





But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe (Romans 3:21-22a)

The court scene of Romans 3:9-20, which convicted all of mankind as rebellious sinners held captive under the law of God, turns to absolute silence once the arraignment is complete. There are no excuses to be had by anyone, for every mouth is silenced (3:19). But it is in this divine court that God Himself intervenes mightily on behalf of His rebellious creation. Certainly, the words of Romans 3:21-26 could be dubbed as the greatest paragraph ever written.

The Apostle Paul has brilliantly brought his audience to the breaking point so that he could reiterate to them the most wonderful news ever given: God's righteousness is manifested. The word "manifested" in Greek means "to make visible." So while condemned man stood in the darkness of his guilt awaiting his just judgment from God, God manifested His light into the darkness as if to say, "Let there be light!" In doing so, God made His righteousness visible in the darkest of moments, just like He did when He created the universe in Genesis 1. And this fits within the context, for although God's manifestation of righteousness was apart from the Law, the Law and the Prophets (the OT) bore witness to it. God's created universe, the earth, the stars, animals, and mankind are all attestations of God's manifested righteousness. God's glory was also revealed after that throughout the existence of the Jewish nation, starting with the exodus from Egypt and proceeding all the way through their history up to the day of Jesus Christ.

Now the righteousness of God was first spoken of by Paul in Romans 1:17 where it stresses God's character and agenda. His righteousness is made known in the gospel (1:17) but apart from the law (3:21). Paul stresses, however, that God's righteousness was first spoken about in the Law and the Prophets (the OT), so it is clearly not a divine postscript or a Plan B on God's part. Both

1:17 and 3:21 teach that it is available only through faith. The only difference between the two passages is the tense of the verbs. In 1:17 God's righteousness is "being revealed" (ongoing present tense), meaning that wherever it is preached at any given time it is being revealed. In 3:21 God's righteousness "has been made known" (perfect tense) which is a reference to Christ's past death on the cross and its eternal benefits in the present and future.

So the scene changes dramatically, for God has now provided a path by which the accused, who stand condemned, can be freed from their guilt. The righteousness revealed has nothing to do with man's good works but only to do with God's character of grace and mercy. As mankind stands guilty before God with no way out, God lovingly provides a way to stand before Him justified and cleared of all wrongdoing. This free pass into God's good graces, however, is simply to be received; it is not offered as a wage to be earned. It is received "through faith in Jesus Christ," and it is "for all who believe." For those who have heard the word of God in Romans 3:9-20 and understand that they stand before God as condemned rebels, they recognize God's free gift of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ. All the rest amazingly refuse to submit to Christ and forfeit the opportunity to become righteous before God.

The Bible, the word of God, was given to man in order to lead him to Christ. It was given to show him how sinful he is and bring him to the point of despair, being without excuse for his sinful rebellion. Man, in his rebellion, desperately wants to earn God's favor, but God will have none of that. He just wants to give it away free of charge as a gift. This is God's righteousness, providing salvation apart from the law according to grace. God will have it no other way. Daniel Tammet is an autistic savant. He can perform mind-boggling mathematical calculations at breakneck speeds. But unlike other savants, who can perform similar feats. Tammet cannot describe how he does it. He speaks seven languages and is even devising his own language. Now scientists are asking whether his exceptional abilities are the key to unlock the secrets of autism. Ever since the age of three, when he suffered an epileptic fit, Tammet has been obsessed with counting. Now he is 26, and a mathematical genius who can figure out cube roots quicker than a calculator and recall pi to 22,514 decimal places. He also happens to be autistic, which is why he can't drive a car, wire a plug, or tell right from left. Since his epileptic fit, he has been able to see numbers as shapes, colors and textures. The number two, for instance, is a motion, and five is a clap of thunder. "When I multiply numbers together, I see two shapes. The image starts to change and evolve, and a third shape emerges. That's the answer. An estimated 10% of the autistic population - and an estimated 1% of the non-autistic population - have savant abilities, but no one knows exactly why. A number of scientists now hope that Tammet might help us to understand better. The blind American savant Leslie Lemke played Tchaikovsky's Piano Concerto No1, after he heard it for the first time, and he never had so much as a piano lesson. And the British savant Stephen Wiltshire was able to draw a highly accurate map of the London skyline from memory after a single helicopter trip over the city. Even so, Tammet could still turn out to be the more significant. Could the human mind be much more powerful than even science is willing to admit? From The Guardian (one of the U.K.'s leading newspapers).



