




Do you take great photos?

Developer's Update

SUBDIVISION DEVELOPMENT

Taylor Woodrow Communities currently does not have any lot development under construction. Future phases of lots in the Bella Mar, Santaluz and the golf communities should start construction by mid-2010, depending upon home sales in the existing neighborhoods.

Custom lot sales continue in The Bluffs on south Quinlan Park Rd., Bellagio Estates on Lake Austin, and in the newest phase of the golf community, Shoreview Overlook, at the end of University Club Drive. COMMERCIAL/MIXED-USE DEVELOPMENT

Longhorn Canyon Townhomes – Kemp Management has completed the first 8 of the 29 townhomes located along the 5th hole of the UT Golf Club course immediately across Quinlan Park Rd from the Towne Square Community Center. For more information on this development please call Kemp Properties at 441-1062.

Fairways at Steiner Ranch – Patio home construction on this site along the 3rd through 6th holes of the UT Golf Club course

is on hold until a new builder can negotiate the purchase from the bank that took this property back in foreclosure from the previous builder/developer. More information about the development and sales hopefully will be forthcoming in the near future.

Commercial/Retail Quinlan Park Rd at RM 620 – A commercial / retail developer is performing due diligence on the southwest corner of Quinland Park Rd and RM 620 (mixed use 1A) for a proposed retail shopping center.

Taylor Woodrow Communities continues to receive interest from various developers for the remaining mixed-use development sites in Steiner Ranch. Vintage Fine Homes has completed city/county site plan approvals to build approximately 20 patio homes on Tract #18 along Steiner Ranch Blvd. across from the Monterone apartments. With the slow down in the local housing market they still have not announced a timeframe to begin construction on this site. Also, pre-leasing continues on the retail/office mixed use development on Tract #4 at the southwest corner of Quinlan Park Rd and Steiner Ranch Blvd. More information on these and other mixed-use sites will be available in the future as development plans progress.







STEINER STARS SWIM TEAMS REGISTRATION - Open to Returning 2009 Swimmers March 1st - 12th

Returning family registration for both Red and Blue Steiner Stars Swim Teams will occur March 1st-12th online with information to be found at www.steinerstars.org. At that time, all Stars families will be allowed to register for the team they swam for during the 2009 swim season. If a returning family fails to register online March 1st-12th, that family will lose returning family status and no longer have a spot on their prior team. Again, you MUST register for the team in which you swam for during the 2009 season. If you wish to request a transfer

between teams, please go to our website for more information on how your request will be processed. Your request will depend on available spots per age group per team; therefore, we CAN NOT guarantee that your request will be granted.

The Stars must limit the size of both teams due to pool availability for both meets and practices. Therefore, once returning family registration is closed, the Stars board will determine how many open spots for new swimmers per age group per team we have available. Those numbers will be posted on our website prior to new family registration.

New family registration will be held on

Friday, March 26th 7pm-9pm at Bella Mar Community Center. All registration information can be found on our website at www.steinerstars.org. Any family wanting to register for the Steiner Stars must bring a COMPLETED packet with payment in the form of a check to registration. Please make sure your child signs the NWSC Code of Conduct form that can be found in the registration packet. One parent per family must be present during the entire registration process in order for their packet to be accepted.

SHOOTING STARS DEVELOPMENTAL SWIM PROGRAM INFORMATION

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
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Steiner Ranch Ladies Win Tennis Championship in Houston



The Steiner Ranch ladies won the USPTA Texas State Team Tennis Championship in Houston in January. TRAILS UPDATE

We have seen frost and even ice on the trees this winter. Sometimes ice bends a branch down or even cracks it. If you see a branch hanging over the trail where it could be hazardous, just bring a hand saw on your next trip and cut it off. Note that any other cutting is never allowed in the greenbelts. Only your HOA is allowed to make trail repairs or reroutes - see below. And remember after a big rain it's best to stay off the trails for at least one day. This gives the water a chance to soak in and your boots or bike tires won't cause ruts in the trails.



