# January HOA Meeting Highlights

- The HOA board members had fourteen homeowners join them at the January HOA meeting which was held on January 28th. The board continues to encourage everyone to come and participate in our HOA meetings every 4th Thursday of the month.
- A homeowner requested that the board allow a neighborhood garage sale this summer. Although our deed restrictions forbid garage sales in our community, the board agreed to allow the garage sale if a coordinator could be appointed and if community interest exists.
- Two of our resident Scouts proposed Eagle Scout projects to the board for consideration. Approval to construct benches near the playground/soccer field area was granted.
- The group assembled to address neighborhood traffic and parking concerns provided the board with an



## **Green Up Your Home**

- <u>Leaky Toilets, Sinks and Showerheads:</u> One drip can waste up to 20 gallons of water a day! To diagnose a toilet leak, add a few drops of food color (not blue or green) to the tank. Wait 30 minutes, check to see if the color has seeped into the bowl.
- <u>Shower Curtains:</u> Many are made of PVC (polyvinyl chloride), which contains volatile organic compounds (VOCs) that have been linked to a variety of health problems. Replace with cloth or look for PVC-free plastic shower curtains.
- <u>Closets/Dressers:</u> Don't use mothballs! They contain naphthalene, a chemical classified as a potential carcinogen by the EPA. Keep pests out of your clothes with pine or rosemary sachets.
- <u>Air Fresheners:</u> Many contain phthalates, which have been linked to health risks. Instead, grind lemon, lime or orange peels or baking soda in the garbage disposal. You can also put baking soda in trash cans. And on a pretty day, open the windows and let the fresh air (or as fresh as it gets here) in.
- <u>Catalogues:</u> They're like rabbits...multiplying all the time. Save some trees. Get off the mailing lists and limit to the ones you really want by going to: catalogchoice.org.

#### THE RECIPE BOX

Field Greens, Crumbled Blue Cheese and Spicy Pecans

#### VINAIGRETTE

- 2/3 c. sugar
- 1 t. dry mustard
- 1 t. salt
- 2/3 c. distilled
- 3 T. apple cider vinegar
- 4 ½ t. onion juice
- 2 T. Worcestershire sauce
- 1 c. vegetable oil

#### SPICY PECANS


- 2 large egg whites
- 1 ½ t. salt
- 3/4 c. sugar melted
- 2 t. Worcestershire sauce
- 2 T. Hungarian paprika

#### **SALAD**

- 4 c. mixed field greens
- 2 green onions, chopped
- 4 oz, blue cheese, crumbled
- 1 Granny Smith apple, cored, seeded & chopped
- 1/4 c. Spicy Pecans, coarsely chopped
- 1 ½ t. cayenne pepper
- 4 ½ c. pecan halves
- 6 T. unsalted butter.

and cooled

- VINAIGRETTE: Combine sugar, dry mustard, salt and vinegars. Stir until sugar is dissolved. Whisk in onion juice and Worcestershire. Add oil slowly, whisking continuously until blended.
- SALAD: Toss greens, onions, blue cheese, apple and pecans in a salad bowl. Add vinaigrette, tossing to coat.
- <u>SPICY PECANS</u>: Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Beat egg whites with salt until foamy. Add sugar, Worcestershire paprika and cayenne. Fold in pecans and melted butter. Spread pecans evenly on a baking sheet. Bake 30 to 40 minutes, stirring every 10 minutes. Remove from oven and cool. Store pecans in an airtight container (may be frozen). Yields 4 ½ cups.
