


Karissa Garcia Chosen to Attend DECATS

Win Your Battles

During our first several years of marriage, Luke and I went through a tough time financially and with relationships. Relationships that dealt mainly with family members. I remember driving in the gym parking lot praying and letting God know that I had had enough. I told Him I was tired of the battling and that it needed to come to a stop. I needed mercy!

That Sunday, during worship in church, the Lord spoke very clearly to my spirit. So clearly in fact, it sounded almost audible except that it was inside my spirit man. The Spirit of the Lord said. "You're trials are over. I have placed a spirit of triumph upon you and Luke (my husband). You will experience triumph in every area of your lives including relationships. I want you to write a book on the spirit of triumph and everyone you pray for to receive the spirit of triumph will receive it." Later, when I was in prayer, the Lord showed me a vision of the story of Joshua and the battle of Jericho:


Now Jericho was straitly shut up because of the children of Israel: none went out, and none came in. And the LORD said unto Joshua, See, I have given into thine hand Jericho, and the king thereof, and the mighty men of valour. And ye shall compass the city, all ye men of war, and go round about the city once. Thus shalt thou do six days. Joshua 6:1-3

Joshua was the one who had originally taken the Israelites through to the promise land. Now he was leading the Israelites and the Lord told him it was time to take the city of Jericho.

And seven priests shall bear before the ark seven trumpets of rams' horns: and the seventh day ye shall compass the city seven times, and the priests shall blow with the trumpets. And it shall come to pass, that when they make a long blast with the ram's horn, and when ye hear the sound of the trumpet, all the people shall shout with a great shout; and the wall of the city shall fall down flat, and the people shall ascend up every man straight before him. Joshua 6:4-5

God gave Joshua specific (and weird!) instructions on how to take Jericho's land. It was to walk around the city seven times and then after the priests blew the trumpets, to let out a "great shout." The word "shout" here is the same word used in the Hebrew (ruwa`) for triumph. In the vision the Lord gave me, He showed Joshua's men surrounding Jericho and shouting. When they did, I saw the spirit of triumph leave their mouths and permeate Jericho causing it to crumble. That spirit of triumph caused the Israelites to obtain the victory. The city actually crumbled before their very eyes! The spirit of triumph is a supernatural anointing designed to give you victory over your enemies!

Psalm 41:11-12 By this I know that thou favourest me, because mine enemy doth not triumph over me. And as for me, thou upholdest me in (Continued on Page 13)

mine integrity, and settest me before thy face forever.

Psalm 41 was written by David while it appears that he was going through a hard time. However, he says that God did not allow his enemies to triumph over him. The word triumph in Psalm 41 translates ruwa' in Hebrew. God did allow David's enemies to come against him. Also, the Lord revealed to me that the reason Joshua and his army had to walk around Jericho seven times with the Ark (which held God's spirit) before they released the spirit of triumph was because they had to bind the strongman first! Now, in the New Testament era, we can verbally bind the strongman in Jesus' name! (Luke 11:21-22)

Harvest Bible Church

Did you know?... God's relationship with His people is one of covenant—a deal, a promise, or a guarantee. Understanding the biblical covenants is key to understanding the Bible and how God works in various administrations (dispensations) of time in the Bible and into eternity. There are two types of covenants in the Bible: conditional and unconditional. The unconditional covenants are promises that God made to man which cannot under any circumstance be nullified. In these God is going to do what He promised to do whether man fulfills his part of the deal or not. On the other hand, conditional covenants are based upon whether or not mankind keeps his end of the deal with God. If he fails, then God is not obligated to bless but is bound to curse.

The biblical covenants team up well with the biblical dispensations, from the Greek word oikonomia, or "stewardship" (Luke 16:2, 3, 4; 1 Cor. 9:17; Eph. 1:10; 3:2, 9; Col. 1:25; 1 Tim. 1:4). These are various time periods in which God administers His purposes on the earth through man under varying responsibilities. The changes in the dispensational dealings of God with man depend upon changed conditions or situations in which man is successively found with relation to God, and that these changes are the result of the failures of man and the judgments of God. For example, in the beginning God dealt with Adam and Eve as innocent people, for they were without sin. But after they sinned, God had to deal with them as fallen beings. God Himself did not change, but He had to change the way in which He dealt with sinful people after the fall.