With a new year comes a new HOA budget for fixing up the trails. Is your favorite trail in need of repair or in need of better sign locations? If you see a problem on the trails, call the HOA at 266-7553 or visit http://www.steinerranchhoa.org under "Report A Problem." Be specific about the location on the trail, the problem you see, your ideas for a solution, and your contact information.

Construction of any kind is not allowed on the greenbelts or along trails. Recently a type of fort was found on the Summer Vista trail

and this is not allowed by our HOA. Responsible parties are subject to fines. If you see any construction take a picture and contact the HOA.

Only the HOA is authorized to create trails in Steiner Ranch. Unfortunately, someone has been cutting down trees in our greenbelt trying to make rogue trail. These are not authorized trails and are actually dangerous routes. We don't wish to spend your HOA money trying to close and re-vegetate rogue trails. Instead, we want to hear from those who want new trails because we are actively looking

at routes within Steiner to expand our trail system. Would you like to help us plan new trails? Contact your trails committee to get involved at 266-8498 or come to the next Trails Committee meeting on Thursday March 4 at 7PM at Bella Mar. All residents are welcome to attend. A trail signage project team is now forming: We are designing a system of labels for our trail sign posts. To get connected here and volunteer your design skills, contact the trails committee at 266-8498.



In 1981, when Sid was 5 and Tommy Shane was 7, the Steiners sold the rodeo business. After that they were off the road for good and lived on the Steiner Ranch. About 11 years ago they moved to their cattle ranch between Bastrop and Elgin. That 9,000 acre ranch was started by Buck Steiner in 1930. Now Bobby is moving back here because they are building a home in the Caslano area. That area was the site of the original homestead. Bobby kept a lake lot, and bought some pieces back.

With Sid Steiner, Bobby feels that anything your kids do always seems and feels better than the things you did yourself. And his kids really impress him. With Sid, they really didn't want him to rodeo, but then all of a sudden he did. Not through coaching from his parents; he just really wanted to do it. When Sid won the world championship and

retired, Bobby was thankful because he knew that nobody gets rich in the rodeo world and Sid got out at the right time. After all, Sid never liked life on the road as his dad Bobby had, and it was probably because Sid started when he was older.


Bobby feels his mom and dad died too soon. But it's not how long you live but how you live your life, he says, and Tommy and Beverly had a very full life. Tommy and Bobby talked about building a steakhouse in the spot where it is now. They drew up plans. Unfortunately Tommy died 2 years later, and it got shelved. A few years later, Steiner Ranch was bigger and the need was more apparent for the Four Points Area. Bobby sat down with Don Burnet and drew up new plans. They wanted an elegant place that you could eat delicious food for a reasonable price and where you could really dress up and have

a fabulous meal, all under the same roof. The Steakhouse has exceeded expectations since it opened.

Now Bobby is interested in what his kids and his grandkids are doing. Bobby's grandson plays local flag football and Bobby sometimes goes to practice. Ranching is important but so is balance. He loves the Steakhouse. He really wants to move back to Steiner Ranch so he can be closer to the family and back on this property. He falls in love with his grandkids imperfections, which he wasn't able to do with his own children. The things that irritate him with his kids, he finds amusing and interesting in his grandkids. SPRING IS IN THE AIR

...and that means lawn maintenance!

Spring is on the way - we can only hope that the rain comes with it. What else comes are weeds! Weed seeds respond to rising soil temperatures and begin to germinate. A lot of the spring time weeds can be managed by a strong, healthy and thick turf. If the turf is weak, thin and sickly, then weeds are more likely. Use of pre-emergent weed control products are in order if the turf is weak. Most garden centers have different choices and you should ask them for their advice. Always follow the directions. DO NOT use the old adage that "if a little is good more is better". Too much preemergent product is never better. These products come with a bit of fertilizer which is good because you do not need much fertilizer right now. The typical spring fertilization that will kick start your turf comes in late March or early April, so for now treat your lawn with pre-emergent products if necessary and enjoy the glory of spring.

