Attention Fairfield Homeowners

Cy-Fair Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

Cy-Fair CERT now has over 200 team members in your neigh-borhood. The team members are not only from Fairfield/Cypress area, but Alief, Katy, Bear Creek, Copperfield, Tomball, and Sugarland. More trained CERT members will be needed in each of these areas to form neighborhood teams.

CERT training is designed to prepare you to help yourself, your family, and your neighbors in the event of a catastrophic disaster. Because emergency services personnel will not be able to help every—one immediately, you can make a difference by using this training to save lives and protect property. For example, during and after Hurricane Ike members of the Cy-Fair CERT volunteered at the phone bank of the Harris County Office of Emergency Management, manned the federal PODs all over the county, distributed Meals on Wheels food, cleared debris in their communities, etc.

The 8-week course (24 hours of training) covers basic skills that are important to know in a disaster when emergency services are not available. You are taught skills about disaster preparedness, small fire suppression, urban search & rescue, medical operations

and more. With training, practice and working as a team you will be able to do the greatest good for the greatest number of people after a disaster, while protecting yourself from becoming a victim.

In 2003, President Bush asked Americans to volunteer to serve oth¬ers. The Harris County Citizen Corps www. harriscountycitizencorps.com was created to help our citizens find volunteer and training opportunities. CERT training is just one of the programs created.

CERT training courses are provided throughout Harris County. There is no cost for this course. A backpack of emergency/medical supplies is provided to all CERT team members during training. This program is brought to you by Harris County Judge Emmett. The next CERT training class for the Cy-Fair area will begin on April 1, 2009 at the Lone Star College (Barker-Cypress campus).



BRADFORD CREEK BOARD OF DIRECTORS NEWS

Spring! Here we are again waiting to hear the first crack of the bat against the ball at one of Fairfield's wonderfully maintained ball fields. Although we cannot take credit for that effort, we do appreciate the work of the Fairfield Village Assn., the Sports Assn, and other neighborhood Boards who collectively strive to make Fairfield "The Place" to live.

Your Bradford Creek Board attempts to keep in touch with concerns from all over Fairfield but our primary mission is to run the business of Bradford Creek Neighborhood, Assn., Inc. – a neighborhood of 1177 homes with an annual budget in excess of \$443,000. Our association is currently the largest in Fairfield with a long list of assets to maintain for the enjoyment of our residents and, for that matter, all of Fairfield residents since the amenities we maintain are mutually inclusive.

This spring we completed repairs from IKE damage by replacing several trees lost during the storm. Also, we have ordered a new swing set for our Clubhouse play area (paid for partially by MUD 354) and will move to separate the pre-school and school age children play areas. This effort is in accordance with the U.S, Consumer Product Safety Commission – Public Playground Safety Handbook. Additionally, we are moving forward with the planned replacement of one of the pocket park swing sets and revising some of the park bench seating.

The replacement of the pocket park swing set presented us with a dilemma. In order to comply with

CPSC guidelines we cannot mix strap swings with toddler swings in the same bay. Therefore, the pocket park at the intersection of Golden Sycamore and Ochre Park will have two strap swings. As we replace other pocket park swing sets we will attempt to balance the mix of swing types such that parents of toddlers will have a spot to take the little folks for some fun.

It should be noted that the cost of the items mentioned above will be covered from our reserve account. The reserve account accumulates budgeted monies contributed each year to fund long range, high cost, capitol replacement items.

In closing let us state that we are concerned as much as any Fairfield resident about matters that globally affect our subdivision. We attempt to keep our finger on the pulse of our community and provide input to the proper authority in a timely fashion. In this column, we attempt to communicate mainly to the residents of Bradford Creek since we are accountable to them in our positions. We sincerely hope that Bradford Creek residents are satisfied with our stewardship of their neighborhood association. All residents are cordially invited to attend Board meetings or to contact any of us via e-mail or telephone as listed inside the front page of this gazette.



