CALL TO ORDER: A quorum being present, the meeting was called to order at 7:00pm.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA: The agenda was adopted as presented.

MINUTES: The June 25, 2008 meeting minutes were previously approved via e-mail. Minutes were signed by Dena for minute book.

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL REPORTS: The May 2008 financials were presented. Financials were reviewed. The Board discussed not informing contractors of what has been budgeted for certain items. The best way to address this is to give the contractor a budget to work within.

### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Plumbing: The Board was presented with a bid from Suncoast Plumbing for the replacement of the commodes in the restrooms at both pools with commercial type toilets. After a brief discussion this item was tabled. Jessica will contact other plumbers to request proposals.

Meadow Estates Park: The Board discussed the work that has been done at the Meadow Estates Park. Jessica informed the Board that Hi-Tech has completed the clean out of the area. The Board discussed the need for landscape replacement now in this area. The Board approved a budget of \$6,000.00 for the installation of irrigation and landscape replacement.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Electrical Proposal/Solar Energy: This was tabled as the information was not available. The Board took this time to discuss the fact that solar energy is still being considered for the community.

center. Jessica states that the advice of the trophy company was not to have a trophy case in an area that has weight as this is a liability. a onetime set-up fee. The Board discussed this option. A motion was made by Shirley that a domain name be set up as long as the cost does not exceed \$200.00. Seconded by Dena. Approved unanimously.

Community Committees: The Board discussed the potential of forming committees to work with the Board of Directors. These committees would consist of members of the community. This will be discussed by the Board to decide on the type of committees that serve the community best and request for participants will follow.

Budget: The Budget was briefly discussed by the Board. During the discussion it was mentioned by Steve Howard that the Board had been advised that the pool on Mills Park will need to be resurfaced this coming year. The cost could be as much as \$65,000.00.

Marquee: Steve Howard brought to the attention of the Board that there was damage to the marquee at the entrance of the Estates. This could be possible vandalism or damage caused by the road crew in preparation of the road expansion. Jessica will seek cost of replacement.

Board Member Vacancy: The Board interviewed three (3) potential candidates for the open position on the Board of Directors with the resignation of Steve Howard. The Board discussed at length the qualifications and the interviews with the potential candidates. A motion was made that the position be filled by Gail Norris; motion was seconded and approved unanimously by those Board Members in attendance.

DELINQUENCY REPORT: The Board reviewed the current delinquency report. The Board is pleased to see that there has been a significant amount of outstanding fees that have been collected.

ATTORNEY STATUS REPORT: The Board reviewed the current attorney status report of the 49 accounts that are currently at attorney status 39 have paid their account in full or have made payment arrangements. 3 have filed bankruptcy, 2 were foreclosed by the lender and 5 are still pending.

ADJOURNMENT: With no further business the meeting was properly adjourned at 9:32 PM.



### **Halloween Safety Tips**

### Trick-or-Treaters

- · Carry a flashlight
- · Walk, don't run
- · Stay on sidewalks
- · Obey traffic signals
- Stay in familiar neighborhoods
- Don't cut across yards or driveways
- Wear a watch you can read in the dark
- Make sure costumes don't drag on the ground
- Shoes should fit (even if they don't go with your costume)
- · Avoid wearing masks while walking from house to house
- Carry only flexible knives, swords or other props
- If there is no sidewalk, walk on the left side of the road facing traffic
- Wear clothing with reflective markings or tape
- · Approach only houses that are lit
- Stay away from and don't pet animals you don't know

#### **Parents**

- · Make your child eat dinner before setting out
- · Children should carry quarters so they can call home
- Ideally, young children of any age should be accompanied by an adult
- If your children go on their own, be sure they wear a watch, preferably one that can be read in the dark
- If you buy a costume, look for one made of flame-retardant material
- Older children should know where to reach you and when to be home
- · You should know where your children are going
- Although tampering is rare, tell children to bring the candy home to be inspected before consuming anything
- Look at the wrapping carefully and toss out anything that looks suspicious

### Homeowners

- Make sure your yard is clear of such things as ladders, hoses, dog leashes and flower pots that can trip the young ones
- Pets get frightened on Halloween. Put them up to protect them from cars or inadvertently biting a trick-or-treater
- Battery powered jack o'lantern candles are preferable to a real flame
- If you do use candles, place the pumpkin well away from where trick-or-treaters will be walking or standing
- Make sure paper or cloth yard decorations won't be blown into a flaming candle
- Healthy food alternatives for trick-or-treaters include packages of low-fat crackers with cheese or peanut butter filling, single-serve boxes of cereal, packaged fruit rolls, mini boxes of raisins and single-serve packets of low-fat popcorn that can be micro-waved later

### **CONSTABLE'S CORNER**

With the rise in population and the presence of more businesses in the Cypress Area, there has been a climb in the crime rate. There are several areas that you can do to assist in the protection of your property. The most likely time for a burglary will be during the daytime while you are away. A common used tool in the burglar's arsenal is to simply knock on your door and see if anyone is home. At this same time, he/she can look inside your windows and see at a glance what type of property you have inside your home. It is a helpful tip to always answer your door if you are home. If you notice that it is a solicitor or someone that you don't want to talk with, simply do not open the door, but ask them to leave. Try and shut your blinds during the daytime around exterior windows this will prevent someone from looking inside and seeing your property. Also at night, please make sure that you shut your garage doors and locked your vehicles trying not to leave any items within your vehicle. This will prevent car burglaries from occurring. If you park a car in the driveway of your residence overnight, do not leave the garage door opener in that vehicle. This invites criminals to get into your vehicle and gives them access to your garage and residence at night. If you are home and see someone out of place on the street or at your

neighbor's residence at any time of the day or night, please call our office to allow the deputies to respond and investigate the presence of the person/vehicle. Remember, the person stealing from your neighbor today that gets away, will be back tomorrow to steal from you.

When you are out working in the yard, even during the weekend, try and keep your garage shut unless you are within eye sight of it. Most people keep high dollar lawn equipment and items inside their garage and a thief will enter the garage taking as much as he can carry while you are in the backyard mowing.

I ask that parents remember that there are no off road motorcycles, four wheelers, or mini-bikes allowed on public roadways. I receive a large number of calls in regards to this over the year. In the past, a stern warning has sufficed in reminding the offender and it usually does not happen again. With the rise of incidents still occurring and complaints from neighbors, citations may be issued to persons caught riding illegal off road vehicles on the road. Together we can help keep Cypress Mill an excellent community to live in.

### **MUD Mowing Schedule**

FYI - the areas owned and maintained by the MUD district have the following mowing schedule:

The top entrances to the detention ponds are mowed by one contractor once a week during the months of March - October. From November - February these areas are only mowed every other week. The typical mowing day is Thursday, but this is subject to change with weather conditions, etc.

The top sidewalk areas and areas behind your fence and top of the ponds slopes are mowed by another company. This mowing is once a week. The remaining areas around the detention pond, including the side slopes and bottom of the basin are only scheduled for mowing once a month all year. 