Remember that all homeowners must keep all shrubs, trees, grass and plantings of every kind on their lot, including any Common Area platted as a part of their lot, cultivated, pruned, mowed, edged and free of trash and other unsightly materials.

If you use a lawn service or do it yourself, make sure your lawn clippings are disposed of correctly and remember to keep the bags of clippings out of site and put them at the curb on trash day only.

If your neighbors are not keeping their lawns maintained, it affects everyone, so please let the Association's Office know by going to www.steinerranchhoa. org and click on the "Report a Problem" link.

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Playscape Structure Submittal

If you are thinking about getting the kids a playscape, don't forget that it will need to be reviewed to the Architectural Committee first. Things you should keep in mind when selecting a playscape:

- Must be constructed with a lumber that resist rotting and deterioration, i.e. redwood or treated lumber.
- Canopies on the playscape must be a solid color, preferably green or earth tone.
- Setbacks for playscapes are to be no less than 5' from each property line.
- Views of the playscape must be minimized from public streets and adjoining units.

Once you've decided on the playscape and location, complete the Architectural Modification form and include the requested items (i.e. photo of playscape, description of materials to be used, etc.) along with the required \$500 refundable deposit check to the Association for review by the Architectural Committee.

Nesting Season Approaches for Endangered Birds

Two endangered species of birds, the Black-Capped Vireo (BCV) and the Golden-Cheeked Warbler (GCW), will again be making their home in Steiner Ranch this spring. These songbirds are native to this area and their nesting seasons begin soon. Why is this important to know? Several of the trails established in Steiner Ranch make their way through the Balcones Canyonland Preserve (Powerline Hill and Eastridge trails) where many of the birds reside. The birds are especially sensitive to environmental changes during nesting season. The established trail rules were designed to minimize the effect humans have on the birds during this period. Though the Steiner Ranch Master Association (SRMA) has the right to install and maintain trails in the Preserve, violations of these rules could force closure of the trails through the end of the nesting season.

GCW Nesting Season – March 1st through July 31st BCV Nesting Season – March 15th through August 31st


Please review the following trail rules before your next hike:

- . The trails are for Steiner Ranch residents, their guests, and persons with written authorization from Taylor Woodrow Communities/Steiner Ranch, Ltd. ONLY.
- 2. Trail hours will be from dawn until dusk. There will be no access of the trails allowed after dark.
- 3. Use of the trails is at your own risk.
- 4. Only use of designated trails is allowed. Leaving designated trails is prohibited.
- 5. No motorized vehicles are allowed.
- 6. No horses are allowed.
- 7. No feeding animals.

- 8. Bikes are allowed only on Hike-and-Bike Trails. Bikes must yield to pedestrians.
- 9. No loitering.
- 10. No hunting.
- 11. No cooking, fires, or smoking.
- 12. No camping.
- 13. All pets must be on a leash at all times.
- 14. No littering or dumping is allowed.
- 15. Do not disturb natural landscapes. Be cautious of plants and wildlife in their native habitat.

In addition to the rules above, the following apply only to the Permitted Trails in the Conservation Easement (Powerline Hill and Eastridge trails):

- 1. No picnicking.
- No tape recordings of birdcalls or other wildlife.
- 3. Access permitted at trailhead access points only.

Facilities Available for Rent

Do you have a holiday party or wedding reception to plan? Baby shower too big for the backyard? Birthday party coming up? How about a school/office party? Is your living room too small for a large celebration? We can accommodate a gathering of any size for a very reasonable price!

Being a resident of Steiner Ranch has many advantages. One of them is our variety of facilities that are available to rent. Many of you do not even realize that we have two indoor clubhouses with full kitchens! Another benefit is our electronic key tags that long ago replaced the "old-fashioned" keys that give you access to all indoor and outdoor facilities. If you do not have a facility tag or if you have lost* yours, please visit the HOA office to pick one up!

