Our office does attempt to notify the attorney of full payments received after the listing is sent, but there is no guarantee that the process can be stopped prior to the charges incurred. To be sure of avoiding legal penalties please pay your assessment in a timely manner.

Partial Payments:

Your Association does accept partial payments – but a onetime \$50.00 payment does not stop legal action.....you must make a payment every 30 days to ensure compliance with your payment plan. Please plan accordingly to pay your assessments – the individual neighborhood assessment will be received in late November and are due January 1, 2009. The budget meetings will be held in October and the individual neighborhood assessments set for 2009 at that time.



While at school, he makes 4 visits a day to the nurse, who checks his blood glucose and/or administers insulin, through his pump. On an average day Matthew has his blood checked no less than 8 times...around 3,000 finger pokes per year. He also wears a medical bracelet and always travels with his diabetes supplies, even when traveling close to home. He now checks his own blood sugar and reads the nutrition labels for the carb count. He looks forward to his 6th year at the JDRF walk and serving as one of the ambassadors. Last year Matthew enjoyed speaking to business' and high school clubs. He impressed his audience with his love for music by singing to them.

Jake was diagnosed 1 month after his 16th birthday and is a junior at Cy-Woods High School. He enjoys sports, hanging with friends, driving and working at his aunt's restaurant. A challenge that Jake faces each day is adjusting to this new life style. When you have been able to always eat, sleep, & play as you wish it is difficult. Jake is required to wake up early (even in the summer and weekends) to give himself his 1st dosage of insulin, with a syringe. He administers at least 4 shots a day... around 1,460 a year (not counting the finger pricks when he checks his glucose levels). He must also eat a certain number of carbs at the same time each day with snacks in between. This is a hard age to be diagnosed when you are used to eating when and what you want. How many teenagers look at the labels of everything they eat?

All of these items are NOT a cure for Matthew or Jake; rather they serve as a life support. No one outgrows Juvenile Diabetes, the only way out is a cure!

The holiness and righteousness of God entail both His love and His wrath. Now Romans 1:18 is a revelation of God's wrath which is reserved for those who refuse to receive Him by faith.

The term used for "wrath" (Greek orgē) in relation to God refers to His predetermined settled indignation that He will manifest at the end of time. It has nothing to do with God losing His temper but is more a reflection of His righteous anger toward those who refuse to receive Jesus Christ by faith. God perfectly hates as much as He perfectly loves (Heb. 1:9). Of course this aspect of God's character flies in the face of the touchy-feely gospel that is often espoused in the modern church. The truth of the matter is that God could not be holy while at the same time failing to hate evil. His holy character will not tolerate unholiness (Hab. 1:13; 1 Cor. 13:6).

God's wrath is revealed all throughout the Scriptures from the Torah to the Prophets and Writings, from the Gospels to the Epistles to the Revelation. God's wrath was evident in the Flood of Noah's day (Gen. 6-9) and at Sodom and Gomorrah (Gen. 18-19). Recall His wrath upon rebellious Israel promised through the prophets (Isa. 9:19; Jer. 7:20; Ezek. 7:19). In the Psalms God is seen as angry at those who reject Him (Ps. 2:5, 12; 76:6-7; 90:7-9). In the Gospel of John God's wrath is on those who do not obey Christ (3:36). The Apostle Paul uses "wrath" 21 times, mostly in reference to God's anger toward those who refuse to believe. And the Book of Revelation unveils seven seals full of God's wrath that devastates the earth and its inhabitants. So to reject the

concept of a wrathful God is ignore the words found throughout the Bible.

God's righteousness is revealed from faith to faith, and this is the gospel – the power of God revealed for salvation for everyone who believes (Rom. 1:16). But God did not reveal His righteousness as an end-all; He revealed it because of the disease of sin that had to be recognized and cured. Doctors recognize and diagnose a disease first, then they seek a cure. In the same way, the Law of God was given to reveal to man his disease (Rom. 3:20), and God's righteousness was revealed as the cure "from faith to faith" (1:16). For "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:23). All are spiritually dead in their sins and are by nature children of wrath (Eph. 2:1-3). But God meted out His wrath on His own Son at the cross as the revelation of His righteousness. Those who believe in the Son are therefore pardoned and cured of their disease, taking God's righteousness upon themselves. Those who don't, however, remain under God's wrath. The wait from now till the day of His future wrath is the time in which the bowl of His wrath is filling up, increasing judgment for increased sin (Rev. 16:1-21).

Liberal theology teaches Christians to proclaim that salvation is given to all, and all we need do is proclaim the good news that no one is going to hell. Their belief is that since Christ died for all, all are saved. But this is not the teaching of the apostles in the NT. They teach that wrath is upon all who do not trust Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. His death, therefore, did not save everyone. His death made it possible for those who believe in him to be saved.



# THE BEST TIME TO EXERCISE

Contrary to popular belief, women aren't the only ones with biological clocks. We all have them, and heed their ticking on a daily basis. If you are a regular exerciser, you may have already determined your most productive time to exercise and follow a routine that works best for you. On the other hand, if your exercise time varies from day to day, and it's wearing you out instead of pumping you up, you may be interested in the work of scientists who are studying the proverbial internal clock and how to best determine what time of day you should schedule your workouts.

#### RHYTHM: IT'S NOT JUST FOR DANCING

The secret appears to lie in circadian rhythms, the daily cycles that our bodies follow. These rhythms originate in the hypothalamus and regulate everything from body temperature and metabolism to blood pressure. The rhythms result from the firing rate of neurons. They have conformed to our 24-hour light-to-dark cycle, and may be regulated and reregulated each day according to the environment.

#### WARM IS BETTER


It is the influence of circadian rhythms on body temperature that seems to yield the most control over the quality of a workout. When body temperature is at its highest, your workouts will likely be more productive; when your temperature is low, chances are your exercise session may be less than optimal. Body temperature is at its lowest about one to three hours before before most of us wake up in the morning, in contrast to late afternoon when body temperature reaches its peak. (To determine your own circadian peak, refer to the box to the right.) Studies have consistently shown that exercise during these late-in-the-day hours produces better performance and more power. Muscles are warm and more flexible, perceived exertion is low, reaction time is quicker, strength is at its peak, and resting heart rate and blood pressure are low.

#### DON'T FIX IT IF IT'S NOT BROKEN

First of all, don't change your schedule if you feel good beginning your day with exercise. Everyone agrees that exercise at any time is better than no exercise at all. In fact, people who exercise in the morning are more successful at making it a habit. And though it has been suggested that morning exercise may put some people at higher risk for heart attack, further research indicates that there is simply a generalized increased risk of heart attacks in the morning. If your schedule favors an early workout, emphasize stretching and a good warm-up to insure that your body is ready for action.

#### **OTHER CONSIDERATIONS**

If stress relief is your goal, exercise always works, all the time. And if you're wondering when it's best to train for an upcoming event, it all depends on what time you'll actually be competing. If an upcoming marathon begins at 7:00 a.m., try training at that time of day. Though training at any time of day will raise performance levels,




#### **Find Your Peak**

To determine your own circadian peak in body temperature, record your temperature every couple of hours for five to six consecutive days. Body temperature usually fluctuates by plus or minus 1.5 degrees throughout the day. Try exercising during the period three hours before and after your highest temperature. If you are an early bird or a night owl, you may notice that your temperature peaks one to two hours before or after the norm (between 4 p.m. and 6 p.m.); you can adjust your exercise time accordingly.

research has shown that the ability to maintain sustained exercise is adaptive to circadian rhythms. In other words, consistently training in the morning will allow you to sustain exercise during a morning marathon longer than if you train in the evening.
