# **Developer's Corner**

### Development Status Notes June 2010

#### SUBDIVISION DEVELOPMENT

New home sales in Steiner Ranch through May 2010 were slightly behind the pace for the same period in 2009. Some of this may be due to the fact that the Tierra Grande neighborhood of 50' homesites that offered homes in the \$200's is nearing build-out.

Taylor Woodrow Communities started construction in early June on the final 39 lots in the Santaluz gated neighborhood of 90' wide homesites. These lots should be completed by the end of September for Highland Homes and Drees Custom Homes. Construction should start in early July on the next phase of 26 - 80' homesites in Emerald Ridge for Taylor Morrison Homes. Additional phases are planned to start construction in late 2010 based upon builder home sales in existing neighborhoods.

Custom lot sales continue in The Bluffs on south Quinlan Park Rd., Bellagio Estates on Lake Austin, and in the newest phase of the golf community, Shoreview Overlook, at the end of University Club Drive. For more information on these custom homesites and all other builder neighborhoods in Steiner Ranch, you may contact the Welcome Center at 266-5833.

#### **COMMERCIAL/MIXED-USE DEVELOPMENT**

Longhorn Canyon Townhomes – Kemp Management has completed the first 8 of the 29 townhomes located along the 5th hole of the UT Golf Club course immediately across Quinlan Park Rd from the Towne Square Community Center. For more information on this development please call Kemp Properties at 441-1062.

<u>Fairways at Steiner Ranch</u> – Patio home construction on this site along the 3rd through 6th holes of the UT Golf Club course is on hold until a new builder can negotiate a purchase from the bank following foreclosure. More information about the development and sales will be forthcoming in the near future.

<u>Commercial/Retail Quinlan Park Rd at RM 620</u> – Property Development Centers (PDC), a commercial/retail developer, has the southwest corner of Quinlan Park Rd and RM 620 (Mixed Use #1A on Master Plan Map) under contract and is currently in the due diligence for a proposed retail/office center at this primary Steiner Ranch entry, that will be anchored by a Randall's grocery store. PDC is negotiating with additional anchor tenants for this site but has not announced any specifics.

Taylor Woodrow Communities continues to receive interest from various developers for the remaining mixed-use development sites in Steiner Ranch. Vintage Fine Homes has completed city/county site plan approvals to build approximately 20 patio homes on Tract #18 along Steiner Ranch Blvd. across from the Monterone apartments. With the slow down in the local housing market they still have not announced a timeframe to begin construction on this site. Also, pre-leasing continues on the retail/office mixed use development on Tract #4 at the southwest corner of Quinlan Park Rd and Steiner Ranch Blvd. More information on these and other mixed-use sites will be available in the future as development plans progress.

### **Pool Update**

Summer is here and that means kids out of school, hot weather and nothing better than refreshing at the pools. Remember that the pools are for all of us and your help to keep them enjoyable is expected and appreciated.

As of May 1st the summer pool hours are in effect, which, for Bella Mar, are Mondays 2 p.m. to 10 p.m., Tuesday through Sunday 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. While there might be some event during those times throughout the summer that will close pools, like the Steiner Stars using the Bella Mar lap pool, or swim lessons at the John Simpson Pool, we have tried to keep a lot of the pools open and accessible all summer long.

This summer we need to really make a conscious effort to be safe at the pools. Last summer the pools were well utilized. That is great. As homeowners though we need to make sure that we do our part to keep the pools safe for our children and open all summer long for everyone's use. While I understand following the rules isn't always easy or fun, they are there to ensure continual usage and for the safety of everyone.

