HOA ANNUAL MEETING & ELECTION of Open Board of Director Positions

The annual meeting for the Silverlake Homeowner's Association, Inc. is scheduled for Tuesday, March 23, 2010 at 7 PM. This is an important meeting where the newly elected Neighborhood Representatives will cast their votes for election of the open Board of Director positions. You will have the opportunity to meet any new Board members and officers.

THE TIMELINE FOR THE ELECTION PROCESS IS AS FOLLOWS:

- December 1, 2009 The Neighborhood Representative and Committee members were elected at the special December 1st meeting. Names and corresponding neighborhoods will be published on the website at SilverlakeHOA.com for your reference.
- December 16, 2009 Letters will be sent to the residents of Neighborhoods One, Five, Nine, Ten and Twelve requesting a brief biography to be submitted if you are interested in one of the open Board of Director positions. Positions are for a three year term in most cases.
 - Director Position Five covers Cambridge Cove, Creekstone, Lakepoint and Winfield (a total of 355 homes)
 - Director Position Nine covers Scofield, Sheldon Cove, Summerfield, Section I, and Weatherford (a total of 330 homes)
 - Director Position Twelve covers Waterbury Estates and Woodbend (a total of 274 homes)
 - **Director Position One** covers Estates at Lakepointe, the Gardens, Meadowview, Parkside, and Silverlake Townhomes (a total of 358 homes). This is a one year term, due to a resignation.
 - ◆Director Position Ten covers Sedgefield (a total of 391 homes). This is a one year term, due to a resignation.

The biography should be limited to approximately 250 to 300 words or one half page. It should include your qualifications and rationale for serving as a Board member. Resident members must be in good standing with HOA dues paid or a payment plan in place and no outstanding deed violations. Deadline for submission of application/biography is January 15, 2010

- January 15, 2010 Deadline for receipt of applications. PCMI will prepare a list of candidates for Board review at the January 26, 2010 meeting.
- January 26, 2010 HOA Board meeting. During Executive Session the Board members will review the applications to assure that all are in good standing.
- February 4, 2010 Notice of the Annual Meeting will be sent to all Silverlake residents. Biographies of candidates will be attached and sent to residents of the five Neighborhoods with open Board positions. A Proxy Directed Ballot will be included in the mailing with instructions for completion.

HOA Board Meeting Recap

The October meeting of the Silverlake HOA was held on October 27, 2009 at the Silverlake Clubhouse. The meeting was well attended by resident homeowners and neighborhood representatives. Here's a recap of items that were discussed during the meeting.

GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Neighborhood rep elections are just around the corner. The board approved a letter to all residents with a timeline as to how the election process will occur. The board would like to see each neighborhood fully represented by a Neighborhood Rep and two Neighborhood Committee persons. The duties of the Neighborhood Rep are very simple. The major job is to cast the votes of the neighborhood for their respective Board Member. In addition, neighborhood reps gather information concerning problems or issues within the neighborhood and present them to the board. The neighborhood committees are charged with getting things going within the neighborhoods themselves, such as a Neighborhood Watch group, a welcoming committee, an activities committee, etc. If you would like to see some of these things implemented within your neighborhood, please consider running for one of the positions. Remember, an active neighborhood is good for your home value.

NEIGHBORHOOD REPS:

The Neighborhood Reps were asked to present problems or concerns in their respective neighborhoods. Issues such as mailboxes, sidewalk repairs and additional monuments in the community were brought up.

RESIDENTS:

There has been an issue with the tennis courts lately. There is a tennis coach that is currently holding tennis lessons that are going on for rather lengthy blocks of time, which is causing a delay in the turnover of the courts to residents that wish to play. After both sides presented their arguments, the board is looking into several different solutions to the problem.

2010 MAINTENANCE FEES:

The board approved the maintenance fees for the 2010 year. The fees for the homeowners will remain at \$582 for 2010. In addition, there will be no increase for either of the additional fees paid by The Gardens and The Estates at Lakepointe. The board voted to increase the maintenance fees by 10% for the commercial properties. The statements are currently being worked on by PCMI and should be out in the mail during November.

LATE FEE POLICY:

The board approved the implementation of a late fee for those that fail to pay the maintenance fee by January 31st. The fee will be a \$25 late fee for the homeowners and a 10% late fee for commercial. In addition there will be a late fee of 10% for The Gardens residents who are over thirty days late in their monthly assessments. These fees will be in addition the interest that is charged for non-payment of dues. The board understands that hard times exist for a lot of people,

Tips for Teaching Children about Table Manners

Teaching your children table manners may sound old fashioned, but it never goes out of style. Having good manners shows your respect for other people, and it's more than saying "please" and "thank you." It's about helping your children develop habits and behaviors that will help them relate to adults and other children in a positive way. "To make your family mealtime time special and relaxing, slow down, sit and talk with your children and expect good behavior. You will be pleasantly surprised at how much easier and enjoyable it will become," said Dr. Mary Zurn, vice president of education for Primrose Schools. "This is important because children with good manners often find it easier to make friends and get along with others at school and at home."

Dr. Zurn offers five table manners tips to get parents started:

1. Start early: Don't wait until you think your child is "old enough" to learn polite behavior. Just as children learn to crawl before they learn to walk, they also learn manners in stages. Even infants watch parents for rules of expected behavior. Very young children can learn to sign key phrases such as "please" or "thank you" and then transition to the spoken words around age two. By age three, children should be able to stay seated at mealtime if you sit down with them.

- 2. Give specific feedback: Children learn best when they receive specific feedback about their behavior which is far more effective than generic praise. For example, instead of saying, "Good job," you can say, "I'm so glad you set the table."
- 3. Encourage polite conversation: Children as young as two can learn to engage in polite conversation at the dinner table with the right kind of guidance. As you are at the table eating together, show them how to take turns listening, talking, and asking questions.
- 4. Set a good example: Make sure your words and actions match. Children watch parents all the time for behavior clues. For example, if you want your child to eat broccoli because it's a healthy food choice, you will need to let them see you enjoy eating it as well.
- 5. Create a routine: Children learn best from consistency because it helps them know what to expect. Start with the repetition of a few simple steps such as putting a napkin in your lap when you sit down. Create a routine that is easy for them to repeat and remember. Pet Adoption Tips

This objective list will remind you to exercise good judgment when you fall in love with a pair of sad puppy eyes. Remember that if your needs and the dog's needs clash, it's not a match; it's a recipe for failure for pup, as well as you and your family. - When looking for your new forever friend, pick out several candidates and ask the shelter if it can provide space for you to spend 30 minutes with each separately. - Be patient with any new pet you bring into your home; it's going to take time regardless of background. Set aside at least an entire weekend to making your new best friend feel welcome, comfortable and safe.
- Be ready to get trained! You and your new pet will fully bond when you learn to communicate. Consider enrolling your new pet in a training course to get the relationship off to a positive start. If you work all day, you may want to check out local doggie daycare facilities, so that your pup gets lots of social play and stays active all day – two requirements for happy dogs. After a day of doggie daycare, you are guaranteed to enjoy a quiet evening with your new best friend. What could be better?
