## **BAK-PAK Critters Reading Program** Wags into Keith Elementary

#### BAK-PAK: Books and Kids, Power and Knowledge

Keith Elementary is participating in a very exciting reading program called BAK-PAK Critters Reading Program. This program is dedicated to helping children improve their reading skills by using specially trained therapy dogs. Teams consist of a handle and their therapy animal. Two teams work with 20 students during the school day on a one-on-one basis to help at-risk students improve their reading skills. Research shows that children who are below their peers in reading skills are often intimidated by reading aloud. The use of therapy pets reduces stress and students are more willing to interact with an animal than with another person.

Keith Elementary gives a special thanks to Lori King and Becky Talash for volunteering countless hours training their own pets to be certified therapy does. Their dogs kicked off the program in January and it has been a huge success.

More dogs are needed. You and your pet can become involved in this specialized animal assisted reading program which is sponsored by Oaks Presbyterian Church and partially funded by a grant for Williams. We do not want you to become lazy, but to imitate those who through faith and patience inherit what has been promised. Hebrews 6:12 NIV

Patient endurance is what you need now, so that you will continue to do God's will. Then you will receive all that he has promised. Hebrews 10:36 NLT

When I think about the word patience I imagine myself sitting around doing absolutely nothing waiting for something to happen. However, look what the word patience means in Greek in the above scriptures:

Patience-(Greek)-hypomonēsteadfastness, constancy, endurance; in the NT the characteristic of a man who is not swerved from his deliberate purpose

and his loyalty to faith and piety by even the greatest trials and sufferings.

According to the bible, patience means that you consistently do God's will without giving up! This type of patience pulls in the promises! Here is another scripture:

Truly the signs of an apostle were wrought among you in all patience, in signs, and wonders, and mighty deeds. 2 Corinthians 12:12 KJV

Again, the word patience in the above scripture is the Greek word; hypomonē! One of the signs of an apostle (apostle means "sent by God") is that they consistently do the will of God without giving up, in addition to bearing signs, wonders, and mighty deeds. Has God sent you on an assignment? If God has specifically assigned you to a task, this is an apostolic work! You can have an apostolic assignment without being called to the fivefold ministry of an apostle. Have you given up on an assignment? Or have you been patiently doing what God has called you to do? If you have, you will bear evidence of signs, wonders, and mighty deeds!

Prayer: Father God, I ask in the name of Jesus Christ that you give me the spirit of patience to do what you've called me to do. Amen

#### Did You Know?

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! (1 Peter 1:3)... Now in vv. 1-2, Peter proclaims that God elects some people for salvation based upon His foreknowledge of them. Now humans can have prior knowledge of some events (Acts 26:5; 2 Pet. 3:17), but when God is the subject of a passage "foreknow" means to "choose or determine before" (Acts 2:23; Rom. 11:2; 1 Pet. 1:2, 20). And He doesn't simply know the decisions those whom He foreknew will make (like choosing Christ for salvation), He foreknows them as His own children. Thus, God's intimate knowledge of them before the foundation of the world is the basis for His electing them for salvation. All are His creation, but all were not foreknown. Note that in Matthew 7:21-23 Jesus rejects some who call him "Lord, Lord," saying, "I never knew you. Depart from me you workers of lawlessness."

Note Peter's response to this doctrine: he blesses God; he worships Him. The word is a compound Greek word from "well" and "word"; hence, "well-spoken of." The English word "eulogy" stems from this Greek word, used at funeral for saying kind things about the dead.

What Peter is doing is describing the reality of the believer's salvation and his necessary response to it. That response, according to the usage of the word "blessed be God...," is something along the

lines of God is "worthy of praise." The point is that worship followed Peter's introduction of God's foreknowledge and election. Contrary to how most so-called Christians deal with the doctrine of election today with hatred, Peter found it worthy of praise! And why not? His praise and worship was the result of his proper understanding God's grace and peace in the fullest (v. 1). So although reject the doctrine of God's predestinating grace for His chosen and foreknown people, true believers not only receive it, they rejoice in it like Peter did. True believers rejoice in all of God's works, for that's what makes a Christian a Christian.

