Letter from the President

NEW POOL FENCE

Construction will begin soon on the new wrought iron fence at the community pool. The portion of the fence that fronts Barker Cypress is rusted and structurally beyond repair. The four large pine trees have already been removed and their stumps ground. The company that bid lowest on that portion of the project also removed all of the bushes outside of the fence. This cost was \$1,500.00

The new fence will expand the fenced in area of the pool because we are building it to within six feet of the existing sidewalk. The six feet will allow for planting a future hedge for privacy of the swimmers and sun bathers. The new fence went through two rounds of bidding before the contract was awarded 3/16/10 to Houston Fence Company.

The new fence will be 7-foot tall. For security purposes the top of the fence curves outward and each picket forms a sharp point. Decorative rings were added to dress up the fence. This portion of the project cost \$12,500 including the upgrades to larger posts and adding the decorative rings The new fence has a 20-year warranty.

I could hardly believe what we discovered still hidden behind those bushes we removed in front of the existing, rusted fence. As some of our long-time homeowners may already know, the old pool fence---back in the day---was a chain link fence with three strands of barb wire at the top. Excuse me if I sound elitist, but, how ghetto!

We are currently taking bids for the remaining ancillary work associated with the project, including removing the front posts of this old chain link & barb wire fence, removing bushes inside the old fence and leveling and re-sodding areas where the bushes were removed outside the fence.

OTHER POOL PROJECTS

The diving board is being resurfaced. The large slide is being cleaned, including grinding certain areas of the support structure to remove rust and refinishing the paint. The slide itself is being cleaned and the water supply that had a line that hung in such a manner that a child could get tangled in it is being routed properly. (Apparently the slide was moved about ten feet sometime in the past and they "Jerry-rigged" the water line.)

The very small baby pool has been removed. It has leaked for years and a few years back we had a company trace the leak to a pipe somewhere under the pool pump and supply building. It was cheaper to ignore and pay a little extra water bill than fix. So we thought. Here's a good reason for constant "new blood" on the Board of Directors. Tom Weathersby who was elected about a year ago pointed out that means we probably have erosion under the building. So yeah, it was find and fix the leak or remove the pool.

MISCELLANEOUS PROJECTS

Competition for "The Yard of the Month" has begun. We run this monthly contest for six months. At the baseball complex we have opted not to cut out base paths, however we are taking bids to level the playing field for the infield area. Bids have been taken for the potential refurbishment of the sand pit for the volleyball court at the Barker Cypress Recreation Center. Refurbishment will include tilling parts of the pit that have hardened, removal of some growth in a few edge areas and adding several yards of new playground quality

sand. Two sets of new soccer goal nets have been ordered at the time of this writing. As soon as I get them I'll install one set and put the other in storage for the next time. We are getting about 18-months of use out of the nets for this popular feature. We are in the second round of bids for the new irrigation system for the Cypress Point Playground. After installing irrigation we will do some leveling and improve the grass for this "pocket park" we started building last year with the new playground.


2010 EASTER EVENT

For most parents, the thought of having a child with cancer is among the worst possible things imaginable. For the Marsh family, it was a harsh dose of reality. At the beginning of May 2009, Ryan and Shanna Marsh were happily raising their three daughters in Cypress, Texas, when their youngest, Layla, began to suddenly show signs of illness.

On May 7, 2009, the doctors revealed that precious Layla had a massive cancerous tumor (Stage 4 Neuroblastoma) in her abdomen. The tumor extended from above her left kidney, around her side, over her belly and wrapped around her aorta. In addition, the cancer had attacked Layla's bone marrow and bones. She fought a valiant fight, but gained her eternal wings March 9, 2010.

On May 8, 2010, the Cypress community is coming together to host a BBQ fundraiser at the VFW Hall on HWY 290 to raise awareness of Neuroblastoma and to raise money for the **Layla Grace Foundation** to help fund Neuroblastoma research. A live and silent auction will take place with games and activities for the children and door prizes. A live band, Beyond Reason, will be performing along with as much other fun and entertainment that we can round up.

Can the Weather Affect My Child's Asthma?

Weather and Asthma

The effect of weather on asthma symptoms isn't fully understood, but clearly there is a link. Numerous studies have shown a variety of connections, such as increases in asthma-related emergency department visits when certain weather conditions are present. Some people find that their asthma symptoms get worse at specific times of year. For others, a severe storm or sudden weather change may trigger an attack.

Exposure to cold, dry air is a common asthma trigger and can quickly cause severe symptoms. People with exercise-induced asthma who participate in winter sports are especially susceptible. Dry, windy weather can stir up pollen and mold in the air, leading to problems for some people.

Hot, humid air also can trigger asthma symptoms, and wet weather encourages the growth of mold spores, another asthma trigger. In certain areas, heat and sunlight combine with pollutants to create ground-level ozone, which is also an asthma trigger.

Studies have shown that thunderstorms can trigger asthma attacks. One study showed that during thunderstorms, the daily number of emergency department visits for asthma increased by 15%. The study concluded that the problem was caused by the number of fungal spores in the air, which almost doubled. It wasn't rain, but the wind, that caused this increase. Changes in barometric pressure may also be an asthma trigger.

Avoiding Allergy Triggers

If you suspect weather is playing a role in your child's asthma, keep a diary of asthma symptoms and possible triggers and talk to your child's doctor. Once you know what kind of weather triggers asthma symptoms, you can take steps to protect your child:

 Watch the forecast for pollen and mold counts as well as other conditions (extreme cold or heat) that might affect your child's asthma.

- Limit your child's outdoor activities on peak trigger days.
- Make sure your child wears a scarf over his or her mouth and nose outside during very cold weather.
- Keep windows closed at night to keep pollens and molds out. If it's hot, use air conditioning, which cleans, cools, and dries the air.
- Keep your child indoors early in the morning (before 10 AM) when pollen is at its highest levels.
- Your child shouldn't mow the lawn or rake leaves, and should be kept away from freshly cut grass and leaf piles.
- Dry clothes in the dryer (hanging clothes or sheets to dry can allow mold or pollen to collect on them).
- Make sure your child always has rescue medication on hand.
 Your child's written asthma action plan should list weather triggers

and ways to manage them, including any seasonal increases in medication. A child whose asthma seems to be allergy-related may also need to see an allergist for medication or allergy shots.
