Battle the Bulge with Fruits and Vegetables

A dding more fruits and vegetables to a healthy diet is a smart way to help maintain a healthy weight. In addition to providing the body with essential vitamins, minerals and fiber, eating more fruits and veggies may also reduce the risk of cancer and other chronic diseases.

A snack-sized bag of corn chips (1 ounce) has the same number of calories as a small apple, 1 cup of strawberries, AND 1 cup of carrots with 1/4 cup of low-cal dip. Try substituting high-calorie processed snacks with these healthy fruit and veggie snacks:: a medium size apple (72 calories), 1 cup of green beans (100 calories), 1 cup of carrots (45 calories) or 1 cup of broccoli (30 calories).

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EMERGENCY PROCEDURES DURING *THUNDER AND LIGHTENING STORMS*

Clearing the Facility

There are no set guidelines for determine exactly when the water should be cleared of swimmers due to an impending storm. Since sound travels more slowly than light, a safe practice is to clear all persons from the water at the first sound of thunder or sight of lightening. Do not risk patron safety! Other suggestions:

- Get all patrons inside
- Keep everyone way from windows. People can be injured by flying debris or glass if the window breaks
- Avoid using telephone, except in an emergency
- Do not stay in structures in open areas, such as picnic shelters
- Keep away from tall, isolated trees or objects that project above the landscape. Keep way from water and objects, such as



metal fences, tanks, rails and pipes

- Get down from the lifeguard chairs as soon as possible
- Do not let anyone use the shower during a thunderstorm. Water and metal can conduct electricity

Return to the Facility

According to the national Lightening Safety Institute (NLSI), wait 30 minutes after thunder and lightening stop entirely before letting patrons get back into the water. However, an additional factor to consider is whether or not the sky is dark and threatening. Unless there are evident signs of clearing, the storm should not be considered "ended". Keep watching for more storms and listen to weather reports on the radio.

Policy Development

All facilities should develop and share their individual policies as to swimming rules and regulations for their guests to see, prior to using the facility. Based on the information given above, it would be wise to state that the facility will be cleared upon the first sound of thunder or sight of lightening, and the patrons will not be allowed to re-enter the facility until 30 minutes after the last evidence of the storm.

Eagle Springs Weather Policy

At the first sight of lightning or the first sound of thunder, the pool will be cleared of all swimmers. Residents may be asked to

leave the premises, depending upon the severity of the weather conditions. The pool will re-open 30 minutes after the last sight of lightning or the last sound of thunder. This policy is based upon recommendations from the National Lightning Safety Institute and the American Red Cross.

Change In Recycling Day



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EAGLE SPRINGS FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK...

The Board was asked to explain the relationship of the various groups involved in Association business. This article will outline the roles of the Board, Neighborhood Voting Representatives, the management company and Committees.

The affairs of the Association shall be governed by a Board, each of whom shall have one (1) vote. Currently, there are three (3) Class "B" or Declarant (developer) members and one (1) Class "A" or resident director. The Class "B" members are selected by the Declarant and the Class "A" members are elected by the Voting Representatives for each Neighborhood.

Article III, Section 3.3 provides that every home (or "Unit") within Eagle Springs shall be located within a Neighborhood. A Neighborhood can be comprised of more than one housing type and more than one section that may or may not be adjoining. (Example: the Cottage Grove Neighborhood consists of the sections or villages of Cottage Grove, Sutter's Creek and Preston Village). Each Neighborhood has one Primary and one Alternate Neighborhood Voting Representative (NVR) that are elected annually by the homes or Units within their Neighborhood (unless a quorum isn't met and then they are appointed by the Board). The primary responsibility of the NVR is to cast all votes for the homes in their Neighborhood when a Class "A" or resident Board member(s) is elected. The



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NVR's represent their Neighborhood at Board meetings and act as a liaison between the residents in their Neighborhood, the Board and management company by communicating issues of concern. The 14 Neighborhoods currently include:

- Arbor Heights
- Barton Ridge
- Cades Crossing
- Crescent Ridge
- Laurel Ridge
- Sierra Bridge
- Biscayne Bend
- Arlington ParkBeringer Place
- Cottage Grove
- Cottage Grove
 Cross Creek
- Meadow Lodge
- Sterling Creek
- Drin astan Dari
- Princeton Park

Any resident in good standing can ask to be placed on the ballot when Neighborhood Voting Representative elections are held. Biscayne Bend (Section 35) and Princeton Park (Section 34) currently don't have representatives so if anybody is interested in serving, please contact the management company. You can find information on your Neighborhood at www.insideeaglesprings.com.

The management company for the Eagle Springs Community Association (ESCA) is C.I.A. Services. Their primary responsibilities are to handle the day to day administration, billing and collection

of assessments, financial reporting, deed restriction management, and oversee contracts for maintenance of the landscaping, amenities, and lakes. They take direction from the Board and do not make decisions. The management company can be reached by calling (281) 852-1700 or emailing ESCA@ ciaservices.com.

We have several Committees within Eagle Springs made up of active volunteers, these include: Pool, Sports Field, Safety Advisory, Landscape, and Modification. These Committees serve at the discretion of the Board and gather/evaluate information to offer recommendations to the Board. A short list of accomplishments include developing a pool entry card system and increasing the furniture inventory, forming a partnership with local law enforcement agencies and promoting safety awareness programs, implementing a sport field reservation system and recommending a landscape maintenance contractor. They are often the first to report topics of concern or maintenance issues to the Board or management company. The community has greatly benefited from the hard work of these Committees.



"Big Slide" at Island Club Pool!

