

Pickers and listener are welcome. No charges. Just fun Jammin or listening.



What Can You Do About Soliciting In The Neighborhood?

Many communities are ripe targets for solicitors – for a variety of reasons. While the Association has no real control over soliciting activities, we have tried to discourage solicitors from marketing in our community by placing "no soliciting" signs in common areas.

The reason that we cannot prevent soliciting is that the streets and roadways within the community are public access ways owned and maintained by the county. This means that no person or persons may be prevented from entering the community. Of course, if an individual or individuals are in the process of breaking the law, the Sheriff or other law enforcement officer can take immediate action.

Your Association recommends the following actions that every owner can take to discourage unwelcome soliciting in the community:

- Report all suspicious persons to the Sheriff's Department and request the deputies on duty be made aware of your concerns.
- Promptly remove all flyers left on your front or garage door.
- Promptly report to the Post Office all flyers left on the mailboxes.
- Refuse to make use of solicitors' offers and refuse to patronize any company being marketed in this manner.
- Notify the managing agent of any companies presently soliciting so that letters can be sent advising them of this policy of not permitting door to door soliciting (they will be reminded of the community newsletter and/or the Green Sheet as marketing options).
- Individual homeowners have the ability to place a small "No Trespassing/No Soliciting" sign at the entry to their homes.





Pressure Free Interview

As I drove at a snail's pace in rush-hour-traffic toward the Fox affiliate station in Houston, Texas, I began running through some possible responses to questions I anticipated from the station's news anchor. I had been asked to appear on the morning news program for an interview about my recent book, Hugs Bible Reflections for Women.

When scheduling the interview, my publicist told me she hoped to send a copy of the interview to Fox's national news coordinator with the goal of securing an appearance on Fox's national morning news program. She ended the call by enthusiastically saying, "I'll be watching you!"

I felt tremendous pressure to make the message in my book appeal to the diverse audience that would be viewing a mainstream news program. I'd done enough media interviews to understand that the station would expect me to use terms like "my faith" instead of "Christianity". I knew full well that it was politically correct to avoid using the name of Jesus. I tried to convince myself that toning down my message would enable the book to get into the hands of more women who wouldn't normally study the Bible.

However, as I thought through ways to avoid offending the nonbelieving viewers, I had a sick feeling come over me. I realized that the only motivation for rehearsing politically correct responses would be to secure more interviews with secular media outlets.

I thought of Paul's words in Philippians 2:3, "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit..." A spirit of conviction came over me as I my life verse began playing in my head, "My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, so that your faith might not rest on men's wisdom, but on God's power" (1 Corinthians 2:4-5).

Tears welled up in my eyes and I cried out to God, "All I want to do is glorify You! This interview is Yours. Please give me the words, Lord God, and forgive me for allowing selfish ambition to enter my heart."

I pulled into the parking lot of the station with a heavy heart. But as I entered the double glass doors, a sense of peace engulfed me. The pressure was gone and I didn't step into the studio with canned responses ready to roll eloquently off my tongue. Instead, I entered as a humbled servant on a mission, dependent upon the Spirit of my Jesus to guide me through that interview.

The tape of that interview will probably never make its way to the station's national news coordinator. I wasn't disrespectful of

Make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you... (1 Peter 3:15).

With the plethora of world religions that exist today, and knowing that all can't be true, where should one begin their search for truth? Here's four reasons to start with Christianity.

First, the uniqueness of biblical Christianity is that it actually invites scrutiny while encouraging people to investigate its claims—about God, man, and the universe itself. And because Christianity hinges on investigative truth, it is both testable and scientific. Essentially, Christianity hangs on one vital point: the physical resurrection from the dead by Jesus of Nazareth three days after being crucified by the Romans. The Apostle Paul wrote: "If Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith" (1 Cor. 15:12ff.). Contrary to the Christian faith, religions like Hinduism, Buddhism, and Mormonism espouse the so-called truth of their faith in feelings—from Nirvana to the "burning in the bosom." Not so with Christianity, for it is scientific in that it can be investigated historically and taught with logic and reason. Better still, it can be shown to be true whether one experiences a feeling related to it or


Second, the seeker of truth should begin with Christianity in order to note that salvation is presented as a free gift from God for those who will trust in Him alone. Nothing is required except faith.