Curbside Trees

The appearance of your trees at the sidewalk at your home is vital to the overall appearance of your community. The trees are part of the overall plan of development and it is each homeowner's responsibility to ensure the trees are trimmed on a regular basis. Many trees have branches hanging over the street, brushing the tops of vehicles and some are even blocking stop signs. For the benefit of all the Fairfield residents, and the overall appearance of your neighborhood, please check your trees and if necessary, raise the canopy (should be 12-14 ft. from the street), remove dead branches,

and shape the tree.

Regrettably, should you chose not to do this, the County has the authority to trim them back and will not take the time to groom them properly.

We have been informed that some homeowners have been tossing their tree limbs, clippings, fence debris, etc. over their fence onto the common area. Doing this creates an additional cost that every homeowner pays to the contractor for the removal. Please understand that any homeowner seen throwing their debris, etc., over the fence onto any common area will be charged for removing the debris. Please dispose of your clippings and debris in the appropriate manner.



Dear Homeowners,

The maintenance fees for the Fairfield neighborhoods are past due and headed into legal collection. The legal fees are very expensive.... please do not ignore our collection letters! Your Boards of Directors are willing to accept reasonable payment plans if payment is made every 30 days.

All homes in Fairfield have 2 assessments – the individual neighborhoods which were due January 1, 2009 and the Fairfield Village CA assessment which is due July 1, 2009. The 09/10 fee will be set this spring after budget review in April. If you would like to send in payments in advance for this assessment please do so – whatever works for your budget! We have homeowners who use automatic bill pay to send in payments each month for their estimated assessments. Please understand that your individual neighborhood and Fairfield Village CA are two different entities – therefore checks must be made out to the Association that you wish the payment applied to.


Crime prevention doesn't always have to be done solely by the police. Vigilant residents can also help.

I was in my car, waiting at a traffic light the other day when I noticed a sign in the rear window of a small car that was sitting in the lane beside me. At first glance, the sign was illegible because the words were backwards. The sticker had been applied on the inside of the window rather than the outside, as it was designed to be displayed. But as I focused in on the words more closely and read in reverse, I realized that the sign read, "God is Always Good."

For a moment, I wondered why the petite, middle-aged woman driving the car would have applied the sticker improperly. Surely she recognized that other drivers would have a difficult time reading the awkwardly displayed sign. But as I gave the scenario more thought, I realized that the woman hadn't applied that sign to her window for other drivers. She had displayed the sign there for herself. It was positioned slightly off center so that it could be seen (and easily read) every time she glanced into her rearview mirror.

I felt an immediately sense of kinship with this unknown woman. I too have experienced seasons in my life when I needed visual reminders of God's goodness amidst circumstances that were exhausting or deeply painful. There have been times when I've written Scriptures that speak of God's faithfulness on my hands, on my vanity mirror, or even taped to the dashboard of my car. Passages like, Know


therefore that the Lord your God is God; He is the faithful God, keeping His covenant of love to a thousand generations of those who love Him and keep His commands (Deuteronomy 7:9) have helped focus my thoughts on God's goodness when my circumstances were not so good.

As the traffic light changed from red to green and we drove in different directions, I lifted up a prayer for this mysterious woman who chooses to keep God's goodness ever present in her rearview mirror. I would imagine her focus on the goodness of our God will give her the strength she needs to make her way through whatever challenges lay ahead for her.

You may not want to paste a sign on the rear window of your car, but during seasons of disappointment or trial, I challenge you to write passages that speak of God's goodness and faithfulness in prominent places in your home, your car, or your workplace. You'll find strength and courage for whatever the road of life may bring.

Harvest Bible Church

Lest you be wise in your own sight, I want you to understand this mystery, brothers: a partial hardening has come upon Israel until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in. And thus, all Israel will be saved... (Romans 11:25)

Having already warned the Christians in Rome against boasting (11:18) and arrogance (11:20), the Apostle Paul now warns them against being "wise" in their own eyes, for arrogance blinds us to the truth. Paul's revelation of God's "mystery" will be key to understanding truth.

