

#### Keeping the pool safe

We have put several policies into place to try and optimize pool safety for everyone. In an effort to minimize contamination, there are ten minute breaks at the top of every hour. We hope that this will allow parents to encourage their children to take a restroom break – we know it can be hard to get them to stop playing long enough to get a drink, reapply sunscreen and use the restroom! Hopefully this will make it easier on everyone and prevent bathroom accidents in the pool.

The facility is closed on Mondays to allow for facility maintenance, as well as for hyperchlorination of the pool. This is another step we are taking to try and prevent water-born illnesses, such as the cryptosporidium outbreaks that were occurring in Austin last year.

#### Who's At the Pool?

We have numerous groups who are playing or training at the pool this summer.

Water Aerobics are in the recreational area Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9-10

am, and we have swim lessons going on Tuesday through Friday 9-11:30 and in the afternoons from 4-6:30 pm.

The Circle C Seals summer league will be working out from8am-11am Tuesday thru Friday and Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 5-6:30pm through the end of June.

The Circle C Select Team has a conditioning clinic that runs through June and July from 7am-8am.

T3, a triathlon training group, runs the Adult Coached Swim and uses the facility Wednesday and Fridays 5:45-7:15 am and Wednesday evenings from 6pm-7pm.

Once again, the pool is hosting the Kaleidoscope and Voyager Daycamp programs from the CDC and Kiker Elementary. The kids splash in on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 11:15am-12:30 and from 1:00-2:30 respectively.

#### **Big News**

The Circle C HOA board of Directors recently approved the continuation of the Circle C Select USA swim team. The

team had a great inaugural season last year, with enthusiastic parent volunteers and 80 registered swimmers. A new Head Coach to lead the program has been selected and registration for the program will be open to Circle C residents beginning June 28th and non-residents beginning July 12th.

This program will be very beneficial to the Circle C community. This provides a year round competitive team to the youth in our community.

Additionally, the Select Team will generate much needed revenue to off-set the cost of winter heating so that the facility can remain available for lap swimming to our residents year round.

#### **Movie Nights**

Another summer activity supported by the HOA are the Summer Movie Nights. July 10th the swim center will be showing the family flick Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs, so grab your suits and floats and be sure to join us around dusk (9pm) for an evening of laughter and fun in the water!

## **Architectural Control Committee Update**

Artificial Turf

Some of you may have received flyers on your front doors advertising synthetic turf with the phrase "Approved and Used by the Circle C Homeowners Association." We wanted to clarify to residents exactly what uses are and have been approved by the Architectural Control Committee.

The ACC reviewed a synthetic turf product and approved it only for use in back yards. Some residents have installed putting greens or small soccer areas in their back yards using this product. Synthetic turf or artificial turf is not approved for any front yard use. If any owner installs this product in the front yard, they would be subject to the deed restriction procedure. If you have any questions about this product for use in your back yard only, please contact Susan Hoover at shoover@onr.com.

The ACC also approved a small amount of the product to be used at the Circle C Swim Center in a high use area that had drainage challenges. This area was not able to sustain the heavy traffic and use of tables without creating a lot of mud. The turf was approved in a limited way for this purpose. The Circle C Homeowners Association does not endorse any vendor with regard to this product.

## **CIRCLE C LANDSCAPE UPDATE**

Trees, trees. This time of year it is particularly important that we give our trees a little extra attention, particularly if the summer pans out to be our typical very hot and dry weather.

If you live in a new home location, your young trees need a regular watering schedule that allows a deep soaking with a drying period in between. You don't want to drown a tree, so be as carefully about overwatering as you are about watering. In general, most young trees benefit from about 30 minutes of soaking with a hose two times per week during the hottest weather. You can put your hand down about six inches into the soil and determine when the soil is becoming dry. If it is dry and cracking, that is too dry. If it is wet and soggy, your tree doesn't need any extra water. Also, it is good to leave the shade trees be for the first year and complete a juvenile prune to establish good leader branches after about a year.


Older, established trees will also benefit from extra water when we get into those drought conditions of July, August and September.


The Circle C Homeowners Association takes great care in protecting, caring for and renewing the tree habitat of Circle C. There are over 2000 shade trees on the property. The tree care plan for Circle C specifies caring for these trees by health pruning,

documenting and treating disease, re-vegetating the urban forest with diversified trees. Prior to any commons areas being accepted by the CCHOA for landscape maintenance, the builder/developer must plant the area to comply with the specifications of the Association. This includes a certain number of both shade and ornamental trees. Homeowners can look forward to the last area along Spruce Canyon in front of the new KB Home lots to being landscaped in this manner.

