2010 Assessments and Late Fees

That time of year is quickly approaching. Assessments are due again on January 1. In order to encourage homeowners to take care the assessment in a timely manner, the Boards of Directors have opted to implement a late fee for each Association. Certainly, most people will not be affected, but the fee may prompt some 'lackadaisical' payers to pay on time.

When fees are not paid on time, not only is your Association missing income, but you actually have to pay money out to collect past due assessments. The hope is that implementing a late fee will cut down on the costs you pay to collect outstanding assessments.

Your maintenance assessment is due on January 1, 2010. Any payment postmarked after January 31, 2010 will be subject to a late fee. The late fee for all Associations is \$25, with the exception of the Trails of Fairfield, which is \$50.

And now for the good news....

There is no increase in the assessment for 2010! Your Boards of Directors have worked very hard to minimize costs as much as possible, especially in such difficult economic times.

AMI and your Boards understand some families are facing financial difficulties due to the economy. If this is the case, please contact AMI to discuss a payment plan. While late fees are still charged on unpaid balances as of January 31, setting up (and keeping to!) a payment plan will avoid additional, very expensive, legal and collection fees. AMI is eager to work with you!

2010 Maintenance Assessments

The maintenance assessments have been set for 2010 and the Boards of Directors are pleased to advise that the assessment billing amounts will remain the same as 2009, with no increase. The assessments are due January 1, 2010 and considered delinquent if received after January 31, 2010.

Effective this year there will be a late charge if you do not pay your assessment by January 31 or have it postmarked by January 31, 2010.

Please plan for this expense. We have residents who pre-pay their assessments, who send in several payments in advance and some who pay on a monthly basis in advance. Whatever works best for your budget! As we have many new residents remember that there are two assessments for your home in Fairfield, one due in January and one due in July. 


that he was distracted also with some of the same thoughts.

My life seems to flow in themes. This fall, the theme has been "speaking the truth in love." Now some confident and more aggressive souls may thrive on confrontation, but I've always been inclined to avoid any form of communication that might make someone else (or me!) feel uncomfortable. However, God has been working on this passive heart the past few months. Through situations at the ministry, our family business, my recent Women's Ministry Director position at our church, and raising our less-than-young children, I've had many "speaking the truth" lessons this past fall.

Ephesians chapter 4:15-16 says, Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will in all things grow up into him who is the Head, that is, Christ. From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work. (NIV)

According to The Bible Knowledge Commentary of the New Testament, speaking the truth in love literally means, "truthing in love, which has the idea of maintaining truth in love in both speech and life." So, let's explore how speaking the truth in love impacts the overall health of our ministries and our churches.

Speaking the truth in love builds believers up- ...From him the whole body...grows and builds itself up in love...

Speaking the truth in love prepares believers for service by edifying them. In other words, when we tell the truth (through teaching or conversation), we help God's people improve intellectually, morally, and spiritually. Let's be honest, telling someone that her actions were not in line with Scriptural principles is seldom

comfortable. Redirecting an aspiring singer into an area of service that better suits her talents and abilities can be painful (for both of you!). And I can tell you from experience that making someone aware that her harsh tone is crushing the spirit of another sister in Christ is a risky endeavor. But in each of these scenarios, speaking the truth in a loving and respectful manner is what is best for everyone involved. Ultimately, the direction and honesty helps to equip women to serve Christ effectively and lovingly. And I've found that the speaker of the truth is often refined in the process as well.

Speaking the truth in love fosters unity - ... From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament...

Unity means that we live in harmony with others in the community of faith, sharing a singleness of purpose as we hold to a common knowledge of Christ. Psalm 133 says, How good and pleasant it is when brothers live together in unity! For there the Lord bestows His blessing, even life evermore (vs. 1,3b). Speaking the truth in love provides clear boundaries and enables people to feel safe because they know what to expect. There have been times when I have failed to handle problems, convincing myself that I was keeping peace. But I've learned in my season of "speaking truth" that by failing to say what needed to be said, or correcting what needed to be corrected, I was giving mixed signals and creating confusion. Clear boundaries and honest, loving communication bring a sense of stability and provide an environment where honest relationships can form. When those relationships are based upon a shared commitment to glorify Christ, people can serve Jesus and grow in their knowledge of Him in a safe, loving environment, rich with growth and blessing.

Speaking truth in love promotes spiritual maturity-...speaking the truth in love, we will in all things grow up into him who is the Head, that is, Christ.

Most of us would probably define spiritual maturity as knowing God's Word well and being able to consistently apply what we know. You are called to serve in ministry so that you can grow and contribute to the growth of others. To do so, we need to guide and instruct—and speak the truth in love. 1 Corinthians 13:4-8 tells us, Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. 6Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails... I think it is safe to say that speaking the truth in love not only fosters maturity, it requires maturity.