In the New Testament "mystery" denotes something unknown in the past which is now made known. As Colossians 2:2 and 4:3 say, "in Christ are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge." Therefore, the mystery Paul speaks of concerns matters relating to Jesus Christ.

Now the mystery the Apostle revealed is threefold. First, that Israel has experienced a "partial" hardening by God. Their hardening pertains to their spiritual dullness like a veil that keeps them from understanding the Old Testament as it has revealed Jesus as the Christ (cf. 2 Cor. 3:14). This partial hardening means that not all Jews have experienced it, for some truly did believe in Jesus as the Messiah unto salvation. This hardening, however, will not last forever, for the second revelation of the "mystery" is that Gentiles

will continue to trust in Christ while Israel is partially hardened. And when the full number of elect Gentiles – "the fullness of the Gentiles has come in" – Israel's hardening will be turned to softening. In other words, Gentiles will continue to hear and respond to the gospel until such a time as their "fullness" is realized. At that point the third portion of the mystery will come to pass, namely that "all Israel will be saved."

The phrase "all Israel" is a designation of the nation as a whole at the end of time, not necessarily to include every single Israelite. Though Jewish Christians are a minority now, there will be a multitude of them in the future compared to the present. This fits with the climactic character of Romans 11, namely that God has not rejected His people Israel (11:1). So, when God saves "all Israel" in the end-times this will finally reveal how faithful God has been to fulfill all of His promises to Israel as a nation of people. The saved remnant, however, though large, will still only qualify as a small group as compared to the nation throughout the centuries that became like the sand on the seashore (cf. Isa. 10:22-23; Rom. 9:27).

Israel's salvation is certain to occur, for God will accomplish it. In fact, it is already achieved, for God foreknew Israel (Rom. 11:2), and those whom God foreknew he also predestined, called, justified, and glorified (Rom. 8:28-30). All of these past tense verbs mean that God completed all of that which His prophets promised He would do long before the world was ever even created!

What Paul wanted the Jews and Gentiles in Rome to know was that God's promises were in the process of being fulfilled. That message is also one that needs to be conveyed today, for God's eternal plan is continuing to unfold – an unfolding that was ordained from the beginning. God has not abandoned Israel in favor of Gentiles, and He is not going to abandon the Gentiles for Israel in the end. God's "mystery" plan is to save both Jews and Gentiles in order to make them into one new humanity in Christ built upon the Scriptures (Eph. 2:11-22). This worldview is essential to understanding what God is doing and to keep us all from looking down at others.

Healthier Homes - Spring Cleaning

It is that time of year again to begin spring cleaning and getting the house freshened up. When cleaning its important that you clean safe. Cleaners that contain disinfectants either serve as antiseptics or sanitizers. Antiseptics disinfect skin and mucous membranes and are less harsh than sanitizers that disinfect inanimate surfaces. Their purpose is to kill bacteria, protozoa and fungi. They are antimicrobial.

There are three main types of disinfectants:

- 1. Phenols found in Lysol
- 2. Halogenated compounds such as bleach and chloramines found in drinking water
- 3. Quaternary ammonium salts found in detergents

Disinfectants are regulated by federal law because they are the form of pesticide that people are exposed to the most. They have an impact on indoor air quality in the home that can be detrimental to human health. The "smell of clean" is not necessarily a good thing...rather it is often the sign that toxic chemicals are being released into the air. The "smell of clean" should have no smell like fresh, outdoor air. Once these antimicrobials are rinsed down the drain they can accumulate in aquatic environments and end up in waste water treatment plants.

