COMMUNITY PATROL Coming to LOE!

### Please share this information with your household, guests, and service people!

Starting in January, our security company, ISSC, has been contracted to provide a community patrol. The patrol will initially be on site for two shifts each week, or a total of 84 hours.

The patrol's primary responsibility will be enforcement of traffic laws. The vehicle is equipped with a radar and camera. Speeding, driving through stop signs, passing loading and unloading school buses, damaging property (reckless driving), and (for non-residents) "piggy-backing" through a resident-only gate will be finable offenses. The amount of the fines are still being determined by the Board, but will be published soon. There will be a breakin period during which warnings will be issued.

Note that if you are a resident and do not have a current (red) LOE sticker on your windshield, the patrol officer may pull you over for piggybacking. Please understand that this sticker is the only way to quickly identify your car as belonging to a resident! Of course, showing your id will resolve the issue of your residency, but no one wants to go through the inconvenience of being pulled over. So, please, contact AMI if you do not have a red resident sticker for every vehicle in your household!

Unpaid fines will be subject to late fees and interest, and will be recorded as a deed restriction until paid. Visitors and service people who violate traffic rules will be ticketed and will further be subject to being banned from driving into the neighborhood.

Please be aware that there are some duties that the patrol officer is not expected to perform:

- The patrol officer cannot issue tickets for offenses not directly observed by him or her.
- The patrol is not meant to replace law enforcement or emergency response. The patrol can be notified of an incident after the proper authorities have first been called.
- The patrol officer is not trained as a pest / animal control officer.






### Motherhood




