



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

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## Developer's Corner August 2009

#### **Subdivision Development**

For the first time in many years, Taylor Woodrow Communities does not have any new lot development under construction. Builders are currently selling homes in all of the neighborhoods from 50' wide lots through 90' lots. Future phases of lots in the Bella Mar community should start construction later in 2009, depending upon home sales in the existing neighborhoods.

Custom lot sales continue in The Bluffs on south Quinlan Park Rd and Bellagio Estates on Lake Austin. For more information on these custom homesites and all other builder neighborhoods in Steiner Ranch you may contact the Welcome Center at 266-5833.

#### **Commercial/Mixed-Use Development**

Steiner Elementary School #3 – River Ridge – Construction is nearing completion for an August 2009 opening on the third Leander ISD elementary school in Steiner Ranch, located between the Tierra Grande and Monterrey neighborhoods and across Quinlan Park Rd from Sierra Vista. Please contact LISD if you have further questions about this new school.

Longhorn Village Retirement Community – The first residents should be moving into the new patio home units by July 2009 and the independent living apartment building with commons area and dining facilities should be ready for occupancy late Summer. In addition to the patio homes and independent living apartments, Longhorn Village will offer assisted living apartments and nursing care units, along with appropriate amenities. Longhorn Canyon Townhomes – Kemp Management has completed the first 8 of the 29 townhomes located along the 5th hole of the UT Golf Club course immediately across Quinlan Park Rd from the Towne Square Community Center. Fairways at Steiner Ranch – Colonial Bank currently owns this site along the 3rd through 6th holes of the UT Golf Club course. Over the past few months they have completed clearing and grading on the site, and have installed additional landscape buffering along

the golf course. We understand that the Bank is negotiating with a builder to be determined to build out the remainder of the 88 patio home units on this site. More information about the development and sales should be forthcoming in the near future.

Taylor Woodrow Communities continues to receive interest from various developers for the remaining mixed-use development sites in Steiner Ranch. Vintage Fine Homes has completed city/county site plan approvals to build approximately 20 patio homes on Tract #18 along Steiner Ranch Blvd. across from the Monterone apartments. With the slow down in the local housing market they have not announced a timeframe to begin construction on this site. Also, pre-leasing continues on the retail/office mixed use development on Tract #4 at the southwest corner of Quinlan Park Rd and Steiner Ranch Blvd. More information on these and other mixed-use sites will be available in the future as development plans progress.

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



With music provided by local band 'Lost in Austin', the event will be hosted by businesses and organizations in the immediate Steiner Ranch and Four Points areas.



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## WCID #17 Mandatory 2 Day Per Week Watering Starts May 1st

NO CALENDAR IS NEEDED, all you need to do is set your irrigation system to your two designated watering days.

#### **Steiner Ranch residents:**

- odd numbered addresses will water Wednesdays and Saturdays
- even numbered addresses will water **Thursdays and Sundays**. Residential customers will be required to adhere to this schedule May 1 through September 30,

and encouraged to adhere to it the rest of the year.

Systems such as the one used by the Steiner Ranch HOA using reclaimed or recycled water will not be subject to the restrictions.

The time of day residents may water. To reduce wasting water through evaporation during daytime heat, watering with an automatic irrigation system is permitted before 10am or after 7pm. Watering with a hand held hose or bucket may be done any time of day or any day of the week. Other water uses such as washing cars or boats is not restricted to watering days unless increased conservation measures become necessary.

Please make a note on your calendars that the Bella Mar pool facility is closed every Monday until 2:00pm during the summer season and the John Simpson Pool facility is closed every Monday beginning at 1:00pm.

#### **Partial Pool Closures**

**Bella Mar:** The swim team will also be using the lap pool & pavilion area only (leaving the splash pool open for resident use) on the following dates/times:

Shooting Stars- July 14th – August 6th (Tue – Fri)

Team 8:00am – 12:00pm

**Towne Square:** The water aerobics class uses the Towne Square pool (shallow end only) on Mon/Wed 6:45 – 7:45pm and Tue/ Thur 9:15 – 10:15am all summer long.

