Goins Earns Eagle Scout Award

William Lawrence "Will" Goins, a Cypress resident and Signal Mountain, Tennessee native, has joined his three uncles in earning the Eagle Scout Award, the Boy Scouts of America's highest honor.

A rising sophomore at Cypress Ranch High School, Will was awarded the Eagle Scout Award during Troop 533's Eagle Court of Honor at Harvest Bible Church in Cypress. He was joined by his parents, Mary Lynn Pearce Goins and Rick Goins and sister Kathleen; as well his grandparents, Paul and Kay Pearce, of Signal Mountain, Tennessee, and uncle John O. Pearce, of Brentwood, Tennessee. His paternal grandmother, Mrs. Barbara Goins of Chattanooga, was unable to attend.

Will and his uncle, John, are joined as Eagle Scouts by brothers P. Alan Pearce of Chattanooga, Tennessee, and E. Lee Pearce of Columbus, Ga. Four Eagles in a family are a rarity. Only 3 in 100 that begin in Boy Scouts complete the rigorous requirements for Eagle Scout, making this accomplishment the more remarkable. Will is the 34th Eagle Scout in Troop 533, and is also a member of the BSA Order of the Arrow honor society.

Will, age 15, began his Trail to Eagle as a Tiger Cub in Pack 3035 at Signal Crest United Methodist Church in Signal Mountain, and was a Bear and Webelo Scout in Pack 405 in Wylie, Texas. He joined Pack 533 in Cypress in 2003 and Troop 533 in January 2005.

Will's Eagle project was managing the construction and delivery of 10 cedar benches for the outdoor playground at Harvest Bible Church, a growing church in northwest Houston.

Will managed the project from inception through completion, developing and managing the project's budget, bench construction, team safety, and delivery to the church. The project took 15 months to complete, from initial discussion with Scout leaders and awarding of the Eagle Scout on June 16, 2009.





As you are aware, there has been a great deal of vandalism within Fairfield Village, all repaired at a cost to you, the homeowner. As the vandalism continues, and as the cost to make the necessary repairs and replacement increases, it also becomes necessary to increase your assessment.

Vandalism includes the operation of a Golf Cart, ATV, or a Dirt Bike on common areas (including sidewalks) or greenbelts. The Sheriff will be notified of anyone seen driving these vehicles. Should the person(s) be under age, the Association will legally pursue the legal guardian for all damages incurred.

Your Association has spent thousands of dollars, your dollars, repairing sidewalks, gazebos, entry markers, irrigation, ruts, etc., and now it's time to make these vandals stop.

New Cell Phone Law *"Till Have to Call You Back:*

I'm in a School Zone." THE LAST SESSION OF THE TEXAS LEGISLATURE PASSED A NEWLAW MAKING IT ILLEGAL TO USE

PASSED A NEW LAW MAKING IT ILLEGAL TO USE YOUR CELL PHONE IN A SCHOOL ZONE. THE EXCEPTIONS ARE:

- if you are using a hands free device
- if your vehicle is stopped
- if you are calling 911 for an emergency.

The law took effect September 1, 2009. Soon you can expect to see new signage in school zones reminding drivers to hang up or face a fine of up to \$200.

After her second breath there was no stopping her and she stormed through that water like she owned it. She ended up finishing first place with a time of 29.25 (almost a full second faster than this morning) and second place was a 29.95!!!! I am proud to say that I am Abbie's coach and it will be an honor to continue coaching her and watch her grow into a wonderful, amazing, and very talented swimmer"

In listening to Coach Jason relive the moment you can smell the chlorine, feel your heart race with adrenaline, and feel the thump in your body from the crowd roaring her to a victory. 

To Do or Not To-Do

Do you find yourself striving to "do" for God? Is your calendar full of things you are doing for the Lord, but lacking in time spent with Him?

My schedule has been particularly busy the last few months and one morning as I turned the page of my day-planner, I could feel stress grip me as I glanced at the long "To-Do" list. I then dialed my voicemail, only to be greeted with the words, "You have ten unplayed messages." My throat tightened, my eyes watered, and I wondered how I could possibly get everything completed on time. Overwhelmed, I whispered a quick prayer, "Lord, please show me what to do!" In my spirit, I sensed God say, "Be still." But how could I be still with the phones ringing, deadlines lurking, and papers piling up around me?

I went into time management mode and began assessing which tasks could be postponed. I opened my mail, put aside anything that wasn't urgent (adding to my piles!), and emailed responses to some of my phones messages to save time. I tackled my "To-Do's" with determination, ate lunch at my desk, and raced out the door just in time to pick up my daughter from school and make it to her orthodontist appointment. As I collapsed in the waiting room chair, I once again sensed God say, "Be still."

After a few days of similar chaos, I recognized that my quiet times had grown shorter as my scheduled had grown tighter. I was so busy "doing" for God that I wasn't taking the time I needed to hear from Him. Most of the tasks in my planner were "for God," but that didn't mean everything on my task list was God directed.

I took the next morning off and simply sat before the Lord, reminding myself of His faithfulness and asking Him for guidance with regard to my schedule. I walked away from that time with a much shorter "To-Do" list and a far greater sense of peace and balance.