To rent any one (or more) of our facilities just follow these easy steps:

- 1. When and Where? Go to our website at www.steinerranchhoa.org and click on Facility Reservations (on the left). The available areas have a hyperlink that you can click on to check availability. Once you have the date and time in mind, call the Associations Management Office to place your name on the calendar.
- 2. First come, first served. Your reservation is only good for TWO days until you turn in your completed reservation form and make full payment (including deposit, if required). We will not make calls to remind you to pay. If you have not made a payment for your reservation after the two days, your reservation will be relinquished.
- 3. What now? Once you have turned in your payment and paperwork, you need not do anything else. The HOA office will activate your facility tag and post a sign at each

- designated facility letting all visitors know you have it rented.
- 4. What do you get for your money? All reservations are set and priced for 6 hour blocks. Even if you plan to use it for only 2 hours you must pay the minimum price. All of our outdoor covered pavilions and uncovered areas and parks are \$25. You do not have to rent out the parks unless you want a guaranteed spot. Towne Square is our larger indoor facility that can hold 80 seated persons and costs \$100. Bella Mar is our newer facility that can hold 40 seated persons and is \$75. Both indoor facilities require a \$300 deposit.
- 5. Cleaning Up. Please remember that there may be a reservation coming in right after you. You are required to clean up after your event. We have a maintenance staff on-site that checks in and takes pictures of damage and/or untidiness of the facilities. You may opt for our staff to clean up after you for an additional \$100. (You are still required to dispose of your trash.)
- 6. <u>Cancelling</u>. If you need to cancel your reservation please call the Association Management Office at least 3 days prior to your reservation for a full refund.

Please call (512) 266-7553 if you have additional questions.

*If you have lost your facility tag, it needs to be reported as LOST immediately to prevent it from getting into the wrong hands. There is a \$20 replacement fee required to obtain a new tag.

Please note: The Steiner Ranch HOA provides each facility "as is" with tables and chairs. Outdoor heaters, fire pits, set-up/break-down and ashtrays are not provided.

Architectural Modification Requirements

So you've decided to do some improvements or make changes to the outside of your home..... what do you do now?

- I. Complete the Architectural Modification form (owner only)
- 2. Include any addendum forms such as for a pool or deck
- 3. Include a scaled drawing showing plan and elevation views of the proposed improvements, modifications or alterations. Submittals must include samples depicting the proposed materials and colors to be used.
- 4. A lot survey (which the owner receives at closing) indicating the location of proposed improvements, and any applicable easements, setbacks, and elevation differences on lot.
- 5. Deposit check in the amount of \$500





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

Climbing water tanks and painting initials on them used to be a teenage rite of passage, and considered a harmless prank. Now, antiterrorism laws make tampering with or even unauthorized entry into any public water facility a serious federal offense punishable by lengthy jail time. In addition, the height of the tanks (120-140 ft) and high winds at those altitudes makes them extremely dangerous places even for experienced personnel with the proper safety equipment. District 17 uses a variety of entry deterrents on both water and wastewater facilities including high fences, barbed wire, and razor wire. It is possible to sustain serious injury just trying to climb a fence. Likewise, opening or closing a fire hydrant improperly can cause serious damage to the surrounding piping and valves.

Please report any suspicious activity around water tanks, hydrants, or water pumping stations to the District office or emergency pager after hours. You can help keep your water supply safe!

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LANDSCAPE LADY:

When to Prune

When to Prune: Since we have had (at least) 2 freezes, it is safe to cut back browned and damaged foliage. The key is to only remove what is absolutely necessary at this time. If you can possibly wait until after last frost free date, it is best to wait. Pruning stimulates new growth which is what you DO NOT want at this time. If you are only cutting into browned material, go for it. Cutting into green tissue or wood will cause the plant to re-sprout

early. This early, tender growth might be damaged if we have another frost. If plants like liriope, knockout roses, lantanas and other perennials, palms and cycads (Sagos) are heavily damaged, they should not be trimmed back until late March or early April. At that time, all browned leaves/fronds should be removed at the base of the leaf

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Millions of Window Shades and Blinds Recalled

WHAT HAPPENED

All Roman shades and pull-up blinds were recalled voluntarily in the United States by the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and Window Covering Safety Council (WCSC) due to the risk of strangulation to young kids.