They will be supervised by camp counselors and you are welcome to use the pool while they are there.

Adult Group Swimming will be using 3 lanes throughout the summer every Wednesday night from 8:00pm – 9:00pm.



#### No Diapers Allowed

Pool Policy regarding children who are not potty-trained:

Children who are not potty-trained and who use swim diapers are not allowed in the Bella Mar Lap Pool.

#### All other community pools:

Double diapers (swim diaper + plastic pants) must be worn by children who have not been completely toilet trained.


This policy is in place to help keep accidents from happening and reducing the need to close pools due to contamination.



## Pool Procedures BATHROOM BREAK!

Last summer the Steiner Ranch Community Pools had to shut down on several occasion due to "accidents". These types of problems will cause a pool to shut down for many hours, sometimes all day, so the pool can be treated and given time for the water to "turn over".

Parents, please help keep the pools clean by taking your children on frequent bathroom breaks. The lifeguards will have the kids get out of the pool during Adult Swim to give kids this opportunity. Children who wear swim diapers should be checked often and if necessary, should be changed in the bathroom and not at poolside.





#### **Trails Update**

Do you like to solve problems and design things? Your Steiner Ranch Trails Committee is actively seeking a volunteer or group of volunteers to design our sign markings for the entire trail system. You don't have to install them – you just have to design the markings. The image shows an example of a sign in the Walnut Creek trail system. We need similar markings for hikers on our trails. As a designer, your job will be to work out what labels to place at each sign location, and place an order for the labels using HOA funds. The markings have several purposes:


- Location: label the trail name on the sign.
- Show how far it is to the nearest trail exit in either direction (we have GPS coordinates to help here)
- At trail intersections, mark which trail continues and which trail branches.
- At trail exits, show the street name for that exit point.
- Show any special information such as steep trail, rocky, water crossing, view point, bench, etc.
- Show emergency information.
- Show special information when the trail is on the Balcones Preserve land.

The water in Lake Austin was too cold for the guests of the Sunshine Nudist Camp, which was established on Lake Austin in the early 1970s, replacing a fishing camp that had been there since the '40s. The campers gritted their teeth for a few years, then decamped to warmer climates. Replacing them were rodeo clowns and cowboys learning the ropes at the Steiner Ranch Rodeo Camp. That venture lasted until 1979, when the Bermuda Inn, a so-called fat farm, opened its doors at this secluded spot. It would stay until 1997, undergoing two name changes (and substantial shifts in philosophy) during that time, becoming Lake Austin Resort in the 1980s and Lake Austin Spa Resort in 1994. Then, in 1997, the property was bought by its present owners, Michael McAdams and Billy Rucks, who kept the name but started changing just about everything else.

The current Lake Austin Spa Resort is incarnation number seven, and that seems to be the lucky number. By 2005 McAdams and Rucks had finished a seven-year renovation of the property. The current spa is the 25,000-square-foot LakeHouse Spa. It has 30 treatment areas, both indoors and out, with an extensive treatment menu. There are special menus for men and teens and a separate beauty salon with

a pedicure bar. The new facility, along with the property's other improvements, puts Lake Austin firmly on the destination-spa map. In fact, in 2008 they were named the #1 Destination Spa in North America by the readers of Conde Nast Traveler magazine.

McAdams's ambition was to build a spa "that would be like your best friend's lake house," he says. However, "I worried that the LakeHouse Spa would be too grand," says McAdams. "I asked the design team to build in a funky factor to give it some whimsy." That took the form of large wooden shutters and a screened-in porch with Kennedy rocking chairs. Both give the building a down-home feel. The mood at Lake Austin is low-key. Many guests pad around in a robe all day and spend downtime in the rocking chairs outside their cabins. The tour of the extensive gardens, full of butterflies and birds, is popular. "If you want to ride horses and climb mountains, this wouldn't be your spot," says a staff member. "If you want to wear jewelry to dinner, this wouldn't be your place, either. If you want to wear no makeup and wear your robe to dinner and feel really comfortable, then you'll like it here."