To summarize, some of the major rules that are currently posted at the pools and in the H.O.A. By-laws that we ALL need to follow:

- 1. Don't prop open the gates to the pool. If you don't have a key fob, go to the HOA office and obtain one or get extra ones. (This will insure that small children from the park don't have access to the pool.)
- 2. Children under the age of 14 needs to be supervised by an adult over age 18. Supervision is considered actively watching their participation at the pool, not simply being on the grounds. There have already been a few cases where children under the age of 14 have been in the pool on a Saturday or Sunday morning with no parents nearby. This is a huge safety and liability issue; please help your children understand why we have this in place.
- 3. No glass containers in the pool area.
- 4. No roughhousing, running on the deck or jumping on the lane lines. No jumping off or climbing on the lifeguard towers or diving off the blocks or removing the block covers, unless you

are there for a designated swim team activity.

5. If your children are still in diapers, the Bella Mar Lap Pool is OFF LIMITS to those children. The Town Center pool or the Bella Mar Splash and Baby Pools are available for children in diapers; they are easier to clean and drain if necessary and limit closure time. It is preferable that children this age stay in the baby pools, but we understand the desire to use the bigger pools. Last year we had to close the pool two times for 7 days while the chemicals cleaned the bacterial levels after a couple of accidents. This affects all of us so please help us with these guidelines.

The lifeguards that we are providing are generally kids from our community. They are being instructed on all these rules and are being asked to enforce them. Please keep in mind that while a lot of the guards are from our community, they might be a little apprehensive to enforce the rules to their neighbor or neighbors getting upset at them for doing their job, which will only lead to further problems, both safety and liability. In addition, while the lifeguards do patrol the whole pool area and are there to assist, their main job is to be looking at the water. The more their attention is taken from the pool to deal with open gates, running children, unattended children, picking up left over pool toys, the more there is an opportunity for another more serious safety and liability problem in the water. The lifeguards have been instructed to give one warning, on the second infraction, to limit water usage to that person, and on the third infraction, the violator will be asked to leave the pool.

A quick reminder: there are two lap lanes at both John Simpson and Bella Mar that are set aside for Lap swimming. If they are not being utilized, feel free to use them. If someone does want to Lap Swim then please move aside if you are just "bobbing" along. We are trying to accommodate everyone in the community.

Summer usage is not all that the Pool committee is working on. There are several other items that we are trying to do to bring full time year round enjoyment of our great facilities.

While we will still be sharing the Bella Mar lap pool with the Steiner Stars swim team for a little longer, (Go Stars!), there has been more (Continued on Page 15)

access in the evenings starting at 7:00pm, with full access at 7:30pm, almost 2 hours more time than last year. The Pool Committee along with the Facilities committee and the two Boards in Steiner, the SRROA and the SRMA, are trying to work out an arrangement to further utilize both Bella Mar and John Simpson for practices come 2011 to ensure even more pool usage time.

In addition, as you know the Bella Mar pool has been heated for the winter. We have stopped the heater for the summer, but it is never too early to talk about winter usage. We are working on trying to extend winter hours come September/October so that you can utilize the pool upon coming home from work. We will keep you updated.

We at the Pool Committee want you and your family to have a great time using the pool facilities. Making sure ALL the pool rules are followed, is an excellent step toward all of us being able to enjoy the pools and have a great and safe summer. Please remember our ability to use these pools is a privilege that we All would like to continue to enjoy.

### **Trails Update**

When our stream flows decrease, you may notice that many of our streams actually flow underground as well as on top, all year long. There are several streams where you will see a flow disappear, but then reappear downhill from that spot. Our land is riddled with underground water passages and the local streams make use of them. This photo was submitted by LeeAnn Dunn of her nephew playing in Bear Creek where Outback Trail, Serrulata and Phoenix Pass Trails come together.

DIY trail maintenance: If you see a branch hanging over the trail where it could be hazardous, just bring a hand saw on your next trip and cut it off. Note that any other cutting is never allowed in the greenbelts. Only your HOA is allowed to make trail repairs or reroutes - see below.