At one point in King David's life, he too became focused on "doing" for God. He looked around his palace and told the prophet Nathan that he wanted to build a house for the Lord. After all, David was living in royal luxury while the presence of God dwelled in a mere tent. Nathan quickly agreed that David's plan was good and urged him, "Whatever you have in mind, go ahead and do it, for the Lord is with you" (2 Samuel 7:3). Turns out, this was not what God had planned at all.

The Lord made it clear that David would not be the one to build a house for His name. God said, "I have not dwelt in a house from the day I brought the Israelites up out of Egypt to this day. I have been moving from place to place with a tent as my dwelling. Wherever I have moved with all the Israelites, did I ever say to any of their rulers whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, 'Why have you not built me a house of cedar?' Then King David went in and sat before the Lord" (2 Samuel 7:6-7,18).

David's heart was right, but the Temple was not his to build. That (Continued on Page 16)

work would be left to David's son, Solomon. Like David, we can get excited about "doing" for God.

Jesus said, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). The Greek word translated weary in this verse indicates one who is fatigued from too much work (Strong's).

As I took that morning to sit before the Lord, I was overloaded and worn out from pushing myself too hard. The tasks on my calendar were all related to ministry, but some of those good works were intended for another of God's servants to perform. Once I took the time to "be still" before the Lord, I was able to make the corrections to my schedule that bought my life back into balance.

How much time are you spending before the Lord in prayer? Are there some ministry "To-Do's" on your calendar that might need to be done by someone else in the Body of Christ? Do you feel weary and burdened by the load you are carrying?

I encourage you to take a morning off to sit before the Lord. You just may find that some of your "To-Do's" are not for you to do.

Will man rob God? Yet you are robbing me. But you say, "How have we robbed you?" In your tithes and contributions (Malachi 3:8)... The prophet Malachi accused the Jews of robbing God sometime around 450 BC. These Jews had just arrived back in Jerusalem after 70 years in Babylonian exile, for God had disciplined them for their many disobediences. Now, they were back in their land and still rebelling against God. Their answer to the prophet's accusation reveals a self-serving arrogance with an assertion of innocence: "How have we robbed you?"

Malachi's answer must have left the Jews stunned and speechless, for how could they argue against what they knew to be true. They were robbing God of the tithes and offerings due Him, and because giving back to God was equivalent to the worship of God, God was being deprived of the worship due His holy name by His holy people Israel. Now in all likelihood, the Jews had probably cut back on their tithing and contributing to the temple and priesthood due to poor economic conditions of their day, but it was still robbery.

Truth is, there were many tithes the Jews were responsible for. First, they were to give a tenth of their earnings and their livestock to support the Levites-similar to a tax. In turn, the Levites were to tithe from what they received to the priests (Num. 18:25-30). A second tithe was annual - the festival tithe (Deut. 12:10-11, 17-18), and it supported the national feasts (Passover, Booths, Weeks) where Jews and converts slaughtered countless animals in celebration of various events in Israel's history. Since this tithe contributed to the worship of YHWH from the people, if it were neglected then the celebratory feasts would suffer as well as the worship itself. A third tithe in the OT was the welfare tithe for orphans and widows (Deut. 14:28-29), and it provided for the helpless widows and orphans in Israel. This tithe averaged out to an additional 3.33% per year of Israel's required giving. Taken as a whole, these three tithes amounted to about 23% of one's income, and they all essentially functioned as a governmental tax that supported the priesthood. For Jews, these tithes were no more voluntary than modern-day taxes for Americans. However, this 23% mandatory tax base was not the grand total of tithes required under the Mosaic Law. They also had a profit-sharing tax (Lev. 19:9-10), a temple tax, and the seven-year Sabbath tax, totaling around 25% of their income to the priesthood.

But the Jews were also robbing God of "contributions." The first was the offering of "firstfruits" from one's harvest (Lev. 23:10; Num. 18:12; Prov. 3:9-10; 11:24) which was a representative sample of one's crops to the priest as an offering to YHWH. The full harvest was not full until the first-fruits had been offered. The second "contribution" was the "freewill" offering (Ex. 35:4-5, 21-22, 29; 36:5-6), an offering given to God from a joyful heart.

When we as Christians choose to not pay our taxes, we rob God, for He establishes governments (Rom. 13:1-8) and commands that taxes be paid. And when we refrain from giving financially to Christ's church—the foundation of Truth, we not only withhold worship from Christ and rob God, we rob ourselves of the blessings that result from true worship. We ought not ever think that giving money to the church, however, will make us rich, for giving concerns worship, and worship is owed to God for His goodness. The poor economic conditions in Israel resulted in famine and poor harvests, so the Jews stopped giving to God what He required of them. But their attempts to save their money during that "recession," resulting only in cheating themselves out of a Divine bailout. It doesn't matter if our economic conditions are good or bad. God is always owed our worship, and if it doesn't go deeper than singing songs then it is lame worship indeed. Let us worship Christ in spirit and in truth, for He is God!