Of course blessing God sounds more like an action for God toward man, but Peter shows that it can and should actually take place by those who love God. It is what worship is, and it is prompted by the knowledge of how God saves through His foreknowledge and election through Christ. Whereas God has blessed His people with salvation and the ability to live, give, worship, and enjoy what He has created, those who realize such have the awesome privilege of offering praise and blessing right back to God. Christians must realize that what God has given to them, they are offer back in the form of praise and worship which is a blessing offered to God.

In the OT the Jews had blessed God as the One who led them (Continued on Page 37)

out of Egypt. They also blessed Him for His creation which accentuated His supreme rule over all things. Now in the NT dispensation, Peter models that Christians are to bless God as the Father of the Lord Jesus Christ. So, any discussion of God apart from the mention of Jesus is no discussion of God at all! Jesus Himself said, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me. If you had known Me, you would have known My Father also; from now on you know Him, and have seen Him" (John 14:6-7). The deity of Christ was not only stated by Jesus but also shown through miracles and healings which demonstrated his mercy toward hurting people who were suffering in this fallen world (Matt. 9:5-13; Mark 2:3-12). These actually proved that the OT God of the Jews was indeed merciful (Ex. 34:6; Ps. 108:4; Lam. 3:22; Mic. 7:18).

Right out of the gate Peter introduced the doctrines of grace: foreknowledge and election—doctrines that separate the men from the boys, as it were. These doctrines, along with the understanding that Jesus Christ IS God, are the ones that spur true worship. It's not about music firing us up to "worship," it's about blessing God for what He has done in eternity.

# **PERSONAL FINANCE** Debt Stacking - Get Out of Debt!

Modern financial planning has to address consumer debt to be realistic. Debt is the biggest blocker to financial success that I know of. And getting out of debt seems to be something most Americans want to do these days. This discussion will focus only on what is known as "bad debt" which includes credit cards and revolving charge accounts. If you would truly like to get out of debt, the first thing you need to do is stop incurring more debt on your credit cards. Pay cash for a month and track your "latte factor." There are several strategies to use from this point. You can transfer your balance to a lower rate card, but beware of the fees associated with transferring the balance. As I am fond of saying, the large print giveth and the fine print taketh away. You can also ask your lender or credit card company to lower your interest rate, but it has become tougher to achieve this.

Many clients benefit from doing a debt consolidation loan which can free up hundreds of dollars a month in cash flow. A powerful method which I recommend is called "Debt Stacking". Debt stacking allows you to use less money to pay off the same amount of debt more quickly. The method of Debt Stacking states that you pay off the highest interest rate debt first, while making just the minimum payments on all the other credit cards. When you pay off that high interest rate credit card, you then transfer the amount that you were paying monthly on that card to the next highest interest rate credit card. Let's look at an example. First, arrange your credit cards in order of highest to lowest interest rate:

- Revolving Charge Card A: \$4,000 at 24% APR, minimum payment \$100
- Credit Card B: \$5,000 at 18% APR, minimum payment \$100
- Credit Card C: \$3,000 at 12% APR, minimum payment \$100

Assuming that you are able to pay \$400 per month towards all credit cards, use the Debt Stacking method to pay \$200 towards Revolving Charge Card A until it is paid off. Then you would add that \$200 to the \$100 equaling \$300 that you would pay on Credit card B until it was paid off. Finally you would add the \$300 you were paying on Credit Card B to Credit Card C for a total of \$400 dollars

until the last one is paid off. In a comparatively short time you are out of debt. You will have paid less interest and gotten out of debt more quickly than if you had you paid the same amount of money spread equally over the three credit cards.

In conclusion, your steps to get out of debt are to stop incurring more debt, pay less interest on the debt you do have, spend smarter, and use the Debt Stacking Method. You'll be debt free much faster, and you will save a lot of money! -RICH KEITH

# Recipe of the Month

## Italian Bread

#### Ingredients

- 1 package Hot Roll Mix
- 4 ozs. grated Parmesan cheese
- 1 tablespoon parsley flakes
- 8 oz. shredded Mozarella cheese

- 1/4 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 8 oz. Ricotta cheese or 1 cup cottage cheese 1 egg

#### Directions

Follow instructions on Hot Roll Mix. Punch down & roll out to a rectangle about 18 x 12". Beat the egg with the ricotta or cottage cheese and spread on the dough. Sprinkle all remaining ingrediants over the dough. Roll up and place in a curved shape on a greased cookie sheet. Cut the dough almost through the roll about every inch. Let rise again for about 1 hour. Bake in 350° oven for about 40 minutes or until browned.