In other religions, however, if God is even a part of them (and in Buddhism, Atheism, and Agnosticism He is not), the Deity himself must be appeased through great efforts on the seeker's part (e.g., terrorism and suicide!). Adherents to other religions must strive valiantly to change their cognitive ideas, feelings, and behaviors all in an effort to please their Deity. One of the problems of these kinds of religions is that there is no way to gauge one's progress in order to know whether or not the Deity is actually appeased. In most, people have to wait until they die and face the Deity to see if they can live in Paradise.

Third, the beliefs of biblical Christianity are fully consistent with the laws of the universe—laws of logic, science, and reason. Contrary to how Christianity if often presented, one does not have to have blind faith to be a Christian. On the contrary, Christianity paints a picture of the world that is in perfect keeping with the way the world really is. Take the problem of evil in the world today. First, to even label something as evil (and all do) is to make a judgment call based on what seems to be right. And in the Christian worldview, right and wrong are clearly spelled out not only in the Bible but in the hearts of all men (Rom. 2:14-15). Hinduism and Buddhism for

instance, have no written moral code, so not only is evil undefined, it is actually relegated to a state of mind, specifically illusion. That's right! So, the Holocaust was not evil; rather, its atrocities were only an illusion, for without a moral code, there can be no right and wrong. In these religions, suffering must be understood properly so that it can it be overcome. You just relegate it to illusion and ignore it as the Buddha did. In Christianity, however, evil and suffering are part of the fallen world where sin is running its course through man's rebellion against God. Once sin is understood, evil and suffering are simple to explain.

Fourth, the seeker of truth should note that in Christianity Jesus is the epicenter of the faith. Oddly enough, he is respected by most other faiths as a great prophet, and he is often merged into them as a model for goodness. Even in Islam Jesus is exalted, at times even higher than Mohammed. But as the epicenter of Christianity, the religion stands or falls solely on his existence as God incarnate, risen from the dead, and coming again. Thus, if all of these religions utilize Jesus and his teachings and life, ought not the seeker of truth start with Jesus of Nazareth?



I'm Texas Energy Analyst Alan Lammey. Maybe you've heard me on the radio talking about the market forces that drive energy prices. I'm here to tell you that you're not stuck paying those high prices to big electric companies anymore!

Why pay more than you have to?

DOYOU LIKE FREE SOFTWARE?

Hey, everybody likes free software – just be careful what you get. Enter anything you want into a Google search with the word FREE and all kinds of things will show up. If you're not careful, you can download a FREE VIRUS – how's that for a deal?

For you readers, here are a few of my favorite free software choices that won't get you into trouble:

For Windows machines, I like Picasa for doing simple editing and cleanup of photos. It's from the folks at Google and you can find it just by going to www.Picasa.com (note that it's Picasa ending with an "a" and not Picasso like the painter with the additional "s"". Do you shop online and like to keep the receipts? Rather than printing them out and storing them in a filing cabinet, use CutePDF to "print" your receipts (or anything else that can be sent to a printer) into a PDF file that you can save on your hard drive. I buy a lot online and CutePDF lets me store all the receipts into a folder on my hard drive that makes life much easier at tax time for my accountant (which is this month if my calendar is correct.) You can download CutePDF at www.CutePDF.com, just download the CutePDF Writer. It installs as if it were a printer and you're ready to go.

For the Mac, Anxiety is a useful to-do list manager to (hopefully) reduce the stress in your life in getting all the things you need to get


done, done. It works with iCal and Mail. You can download it at http://www.anxietyapp.com/. Carbon Copy Cloner lets you backup your entire hard drive to another, allowing you to boot to the 2nd drive should the first one fail completely (and it happens more often than you know.) Download it at http://www.bombich.com/.

Stay away from sites offering free music or movies (like LimeWire), this is an excellent way to contract a virus. If you think you're getting something that costs money in a store for free online, it's probably going to cost you more than you know by the time you get your computer cleaned up.

Be skeptical and be safe. One of the best places to go for free software is http://sourceforge.net/. You're not going to find Microsoft Office for free, but you might find a program that does something close. Want Photoshop but don't have \$400 to spend, then check out Gimp. There are a lot of genuinely nice people developing programs because they enjoy doing it. Some will ask for but not require a donation, that's only fair. If you like a program, throw a few dollars their way to encourage them to keep improving their program. If you can say "I wish I had a program that", then you'll probably find something at SourceForge.net that meets your needs.



