I do not yet know the names of the new Deputies but will let you know. Deputy Polk and Goforth will be missed. They have done an excellent job of keeping our community safe.

Our "New Sheriff's in Town" deemed that contracts should be on a bid basis to Deputies that have the most seniority even if they are not already a part of our District V. He also has implemented other new rules that do not make much sense to me. One is eliminating the BARS division (the Burglary unit) and assigning those investigations to the already overworked detectives in other units.

He stated that he wanted to rid "The Good Ole Boys network" but quickly appointed his "Good Ole Boys" to the Sheriff's Office and promoted other "Good Ole Boys". Maybe this will be remembered when the next election comes around.

Be sure to get acquainted with our new Deputies. Stop them and say "Hi" and make them feel welcomed in our community. We do have a special community in that we are getting to know our neighbors and are concerned about what happens in it. We have been fortunate to have a very low incident of any real crime but have mostly vandalism by teenagers that live in or out of our area.

Wortham Villages Community Association, Inc.

- 1. Proper swim attire must be worn to be admitted to the pool.
- 2. Only Wortham Village residents and their guests will be allowed to use the pool. Residents must accompany guests. Residents are allowed four (4) guests with each adult pool tag (this does not include children 10 15 years old). Under this guest policy, there must be one adult for every two kids under 12 years of age. No Wortham resident under the age of 18 is allowed to bring a guest.
- 3. Pool passes will be strictly enforced. It is the resident's responsibility to bring to the pool. It is very awkward and uncomfortable situation for everyone when the lifeguard must ask a member to go back home and get his or her tag.
- 4. Lifeguards are employed to insure the safety of swimmers, and they have the authority to remove from the pool area anyone disobeying the rules and/or endangering the safety of themselves or another person.
- 5. There will be a 10 minute break each hour. During this time the pool will be cleared with the exception of persons who are eighteen (18) years of age and older.
- 6. The following activities and items are not allowed:
 - Running or rough-housing
 - Skates, bicycles or skateboards

- Glass containers and/or alcoholic beverages
- Littering
- Cooking
- Loud music
- Pets
- Cutoffs
- Loud, abusive or foul language
- Cocoa butter, baby oil or other heavy suntan oil
- 7. Flotation items for swimming pool are allowed, but are restricted to small size tubes and floats.
- 8. Diving Rules:
 - No diving in the shallow end
 - No swimming in the deep end while the boards are open for diving
 - Only one person on the diving board at all times
 - Divers must jump straight out and not towards the sides
 - Divers must wait for person in front of them to get to the side before diving
- 9. Any child nine (9) years or under must be accompanied by said

child's parents or person eighteen 18 years old or older. Children 10 - 15 years of age may swim without adult supervision after passing a swim test and received pool tags.

10 Baby Pool Rules:

- Only non-swimming toddlers 5 years and under may use the baby pool.
- Parents, not lifeguards, are responsible for children in baby pool.
- Any child not potty-trained must wear rubber pants with elasticized waist and legs over disposable diapers when in the water.
- 11 Trespassers and vandals will be prosecuted.
- 12. Parents are responsible for their children and guests at the pool. Parents must closely supervise their children at all times. The lifeguards will always enforce pool rules throughout the facility, but children who cannot swim must have an adult (18 or older) within arms reach at all times. The same rule applies even if the child is wearing a flotation device.





HEALTHIER HOMES

We are constantly reading labels because we believe that the product information listed will inform us as to whether the product is healthy for our home and family. Listed below are three best selling products. Each product is manufactured by U.S. companies with both domestic and international sales up to one billion dollars annually. One tends to believe that what is printed on the product label is what truly is in the product. However, many times there are toxic chemicals within that are not listed.

PRODUCT #1 – PLUG IN AIR FRESHENER Printed on the label: No ingredients listed

Laboratory testing showed that the product actually contained: d-limonene, alpha-pinene, beta, pinene, ethanol, ethyl butanoate, ethyl acetate, 3-hexen-1-01, 1-butanol, 3 methyl-acetate, beta-phellandrene, acetaldehyde, benzaldehy, carene isomer, 1-methyl-3(1-methylethyl-cyclohexane, isopropyl alcohol, 1-butanol, 2-methyl-acetate, camphene, acetone, methyl butanoate, dimethyl ethyl cyclohexane, alpha-phellandrene

PRODUCT #2 - DRYER SHEET

Printed on the label: Biodegradable cationic softeners & perfumes

Laboratory testing showed that the product actually contained: linalool, ethanol, loenyl acetate, cls-rose oxide, carene isomer, 2, 4-dimethyl-3-cyclohexane, 1-carboxaldehyde, d-limonene, 3-methyl -2-buten-1-ol acetate, 2, 7-dimethyl-2, 7-octanediol, alpha-pinene, trans-rose oxide, eucalyptol, alpha-phenyl ethyl acetate, beta-pinene

PRODUCE #3 – SCENTED LIQUID DETERGENT ADDED TO THE LAUNDRY

Printed on the label: Ingredients include biodegradable surfactants (anionic and non-ionic) and enzymes.

Laboratory testing showed that the product actually contained: ethanol, d-limonene, 2-methyl-2 propoanol, 1, 4-dioxane, 3, 7-



dimethyl-1, 6-octadiene, ethyl acetate, alpha pinene, beta-pinene, 2-butanone, 1- methyl-3(1 methylethyl) – cyclohexene, 2, 4-dimethyl – 3-cyclohexene – 1-carboxaldehyde, undecane, beta-terpinene

There is an obvious difference between the chemicals identified in the laboratory study and the chemicals listed on the product labels. Several of the products emit Hazardous Air Pollutants which are harmful to human health. Currently there is not a United States Law requiring that consumer products or fragrance chemicals be fully disclosed even though they are main sources of toxic volatile organic compounds (VOC's). Regulation of consumer products other than food, drugs, cosmetics, tobacco and pesticides largely fall under the Consumer Product Safety Act (CPSA). The CPSA does not require disclosure of all ingredients in all products. This is troubling since ninety percent of total human exposure to VOC's come from small sources, close to us and within our control, but they are not listed on the labels. Shouldn't we be concerned?

2 Medium Granny Smith apples, cored and dicedGreen onions, sliced, including tops

½ Cup Dried cranberries or cherries

1/2 Cup Chopped celery
1/2 Cup Chopped pecans

DRESSING:

½ Cup	Mayonnaise
½ Cup	Sour cream

3 Tbsp Chopped Mexican mint marigold

(or 3 Tbsp fresh tarragon or 1 tsp dried)

1 Tbsp Tarragon wine vinegar

2 tsp Dijon mustard

1 tsp Beau Monde seasoning (by Spice Island)

Dash Tabasco Salt and pepper to taste

Mix chicken salad ingredients in a bowl; toss gently to combine. In a separate bowl, stir dressing ingredients together. Combine dressing with salad, adding enough dressing to bind salad. Chill and serve on leaf lettuce.