The ESCA Board, Sweetwater Pool Management and Pool Committee have discussed at length the large slide at the Island Club Pool and based on the following have come up with a set of rules specific to this slide. Due to the nature of the slide (size, flow rate of water, etc), there are safety risks unique to this slide. After a review of manufacturer recommendations; precautions already in place at our pools; and other rules for similar slides; the ESCA Board has determined the following rules will apply from this point forward:

- No flotation devices of any kind down the slide.
- All sliders must be a minimum of 36" tall.
- No one may catch a slider at the bottom of the slide.
- Sliders must be able to swim to the side of the pool to exit, unassisted.

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A MESSAGE FROM YOUR DEPARTING RESIDENT BOARD MEMBER

My name is Maury Hudson, and I've served over the last two years as the first elected resident Board member for the Eagle Springs Community Association (ESCA). During this time I've served alongside 3 developer-appointed Board members, and I have been supported by a very active group of community volunteers, your neighbors and friends who care enough to work tirelessly to make Eagle Springs (ES) a great place to live. I am extremely proud of what we have accomplished over the last two years.

For those who don't know, our governing documents called for election of a resident to the Board once the community reached 50% of complete build-out. We will gain more resident representation as more homes are built. The "sub-communities" that make up Eagle Springs are represented by Neighborhood Voting Representatives (NVR's) who are elected by residents to represent them in selecting Board members. The NVR's are the first group of volunteers who have supported me. Shortly after my election, we instituted a monthly meeting to discuss community concerns and formulate recommendations to carry forward to the full Board at the Board meetings. The NVR's have been the main conduit for resident concerns to flow to the Board.

In addition to the NVR's, we have volunteer committees whose members have shouldered a tremendous amount of responsibility for bettering our community. We have added Landscaping and Sports Fields to the already established Pool and Safety Advisory Committees. All committees work under a charter template that we have developed and all residents are welcome at all meetings, which are typically held monthly. Check www.insideeaglesprings.com for meeting dates and times.

Safety Advisory Committee (SAC) is responsible for an excellent relationship with our Precinct 4 Constables. The constables have told us that the constant interaction with our volunteer committee is what keeps them so vigilant in Eagle Springs. A constable sergeant or deputy is usually present at each meeting. This committee has brought safety classes for children and babysitter training classes to the neighborhood. They hear first hand of crime related incidents and get the word out to residents. Also, volunteers have established a Neighborhood Watch Program (NWP) headed by resident volunteers.

Pool Committee is responsible for holding the Pool Management Company accountable through volunteer member reports to the Board, implementation of pool ID cards to keep non-invited, nonresidents out, choosing the designs used in re-plastering, choosing water features, and growing the supply of furniture as the community grows. This committee took one of the most visible assets which was deteriorating sadly and has brought it back to be even better than it was when I first moved into Eagle Springs over 7 years ago. And to demonstrate volunteer commitment, a Pool Committee member donated approximately \$10,000 worth of services to develop the website that enhanced the pool card process this year while two other members spent 60 hours entering resident information into

the database!

Sports Fields Committee has coordinated volunteer efforts to spread dirt on the fields, developed a schedule and lottery for field use, installed safety padding on the baseball field fences, and generally made sure the fields are maintained. The fields look greener and better maintained now than ever.

Landscaping Committee acts in an advisory capacity and took part in the bid process that resulted in a change of landscaping contractor for a much more cost competitive price. This committee has maps of the entire neighborhood and promptly brings issues needing attention to the Board.

Even this newsletter is the product of a volunteer Newsletter team that works with an independent newsletter publisher to communicate community happenings and keep residents up to date on issues!

Over the last two years, we have:

- Initiated bid processes for pools and landscaping that have saved thousands of dollars for residents.
- Established a relationship with Commissioner Eversole's office resulting in Eagle Springs Elementary (ESE) flashing lights for Kindergarten release and a traffic study for ESE.
- Implemented fire lanes around the Clubhouse at the recommendation of the traffic study to make our children safer during ESE release times.
- Had curbs cut back where they extended onto Eagle Springs Parkway, making children walk into the street to follow sidewalks prior to the changes.
- Increased mosquito patrols during especially wet summer months.
- Installed more trash cans and lighting throughout the community.
- Had a resident participate in the annual budget process as a precursor to a formal Budget Committee.
- Established a replacement fund to assure we have money set aside to replace our assets as they age and deteriorate.
- Raised the level of cash in our operating fund to allow us flexibility for the unexpected, like the expenses of Hurricane Ike.

This list could go on, but I'll stop here and simply extend a great big thank you to the volunteers who have accomplished so many wonderful things. We have wonderful residents in Eagle Springs. The Pool Committee put out a call for volunteers to help with this year's pool cards, and it was answered by 70+ residents who care. That shows the level of commitment in our community. And, I want to encourage each of you to find a place to participate. Look at the schedule and attend a committee meeting, introduce yourself to your NVR, join neighborhood watch, offer your skills on a volunteer basis to lower community costs, find your place!

Eagle Springs will eventually grow to a community of approximately 4,500 homes. Conservatively assuming an average of 3 residents per

home, that's 13,500 residents, more than many small cities! It will take residents who care to keep us moving into the future. Your NVR's are currently in the process of electing the resident who will replace me on the Board. This process should be completed by the end of May. Please look for the announcement introducing your next resident Board member and throw your support behind them.

In closing, I want to thank my wonderful wife Kendra and my two wonderful daughters, Kierstyn and Macey, for supporting me as the time commitment to this role took me away from them. And to all the volunteers and residents, thanks for a great two years!
