Toddler Swings Coming to Perry Park!

As we mentioned in the last issue, HPWBANA and Friends of Perry Park have been awarded a grant from Austin Parks Foundation to install an ADA-compliant, one-bay toddler swing set (2 swings) within Perry Park playground. These will be bucket-style swings with leg holes to support a young child in an upright position. Our goal is to have age-appropriate playground equipment to attract a greater number of users, and increase the utilization of the playground.

The project must be completed within a one-year timeframe. AND WE NEED YOUR HELP! The grant covers only half of the estimated total project cost of \$8,000. Our neighborhood businesses have committed \$1,000, and HPWBANA will also contribute to this project. However, we still need to raise \$2,000 for this project to be fully funded.





Do You Have a Wildlife Habitat Yet?

Just a reminder that there is still time to certify your yard as a wildlife habitat and help Austin earn points towards becoming certified as Texas' first National Wildlife Federation Community Wildlife Habitat.

All you and your family need to do is provide food, water, cover, places to raise young for wildlife and practice sustainable gardening practices are eligible for NWF wildlife habitat certification. Creating habitat is as simple as planting native plants that provide nectar, pollen, seeds, and berries year round, including a reliable water source to attract a variety of critters, and providing places for cover and rearing young such as planting evergreen shrubs, leaving brush and rock piles or putting up a birdhouse.

The Parks and Recreation Department's new Wildlife Austin program is sponsoring the challenge and neighborhoods must register their neighborhood with Wildlife Austin no later than October 31st.. Visit www.nwf.org/gardenforwildife or www. keepaustinwild.com for more details on the requirements for certification. 

EcoTexas Helps Bright Leaf Preserve

The HPWBANA Beautification Committee recently learned about the organization, EcoTexas. This group has been working in our neighborhood (in Bright Leaf Preserve) removing nonnative plants. And guess what...the group is located right here in our neighborhood!

As many know from experience, it is quite a struggle to get a teenager out of bed in the morning on the weekend, not to mention several dozen of them. However, one might be surprised to see such a sight at one of the frequent workdays sponsored by EcoTexas, a local nonprofit, in which many area teenagers pry themselves out of bed well before 8:00 AM to help do manual labor at local parks and preserves.

Such volunteer workdays help to defend our local environment by removing substantial amounts of invasive plants that threaten to decimate the unique ecosystem that is endemic to Central Texas. Invasive species are foreign plants and animals that invade a local environment and wreak havoc on it. Even the presence of one invasive species can cause substantial environmental, economic, and health damage. In fact, some studies have shown that the invasive species EcoTexas seeks to eradicate cause the United States over \$122 billion dollars in damage each year, \$36 billion dollars in public health damage, and have driven over 42% of plants and animals on

Endangered Species list to their threatened status. On the contrary, native plants are naturally part of a local environment and fulfill important functions within an ecosystem.

Founded in 2007 by high school students dedicated to making a difference, Eco Texas is a nonprofit organization organized as a special project fund with the Austin Community Foundation. It encourages friends and neighbors to take action to reduce the threat of invasive species to our community by removing

them from sensitive areas in local parks to protect our local environment, promoting the presence of native plants, and by raising awareness about the cause itself. To this day, EcoTexas' efforts are still driven by the work of teenage

Since our environment is a valuable part of what defines our home and heritage in Texas, we believe that we have an obligation to preserve it for our children and grandchildren.