Since Circle C is within the City of Austin, both homeowners and the Association commons areas fall under the tree regulations of the City. The city ordinance designates all trees that are 19 inches caliper (60 inches circumference, measured four feet up the trunk) as protected trees. Everyone living within the City is required to have a permit to remove any tree of this size, no matter what species, even if the tree is dead. The only exception to this regulation is if the tree in imminent danger of harming people or property. Homeowners can find extensive information regarding the City regulations on the City website at www.ci.austin.tx.us, under the Development tab, Tree Protection. There is also a lot of helpful information regarding trees in this section.






#### Circle C Landscape Update 1- (Continued from Page 10)

Over the past few years the CCHOA has had trees pruned in the following areas: Escarpment, LaCrosse from Mopac to Escarpment, Wildflower Park, Circle C North and selected protected trees throughout. Oak Wilt treatment has been implemented in Circle C North, Wildflower Park, Escarpment and South Bay for trees that are located near oak wilt centers. In the fall, the CCHOA will be adding trees to the median on Escarpment just north of LaCrosse where the Bradford Pear trees were removed earlier this year. Other improvements include running bubblers to trees that are affected by the extreme heat and drought, and replacing trees that have been hit by traffic or declined in other ways.

For your personal trees, we encourage you to call a certified arborist for pruning large trees or diagnosing disease, and make sure that if you are thinking of removing a tree, you obtain the proper permit from the City of Austin. Each home in Circle C is required to have two shade trees unless you are in an area such as Park West, which requires only one. If you remove a tree from the front yard, please fill out a submission form for the Architectural Control Committee and email it in and they will check and let you know if you need to plant an additional tree as a replacement.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

## What are the rules on trash containers and recycle cart storage?

Trash containers and recycle carts are permitted to be at the curb only on your scheduled collection day. Trash containers and recycle carts are to be stored where not visible from the street at all other times.

#### Are basketball goals allowed in Circle C?

Permanently installed goals are not permitted in Circle C. The deed restrictions state that basketball goals are to be stored out of the view of neighbors when not in use. City of Austin code states that only motorized vehicles are allowed to be parked on public streets and all sidewalks must remain clear and open for pedestrians.

#### Are cars allowed to be parked on the street?

The CCHOA does not have jurisdiction over the streets in Circle C; they are the responsibility of the City of Austin. Obviously inoperable vehicles may not be parked or left on public streets for more than 72 hours. Please call 974-8119 to report an abandoned or non-operating vehicle. Please call 311 to report illegally parked vehicles.

## What should I do about barking dogs and stray animals?

Stray Animals may be picked up by animal control by calling 311. The City of Austin states it is unlawful for dogs to make frequent noise disturbing to persons in the neighborhood and violations should be reported to the City. You may also call the CCHOA office at 288-8663 with specific date and time for excessive barking. The staff will send a cooperative letter to the homeowner.

#### How do I report a street light outage?

Every light pole has an assigned number mounted on the pole. Jot down that number and call the City of Austin 311 non-emergency number to make the report.

## Are boats, trailers and recreational vehicles allowed in Circle C?

The Deed Restrictions require that any vehicle or trailer other than a conventional automobile be stored, placed or parked in an area concealed from view of other Homeowners.

## **CCHOA News**

**Frequently Asked Questions** - (Continued from Page 15)

#### What are the rules on maintenance?

Homes are to be kept in a well-maintained, safe, clean and attractive condition at all times. Lawns and garden areas should be kept alive, free of weeds and attractive. Lawn mowing is required on a regular basis. Trees and shrubs are to be pruned. Public right of way and sidewalks should be clear and unobstructed. Litter, trash, dead vegetation and debris should be promptly removed.

## What are the rules in Circle C on walking with your dog off leash and what about picking up after your dog?

Both of these issues fall under the jurisdiction of the City of Austin. It is against CoA ordinance to have a dog off leash except on your private property. It is also a requirement by the City that dog owners pick up and properly dispose of their dog's feces. In this regard, we recommend dog walkers carry a plastic grocery bag or newspaper sleeve. Slide it on like a glove, pick up the offensive matter, pull the bag back over your hand, knot it and throw it in your trashcan when you return home. Please keep our landscaped commons areas beautiful and clean for the enjoyment of all.