#### From the Association Office

#### **Greenbelt and Fence Line Inspections**

Some of you may have recently received a letter from the Association notifying you of an upcoming greenbelt/fence line inspection that will be conducted in your neighborhood. Many of you might be questioning why is the Association doing this now, what exactly are they looking for, what is considered a violation? Below are a few common questions that have been asked of the Association since commencing this inspection and the answers that are most applicable:

Why is the Association conducting this inspection? As Steiner Ranch grows in size and as some homes are offered as a lease option, this has become an ever-growing necessity. Many Residents are not aware that the greenbelts and common areas are property of the Association; maintenance and repair of these areas are the responsibility of the Association as well. Unfortunately,


several areas in the greenbelt have been abused, unauthorized clearings, pathways cut into, forts erected and other private items stored or placed in for personal use. This type of activity is strictly against the covenants for the Steiner Ranch community. With the vast number of homes that are adjacent to the greenbelt, the Association is simply requesting the Residents to help in addressing these issues by allowing us open access to the rear of your property.

What is the Association looking for? We are looking for any activity intentional or not that could have a negative effect in the greenbelts, common areas and to your property. This would include but not limited to private gates, unapproved clearing, dumping of trash or building material, forts or tree houses, unapproved modifications, prohibited plant material, fencing in disrepair, etc. These activities

could result in a fine assessed against your property and could ultimately cause an increase in bi-annual assessments due to the Association having to incur the expense of repair for these areas.

What to do if my property is in violation? After the inspection the Association will communicate to you in writing if there were any violations found with your property. One of the most popular violations is a gate in the rear fence line leading to a greenbelt. The Association and Board of Directors will require for you to permanently close the private access gate by either welding or bolting the gate shut. Once the violation is corrected you may contact the Association to request a re-inspection and removal of the violation. If you have questions or concerns regarding the violations, please do not hesitate to contact the Association's office.

#### From the Association Office

#### **Tenant/Occupant Registration Requirement**

There are over 3,300 occupied homes in Steiner Ranch, but not all are occupied by the actual homeowners. Some homeowners, for various reasons, rent or lease their home to tenants/occupants, and that is when challenges arise for the Community Associations Office staff. There are certain notification requirements placed upon the Association by the governing documents of Steiner Ranch. These notifications include but are not limited to:

- Semi-annual assessment statements
- Annual meeting notifications
- Deed restriction violation notices
- General correspondence

Not having a homeowner's absentee or off-site address for the notifications mentioned above can, unfortunately, cause fines or other fees to be charged to a homeowner's account for failure to pay assessments on time or for failure to correct violations on the property within a specified timeframe. When tenants/occupants are registered at the Community Associations Office, the Association has the homeowner's absentee address on file and is able to send all the required notifications directly to the homeowner.

Having tenants/occupants registered also helps to protect the homeowner and his/her Steiner Ranch property. If the Association discovers that a tenant/occupant is not properly maintaining the landscaping or has caused some other violation on the property, a notice is sent to the homeowner informing them of the violation and a copy of the notice is sent to the tenant/occupant. Quickly correcting violations helps to ensure individual property values are maintained at their highest level, as well as the entire community.

Due to the challenges which have arisen as a result of rented and leased homes, the Association requires registration of all tenants/ occupants in Steiner Ranch. In order for a tenant/occupant to receive access to the Steiner Ranch facilities, the homeowners must register the tenants/occupants via the Tenant/Occupant Registration Form and complete the Facilities Use Agreement. Once these forms are on file in the Community Associations Office, the Association will issue a "Facility Tag" to the tenants/occupants so they may enjoy all the facilities Steiner Ranch has to offer. Without the Facility Tag, tenants/occupants will not be able to enter any of the locked facilities, which includes the pools, tennis courts and the Lake Club.