In the Bible, there are various administrative responsibilities which span the entire history of mankind. Each of them ends, however, in the failure of man under the respective test and in an ensuing judgment from God. Three of these dispensations are the subject of extended revelation in the Scriptures: the dispensation of the Mosaic Law, the present one of the church, and the future dispensation of the millennial kingdom. Each are distinct yet chronologically successive.

The dispensations do not represent various ways of salvation. They are not in themselves dependent on covenant relationships but are ways of life and duty to God that test the submission of man to God's revealed will during a particular time. If man does trust in his own efforts to gain the favor of God or salvation under any dispensational test, because of inherent sin, his failure to satisfy fully the just requirements of God is inevitable and his condemnation

According to the "eternal purpose" of God (Eph. 3:11), salvation in the divine reckoning is always "by grace through faith," and rests upon the basis of the shed blood of Christ. God has always been gracious, regardless of the particular dispensation in effect at any point in history, but man has not at all times in past history been under the dispensation of grace apart from works of the law or conscience (the Church is presently under this dispensation of the cross of Christ apart from law or conscience according to 1 Cor. 9;17; Eph. 3:2, 9; Col. 1:25; 1 Tim. 1:4).

It has always been true that "without faith it is impossible to please God" (Heb. 11:6), and Old Testament saints were saved by faith in a coming Savior and Redeemer. However, due to the progress of revelation, it was historically impossible for them to comprehend to the same extent as Christians do, the nature of the prophecies and sacrifices that they portrayed, the incarnate, crucified Son, the Lamb of God. They did have some understanding of the prophecies and types of the suffering Savior and other details (1 Pet. 1:10-12), but this faith, vague as it was, was counted unto them for righteousness (Rom. 4:3-8; Gen. 15:1).

Understanding the dispensations and covenants is a great way to memorize the events recorded in the Bible. One can see and appreciate the unfolding story of God's creation, man's sin, his corruption, his salvation, and his ultimate destiny. 





Breath Test Detects H. Pylori In Stomach

Testing for the bacterium that causes most stomach ulcers and some forms of stomach cancer can be as easy as blowing into a bag, say doctors at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

In fact, the "breath test" for the bacterium Helicobacter pylori is not only the easiest but the most accurate test, said Dr. Waqar Qureshi, associate professor of medicine and chief of endoscopy at BCM. More traditional ways of diagnosing H. pylori require endoscopy or putting a scope down a person's esophagus to obtain a sample of the stomach lining for study.

Patients start by drinking a substance that is broken down by H. pylori. This breakdown results in the release of labeled carbon dioxide that is detected in breath. After 20 minutes, the patient blows into a specialized bag, which is then tested for the infection.

Once a person is diagnosed with H. pylori, there is a higher chance his or her family members also have the bacteria. Doctors usually test people with a family history of stomach ulcers or cancer, or those who present with a history suggestive of ulcers, for this infection.

Exposure to Different Flavors Helps Kids Develop Taste for Variety of Foods

Many parents get frustrated when their children won't eat what's being served for dinner. But according to an expert at Baylor College of Medicine, children have different taste perceptions and sense of smell than adults. That's why exposing children to various types of food at an early age is important.


"Early imprinting will help alter their taste perceptions," said Roberta Anding, registered dietitian with BCM and Texas Children's Hospital.

She advises:

- Don't give up after offering a new food just one or two times. It can take 10 to 15 food exposures for a child to like it.
- Avoid forcing a child to eat a food it may make him or her less likely to try it again.
- Offer raw vegetables rather than cooked ones, since they don't have as strong of a smell.
- Get children involved in food preparation.
- · Don't reward children with food. It could make certain foods or treats more valuable to children.



Say Goodbye To Skin Cancer, Scars

A topical treatment for certain types of skin cancer means some patients won't have to worry about scarring, say dermatologists at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

While a topical treatment for precancerous cells has been around for more than 30 years, it was only in the last five to 10 years that a topical cream was developed for cancerous lesions. The cream, called AldaraTM, only works for certain types of skin cancer, explained Dr. Ida Orengo, professor of dermatology at BCM and director of the Mohs Surgery Center at the Baylor Clinic.


"You simply rub it on the area, usually at night, and after about four to six weeks, the cancer is gone in about 80 percent of the cases," she said. "This might not work for everyone, but for those who have superficial basal cell carcinoma on visible areas like the face or chest where you don't want scars, it is a good treatment option to talk to your doctor about."



Roth IRA Income Limits Lifted