## Do I have to submit plans for improvements and/or additions to my home?

All improvements such as decks, patio covers, pools, change in fencing or any other permanent structure must be submitted to the

Architectural Control Committee. You may download an application form as well as a fee schedule on our website at www.circlecranch. info under the "ACC" quick link section.

#### What do I need to visit the Swim Center?

All residents must possess and show their swim center ID card to enter the facility. ID cards are available at the aquatic office. Contact 288-6057 for information on what is required to obtain an ID. Guests of Circle C residents must pay a \$3 entrance fee and sign a liability waiver before entering the facility. Children under 3 are free.

## Are door to door solicitors and door flyers allowed in Circle C?

Both of these issues are governed by the City of Austin. By City ordinance, solicitors must abide by "No Soliciting" signs on private property. Some neighbors have had success in placing a small "No Soliciting" sign near the doorbell and/or a small staked sign near the front porch.

#### What do new Texas residents need to know?

According to the Texas Department of Public Safety (www.txdps. state.tx.us) a new Texas resident is required by state law to obtain

## July Program: Wallace Jefferson, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Texas

Chief Justice Jefferson was appointed to the Supreme Court of Texas in March 2001, elected in November 2002 and on September 14, 2004, he was appointed Chief Justice. His appointment as Chief Justice was confirmed unanimously by the Texas Senate on March

9, 2005. He was elected Chief Justice in 2006, and reelected to a full term in 2008. His term ends December 31, 2014.

Chief Justice Jefferson joined the court from private practice in San Antonio. As a partner in the appellate specialty firm of Crofts, Callaway & Jefferson, he successfully argued two cases before the United States Supreme Court. He is a graduate of the James Madison College at Michigan State University and the University of Texas School of Law.

He is certified in civil appellate law by the Texas Board of Legal Specialization. He was San Antonio Bar Association President for 1998-99, and was named the San Antonio Young Lawyers Association's Outstanding Young Lawyer in 1997.

In August, 2008, Chief Justice Jefferson was elected First Vice President of the Conference of Chief Justices, and is scheduled to lead the organization as its President in 2010. The Conference is an association of chief justices from each of the fifty states and the U.S. territories. As President, Chief Justice Jefferson will be Chair of the National Center for State Courts, a policy and resource organization in Williamsburg, Virginia.

Chief Justice Jefferson has a fascinating personal story to share with us including his ascendancy to the top judicial office in Texas and how that branch of government works.

#### WATCH FOR DEHYDRATION

Summer time is a fun time to play tennis. Unfortunately, it is also season when tennis players can get dehydrated quickly and get injured. Avoid Heat Stress by:

- Schedule practice time in the morning and late afternoons.
- Wear light-colored clothes made with breathable material.
- Wear white hat to protect face, skull and neck
- Drink 18-20 oz of fluid two or three hours before your match, then again another 8-10 oz ten to twenty minutes before match.
- During play, drink 8-10 oz every ten to twenty minutes (during changeovers.)
- If you have heat cramps, stretch the muscle, and take rehydration drinks with glucose and electrolytes.
- If you feel light-headed and think you might faint, lower your head or lay down on your back with your feet up. It would be a good idea to stop playing and to sit down in a cool area.

months waiting for the arrival of the third daughter.

Military service was 2 and 1/2 years on Okinawa where he was chief of General Surgery. During the Tet offensive, the Army hospital received approximately 150 air evacs a week.

During Dolph's tour of duty, Beverly served as president of the Medical Wives Club. She developed her artistic talent and received a teaching certificate in the Sogetsu method of Japanese flower arranging. She also studied Chinese cooking and became an expert. Their fourth baby girl arrived during this military tour on the island.

During this time, one of their almost life-long adventures began. Beverly gave Dolph a birthday present - a motorcycle. He has been riding ever since, with Beverly as a frequent passenger. Together, they have logged tens of thousands of miles in the US, Canada, Europe and New Zealand. Within

the last 5 years, they have enjoyed taking pictures from their two-wheeled vehicle on many trips primarily to the western states. Recently, their trips have been pulling a travel trailer to allow them to carry their camera equipment.

## **BOWIE HIGH SCHOOL ORCHESTRA**


Salutes the Boy Scouts of America