Please be aware that Tenant/Occupant Registration forms must be completed by the homeowner and the responsible tenant/occupant. Forms signed by a property manager or other non-homeowner will not be accepted unless a power of attorney form is also submitted







## **NatureWatch**

#### Webs of Intrigue

Spending summer days in the fields, woods, and even our own suburban gardens can yield many interesting sights, but few are more curious than that of the spider web. Formed out of protein-rich silk extruded from a spider's spinnerets (or silk-producing organs located at their abdomens), webs can take many forms, including spiral orbs, tangles, funnels, tubes, sheets, domes, and tents. While most spiders can use both sticky and fluffy silk to construct a web, they can also position the web horizontally or vertically or at any angle in between, depending on its specific purpose.

Web construction is a unique and delicate process, with the spider using its own body for measurements. Starting with the most difficult part, the first thread, spiders use the wind (and a bit of luck) to carry it to an adhesive surface. Once caught, the spider will carefully walk over the thread while strengthening it with another thread, repeating this action until this primary thread is strong enough to support the finished web. Step two involves the process of making many radials, making sure that the distance between each radial is small enough to cross. Ergonomically speaking, this means that the number of radials in a web depends directly on the size of the spider and helps to determine the final size of the web.

Once the radials are complete, the spider will fortify the center of the web with several circular threads, and move outward, continuing a spiral of non-sticky, evenly-spaced threads made so the spider can easily move around its own web. Then, beginning from the outside edge and moving toward the center, it adds sticky spiral threads by utilizing the radials and non-sticky spirals as guidelines. Once again using its body as a measuring device, the spaces between each of the sticky spirals is directly proportional to the distance from the tips of its back legs to its spinnerets. After the sticky spirals are complete, the spider consumes the non-sticky spirals as they are no longer needed, chews off the initial center spiral threads and sits and waits for prev.

Webs are literally extensions of a spider's ability to feel, and they allow them to catch their prey without having to expend the energy to run it down. Some spiders will decorate their webs with loose, irregular tangles of silk to disorient and knock down flying insects and to warn birds and other flying predators of the presence of the web. Constructing a web is energetically costly for a spider due to the large amount of protein required, so broken webs, especially if they are still structurally sound, are not always repaired. It is not

uncommon, however, for spiders to eat their own web daily to recoup some of the energy used in spinning and recycle the protein by spinning a new web. Normally, a spider's web will remain in one location for the entire summer, but spiders can change locations usually early in the season, if they find a place with better protection or better hunting.

Commonly, webs are about twenty times larger than the spider building it. Rich in vitamin K, which can be effective in clotting blood, spider webs were used several hundred years ago as gauze pads to stop an injured person's bleeding. Today, we know that the tensile strength of spider silk is greater that the same weight of steel and has a much improved elasticity. Research into its microstructure is being performed for potential and surprising applications such as bullet-proof vests and artificial tendons!

The next time you are out in your garden in the early morning hours and you come across a delicate spider web glistening with drops of dew like strings of tiny diamonds, appreciate what you are seeing for its natural beauty, strength, and purpose!

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## Is Your Home an Internet Broadcaster?

(It might be and you don't even know it)

Laptop computers have made computing mobile and very convenient. Wireless routers in our homes have made it possible to use our computers anywhere in the home, and not just where the connection comes into your home.

If you have a wireless router at home, then you are using one of three possible levels of security, 1) none, 2) poor and 3) what you SHOULD be using. "None" is real simple, open the box, plug in the router, connect to the Internet. With this connection, ANYONE within range, meaning your neighbors, passersby and that annoying teen-age kid down the street who likes to hang around your house in the evening, can use your wireless network to access the internet or worse, access your computers at home. Also, any illegal activity over the Internet is going to be traced back to your home, not to the person or computer that may have done it.

