Due to safety regulations, please remember that any tree over 5 ft. tall must be cut in half before it can be placed in the hopper – metal stands are not permitted; wood stands will be permitted and must be removed from the base of the tree for collection. Please place the tree separately at the curb. DO NOT mix trash or other materials with, under or on top of the tree.

Please be a good neighbor and bag all packing peanuts; bag all wrapping paper; flatten all boxes – tape or tie them together and stack them curbside.

Please utilize the cart to bag and contain your holiday kitchen waste first.

Attention Fairfield Homeowners

Architectural Applications

Now that the Holidays are approaching you may be considering making changes or additions to your home. Please be reminded that anything that alters the exterior appearance of your home or your property, front or back, i.e., pool, basketball goal, play equipment (including trampolines), patio cover, storage building, play houses, satellite dish, etc. must have your Association's prior written approval before construction or installation commences.

If you're building something that has a roof and/or sides, i.e., patio cover, storage building, you will need to include the following along with your application: materials including roofing, dimensions, height (measured from ground to peak), width and length, and a copy of your lot survey indicating the proposed location and a side view elevation drawing. Remember, metal, plastic, etc. are not permitted.

If you plan to install play equipment, please include a copy of your lot survey showing the proposed location, the dimensions of the equipment (height, width and length) and color of the tarp.

If you're painting your home, please include a sample of the color(s) you wish to use. Basketball goals...include a copy of your recorded lot survey indicating the proposed location where you wish to keep the goal.

If you're planning to build a pool, please contact AMI for the information required.

Keep in mind that applying for all improvements, modifications or additions is a requirement set forth by your Governing Documents and is not an "FYI" procedure. Applications are official documents that must receive your Association's written approval before any work commences. By not doing so you risk your changes not being in compliance and the cost to modify the change.

It's a real easy process and takes no time at all to adhere to your governing documents. You can apply by U.S. Mail, fax (713-932-6059) or email (ami@amitx.com) or via Fairfield Village's website www.fairfieldvillage.org – whichever is easiest for you. An application as well as your Governing Documents can be obtained on line.

2010 Assessments and Late Fees

That time of year is quickly approaching. Assessments are due again on January 1. In order to encourage homeowners to take care the assessment in a timely manner, the Boards of Directors have opted to implement a late fee for each Association. Certainly, most people will not be affected, but the fee may prompt some 'lackadaisical' payers to pay on time.

When fees are not paid on time, not only is your Association missing income, but you actually have to pay money out to collect past due assessments. The hope is that implementing a late fee will cut down on the costs you pay to collect outstanding assessments.

Your maintenance assessment is due on January 1, 2010. Any payment postmarked after January 31, 2010 will be subject to a late fee. The late fee for all Associations is \$25, with the exception of the Trails of Fairfield, which is \$50.

And now for the good news....

There is no increase in the assessment for 2010! Your Boards of Directors have worked very hard to minimize costs as much as possible, especially in such difficult economic times.

AMI and your Boards understand some families are facing financial difficulties due to the economy. If this is the case, please contact AMI to discuss a payment plan. While late fees are still charged on unpaid balances as of January 31, setting up (and keeping to!) a payment plan will avoid additional, very expensive, legal and collection fees. AMI is eager to work with you!

2010 Maintenance Assessments

The maintenance assessments have been set for 2010 and the Boards of Directors are pleased to advise that the assessment billing amounts will remain the same as 2009, with no increase. The assessments are due January 1, 2010 and considered delinquent if received after January 31, 2010.

Effective this year there will be a late charge if you do not pay your assessment by January 31 or have it postmarked by January 31, 2010.

Please plan for this expense. We have residents who pre-pay their assessments, who send in several payments in advance and some who pay on a monthly basis in advance. Whatever works best for your budget! As we have many new residents remember that there are two assessments for your home in Fairfield, one due in January and one due in July. Therefore we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard, lest we drift away from it. 2 For since the message declared by angels proved to be reliable and every transgression or disobedience received a just retribution, 3 how shall we escape if we neglect such a great salvation? It was declared at first by the Lord, and it was attested to us by those who heard, 4 while God also bore witness by signs and wonders and various miracles and by gifts of the Holy Spirit distributed according to his will (Hebrews 2:1-4).