Less than a third of the selling price of a package of Girl Scout cookies goes toward the actual cost of the cookies. This means that more than two thirds of every Girl Scout cookie purchase goes toward programs and services to benefit girls. A portion of that goes directly to the troop/group selling the cookies.

Each Girl Scout council's volunteer board of directors determines the baker, the price per package of cookies, how revenue will be used to provide vital services in the community and how much money will be returned to troops/groups selling cookies for their projects and activities.

Within our Council, approximately half of the operating budget is funded by the Cookie Sale. The price for a package of cookies is \$3.50. Troops receive 56 to 63 cents of every cookie package they sell. Service units receive 3 cents per package. Troops/Groups and Service Units decide how they want to spend their bonus money. The national organization receives no funding from the cookie sale.

in an eye that appears to be normal. Two common causes are crossed eyes and a difference in the refractive error between the two eyes. If untreated, amblyopia can cause irreversible visual loss in the affected eye. (By then, the brain's "programming" will ignore signals from that eye.) Amblyopia is best treated during the preschool years.

- **Strabismus** is a misalignment of the eyes; they may turn in, out, up, or down. If the same eye is chronically misaligned, amblyopia may develop in that eye. With early detection, vision can be restored by patching the properly aligned eye, which forces the misaligned one to work. Surgery or specially designed glasses also may help the eyes to align.
- **Refractive errors** mean that the shape of the eye doesn't refract, or bend, light properly, so images appear blurred. Refractive errors also can cause eyestrain and/or amblyopia. Nearsightedness is the most common refractive error; others include farsightedness and astigmatism:
  - **Nearsightedness** is poor distance vision (also called myopia), which is usually treated with glasses or contacts.
  - **Farsightedness** is poor near vision (also called hyperopia), which is usually treated with glasses or contacts.

 Astigmatism is imperfect curvature of the front surface of the eye, which is usually treated with glasses if it causes blurred vision or discomfort.

Other eye conditions require immediate attention, such as retinopathy of prematurity (a disease that affects the eyes of premature babies) and those associated with a family history, including:

- **Retinoblastoma** is a malignant tumor that usually appears in the first 3 years of life. The affected eye may have visual loss and whiteness in the pupil.
- Infantile cataracts can occur in newborns. A cataract is a gradual clouding of the eye's lens.
- **Congenital glaucoma** in infants is a rare condition that may be inherited. It is the result of incorrect or incomplete development of the eye drainage canals before birth and can be treated with medication and surgery.
- Genetic or metabolic diseases of the eye, such as inherited disorders that make a child more likely to develop retinoblastoma or cataracts, may require kids to have eye exams at an early age and regular screenings.

Be sure to talk to your doctor if your child is at risk for any of these conditions. *(Continued on Page 49)* 



#### Your Child's Vison- (Continued from Page 48) GLASSES AND CONTACTS

Kids of all ages — even babies — can wear glasses and contacts. Keep these tips in mind for kids who wear glasses:

- Allow kids to pick their own frames.
- Plastic frames are best for children younger than 2.
- If older kids wear metal frames, make sure they have spring hinges, which are more durable.
- An elastic strap attached to the glasses will help keep them in place for active toddlers.
- Kids with severe eye problems may need special lenses called high-index lenses, which are thinner and lighter than plastic lenses.
- Polycarbonate lenses are recommended, especially for kids who play sports. Polycarbonate is a tough, transparent thermoplastic used to make thin, light lenses. However, although they're very impact-resistant, these lenses scratch more easily than plastic lenses.

Infants born with congenital cataracts may need to have their cataracts surgically removed during the first few weeks of life. Some children born with cataracts wear contact lenses at 6 months of age.

Around age 10, kids may express a desire to get contact lenses for cosmetic purposes or convenience if they play sports. Allowing a child to wear contacts depends on his or her ability to insert and remove lenses properly, faithfully take them out as required, and clean them as recommended by the doctor.

Your eye doctor can help you decide what type of vision correction is best for your child.