I often tell the story of the time I moved to Austin from Sacramento 4 1/2 years ago over the Thanksgiving holiday. I stayed overnight with a friend in Flagstaff, Arizona at her parents' home. Lots of relatives were there and they all smoked (and smoked a lot). Even though it was 35 degrees outside, I went and sat in my car for an hour just to breathe fresh air. While in my car I powered up my laptop and discovered a completely unsecured network within range. I connected to it and took the opportunity to check my email and do some web surfing. Then the good Samaritan in me decided to do them a favor. I figured they hadn't changed the default password on their router, and sure enough I was right. I logged onto their router and took a screen shot of it. Since they were also using the default name for their computer network, I changed mine to match and could see that they had a computer turned on with one of their hard drives shared (no, I didn't peek at it.) I also saw that they had an Epson printer connected to it, so I downloaded the printer driver and installed it on my laptop, opened Microsoft Word and pasted the screen shot of their router into it. I also included instructions on how to keep prying eyes out of their network, thanked them that

I was able to check my email, and then I PRINTED the document out on their printer. Keep in mind I have no idea which house I had connected to. I imagine if they were home that they were a little shocked to have their printer start all by itself and print a note from a complete stranger. Lucky for them I wasn't someone who wanted to copy their files, plant a virus or lock them out of their own network.

The two levels of security that are usually displayed with a padlock symbol are WEP and WPA. WEP falls into the "poor" category of security. WEP will keep honest people out of your network, and will prevent someone from accidentally getting connected to your network, but WEP was "cracked" several years ago, and nowadays it only takes a laptop and 60 seconds to break into a network secured with WEP.

What you should be using is WPA (or WPA2) to provide a connection that (with a good password) can't be cracked in a comfortable lifetime. Log into your router (usually at http://192.168.0.1 or http://192.168.1.1), go to the wireless security settings and set it for WPA. Then change your laptops and other wireless devices to match.

There are many different routers on the market, but there are a few standard rules to follow: Changing the security settings on your router should always be done with the computer attached to the router via a network cable - don't change it over a wireless connection. If you make a mistake, you won't be able to get back in to fix it. In the wireless security settings on your router, you will see WEP and SHOULD see WPA as options. If you don't see WPA as an option, your router is probably several years old. Go to the manufacturer's support page on their web site and look for updated "firmware" to download. Download the firmware and update the router per the instructions provided by the manufacturer. If the latest firmware doesn't provide WPA encryption, then it's time for a trip to Best Buy or Fry's for a new router. ANY new router will provide WPA

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

encryption. Next use a strong password. A strong password should be at least 12 characters long, feel free to make it a lot longer - the longer the better. Be sure to use upper and lower case letters, use numbers AND use special characters like # \* ( \ } [ @ ! &. Write it down and put it in a safe place. If it helps, use 2 or 3 non-related words or numbers that you know but no one is likely to guess. Something like maybe the city you got married in with the year of your first car and the name of your brother's daughter. It might look something like Dallas@1989!Samantha#. 
# **National Night Out**


It's time again to gather your neighbors and team up with your Law Enforcement Agency to give crime a going-away party.


Looking at the bright side, I hope this review saved you a worthless read.

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# The "Four Awareness" Points When Playing Tennis

In past issues, I have written about how to choose proper tennis equipment and efficient ways to practice. This issue offers advice on how to tackle the "critical points" in your matches.

In every match, you will find critical points that can determine whether a player wins or losses. At these critical points, I suggest reviewing what I call the "four awareness" points:

#### First Awareness: Self

Every player possesses certain shots that they feel more comfortable hitting on a critical point. For example, it could be a forehand

topspin, or a slice one. When choosing which shot to hit on a critical point, decisively utilize the shot that comes more naturally without changing your mind. That is when mistakes are made.

#### Second Awareness: Opponent

When the players decide on a shot at a critical point, they need to consider their opponent's strengths and weaknesses. During the match, they should notice the shots the opponent has less success with than others. On a critical point, players should use the shot they feel more comfortable with but also they will aim towards their opponent's weaknesses.