Is your favorite trail in need of repair or in need of better sign locations? If you see a problem on the trails, call the HOA at 266-7553 or visit http://www.steinerranchhoa. org under "Report A Problem." Be specific about the location on the trail, the problem you see, your ideas for a solution, and your contact information.

Construction of any kind is not allowed on the greenbelts or along trails. Your HOA dollars are wasted paying for labor to remove structures such as forts, and the responsible parties are subject to fines. If you see any construction, take a picture and contact the HOA. Recently a resident was injured when he fell against one of the T-posts which have been installed in some of our older trails. Please be careful around these T-posts as we work to remove them from the trail system.

Only the HOA is authorized to create trails in Steiner Ranch. Unfortunately, someone (Continued on Page 23)

We don't wish to spend your HOA money trying to close and re-vegetate rogue trails. Instead, we want to hear from those who want new trails because we are actively looking at routes within Steiner to expand our trail system. Would you like to help us plan new trails? Contact your trails committee at 266-8498 to get involved or come to the next Trails Committee meeting on Thursday July 8 at 7PM at Bella Mar. All residents are welcome to attend. A trail signage project team is now forming: We are designing a system of labels for our trail sign posts. To get connected here and volunteer your design skills, contact the trails committee at 266-8498.

If you see any rogue trail cutting or dangerous activity, including motorcycles anywhere on the trails or in the parks, take a picture and call the Travis County Sheriff West Command at (512) 854-9728 and the HOA. Remember, your trails are private and are for your use, and your accompanied guests' use only.

### **Balcones Canyonlands Preserve Educates Steiner**



This spring, Travis County staff from the Balcones Canyonlands Preserve (BCP) participated in three educational events with Steiner Ranch youth. First, BCP biologists and rangers were guest scientists at the Steiner Ranch Elementary Science Rodeo. They shared information about the BCP and their jobs with approximately 300 students, teachers, and parents. Second, staff guided 25 Cub Scouts and their parents from Pack 203 on a hike through the preserve in Steiner Ranch. Hikers learned about the difference between a preserve and a park, hiking safety, consequences and dangers of trespassing, poison ivy, invasive plants, endangered species, gall wasps, native plants and wildlife, and a little about the history of the Texas Hill Country. The Scouts plan to make seed balls, which will be spread at the BCP to restore native grasses and wildflowers to disturbed areas. Third, Travis County staff led interpretive hikes for six classes of third graders, teachers, and parents through the greenbelt by Steiner Ranch Elementary School. The students learned about the preserve, endangered species, law enforcement, invasive plants, non-point source pollution, and plant adaptations. We look forward to future education and outreach events at Steiner Ranch. # Steiner Ranch History Corner

McNelly Trail in Steiner Ranch is named after one of the most famous of all the Texas Rangers. In June 1875, Capt. Leander H. McNelly, age 31, led the Red Raid in Nueces County near the Gulf of Mexico. After receiving a telegram complaining of widespread cattle theft, McNelly organized a company of Texas Rangers and moved south from his home in Burton. As McNelly approached the border, he found the area overrun by bands of armed men who associated for the public purpose of self-protection, but they could not be distinguished by their appearance or their behavior from the groups whose only purpose was to plunder and raid the Mexicans and the local ranches.

McNelly's usual tactic was to use overwhelming force, and he quickly charged in and struck down these organized groups, both Mexican and Americans alike. He felt this was necessary to the eventual clean-up he had planned. He was horrified by the acts of terror these groups had been part of: burning ranches, stealing cattle and murdering or driving away ranch owners. So he disbanded them by forbidding them to gather, which they reluctantly agreed to. McNelly discovered the large increase in cattle theft was due to the Mexicans securing large contracts to deliver beef to the Cuban market. When McNelly got to Port Isabel, there was a steamer off shore to receive a herd of 400 cattle. Hidden cattle were discovered in a marsh, and McNelly chased down and slew dozens of Mexican thieves. 265 cattle, 2/3 of which had American brands were captured. One Ranger was lost. After the raid, McNelly wrote in his report that the whole area was out of control, with the Mexicans nationals vowing revenge and the Mexican residents of Brownsville decrying the killing and irritated by the attention paid to the dead soldier. ### From the Association Office **FIREWORKS / FIRECRACKERS PROHIBITED** *Steiner Ranch Fireworks Policy*

The Steiner Ranch Master Association (SRMA) and the Steiner Ranch Residential Owners Association (SRROA) have heard from an increasing number of homeowners concerning fireworks and firecrackers in Steiner Ranch.