The National Association of Clean Water Agencies (NACWA) is concerned that the disinfectants in the wastewater could harm

microbes in activated sludge which is a biological process that treatment plants use to clean up wastewater. Some healthier disinfectant options are to use hydrogen peroxide 3% in a spray bottle (wipe down) followed by vinegar in a spray bottle (wipe down). Another alternative is Borax or a borax spray made by mixing 2 tablespoons of borax with ¼ cup of lemon juice and 2 cups of hot water in a spray bottle and use as any commercial all-purpose cleaner. This will not have the detrimental impact on indoor air quality and on wastewater that is rinsed down the drain.

Remember, no legal requirements exist for listing ingredients on the labels of household cleaning products. Many companies voluntarily provide Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) for products but they can be incomplete. These MSDS sheets do not list carrier chemicals such as phthalates which you have heard a lot about in the news lately nor do they specify fragrances.

It is time to consider spring cleaning a healthier way!

Sustainable Living Houston **Kicks off National Bike Month!**

On Friday, May 1, 2009, residents of Cypress, Texas, will bicycle from the Coles Crossing subdivision to the nearby METRO Park & Ride and transit oriented development. The rain date for this ride is May 15, 2009.

There will be a highly recommended preride safety briefing at the Coles Crossing Community Center parking lot on April 25th at 8:00 a.m. where helmets, lighting, bike commuter clothing, and vehicular cycling will be discussed, as well as a test ride of the route. This briefing will be led by a League of American Bicyclist certified cycling instructor.





What's at Stake?

The Health of Your Trees

Most of us have trees in our front yards that were provided by our home builders. Did you know that the stakes supporting these trees need to be removed within the first year? This

is because stakes provide artificial support that replaces a supportive trunk and root system.

Movement of the trunk helps strengthen the tree by thickening it and giving it taper from bottom to top. Trunk movement also stimulates root growth. The artificial support from the stakes leaves tree trunks weak and their root systems less developed.

Bottom line - all staking material needs to be removed after roots have established. This can be as early as a few months, but should be no longer than one growing season.

Alternatives to Microsoft Office

Anyone who works in an office and with a computer probably has Microsoft Office installed on it. Word, PowerPoint and Excel and found in almost every corporate environment. But when it comes time to buy software for your home computer, most people don't realize there are free and low-cost alternative.

To start, Microsoft does offer an Office 2007 "Home and Student" edition that I've seen online for as low at \$80. This edition includes Word, PowerPoint, Excel and OneNote, but not Outlook, which is what many Office users expect with their "office" suite.

The most popular free option is probably Sun's Open Office 3 (available at www.openoffice.org) It has powerful word processing, presentation and spreadsheet programs that are compatible with Microsoft Office, and also includes a graphics program and database (but again, no e-mail program.)

Another free alternative is a surprising name from the past. Lotus (owned by IBM) has resurrected its Symphony suite and is closer to Open Office that Microsoft Office. Its programs are IBM Lotus Symphony Documents, IBM Lotus Symphony Presentations and IBM Lotus Symphony Spreadsheets and also offer Microsoft Office compatibility.

Google has recently entered the office application fray with their own product (which are still in "beta" – a Google trademark), Google Docs. It offers Microsoft Office compatibility for Word and Excel with a twist, everything is stored online. You can access and share your files with anyone from anywhere. Some consider this the future, known as "cloud computing" (the internet is the cloud in computer network diagrams.)

Corel offers an \$89 alternative that is compatible with Office Word, PowerPoint and Excel, but includes VideoStudio LE for editing your home videos, and MediaOne SE for enhancing and organizing your photos.

At the time of this writing, the most popular (non-Microsoft) email client, Eudora is undergoing a rewrite but the older versions are still available at www.eudora.com. If you're already using hotmail, yahoo mail, Gmail, or your Internet Service Provider's (ISP) web-based mail, then you don't need an e-mail client to run on your computer anyway.

So don't automatically feel like you have to fork out a couple hundred dollars just to have Office functionality at home. There are affordable and even FREE alternatives out there for you.
