Cypress Christian School Athletic Accomplishments





He was the winner at the Olympic Trials held this past June in Philadelphia. Al, Margo, sister Margo and fiancé, Haley were all in attendance to help him celebrate this momentous occasion. Jonathan left for Beijing on July 29 and mom and dad plan to be in attendance to encourage, support and cheer him

on. His Olympic dream started when he was 4 years old and has continued to be his life-long passion for the past 18 years. His past accomplishments include receiving 18 All-American honors, helping lead the OU gymnastics team to 3 National Championships, receiving the 2008 Nissen-Emery Award (equivalent to the Heisman Trophy Award), being named the 2006 and 2007 American Cup All-Around Champion, and last year in Germany at the World Championships he placed 4th All Around. Most youth in the Tomball, Cypress and Klein school districts who play on their school tennis team, attain top state and national rankings, and earn college scholarships, started playing matches in our Junior Team Tennis League. The Northwest Youth Tennis Association (NWYTA) encourages even the youngest player to develop tennis skills and good sportsmanship attitudes as a team member in this affordable league. For just \$40.00, kids get six to eight weeks of matches, a T-shirt, a USTA membership or renewal, the season's end award/fun event and winners' trophies.

NWYTA welcomes youth up to 18 years old who already know how to play tennis. We do not teach tennis, but support the work of area tennis professionals by giving the youth a chance to practice what they learn in their lessons. Teams, set by age and ability, play out of their own neighborhood or local clubs against other clubs and neighborhoods. NWYTA can help you build a neighborhood team or place you on a team elsewhere. Winners at our local level could advance to regional, state and national championships.

Registration for the 2008 Fall Season closes August 29th. Play begins in mid-September, ending with playoffs and a fun awards event in November.

Tennis Tips

Watch for Dehydration - Avoid Heat Stress by:

- Schedule practice time in the morning and late afternoons.
- Wear light-colored clothes with breathable material.
- Wear white hat to protect face, skull and neck
- Drink 18-20 oz of fluid two or three hours before your match, then again another 8-10 oz ten to twenty minutes before match.
- During play, drink 8-10 oz every ten to twenty minutes (during changeovers.)
- If you have heat cramps, stretch the muscle, and take rehydration drinks with glucose and electrolytes.
- If you feel light-headed and think you might faint, lower your head or lay down on your back with your feet up. It would be a good idea to stop playing and to sit down in a cool area.
- Take two coolers on the court. One full of ice and water to drink and one with ice only with a towel. Between games, soak your towel in the cooler and refresh your face, neck and wrists.

-----POOL RULES -----

1. Proper swim attire must be worn to be admitted to the pool.
2. Only Wortham Village residents and their guests will be allowed to use the pool. Residents must accompany guests. Residents are allowed four (4) guests with each adult pool tag (this does not include children 10 - 15 years old). Under this guest policy, there must be one adult for every two kids under 12 years of age. No Wortham resident under the age of 18 is allowed to bring a guest.
3. Pool passes will be strictly enforced. It is the resident's responsibility to bring to the pool. It is very awkward and uncomfortable situation for everyone when the lifeguard must ask a member to go back home and get his or her tag.
4. Lifeguards are employed to insure the safety of swimmers, and they have the authority to remove from the pool area anyone disobeying the rules and/or endangering the safety of themselves or another person.
5. There will be a 10 minute break each hour. During this time the pool will be cleared with the exception of persons who are eighteen (18) years of age and older.
6. The following activities and items are not allowed:
 - Running or rough-housing
 - Skates, bicycles or skateboards
 - Glass containers and/or alcoholic beverages
 - Littering
 - Cooking
 - Loud music
 - Pets
 - Cutoffs
 - Loud, abusive or foul language
 - Cocoa butter, baby oil or other heavy suntan oil
7. Flotation items for swimming pool are allowed, but are restricted to small size tubes and floats.
8. Diving Rules:
 - No diving in the shallow end
 - No swimming in the deep end while the boards are open for diving
 - Only one person on the diving board at all times
 - Divers must jump straight out and not towards the sides
 - Divers must wait for person in front of them to get to the side before diving
9. Any child nine (9) years or under must be accompanied by said child's parents or person eighteen years old or older. Children 10 - 15 years of age may swim without adult supervision after passing a swim test and received pool tags.
10. Baby Pool Rules:
 - Only non-swimming toddlers 5 years and under may use the baby pool.
 - Parents, not lifeguards, are responsible for children in baby pool.
 - Any child not potty-trained must wear rubber pants with elasticized waist and legs over disposable diapers when in the water.
11. Trespassers and vandals will be prosecuted.
12. Parents are responsible for their children and guests at the pool. Parents must closely supervise their children at all times. The lifeguards will always enforce pool rules throughout the facility, but children who cannot swim must have an adult (18 or older) within arms reach at all times. The same rule applies even if the child is wearing a flotation device.

Residents must be current on their maintenance fees before tags will be issued. Every resident issued tags will be required to wear pool tags for admittance to the pool area.

The pool tag registration days for tag distribution at the clubhouse have been completed for this season.

If you were unable to attend the official registration days, tags will be issued by Crest Management by mail only at a cost of \$20.00 per family. Fill out the form you received in the mail and send in with the \$20.00 fee for the tags to be mailed. Again, you will not be admitted to the pool area without a tag. Cost for replacing tags is \$20.00.



August Landscaping

August is a great month to stay inside and make your plans for this fall's plantings. Browse the catalogs for ideas and bulbs to order now to plant in November and December for next spring's display. If you are going to work in the lawn or garden, plan it around the early morning or evening in the cooler hours. Drink plenty of water to keep from dehydrating.


The July heat may have already taken its toll on your annuals. If they are beyond help, pull them out and replace them with more heat tolerant varieties. If they are okay but overgrown, you can trim back your annuals and perennials by 1/3 to 1/2 to get better flowering in the fall. You can also trim off the dead or damaged canes and the errant chutes from your roses to enhance the fall blooms. Fertilize your roses right after you prune, as this application is very important. Do NOT trim flowering shrubs, like Indian Hawthorns, after July or you will probably trim off the buds (look like berries) that would provide the flowers next year. Rework your beds to prepare them for fall plantings of flowers or vegetables. Bury in the compost materials and add the mulch on top. They will be ready for planting when it is time. You can fertilize your lawns this month with a 3-1-2 ratio 50% slow release nitrogen fertilizer. This is a good fertilizer for your shrubs and flowerbeds too.

The heat stresses all our lawns, shrubs etc. We will probably not get much rain so we will have to water with irrigation systems or drag around sprinklers to keep everything from burning up. 1 inch of water per week should be enough. Do not water in mid-day, as most of it will simply evaporate prior to getting into the ground. Irrigate in the early morning if possible. Water deeply, not frequently. Watering in the evening can lead to plant diseases. Maintain the water in the soil of your beds more effectively by having a good thick layer of mulch.

Most every month I comment on the benefits of thick mulch but it is a topic worth repeating, as its benefits are many.

If your property is in need of new sod, it can be put in now with no problems as long as you water it properly.

With new sod, you do not have to suffer with mud in the fall and winter.
