



Happy Mother's Day!

Happy Mother's Day to all the mothers in the subdivision!!! Mother's Day is an annual holiday that recognizes mothers, motherhood and maternal bonds in general, as well as the positive contributions that they make to society. Mother's Day is celebrated on the second Sunday in May. The first attempts at establishing Mother's Day was mostly marked by women's peace groups. A common early activity was the meeting of groups of mothers whose sons had fought or died on opposite sides of the American Civil War. In 1868 Ann Jarvis created a committee to establish a "Mother's Friendship Day" whose purpose was "to reunite families that had been divided during the Civil War", and she wanted to expand it into an annual memorial for mothers, but she died in 1905

before the celebration became popular. In 1904, Frank E. Hering, President of the Fraternal Order of Eagles, made the first known public plea for "a national day to honor our mothers." Today,, Mother's Day was established by Anna Marie Jarvis, following the death of her mother Ann Jarvis on May 9, 1903, with the help of a Philadelphia merchant, John Wanamaker. On May 8, 1914, the U.S. Congress passed a law designating the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day and requesting a proclamation. On May 9, 1914, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation, declaring the first national Mother's Day, as a day for American citizens to show the flag in honor of those mothers whose sons had died in war. Since then, carnations have come to represent Mother's Day. The founder, Anna Jarvis, chose the carnation because it was the favorite flower of her mother. In part due to the shortage of white carnations, and in part due to the efforts to expand the sales of more types of flowers in Mother's Day, the florists promoted wearing a red carnation if your mother was living or a white one





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if she was dead.

#### Winchester Country Pool Rules 2010

- 1. All rules apply to Adults and Children.
- 2. Only registered Winchester Country and Winchester Meadows residents and their guests will be allowed to use the pool. Maintenance fees must be current and pool registration must be on file in Guard office at the pool.
- 3. All guests will be charged \$1 daily and may be issued a guest pass that must be returned upon leaving.
- 4. The telephone located in Guard's Offie and Guard Check-in Station is for emergency use only.
- 5. Children under 10 must be accompanied by an adult (18 years or older.)
- 6. The baby pool is restricted to non-swimming children who are under the age of 5.
- 7. Non-swimming children must stay in the baby pool and within arm's reach of an adult. This also goes for the large pool. Only 2 non-swimmers per adult will be allowed.
- 8. All non-potty trained children must wear swim diapers at all times provided by the Resident.
- 9. Parents or Guardian are responsible for children and/or guests in both the baby pool and large pool at all times.
- 10. Running is not allowed in the pool area. No horeseplay will be tolerated either in or out of the water.
- 11. Glassware/glass containers are not allowed in the pool area. No alcoholic beverages are allowed in the pool area. Users of the pool are responsible to clean their area and use facility trashcans to discard their trash.
- 12. Abusive/offensive language or gestures and music with inappropriate lyrics will not be tolerated.
- 13. Smoking is not allowed in the fenced area of the pool facility. There are designated smoking areas in front of the Coordinator office and Clubhouse II.
- 14. All persons younger than 18 years of age will leave the water during the scheduled hourly Lifeguard break/Adult swim period and sit away from the pool edge. Adults at least 18 years of age can swim at their own risk at this break time.
- 15. All swimmers must wear swim suits. No cutoffs are allowed.

- 16. Only Coast Guard approved floatation devices will be allowed and must be approved by the lifeguard staff. All non-swimmers must wear Coast guard approved floatation devices.
- 17. Persons with bandages and/or open sores will not be allowed in the pool.
- 18. Cocoa butter, baby oil or other simal products will not be allowed in the pool. Commercial suntan preparations only.
- 19. No pets are allowed in the pool area.
- 20. The Association is not responsible for lost or stolen items or unclaimed items on the "Lost & Found" shelf. Unclaimed items will be disposed of throughtout the pool season.
- 21. No climbing on shade awning support poles or perimeter fencing.
- 22. The lifeguards on duty will have the final authority for the enforcement of pool rules and the overal safe operation of the facility both explicit and implied by the Pool Rules and must be obeyed at all times.

#### Discipline

Infractions to pool rules will result in disciplinary action taken by the contracted pool Management Company and/or Winchester Country Board of Directors. Disciplinary actions may include time out and/or the suspension of cards from one day up to and including the remainder of the pool season.

Our tennis court gate has been fixed. If your tennis card does not work please contact Joanna Abbondandolo at 281-890-8856. If you wish to obtain a tennis court card there is a \$10 deposit. You can either mail a check (made payable to WCMA) to WCMA, 9607 Rio Grande, Houston, Texas 77064 or you can drop off your check in the mail box slot located outside the clubhouse office. Please write in the memo line of your check "tennis card." Please include your mailing address. Your card will be mailed to you. If you would rather pick up your card you can stop by the Community Coordinator's office during office hours.

