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New Elementary School Boundary Issue Submitted by Jamie Casaday

AISD is building a new public elementary school in the Meridian development south of Texas 45 and east of 1826 that is supposed to open in Fall 2010. This school will relieve overcrowding at Clayton,

where Granada Hills and neighboring areas are currently zoned.

Everyone in the neighborhood should be aware of the school boundary changes coming. Proximity and quality of a neighborhood's public schools affects all of us via enhanced or degraded property values, not merely parents of public elementary school students.

I think it is important for our neighborhood to have a somewhat unified voice in the upcoming school boundary change process that starts this August. The Circle C HOA has an active Education Committee that fought

ferociously and victoriously during the recent (and bitterly contested) middle school boundary changes. They have many dedicated people willing to put in a lot of time and energy to get what they want. We can expect their battle-hardened veterans to be very involved in



the Clayton/Meridian boundary change. During the middle school fight Circle C's interests aligned with Granada Hills', but we should NOT expect that this time around.

It is highly likely that our neighborhood will be zoned differently when the new school opens, unless we decide to voice our opinion. While I expect that the new school will be of high quality, my concern is that it will be even further away from our neighborhood than Clayton. In fact, there are five elementary schools closer to our neighborhood than the new school will be. (These are, in general order from closest to furthest away, Mills, Oak Hill, Kiker, Clayton, and Patton, although the exact ordering varies slightly depending upon where exactly you start from.)

Of Clayton's nearly 1,000 students, only about 300 students live outside of the immediate area of the school, which includes the entire Meridian neighborhood and all the neighborhoods west of FM 1826. The vast majority of Clayton students (about 70%) live (Continued on page 5)

in Circle C and closer to Clayton than they do to the new school. The general feeling from these families is that they ALL expect to remain at Clayton. Since that will not be possible, we can be certain they will oppose moving more Circle C families to the new school so that some of "outside" 30% can remain at Clayton.

If you think that Granada Hills, as a neighborhood, should be involved in a somewhat unified way in these boundary discussions, please e-mail me at schools@markschulze.net and I will report back to the Granada HOA email list about the level of interest in the community. Together we'll take the next steps in organizing based on how much interest is shown. Regardless of any neighborhood organization that we may develop, I encourage you all to monitor the situation and express your opinions to school and district authorities.

Granada Hills & Estates HAVE YOU SEEN THE BLUEBONNETS AT THE CORNER?

Several years ago while walking in the neighborhood I harvested Bluebonnet seeds from many, many locations in Granada Hills. At the time the flower bed at El Rey and Espanola was just being developed and I must have thrown well over one hundred seeds in that bed. Many harvested right here in the neighborhood and some I bought at the "Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center" and last year one plant came up. I just wonder where all those other seeds went! I hope they came up in your yard. All last summer and this past winter I kept an eye on that corner and no sight of a single Bluebonnet, until one day in February scattered between the rocks a Bluebonnet plant popped up, I was so excited I could hardly speak. As the weeks went on I would check the corner regularly and more and more plants were appearing, I quickly weeded the area and prayed that they

would survive, and they have!!!! Every day or so I either walk by or drive by and can not believer my eyes, there are masses of flowers, just think they will go to seed and throw their seeds and next year, with a little luck, the corner will welcome Spring with those sweet little flowers among the rocks.

For your pleasure by the pool we have planted the flower pots with some interesting plants for this summer season. One is a Dieleptra Mexicana (Hummingbird bush) it was recommended to me by the lady at Geo Growers just down 290. Also, planted in the pots are Plumbago Auriculata that will bloom all summer with lovely blue flowers, and Melampodium Leaucanthum otherwise known as Black Foot Daisies. All of these plants should be spectacular once the swim season begins. I hope we attract lots of hummingbirds and butterflies. Last but not least a big thank you to Elizabeth Keller and Julie Clark for a donation of plants for the park. Both were thinning out flower beds and were kind enough to share with the park. THANK YOU ELIZABETH AND JULIE, things are more beautiful for you thoughtfulness.

- Single Person must make under 75k, married under 150k, (If income is slightly over, then partial tax credit is possible)



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