In the first chapter of Hebrews, the author revealed the superiority of Jesus Christ over the angels. And since all doctrine demands a response, the first words of chapter two do just that. The application the author of Hebrews is seeking is obedience to Jesus, for He is God Almighty.

First, the readers are told to pay closer attention to what they had heard, lest they drift away from it. The fact that Jesus was indeed the long-awaited Messiah is not to be ignored in favor of angels or any other idea that might trivialize Christ's superiority.

The two phrases, "pay closer attention" and "drift away," both have seafaring nuances. "Paying closer attention" was a phrase used in relation to tying a boat to a dock and making sure it was secure. And "drifting away" was a phrase used for a ship that coasted by a harbor. Taken together these two phrases warn the audience to be cautious not to slip past the only dock of salvation and to secure themselves to the gospel of Jesus Christ above any other. Obviously the writer's predominately Jewish audience who had professed belief in Christ had become somewhat apathetic and were in danger of drifting past their intended goal due to their indifference to the doctrines they had been taught about Christ. As a result of their indifference they were in danger of making shipwreck of their lives (cf. 6:19).

There are a handful of passages and contexts in Scripture that speak of people drifting away from their faith (Mark 4:1-20; 1 John 2:19). This has resulted in the widespread belief today that one's salvation can actually be lost. The issue is not, however, that a person can lose his/her salvation. Salvation is a gift that comes from God - a gift that is eternally secure (Eph. 1:13-14) and one that He does not take away. There is nothing a person can do to lose his/her salvation. The question is not "can one lose salvation?" rather, the question is "who truly has salvation?" The writer of Hebrews wrote primarily to a first century Jewish audience who had professed faith in Christ (10:32-34). Secondarily, he wrote to some who had intellectually believed in Christ but had not committed their lives to Him (6:1-8). And third, he wrote to some who simply didn't believe at all (9:11-13). Hebrews 2:1 is universally addressed to people who make a profession of faith in Christ but who may not be truly saved, for they tend to waver in their actions and are in danger of drifting away from the faith they profess.

This was Adam's downfall in the beginning, and it is has proven to be the downfall of many people in history who profess faith in Christ. 



TIPS FOR TEACHING CHILDREN About Table Manners Submitted by Rebecca Beavers

Teaching your children table manners may sound old fashioned, but it never goes out of style. Having good manners shows your respect for other people, and it's more than saying "please" and "thank you." It's about helping your children develop habits and behaviors that will help them relate to adults and other children in a positive way. "To make your family mealtime time special and relaxing, slow down, sit and talk with your children and expect good behavior. You will be pleasantly surprised at how much easier and enjoyable it will become," said Dr. Mary Zurn, vice president of education for Primrose Schools. "This is important because children with good manners often find it easier to make friends and get along with others at school and at home."

Dr. Zurn offers five table manners tips to get parents started:

- 1. Start early: Don't wait until you think your child is "old enough" to learn polite behavior. Just as children learn to crawl before they learn to walk, they also learn manners in stages. Even infants watch parents for rules of expected behavior. Very young children can learn to sign key phrases such as "please" or "thank you" and then transition to the spoken words around age two. By age three, children should be able to stay seated at mealtime if you sit down with them.
- 2. Give specific feedback: Children learn best when they receive specific feedback about their behavior which is far more effective than generic praise. For example, instead of saying, "Good job," you can say, "I'm so glad you set the table."
- 3. Encourage polite conversation: Children as young as two can learn to engage in polite conversation at the dinner table with the right kind of guidance. As you are at the table eating together, show them how to take turns listening, talking, and asking questions.
- 4. Set a good example: Make sure your words and actions match. Children watch parents all the time for behavior clues. For example, if you want your child to eat broccoli because it's a healthy food choice, you will need to let them see you enjoy eating it as well.
- 5. Create a routine: Children learn best from consistency because it helps them know what to expect. Start with the repetition of a few simple steps such as putting a napkin in your lap when you sit down. Create a routine that is easy for them to repeat and remember.