All homeowners are reminded that Section 2.14 of the Steiner Ranch Master Association Development Area Declaration and Section 3.13 of the Steiner Ranch Residential Owners Association Covenants, Conditions & Restrictions (CC&R's) titled Hazardous Activities SPECIFICALLY forbid fireworks within Steiner Ranch, unless prior written board approval has been granted for professional pyrotechnic shows meeting all mandated safety requirements.

There are a number of reasons for this prohibition.

- 1. The usage of increasingly powerful fireworks places homes at serious risk of fire.
- 2. The topography and green space of Steiner Ranch are conducive to major fires.
- 3. Federal rules regarding management of the BCCP (which borders Steiner Ranch) impose significant restrictions on activities that may affect the wildlife therein. Serious penalties for their violation can be imposed by federal officials.
- 4. Homeowners are entitled to the peaceable enjoyment of their property.

Fireworks and firecrackers are and will remain prohibited in Steiner Ranch for the reasons above. Your Board has authorized a warning for the first violation and a \$250 fine for the second violation of Section 2.14 and/or Section 3.13. Violations, once finalized after appeal, are permanent; repeat violations are subject to a \$500 fine. Professional patrols are in place to assist with the implementation of this policy.

Your Board reminds all homeowners that each of us has the ability and the responsibility to enforce the CC&Rs of Steiner Ranch whenever we feel that a violation is occurring. In the matter of fireworks and firecrackers, please contact the Association Office, at (512) 266-7553 as soon as possible during or immediately following an occurrence. Physical and/or photographic evidence is very helpful in substantiating a violation.

# What should I do if I see a coyote?

#### To report coyote sightings, call 3-1-1.

You will be asked to describe in detail the nature of your complaint, time, location, etc. The city's Animal Control Program will gather data related to coyotes and provide that information to Texas Wildlife Services for response/follow-up. Animal Control will respond to reports of injured or trapped coyotes.

Call 3-1-1 to report a coyote attack on a human (to date there have been no reports in Travis County of coyotes attacking humans).

### BOATS AND WATERCRAFT PARKING

### Where can I park them?

Boats and other watercraft are frequently seen in Steiner Ranch. Please remember that boats and watercraft must be stored in an enclosed space at all times. Do not store them on your driveway or park them in the street. They are unsightly in your driveway and are an extreme safety hazard in the street. Repeat violators are subject to fines and/or towing.

If you see a boat, trailer or other recreational vehicle, feel free to report it to the Association at www.steinerranchhoa. org through the "Report a Problem" link. Please include a description of the violation and the address where the violation has occurred.

### Where Am I?

Do you know the addresses for the Towne Square Pool or the Lake Club? If you have an emergency while you are at a Steiner Ranch facility and you call for help from your cellular telephone, the emergency dispatcher will not receive a display identifying your location. (For address identification, a call must originate from a landline telephone.) ### Pool Procedures BATHROOM BREAK!

Every summer the Steiner Ranch Community Pools have to shut down on several occasions due to "accidents". These types of problems will cause a pool to shut down for many hours, sometimes all day, so the pool can be treated and given time for the water to "turn over".

Parents, please help keep the pools clean by taking your children on frequent bathroom breaks. The lifeguards will have the kids get out of the pool during Adult Swim to give kids this opportunity. Children who wear swim diapers should be checked often and when necessary, should be changed in the bathroom and not at poolside.