Health Canada also issued an advisory alerting parents to the potential strangulation hazard of Roman shades and pull-up blinds. According to the CPSC, in a single year consumers purchase about 5 million Roman shades and 3 million pull-up blinds.

WHAT THIS MEANS

The CPSC is aware of five deaths and 16 near strangulations in Roman shades since 2006 as well as three deaths in roll-up blinds since 2001. Strangulations in Roman shades are possible when a child pulls the cord out of the shade and wraps it around the neck or when a child places his or her neck between the exposed inner cord and the fabric on the

backside of the blind.

In roll-up blinds, strangulations can occur if a child's neck becomes entangled in a lifting loop that has slid off the side of the blind or if a child places his or her neck between the roll-up blind fabric and the lifting loop.

WHERE THIS PRODUCT WAS SOLD

Major retailers in the United States and Canada, including Walmart (500,000 Roman shades and 600,000 roll-up blinds), J.C. Penney (more than 2.2 million Roman shades and about 340 roll-up blinds), and Pottery Barn (along with Pottery Barn Kids and PBTeen; about 305,000 Roman shades and 45,000 roller shades; an additional 85,000 Roman shades were recalled in August 2009), and online.

WHAT TO DO NEXT

Additionally, the CPSC and the WCSC suggest taking these measures:

Examine all shades and blinds at home to ensure there aren't any accessible cords on the front, side, or back of the product — and if there are any, make them inaccessible to young children.

If possible, install cordless window coverings in homes where kids live or visit.

Place cribs, beds, and furniture away from the windows to prevent kids from climbing on them to reach the cords on the window coverings.

Install tension devices in shades that have looped bead chains or nylon cords to keep the cords tight.

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Have You Been Phished?

Phishing (sounds just like fishing) is what thieves on the internet do to get your personal information. In fact, it is just like fishing – they use bait (and you are the fish.)

What does phishing look like? It can look like an email from your bank. They tell you that there has been suspicious activity with your bank account, and in order to avoid having the account frozen you need to click a link and verify your information on their web site. If you click the link, it will take you to a web page that looks just like your banks login page. You enter your username and password, you may then see a page saying thank you for validating your information, or you may see an error page that says please try again later. The problem is you didn't actually go to your bank's web site; instead you just gave your login information to the bad guys.

Another scheme frequently seen at this time of year is an email from the IRS and SURPRISE, it's good news! You are eligible for a tax refund, and all you have to do is click on the link and submit your tax refund request. And oh, if you don't respond within 48 hours they will assume the refund in invalid and it will be suspended. You'll be in for another surprise when you later find out that it wasn't really the IRS, and you gave your personal information, including your social security number to the bad guys.

Who are these bad guys? How come they don't get caught? Well, you'll find them in China, eastern European countries and Russia. That's why you'll often find these emails filled with poor or awkward grammar. They buy lists of email addresses and send them out by the millions. There are lots of "phish" in the ocean, but you only have to catch a few to make a lot of money.

How do you protect yourself from phishing attacks? First and most important, NEVER click on links in email. Even if you get an email from a friend, are you sure they intentionally sent it? Many viruses will scan through an address book and then send an email to everyone with a generic message like "this is so funny, check it out" or "did you see this video of you online?" If you're not expecting the email, DON'T CLICK. The same goes for attachments. Don't fall for fake messages from UPS, FedEx, etc. Ask yourself "did I give them my email address?" You probably didn't, so you can be sure they didn't send it.

The Internet is a big world filled with gleaming cities and dark alleys. As long as you're aware that there are bad guys who are trying to steal from you, simple precautions and common sense will keep you safe.

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