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#### Third Awareness: Court

Once you decide on your most consistent shot, consider the opponent's weakness, you also need to take into account the court conditions. Factors such as the sun, wind, and surface will make a difference on the shot executed. When in doubt, you should either choose a shot toward an opening on the court, or directly at your opponent's feet; open spaces or shoe laces.

#### Fourth Awareness: Score

When you decide on your shot, the placement and being aware of the court challenges, a good player should also remember the score in hand. Players will be aggressive when the score is in their favor, and be more conservative when tied, or behind. For example, when a player is serving at 40-15, the serve should be a powerful and assertive. In contrast, if the score is 15-40, the player should serve the first serve with some power, but with more placement.

Over time, these four awareness points will become both automatic and reactionary as players become more experienced in playing and competing. After the shot has been properly executed, they will sometimes give themselves a pat on the back for doing the right thing at the right time, and remind themselves that they followed the "four awareness" points.

# Outdoor Water Conservation Tips

Even though we use water every day, it's easy to take it for granted. Just imagine how you would function without clean water. It's everyone's responsibility to conserve and protect water resources. The decisions and actions you make today truly affect our water resources for the future. The following suggestions will help you get in the habit of saving water in the great outdoors:

- Use mulch around landscape plantings. Mulch will help eliminate weeds and hold moisture in the soil.
- Select hardy plants that don't need much water. Native plants that are well adapted to your climate and soils will survive well without supplemental watering. A copy of the Steiner Ranch Approved Plant list is available on the website at www.steinerranchhoa. org.
- Water during the cool part of the day to avoid rapid evaporation and follow the WCID #17 Mandatory 2-day per week watering schedule.
- When watering is necessary, water slowly and thoroughly. If you notice puddles or runoff, turn water off and wait for water to soak in. Also be sure your sprinkler puts water where you need it—not on driveways or sidewalks.
- Wash cars efficiently. First give the car a quick rinse, and then turn the water off.
   Wash one section of the car at a time and rinse that section quickly. Turn the water off each time.

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# A Sensible Plan for College Funding

As a parent, you may feel a moral obligation to fund your children's education, but you don't want to sacrifice your current lifestyle or rob your future retirement in order to fund education costs. Well, to make funding both their education and your retirement a non-issue, you must consider how to:

- Maximize your cash flow so that you can invest funds in education and retirement accounts. This includes both reducing debt and lowering expenses.
- Utilize the numerous education tax incentives provided by the IRS to reduce taxes and produce so-called "tax scholarships" for your family.
- Qualify for merit and need-based financial aid offered by colleges

If you can maximize the benefits produced by the above strategies, you may not have to compromise your education and retirement goals. Historically, we see that college costs have risen at 2 to 3 times the inflation rate of the Consumer Price Index. And college really costs you more than you think because it is paid with after-tax dollars. Depending on which tax bracket you are in, the amount you must earn to pay for college is a good deal more because you must first pay the IRS...before you pay the college.

How old will you be when your last child graduates from college? Assume that you are 45 years old and you plan to retire in 20 years and that a public college costs \$60,000 for 4 years. You take the money out of your retirement savings today. The money you give to a public college for four years will cost your retirement fund about \$280,000 at an 8% return. Elite colleges cost more, but there is a hidden benefit which we will get to later. And remember, these numbers are for just one child's college education.

Clearly this presents a funding dilemma shared by parents everywhere: how to fund college and retirement? Experts agree there are two methods to make this work:

The first method is by using your money through: (A) paying out of your current income, (B) paying with withdrawals from your savings accounts, or (C) borrowing. Most people use some combination of all three. The second method is to use money from others. This comes in the following forms: (A) financial aid, (B) by using special education tax strategies, (C) gifts from relatives, or (D) your child's resources (his/her income and assets). We will explore this topic in future columns, how to make a sensible, methodical plan for funding college expenses.