### **No Diapers Allowed**

As the swim season gears up, please be aware of the pool policy regarding children who are not potty-trained:

Children who are not potty-trained and who use swim diapers are not allowed in the Bella Mar Lap Pool.

All other community pools:

Double diapers (swim diaper + plastic pants) must be worn by children who have not been completely toilet trained. Ask the lifeguards, they usually have a supply of plastic pants on hand.

This policy is in place to help keep accidents from happening and to reduce the need to close pools due to contamination.

### Playscape Structure Submittal

If you are thinking about getting the kids a playscape, don't forget that it will need to be reviewed to the Architectural Committee first. Things you should keep in mind when selecting a playscape:

- Must be constructed with a lumber that resists rotting and deterioration, i.e. redwood or treated lumber.
- Canopies on the playscape must be a solid color, preferably green or earth tone.
- Setbacks for playscapes are to be no less than 5' from each property line.
- Views of the playscape must be minimized from public streets and adjoining units.

Once you've decided on the playscape and location, complete the Architectural Modification form and include the requested items (i.e. photo of playscape, description of materials to be used, etc.) along with the required \$500 refundable deposit check to the Association for review by the Architectural Committee.

#### Architectural Modification Requirements

So you've decided to do some improvements or make changes to the outside of your home...... what do you do now?

- I. Complete the Architectural Modification form (owner only)
- 2. Include any addendum forms such as for a pool or deck
- 3. Include a scaled drawing showing plan and elevation views of the proposed improvements, modifications or alterations. Submittals must include samples depicting the proposed materials and colors to be used.
- 4. A lot survey (which the owner receives at closing) indicating the location of proposed improvements, and any applicable easements, setbacks, and elevation differences on lot.
- 5. Deposit check in the amount of \$500

All of these forms can be found on-line at www.steinerranchhoa. org.

Do you have a holiday party or wedding reception to plan? Baby shower too big for the backyard? Birthday party coming up? How about a school/office party? Is your living room too small for a large celebration? We can accommodate a gathering of any size for a very reasonable price!

Being a resident of Steiner Ranch has many advantages. One of them is the variety of facilities available to rent. Many of you do not even realize that we have two indoor clubhouses with full kitchens! Another benefit is our electronic key tags that long ago replaced the "old-fashioned" keys that give you access to all indoor and outdoor facilities. If you do not have a facility tag or if you have lost\* yours, please visit the HOA office to pick one up!

To rent any one (or more) of our facilities just follow these easy steps:

- 1. <u>When and Where?</u> Go to our website at www.steinerranchhoa.org and click on Facility Reservations (on the left). The available areas have a hyperlink that you can click on to check availability. Once you have the date and time in mind, call the Associations Management Office to place your name on the calendar.
- 2. <u>First come, first served.</u> Your "hold" is only good for TWO days until you turn in your completed reservation form and make full payment (including deposit, if required). We will not make calls to remind you to pay. If you have not made a payment for your reservation after the two days, your reservation will be relinquished.
- 3. <u>What now?</u> Once you have turned in your payment and paperwork, you need not do anything else. The HOA office will activate your facility tag and post a sign at each

designated facility letting all visitors know you have it rented.

- 4. What do you get for your money? All reservations are set and priced for 6 hour blocks. Even if you plan to use it for only 2 hours you must pay the minimum price. All of our outdoor covered pavilions and uncovered areas and parks are \$25. You do not have to rent out the parks unless you want a guaranteed spot. Towne Square is our larger indoor facility that can hold 80 seated persons and costs \$100. Bella Mar is our newer facility that can hold 40 seated persons and is \$75. Both indoor facilities require a \$300 deposit.
- 5. <u>Cleaning Up</u>. Please remember that there may be a reservation coming in right after you. You are required to clean up after your event. We have a maintenance staff on-site that checks in and takes pictures of damage and/or untidiness of the facilities. You may opt for our staff to clean up after you for an additional \$100. (You are still required to dispose of your trash.)
- 6. <u>Cancelling</u>. If you need to cancel your reservation please call the Association Management Office at least 3 days prior to your reservation for a full refund.

