It's Almost That Time Again.....

Village Creek gears up for the summer

As the days get hotter one question is on the tip of every child in Village Creek's tongue. When is the pool going to open? Well, the wait is almost over the community pool and splash pad will be open from Memorial Day until Labor Day from 10 am until 8 pm every day of the week except Mondays. However, some changes have been made at the entrance gates and residents will be issued new pool cards.

The new cards can be picked up at the pool on April 4 and April 18 from 9 am until 11 am or any Saturday in May from 9 am until noon. The cards will not be distributed via mail or delivered to residents' homes. One adult from each household must show up with last year's pool card, and they will be issued one new card per household. If you do not have last year's card a \$30 cash fee will be charged. Residents must be in "good standing" to have new pool cards activated. That is, they must not have an outstanding balance with the Community Association. To inquire about your standing you may contact Chaparral Mgmt at 281-537-0957 or email poolcards@myvillagecreek.net.

Also, new this year residents may book the pool for parties. A \$250 refundable deposit will be charged as well as other fees associated with the party. There is a 20 person (swimmers and non-swimmers) limit and parties will not exceed 2 hours or be booked on holidays. Also, no music will be allowed at the party as a courtesy to those who live near

Remember while enjoying the facilities this summer to always observe the rules. All pool rules apply to the splash pad and the lifeguard has the final say. Each household may bring up to four guests with them, and families are welcome to bring lawn chairs to the splash pad as seating is limited. Also, no pets are allowed within the gated pool and splash pad area.

With all the buzz about the new splash pad many residents have been wondering what is to become of the old one. The HOA is researching options and would welcome any suggestions. Just email ideas to any board member. Their email addresses may be found on page 2 of newsletter in the Important Numbers box. Some of the suggestions being considered include an outdoor volleyball court or adult exercise area, skateboard park, family gathering area with additional picnic tables, playground, or a dog park. Sustainable Living Houston Kicks off National Bike Month!

On Friday, May 1, 2009, residents of Cypress, Texas, will bicycle from the Coles Crossing subdivision to the nearby METRO Park & Ride and transit oriented development. By riding bikes to the Park & Ride, and then taking the #217 METRO bus to their work locations, the residents will complete a long-haul, suburb-to-city multi-modal commute without the use of private automobiles.

METRO has recently installed bike racks at the Cypress Park & Ride, and these will be used to secure the bicycles. There is also limited space for taking a few bikes in the sub-floor storage compartments of the # 217 buses.


Residents will assemble at 6:50 am on Friday, May 1, 2009 at the Coles Crossing Community Center parking lot and depart at 7:00 am sharp. Use of helmets, front & rear lights, red rear reflectors and articles of reflective clothing will be mandatory. Residents will ride on the sidewalk south on Barker-Cypress Rd. to Jarvis Rd., whereupon the group will transition to riding on Jarvis Rd. in a vehicular cycling mode. The total ride distance

will be about a mile each way, and the time to the Park & Ride from the neighborhood will be about 6 minutes.


The rain date for this ride is May 15, 2009.

There will be a highly recommended pre-ride safety briefing at the Coles Crossing Community Center parking lot on April 25th at 8:00 a.m. where helmets, lighting, bike commuter

clothing, and vehicular cycling will be discussed, as well as a test ride of the route. This briefing will be led by a League of American Bicyclist certified cycling instructor.







Constable's Corner

Harris County seems to be plagued with traffic accidents. On a daily basis, the police respond to numerous traffic accidents. Most of them are minor fender benders but some send people to the hospital or worse. North Harris County is "no longer out side of the city" and traffic congestion continues to grow.

There are numerous traffic violations that play part in the cause of traffic accidents. Here are just a few that police see on a regular basis. All of these violations are listed in the Texas Transportation Code.

- 1. Following Distance-Always maintain a safe distance between your vehicle and the vehicle that precedes yours. If you run into the back of another vehicle, you were too close regardless of your speed or traffic conditions.
- 2. <u>Disregard Traffic Control Device (Traffic Light/ Stop Sign)</u> You can enter an intersection when the light is yellow. If the light is red prior to entering the intersection, you must stop. A vehicle must come to a complete stop at a Stop Sign. Officers look to see if the tires come to a complete stop.
- 3. Fail To Yield Right of Way- Private Drive- This is when a vehicle pulls out of a business parking onto the roadway and gets struck

by a vehicle on the roadway. All vehicles on the roadway have the right of way.

- <u>4. Changing Lanes When Unsafe-</u> Always check your mirrors and look over your shoulder when changing lanes.
- 5. Racing on Highway (Drag Racing) The younger drivers tend to do this. This is very dangerous. Please educate the younger drivers to prevent them getting involved in this type of activity. Racing is also an arrestable offense- Class B Misdemeanor.

In the event of a traffic accident, call the police and/or EMS . If you choose to ex-change accident information with the driver of the other vehicle involved without calling the police, the police will not complete an accident report a later time. Police must respond to the scene of the accident in order to complete an accident report.