- Continuously educate children on water safety. This is a great thing to do at home, on the boat, at the pool, wherever there is water. Each time you are getting your little one ready for a swim session or water play, go over the
- rules of water safety. Repetition is key with small children. Make sure your swim instructor incorporates a "Safety Lesson of the Week" into its lesson curriculum. This includes questions about water safety and how to avoid dangerous situations.
- 3. Designate a "Water Watcher." This is a responsible adult who sticks to alcoholfree beverages during swim time and who is in charge of keeping both eyes on the pool while it is in use. Or, better yet: consider renting a Lifeguard for your party or group event.

- 4. Remove all pool toys, floaters, ring buoys and other child-enticing items from the pool area when it is not in use. One wrong reach for that floating rubber ducky could be disaster.
- 5. Clear homes of common household items that can be dangerous to a curious toddler. It takes just 2 inches of water for a child to drown in a bucket. Put all mop buckets, dog dishes and coolers out of children's reach.
- 6. Never leave a young child in the pool or bathtub--even "just to get the phone."
- 7. Enroll your child in swim classes. Start lessons early. The longer a child has lessons the more they understand water safety. A great time to do this is in the spring! This way your kids are already prepped and ready to roll for the summer swim season. You'll want to find an inside heated pool and lesson times geared towards working families.
- 8. Supervise, Supervise, Supervise! Try to have your eyes on your children in and around the pool at all times. Adults should always be present when any child is in the pool area.

Let's help our kids love the water while also respecting it by being safe and well-trained at all levels.



Do you have a favorite playground? Maybe it's a new wooden one that has lots of tall towers and passageways. Or maybe your favorite is an old-fashioned playground with swings and a seesaw. Playgrounds are fun places for kids because there's so much to do and other kids to have fun with. But sometimes kids get hurt at playgrounds. That's no fun, so here are 10 ways to keep safe:

I. Take a grown-up. As kids get bigger, they like doing things on their own. Going to the playground shouldn't be one of them, though. Grown-ups come in handy because they might spot problems at the playground, they can help you down if you get in a tight spot, and they can help if you happen to get hurt.

- 2. Take a good look around. If the playground has lots of trash, such as broken glass, or the equipment looks broken, don't play there.
- 3. Keep your size in mind. Many playgrounds have some equipment that's for little kids (like 2- to 5-year-olds) and other equipment that's meant for older kids. Use the equipment that's right for your age. If you squeeze yourself onto a swing for toddlers, you might get stuck. Likewise, if your little brother or sister starts climbing something meant for older kids, guide him or her to the little kid stuff.
- 4. Don't go too high. Many playgrounds have tall stuff to play on, such as towers or open passageways between equipment. Don't climb higher than you feel comfortable, and feel free to ask your grown-up if you need help getting down. Never climb up the outside of equipment, or hoist yourself up on the roof. The view might be cool, but it's a long way down.
- **5. Look out below.** The best playgrounds put down special surfacing material, such as mulch, wood chips, sand, gravel, or rubber matting. These surfaces can help soften a fall, but that doesn't mean you won't get hurt, especially if you tumble from a high spot.
- **6. Swing safely.** Kids often get hurt at the playground because they get hit by someone on a swing. If you're

- swinging, watch out for people who might be getting too close. And if you're walking around the playground, don't get too close to the swingers.
- 7. Use your head. Sometimes you'll see kids going headfirst down the slide or maybe two or three kids will get on a piece of equipment that's only meant for one. Or some kids might start goofing around and trying to push each other off a swing or off of a high spot. If your grown-up sees you doing this, he or she will probably say, "Knock it off. Someone's going to get hurt." It's true, so try to use the playground equipment properly. And if you get stuck, or don't know how to get down from something, call your grown-up over so he or she can help you down.
- **8. Report problems.** If you see graffiti (when people write or paint on stuff), a broken swing, or find any other problems while you're playing, tell your grown-up. He or she can report the problem so it can be fixed.
- **9. Clean up.** If you bring a drink or snack to the playground, clean up your trash before you leave. When you do, the park will look nice when the next kid comes along to play and you will have shown that you're a good playground citizen.
- I 0.Have a great time! How can you make a good time at the playground even better? Bring a friend and only complain a little when it's time to leave.