CAN EXERCISE REDUCE YOUR RISK OF CATCHING A COLD?

Sir William Osler, the famous Canadian | a few hours. medical doctor, once guipped, "There's only one way to treat the common cold - with contempt." And for good reason. The average adult has two to three respiratory infections each year. That number jumps to six or seven for young children.

Whether or not you get sick with a cold after being exposed to a virus depends on many factors that affect your immune system. Old age, cigarette smoking, mental stress, poor nutrition and lack of sleep have all been associated with impaired immune function and increased risk of infection.

KEEPING THE IMMUNE SYSTEM IN GOOD SHAPE

Can regular exercise help keep your immune system in good shape? Researchers are just now supplying some answers to this new and exciting question. Fitness enthusiasts have frequently reported that they experience less sickness than their sedentary peers. For example, a survey conducted during the '80s revealed that 61 percent of 700 recreational runners reported fewer colds since they began running, while only 4 percent felt they had experienced more.

Further research has shown that during moderate exercise, several positive changes occur in the immune system. Various immune cells circulate through the body more quickly, and are better able to kill bacteria and viruses. Once the moderate exercise bout is over, the immune system returns to normal within

In other words, every time you go for a brisk walk, your immune system receives a boost that should increase your chances of fighting off cold viruses over the long term.

SHOULD YOU EXERCISE WHEN SICK?

Fitness enthusiasts and endurance athletes alike are often uncertain of whether they should exercise or rest when sick.



Although more research is needed, most sports medicine experts in this area recommend that if you have symptoms of a common cold with no fever (i.e., symptoms are above the neck), moderate exercise such as walking is probably safe. Intensive exercise should be postponed until a few days after the symptoms have gone away. However, if there are symptoms or signs of the flu (i.e., fever, extreme tiredness, muscle aches, swollen lymph glands), then at least two weeks should probably be allowed before you resume intensive training.

STAYING IN SHAPE TO EXERCISE

For athletes who are training intensely for competition, the following guidelines can help reduce their odds of getting sick.

- Eat a well-balanced diet. The immune system depends on many vitamins and minerals for optimal function. However, at this time, there is no good data to support supplementation beyond 100 percent of the Recommended Dietary Allowances.
- 2 Avoid rapid weight loss. Low-calorie diets, long-term fasting and rapid weight loss have been shown to impair immune function. Losing weight while training heavily is not good for the immune system.
- Obtain adequate sleep. Major sleep 3 Obtain adequate steep., disruption (e.g., three hours less than normal) has been linked to immune suppression.
- Avoid overtraining and chronic fa-4 tigue. Space vigorous workouts and race events as far apart as possible. Keep "within yourself" and don't push beyond your ability to recover.

What's that Quarter Pounder Worth to You?

Ever wonder why it's so easy to gain 10 pounds and so hard to lose 10 pounds? How can something called a Quarter Pounder add 5 pounds to my hips? If a Krispy Kreme donut is traveling at 15 mph, how long does it take to reach my butt? These are the questions that keep me up at night. (Well, not really.)

During our summer vacation, my husband and I took the kids to the Houston Museum of Natural Science, a great way to spend a rainy, hot afternoon in Houston. Part of our tour included a hands-on science lesson by a Bill Nye wannabe. The kids loved the interactive experiments, but I was completely shocked by one that compared the density of Pepsi vs. Diet Pepsi. Did you know that a can of Diet Pepsi will float in water but a can of Pepsi will sink? Do you know why? It's that 12 teaspoons of sugar that weigh it down! 12 teaspoons! In one can! Put 12 teaspoons of sugar in a juice glass and tell me you're not impressed by that.

So, being the Coke lover that I am, I started wondering how many sit-ups it would take me to earn a single can of Coke. That would be 420. Yikes! That's like a month's worth of sit-ups for me! I could also rid myself of the Coke calories by jogging – for about 20 minutes. Or walking for about 40 minutes. All for one lousy can of Coke.

And if a can of Coke can do that to me, what about a plate of chicken fajitas? Turns out that those fajitas at Pappasitos with rice and beans and 2 tortillas (no sour cream or cheese) pack in a whopping 1150 calories! (That's like 8 cans of Coke, if you're still counting.) Prozac, Zoloft or Vitamin D3 deficient?

Sick all the time? Sad? Depressed? Low energy? Just don't feel D can help prevent such conditions as: well? Hurt all over? Low motivation? Lack of Focus?

Your body may be deficient in anti-depressants, highly unlikely, or you may be deficient in vitamin D3.