I'm still working on this art of speaking the truth in love. I have a feeling I have many more truth telling lessons to learn. But it is my goal in 2010 to learn this craft well. I encourage you to do the same. Truth and love are crucial if we want to live in unity and harmony with our brothers and sisters in Christ. Join me as I aspire to speak the truth consistently with a heart overflowing with the love of our Savior. And...the Father's Son, will be with us in truth and love. (2 John 1:3b NIV)

Did You Know?

"...things into which angels long to look" (1 Peter 1:12).

Many of the writings of the Old Testament prophets spoke of the coming Christ; hence, the good news of Christ was in the OT. The Apostle Peter said that these "things which have now been announced" were "things into which angels long to look."

Angels are interesting beings. They are seen in the Bible opposing demons (Dan. 10:13; Jude 9), carrying divine messages (Dan. 8:16-17; 9:21-23; 10:11; 12:6-7; Matt. 2:13; Luke 1:19, 28; 2:10-14), and doing divine works (1 Kings 19:5; Ps. 91:11-12; Matt. 4:11; 13:39-42; Acts 12:7-11; Heb. 1:14). Now, per Peter's words, it is revealed that they long to look into the gospel truths. Since the verb "long" describes a deep and insatiable desire for something, the term reveals the awe of the angelic creatures over God's saving grace. They aren't simply curious, they have a deep-seated passion "to look" at what God did and what He is doing. The word for "look" literally means to stretch one's head forward or to bend down. Like rubberneckers on the freeway after a wreck, they have a voracious desire to see God's work. Why? Likely for the sole purpose of worshipping more appropriately the God they continually stand in the presence of. Amazing that so few people care to delve into these truths!

Angels are a part of God's plan of salvation. They announced Christ's birth (Luke 1:26-35; 2:10-14), ministered to Him at his temptation (Matt. 4:11; Luke 22:43), announced the empty tomb (Matt. 28:5-7; Mark 16:4–7; Luke 24:4-7), were present at his ascension into heaven (Acts 1:10-11), continually serve believers (Heb. 1:14), and they are always watching the behaviors of God's people (1 Cor. 11:10). They also rejoice at one sinner's repentance (Luke 15:7, 10). One might conclude that God's purpose in doing all that He does to bring glory to Himself is to put His saving grace on display before the angels "that the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known through the church to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places" (Eph. 3:10).

Note from the Book of Revelation the longing interest the angels have in redemption: "And [Christ] came and took the book out of the right hand of Him who sat on the throne. When He had taken the book, the four living creatures and the 24 elders fell down before the Lamb, each one holding a harp and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. And they sang a new song, saying, 'Worthy are You to take the book and to break its seals; for You were slain, and purchased for God with Your blood men from every

tribe and tongue and people and nation. You have made them to be a kingdom and priests to our God; and they will reign upon the earth.' Then I looked, and I heard the voice of many angels around the throne and the living creatures and the elders; and the number of them was myriads of myriads, and thousands of thousands, saying with a loud voice, 'Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and riches and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing'" (Rev. 5:7-12).

There is no greater pleasure in life than reading and studying the timeless words of God that the prophets recorded as Scripture. Of course once you do, all you want to do is tell others about it. And then you'll likely see others get excited too, and there is nothing more beautiful than that. Before you know it, Christ will come back and find you neck deep in his work. 

What do I owe my in-laws? That's an interesting question. Perhaps you feel caught between trying to please them (or trying to avoid offending them) on the one hand, and just wanting to be yourself or wanting your own "space" on the other. In concert with your mate, set reasonable boundaries; ask that he or she firmly and kindly insist that your in-laws respect these limits.

When you married, you also became part of another family with its own set of expectations. You need to recognize and respect those—within limits. What are those limits? Here are three things that "honoring" your in-laws does not mean:

- 1. It doesn't require that you submerge all your own feelings, desires, preferences, and needs in the service of "doing things their way."
- 2. It doesn't mean you must permit them to disrespect, control, or manipulate you for their own selfish ends.
- 3. It doesn't entail "obeying" all their "parental" requests or requirements—which, in some instances with some in-laws, may get pretty crazy.

Sometimes the most honoring response is to diplomatically but

firmly say, "No." Letting in-laws split, manipulate, or control you by silently acceding to their nutty, neurotic, inappropriate demands isn't necessarily showing Christian love. In-law conflicts grow more complicated when a spouse seems to side with his or her parents and against his or her mate. The mate may rightly feel outnumbered or "ganged up on." This isn't so much an in-law problem as a marital one. If one spouse remains too dependent upon his or her parents, that needs to be addressed in a straightforward way. If one spouse is blaming the in-laws for a disagreement the couple is experiencing, that should be dealt with, too. If you've become engaged in a quiet (or not so quiet) war with your in-laws—and maybe also with your spouse—about these tangled issues, don't let it erode your marriage further. Do the healthy thing and seek out a Christian therapist. -- copied
