the early morning or evening in the cooler hours. Drink plenty of water to keep from dehydrating.

The July heat may have already taken its toll on your annuals. If they are beyond help, pull them out and replace them with more heat tolerant varieties. If they are okay but overgrown, you can trim back your annuals and

perennials by 1/3 to 1/2 to get better flowering in the fall. You can also trim off the dead or damaged canes and the errant chutes from your roses to enhance the fall blooms. Fertilize your roses right after you prune, as this application is very important. Do NOT trim flowering shrubs, like Indian Hawthorns, after July or you will probably trim off the buds (look like berries) that would provide the flowers next year. Rework your beds to prepare them for fall plantings of flowers or vegetables. Bury in the compost materials and add the mulch on

top. They will be ready for planting when it is time. You can fertilize your lawns this month with a 3-1-2 ratio 50% slow release nitrogen fertilizer. This is a good fertilizer for your shrubs and flowerbeds too.

> The heat stresses all our lawns, shrubs etc. We will probably not get much rain so we will have to water with irrigation systems or drag around sprinklers to keep everything from burning up. 1 inch of water per week should be enough.

Do not water in mid-day, as most of it will simply evaporate prior to getting into the ground. Irrigate in the early morning if possible. Water deeply, not frequently. Wa-

tering in the evening can lead to plant diseases. Maintain the water in the soil of your beds more effectively by having a good thick layer of mulch. Most every month I comment on the benefits of thick mulch but it is a topic worth repeating, as its benefits are many.

If your property is in need of new sod, it can be put in now with no problems as long as you water it properly. With new sod, you do not have to suffer with mud in the fall and winter.



Natural Watch Dog

These dogs are all barking inappropriately. In other words this is nuisance barking. Birds, squirrels, leaves, cats, lizards or other dogs and people are not things we need Rover telling us about. Fires, someone breaking in, or unexpected things are what we want to be notified about.

As I said, Rover is not a barker. He'll look towards the sound of other dogs barking but he doesn't join in. The times he did join in we corrected him. We consistently let him know that we didn't need to know if the Yorkies saw someone or even if he saw someone. It was none of his business, but if he wanted to watch he could do so quietly. Now he basical-

out of the ordinary. They WILL warn about unusual events, even if they are corrected for barking at the wrong things.

If Rover is a nuisance barker the chances are that over time we'll just tune him out. It's like the boy who cried wolf. When the wolf really comes we won't believe him.

Nuisance barking CAN be corrected but it's important to address the cause(s) and not just the symptom(s). Dogs bark for various reasons such as calling the pack, trying to scare someone or something, because they are afraid, or because they're bored. It's often stressful not only to us and our neighbors, but to the dogs as well. This is especially true with issues of separation anxiety.

Do you have a neighbor whose dog is creating a nuisance with his constant barking? How you approach this might be difficult. You might ask if their dog is ok because it seems to be upset a lot. If it only barks when the owners aren't home they might not even know it's barking. Ask about the dog with concern instead of confrontation and you may have a better chance of getting the owner to understand there's a problem.

Once the inappropriate barking is under control you'll have a natural watchdog. One who alerts you to something out of the ordinary, and one who's warning you can trust. Once we can trust Rover's warning we'll know when we have to really check on things and it won't be because the kids down the street are outside playing. The results?

Happy Dogs = Happy Families and Happy Neighbors.

Watch for Dehydration - Avoid Heat Stress by:

- Schedule practice time in the morning and late afternoons.
- Wear light-colored clothes with breathable material.
- Wear white hat to protect face, skull and neck
- Drink 18-20 oz of fluid two or three hours before your match, then again another 8-10 oz ten to twenty minutes before
- During play, drink 8-10 oz every ten to twenty minutes (during changeovers.)
- · If you have heat cramps, stretch the muscle, and take rehydration drinks with glucose and electrolytes.
- If you feel light-headed and think you might faint, lower your head or lay down on your back with your feet up. It would be a good idea to stop playing and to sit down in a cool area.
- Take two coolers on the court. One full of ice and water to drink and one with ice only with a towel. Between games, soak your towel in the cooler and refresh your face, neck and wrists.

Regaining A Healthy Liver, One Pound At A Time

Baylor College of Medicine

HOUSTON – (July 10, 2008) – For those suffering from cirrhosis of the liver resulting from nonalcoholic fatty liver disease, each pound lost is a step towards regaining your health, say doctors at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

"Non-alcoholic fatty liver disease is now being seen increasingly in the United States as the obesity epidemic continues," said Dr. John Vierling, professor of medicine and surgery at BCM and director of Baylor Liver Health.

Cirrhosis is a condition associated with dense scarring and regenerating nodules on the liver. It can result from a number of illnesses, including alcoholic and viral hepatitis, autoimmune and metabolic liver diseases. Nonalcoholic fatty liver disease causes cirrhosis when a large amount of fat accumulates in the liver in the presence of damaging inflammation.

"It's important for people to understand that cirrhosis can be caused by obesity in adults and children," said Vierling. "Very often people think it is only associated with over consumption of alcohol or viral hepatitis."

Reaching a healthy weight is one way to reverse damage to the liver. For many people the thought of having to lose 100 to 200 pounds is daunting, but Vierling said even losing 10 percent of your body weight can help the liver begin to heal.

"Losing a little weight won't cure the problem, but it starts the

process of healing," he said. "It's easy for people to get discouraged when it comes to weight loss, but understanding that every pound lost is helping the liver helps make the process more fulfilling."

Vierling adds that other health issues are associated with obesity such as diabetes and high lipids. So it's important to consult a doctor for evaluation and advice.

"The liver is one of the five major organs of the body you can't live without," Vierling said. "So doing everything you can, one step or pound at a time, is important to stay healthy."