"Inadequate vitamin D status is an important public health problem, which could be readily addressed by adequate vitamin D intake or sunlight exposure" (Am J Clin Nutr 1997:66:929-36)

There is an epidemic of depression in the country. Can we all be depressed? Probably not. Studies have shown that vitamin D deficiency can cause low mood and moderate depression like symptoms. Think about how depressed people in colder climates become in the winter months. Indoor tanning has become a huge industry in the Northern and Midwest states because it makes people "feel good."

We need Vitamin D, specifically in the D3 form for multiple normal functions of the body such as:

- · Normal Thyroid Function
- Normal bone and cartilage mineralization
- To absorb and maintain Calcium levels
- Normal Blood Clotting
- Normal Heart Action
- Healthy skin integrity

Vitamin D3 can be considered both a vitamin and a hormone due to where it is produced and released. Therapeutic doses of Vitamin

- Polycystic Ovary Syndrome
- Peripheral Neuropathy
- Lupus (SLE)
- Fibromyalgia
- Depression
- Autoimmune Disorders

"The significant role of Vitamin D compounds as selective immunosuppressants is illustrated by their ability to either prevent or markedly suppress animal models of autoimmune disease". (FASEB J 2001 Dec:15(14):2579-85).

In Norway there is a high incidence of MS, an autoimmune disorder, inland. But a low to zero incidence on the coast. This could be explained by the abundance of vitamin D-rich fish on the coast and the native consumption if it. Coincidence? In Switzerland, there is a high incidence of MS at low elevation, but a low incidence at high elevation. Coincidence that in low elevation the sun exposure is close to zero?

With the fear of skin cancer and wrinkles we are in the sun less and less these days. And when we are, we a lathered up with chemical based-toxin containing sun screen, blocking vitamin D absorption.

So, how do we achieve normal and/or therapeutic levels of Vita-

min D3? Let's start with nature. Spend 15 minutes in the sun 2-3 times per week without a sun block. As we said, low light climates can dampen Vitamin D levels. This emphasizes an important point: optimal functioning of the skin, liver, and kidney are necessary for metabolism efficiency.

Unable to swing that? Try adding it to your diet through foods high in vitamin D such as organic egg yolks, fish and liver. You will need to eat 3 to 4 servings of each per week to achieve the needed 400-600 IU per day. Most of us don't eat, nor want to eat the foods rich in D so supplementation of D3 can be used.

Supplementation is absolutely needed when treating conditions present from depletion. But be careful where your vitamin D supplement is coming from. Unfortunately, like in anything else, you get what you pay for. Most over the counter products are in such low doses and poor content you won't absorb it well enough to feel a difference. The D3 we carry in the office is the highest quality and purest form on the market.

So, eat more fish - play in the sun - take your Vitamin D3 and feel good!


Follow Our Top 10 Ways To Save Gas!

If you are serious about saving more gas, it is important to understand that you will see the largest savings when you practice a combination of proper car care and smart driving behaviors. An aggressive attack plan can save you hundreds of dollars per year in fuel.

- 1) Drive fewer miles: Combine errands, carpool when possible, eliminate unnecessary trips. The average vehicle uses a gallon of fuel for every 20 miles driven. A few thousand less miles per year adds up to big money!
- 2) Correct tire pressure: This one has gotten a lot of press recently, but improper tire pressure can cost 3% in fuel economy.
- 3) Replace dirty air filters: Replacing your air filter every 12,000 miles will save up to 10% fuel.
- 4) Pay attention to the Orange engine light: This light warns you when something is wrong in your fuel or emission system. A faulty Oxygen sensor or fuel injector can waste 35% more fuel and increase the harmful pollutants you vehicle emits.
- 5) Check the gas cap: 147 million gallons of gas vaporizes annually in the U.S. due to loose gas caps.
- 6) Avoid jack-rabbit starts: The key to good fuel economy is smooth starts and stops. Driving like a grandma may not be fun, but it will raise your fuel mileage by up to 33%.

- 7) Slow down: Every 5 miles per hour over 60 mph is like paying an additional .26 cents per gallon for gas.
- 8) Remove excess weight: Every 100 pounds of weight reduces your mpg by 2%.
- 9) Change to synthetic motor oil: Reduces friction and increases fuel mileage by 2%
- 10) Inspect brakes Dragging brakes can seriously decrease fuel mileage.