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#### **May Day**

#### **Armed Forces Day**

On August 31, 1949, Secretary of Defense Louis Johnson announced the creation of an Armed Forces Day to replace separate Army, Navy and Air Force Days. The single-day celebration stemmed from the unification of the Armed Forces under one department

-- the Department of Defense. Each of the military leagues and orders was asked to drop sponsorship of its specific service day in order to celebrate the newly announced Armed Forces Day. The Army, Navy and Air Force leagues adopted the newly formed day. The Marine Corps League declined to drop support for Marine Corps Day but supports Armed Forces Day, too. We celebrate Armed Forces Day on the third Saturday in May and Armed Forces Week begins on



the second Saturday of May and ends on the third Sunday in May. The purpose of Armed Forces day is to honor Americans serving in the five services—the Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, and Coast Guard.

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


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#### **MEMORIAL DAY**

Memorial Day is a United States Federal Holiday observed on the last Monday of May, this year being on May 31, 2010. The holiday was formerly known as Decoration Day,

where it commemorates U.S. men and women who died while in the military service. First enacted to honor Union soldiers of the American Civil War, it was later expanded after World War I. Following the end of the Civil War, many communities set aside a day to mark the end of the war as a memorial to those who had died.

#### Ode to those we honor



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

#### **EDITORIAL / ENDORSEMENT**

Fortunately, we have an article in this month's newsletter describing the incredible services our own West Harris County MUD #10 provides to all of us. We are very blessed to have such a responsive and resourceful Board of Directors on our MUD. A lot of areas are not that lucky.

I would like to say we have the Board we have and the incredible services we enjoy because the voters in our district are careful and they take the time to learn about the candidates before voting. However, I am not sure that is the case. If we were talking about voting in the Governor's race or the Presidential election that would surely apply but most people can't name their Congressman much less their MUD Directors.

You may be asking yourself, "Why should I care as long as I get the services I need. There are so many other things to keep up with in our daily lives."

Here are several reasons why you should pay close attention to who you vote for when choosing your MUD Directors:

1. Running for office and serving are two very different things. We have candidates who are perennial and who spend their time meddling in everyone's affairs with the hope that they will someday be elected to something more than precinct chair. Beware of people like this. A MUD Director requires very specific and sometimes

technical skills and knowledge. We don't need someone who knows everyone on the block, we need someone who knows about our two complete water supply plants and the system to operate them efficiently and keep them running when adverse weather and electricity failures threatens us all;

- 2. Just because their name is on the ballot doesn't mean they are trustworthy. We have candidates that have filed for office in spite of their criminal history. While the law doesn't technically prohibit voters with criminal backgrounds from filing and running for office do we really want to entrust our tax dollars and something as important as our water supply to someone who can't stay out of trouble with the law?
- 3. Continuity is important. Our MUD is one of the most successful, resourceful and efficient MUDS in the area while we enjoy one of the lowest water rates in the area and a tax rate that is very competitive. It's not broken so we don't have anything to fix. Our current Board of Directors is diverse, representative of our community and has struck a balance enabling them to work very well together. We need to keep that momentum and continuity working for us.

On May 8th there is an election where three of our five current (Continued on Page 12)

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### In Our Neck Of The Woods, Mud Is A Good Thing!

While most Municipal Utility Districts (MUD's) engage solely in water supply, conservation, irrigation and drainage issues, our MUD strives to be much more responsive to our District's individual needs. There has been a lot of talk recently about the City of Houston raising their water rates as much as 50% (in certain apartment complexes) and even in other MUD's the regional water rates are much higher. Our MUD (West Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 10) has continued to keep our rates low. In fact, our MUD offers exemptions for disabled and elderly households. Those are just some of the benefits of having our own MUD.

As Directors of West Harris County MUD #10, we saw the need for a sidewalk across the street from Cook Middle School so we built it. We have also funded new construction for much needed Parks in our area. Both of which help keep our children safe.

Speaking of safety, our MUD provides security funding to the Homeowner's Associations in our area to help fund our law enforcement security contracts. We fund sidewalk repair and manhole maintenance on an as needed basis and we clean up graffiti as soon as we see it.

We entered into a mowing agreement with the Flood Control District in order to subsidize extra mowing cycles throughout the year and maintain our bayous throughout the district. After Hurricane IKE, our bayous became a dumping ground for debris so we entered into a joint effort with a neighboring MUD to have the trash and debris collected and removed from our area. Thankfully, we had the luxury of uninterrupted water and sewer service during Ike. And, the generators we own kept our plants running normally while systems all over town were going down.

We are actively involved in our community and we work very hard to respond to the needs of our neighbors. We strive to achieve the latest advances in water treatment services. We pride ourselves in being good stewards of your tax dollars by making sure we get the most out of our monies. West Harris County MUD No. 10 operates efficiently and with transparency because we know we can stretch a dollar as far as possible and improve our neighborhoods at the same time.