# THE GIVER BY LOIS LOWRY "A Perfect World?"

The Giver by Lois Lowry won the 1994 Newbery Medal. Considered a young adult book, I purchased it for my nephew, but wanted to preview it before giving it to him. While I thoroughly enjoyed the book (it is intensely deep and invited more thought and examination than any other book I've read in a long time), I don't think the content is appropriate for young adults. I'll explain this in more detail, but in preparation for writing this review, I noticed that The Giver is on many middle school reading lists, but it is also on many banned book lists and appeared on the American Library Association's list of the most challenged books of the 1990's.

Although I didn't give the book to my nephew, I think it is an excellent adult read. This book makes you really think. It describes a community that lives in what the author describes as a "perfect" world—one without pain, emotion (including love), color, decisions, surprises, memories, inconvenience and even temperature variations. While this is definitely not my idea of a perfect world, the people of this community of people live their daily lives in a very robotic and extremely organized way.

Each member of this community is assigned a specific role at the age of 12 and the main character, Jonas, is given the role of Giver. He is given all the memories of past generations where there was pain, love, hunger, the brilliance of color and he is responsible for holding all of these memories so no one else has to live through them. The way the Receiver transfers these memories to Jonas and the horrifically hard life that awaits Jonas is extremely interesting and creative.

When Jonas questions things—which he has never been permitted to do—he understands the very hard, but accepted way of life in his community. In particular, the "releasing" of the rule breakers, elders and anyone else who stands out or is an inconvenience to the group is heart wrenching—this is the part that is not for young adults.

The book is extremely creative; from the way the community and each family are structured to the unique role each person is assigned. It begs the question, "What would you give up to live in a more secure world?" and on the other hand, "What would you sacrifice to live life to the fullest?"

I definitely have Gathering Blue and Messenger on my reading list, two other books that are companion reads to The Giver.

# **Battling Boredom**

#### ARE YOU FINDING IT DIFFICULT TO GET

out of bed in the morning for your daily walk and making up excuses to skip the gym on the way home? Even the most dedicated exercisers occasionally get bored with their routine. Waning motivation, cutting workouts short and not having your old enthusiasm all are signs of a stale exercise regimen.

#### Quick Fix

First, evaluate your current routine to determine what really bores you. A new variation on your favorite activity such as cardio-funk or kickboxing instead of step aerobics, or hoisting free weights instead of working on machines may be enough to reinvigorate a stale routine.

If you've always worked out indoors, logging miles on a treadmill, stairclimber or stationary bike, move your workout outside for a welcome change of scenery. Run, hike or bike on trails; swim in a lake or ocean.

#### **Bigger Changes**

When tweaking your routine isn't enough, make bigger changes. Take up an entirely new activity — especially something you never thought you'd do. If you've always stuck to solitary pursuits, sign up for a team sport, such as volleyball, basketball or even doubles tennis. Or tackle something you've always shied away from — indulge your thirst for adventure with a rock-climbing class (start on an indoor wall, then move to the real thing as your skills improve).

#### Good Company

Working out alone often is an oasis of solitude in a busy day, but maybe you need some company. Exercise companions add a social element to any routine. Ask a friend to be your workout partner—you won't skip a workout if someone is waiting for you.

Just about every sport or activity has a club; to find one, ask around at gyms or local community centers. Keeping up with the crowd also means you'll be challenged to improve your skills. Ask about organized workouts and fun runs offered by local track clubs, as well as group rides hosted by cycling clubs.

#### Challenge Yourself

Many exercisers work out simply to stay in shape, and most of the time that's just fine. But setting a goal, such as

finishing a 10K race or completing a rough-water swim, will give your daily workouts more meaning.

Start by incorporating bursts of speed into your workouts. After a gentle warm-up, alternate a fast pace with a slower one for recovery. This can be as simple as sprinting to the next tree, or as structured as running intervals on a track or sprinting laps in the pool.

#### Add Variety

Elite triathletes pioneered the cross-training concept, and it works for the rest of us, too. If you usually focus on one activity, substitute another a few days a week. Ideally, any exercise program includes elements of cardiovascular exercise, weight training and flexibility.

#### New Toys

Small exercise gadgets aren't necessary, but they can make your workouts more fun and challenging. Heart-rate monitors, aquatic toys and safety equipment are just a few items to consider. Find out which new training gadgets are available for your favorite activity.

#### Take a Break

Sometimes you really do need time off. In that case, cut back on your usual routine, and substitute other activities. You might even find one that you enjoy more than your old favorites.

Once you've fought your first battle with boredom, you'll know the tricks to keep exercise from becoming too routine.