Protecting Your Children on the Internet

Just as we try to protect our children from bullies and predators on the streets, as parents we need to be doing the same when it comes to the Internet. Before the internet much of our socialization was done on the telephone. We would talk on and on while our parents were telling us to get off the phone. But with the advent of the Internet has come online chat as well as popular social networking sites such as MySpace and FaceBook, which have provided a totally new way for kids to socialize but at the same time exposed them to a new world of dangers. There is no need however to panic, as there are steps you can take to greatly reduce any risks.

First, talk to your kids. There is no software or hardware that will better protect your children than you. Keep computers out of children's bedrooms and in a public area of the home. Kids should not be talking to people online that they don't know in person. They should enhancing existing relationships, not creating new ones online. Never should your child give out personal information such as a phone number, address, birthday, school, etc.

Netsmartz.org is a fabulous site run by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children; they have lots of material for both parents and kids from K – High School. An excellent tool is their "Internet Safety Pledge" that you and your child can read together and sign as an agreement between you. For younger kids there are

kid-safe web browsers such as "MyKidsBrowser" and "Kidzui". There are tools such as NetNanny and CyberSitter that can be installed on a computer to limit what programs can be run and what sites can be visited (be advised that clever teens seem to figure ways around them). OpenDNS is a free service that you can use to transparently control access for all computers in your home (though it does require a little technical knowledge to fully implement).

You tell your children not to talk to strangers and never get into a car with a stranger, using the same caution regarding strangers on the internet is a great first step in allowing your kids to enjoy the richness the Internet has to offer while minimizing the risks.

House plants look pretty, fill empty spaces on the floor, and reduce stress. That's right, reduce stress. Being close to house plants makes us feel good. House plants reduce heart rate, blood pressure, and help with skin conductivity. Research has shown that people in planted offices recover from stress more quickly than those in un-planted offices.

No, the nursery with the pink flamingos around the corner from my office did not pay me to write this! It's true, the effect is seen more significantly in situations where the tasks being performed are repetitive or require only low levels of concentration by improving the air quality and people's perception of the building.

Think about it, humans were made to be outside in the woods or jungle, not inside of a cubicle with florescent lighting for eight hours. So, plants in the office help remind our cells there is life outside the four walls of our office.

Plants also give employees a sense of nurturing and caring, and is a highly interactive and a satisfying experience as it relates to our innate desire to take care of something else living.


A number of studies also show plants can reduce the incidence of minor health complaints. Planted buildings have less airborne dust and increased humidity and static electricity. This is mainly because

plants are slightly negatively charged compared with their surroundings. This attracts positivity charged dust particles and reduces the number in the air and on the surrounding surfaces.

A Norwegian study, after plants were installed in the trail office, the staff complaints about:

- *fatigue was reduced by 30%
- *dry throats were reduced by 30%
- *headaches were reduced by 25%
- *coughing was decreased by 40%
- *skin irritations were reduced by 25%

So go out and buy a beautiful fern, a prayer plant, or a begonia today and feel better in your office!

1/3 cup chopped fresh sage leaves

1/4 cup fresh rosemary leaves

3 tablespoons fresh thyme leaves

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon pepper

1/3 cup plus 1/2 cup olive oil
Additional stems rosemary, thyme and sage

Heat oven to 325° F. Remove giblets and neck from turkey; discard or save for broth, if desired. Rinse cavity of turkey and pat dry. Sprinkle inside of turkey with salt and pepper. Place onion, celery, carrot and, if desired, 1 to 2 stems each of sage, rosemary and thyme inside turkey. Place turkey on rack in roasting pan; set aside.

In food processor or blender, chop garlic until fine. Add herbs; pulse until coarsely chopped. Add salt and pepper. With machine running, add 1/3 cup olive oil; process until well blended.


Carefully separate (but do not remove) the skin from meat on breast of turkey. Rub 2 tablespoons olive oil mixture between meat and skin. Replace skin. If desired, add 1 cup water or broth to pan under rack. Roast turkey 1 hour.

Meanwhile, blend remaining 1/2 cup olive oil into remaining herb mixture. If desired, bundle remaining fresh herb stems together to form "basting brush." After 1 hour of roasting, baste turkey with part of herb mixture.

Continue roasting $2\frac{1}{2}$ to $3\frac{1}{4}$ hours or until internal temperature of thickest part of thigh is 170° F and juices run clear, basting every 1 hour. If necessary, cover breast of turkey with foil to prevent overbrowning during roasting. Cover loosely; let stand 10 to 15 minutes before carving.


