US CENSUS INFO

April 1, 2010 is Census Day. An accurate census of our area will benefit our school district and community by influencing the distribution of \$300 billion in federal funds earmarked for states and local communities. In order to accomplish this, it is important that everyone participates. Census information is confidential by law and no other agency has access to the personal data.

I have included information for you to share with other community members:

- The U.S. census is taken every 10 years.
- Census questionnaires will be mailed or delivered to households in March.
- The questionnaire is short and asks only a few simple questions-name, relationship,gender, age and date of birth, race and whether the respondent owns or rents his or her home.
- Questionnaires are returned by mail.
- Census takers will visit households between April and July if the questionnaires have not been returned by April 1.

How is census information used?

- To distribute Title 1 and special education funding, which impacts school district budgets
- To distribute funds for college tuition grant and loan programs
- To build new roads and plan for public transportation
- To redistrict state legislatures, county and city councils and voting districts
- To determine areas eligible for housing assistance
- To plan for hospitals, nursing homes and clinics
- To direct funds for people in poverty
- To develop assistance programs for low-income families
- Taking the time to complete the census form supports our school district and the Cy-Fair
- community.

Want 10 good reasons to fill out your 2010 Census questionnaire?

2010 Census Information is needed to:

- 1. Direct services to children and adults with limited English language proficiency.
- 2. Determine areas eligible for housing assistance.
- 3. Attract new businesses to state and local areas.
- 4. Develop adult education programs.
- 5. Plan budgets for government at all levels.
- 6. Plan for hospitals, nursing homes, clinics, and locationsof other health services.
- 7. Direct fund for people in poverty.
- 8. Develop assistance programs for low-income families.
- 9. Create maps to speed emergency services tohouseholds in need of assistance.
- 10. Make decisions at all levels of government.

POOL SEASON IS COMING SOON!! The Riata Ranch swimming pool will be open weekends in May. Please see reverse side for dates and times. Greater Houston Pool will be handling pool management again. Their number is 713-771-7665: feel free to contact them for any pool related questions or concerns (except pool registration) and to schedule pool parties. Please follow these steps to register for the 2010 swim season:

POOL REGISTRATION PROCEDURES:

- 1. Complete the enclosed Pool Registration Form. List all family members residing (full time) in your home in need of pool tags. All assessments must be paid in full. Swimmers must be homeowners and residents in good standing to register for the pool. All information must be filled out especially the Emergency Contact. Failure to do so will delay processing.
- 2. Mail the COMPLETED registration form, to the office of SCS Management Services, 7170 Cherry Park Drive, Houston Texas 77095, fax to 281-500-7167 or email to mluttrell@scsmgmt. com.
- 3. PLEASE NOTE: YOUR REGISTRATION FORM MUST BE RECEIVED BEFORE JUNE 1. ANY REQUESTS FOR

TAGS AS OF JUNE 1 WILL BE SUBJECT TO A \$35.00 PROCESSING FEE.

- 4. Everyone must have a tag and worn at all times in pool area. Members may invite one guest per tag holder.
- 5. Initial registration will be done entirely by mail. Tags will not be available for walk-in registration until June 1.
- 6. For lost, misplaced or stolen pool tags, there will be a \$50.00 charge per tag.
- 7. Fees not paid in full prior to June 1, 2010 will not be allowed pool privileges for the 2010 pool season. This does not apply to new homeowners.
- 8. A limit of six (6) pool tags per address will be issued per household. Applicants requiring more than 6 tags should note the circumstances on the back of the registration form for Board review.

9. You will not be allowed entry into the pool without pool tags. LATE REGISTRATION PROCEDURES:

1. Effective June 1st, any request for tags will incur a processing fee of \$35 per household. The processing fee will need to be

Luke Bowman sped to a 1st place finish in the 50 fly, and 2nd in the 50 breast. Luke was cheered on by his grandfather – Coach Eddie Reese of the University of Texas.