Please call (512) 266-7553 if you have additional questions.

\*If you have lost your facility tag, it needs to be reported as LOST immediately to prevent it from getting into the wrong hands. There is a \$20 replacement fee required to obtain a new tag.

Please note: The Steiner Ranch HOA provides each facility "as is" with tables and chairs. Outdoor heaters, fire pits, set-up/break-down and ashtrays are not provided.

#### WCID #17 Mandatory 2 Day Per Week Watering Started May 1st

NO CALENDAR IS NEEDED, all you need to do is set your irrigation system to your two designated watering days. Steiner Ranch residents:

- odd numbered addresses will water Wednesdays and Saturdays
- even numbered addresses will water Thursdays and Sundays.

Residential customers will be required to adhere to this schedule May 1 through September 30, and encouraged to adhere to it the rest of the year.

Systems such as the one used by the Steiner Ranch HOA using reclaimed or recycled water will not be subject to the restrictions.

The time of day residents may water. To reduce wasting water through evaporation during daytime heat, watering with an automatic irrigation system is permitted before 10am or after 7pm. Watering with a hand held hose or bucket may be done any time of day or any day of the week. Other water uses such as washing cars or boats is not restricted to watering days unless increased conservation measures become necessary.

- 1 Medium red vine tomato, diced
- 1 Medium sweet onion, diced

#### **GRILLED VEGETABLE KABOBS**

- 2 zucchini
- 1 red and 1 yellow bell pepper
- 1 onion
- 12 oz halved mushrooms
- 4 skewers

Cut bell peppers, onions, and zucchini into uniform pieces. Thread the vegetables onto the skewers. Optionally brush with oil and vinegar and then place on grill until vegetables are tender and slightly brown.

### News You Can Use KEEP OUT MEANS KEEP OUT (for your Safety) Children's Curiosity Could Result in Injury

Summer is upon us and WCID 17 General Manager asks that you "please explain to your children the hazards of entering any area that is fenced off such as wastewater and water pumping stations and tank sites. These areas are fenced off for safety!" Not only could your child damage property, they could sustain serious injury just trying to climb a fence. They could also encounter hazards such as electrical circuits with high voltage, razor wire and deep manholes. She said that some teenagers consider it to be a harmless prank to climb water tanks and paint initials on them as a rite of passage. "This is not the case. The height of the tanks (120-140 ft) and high winds at those altitudes makes them extremely dangerous places, even for experienced personnel with the proper safety equipment." In addition, antiterrorism laws make tampering with or even unauthorized entry into any public water or wastewater facility a serious federal offense punishable by lengthy jail time.

District 17 uses a variety of entry deterrents on both water and wastewater facilities including high fences, barbed wire, and razor wire. WCID 17 will enforce a \$100 fine for any first offender and \$500 for a second offense. The General Manager explained that "WCID 17 has installed motion detecting cameras on most of their sites to help identify any unauthorized entries." Please report any suspicious activity around wastewater pumping stations, water tanks, hydrants, or water pumping stations to the WCID 17 office at 512-266-1111 or emergency pager after hours, 512-397-9061. You can help keep your children safe! Please keep children out of water and wastewater facilities.

### **COMPUTING 101** How's Your Memory?

I run into this bit of confusion almost every day – people deleting files to give them more "memory". Deleting files may give you more hard drive space, but it won't give you more memory.

Let's start with the hard drive. The hard drive in your computer is your filing cabinet. This is where Windows and all your programs are installed. ALSO, this is where ALL your documents, music, photos and movies are stored. Your hard drive is your storage in the same way that you may have music CD's or DVD's stored on a shelf, or your important papers in a filing cabinet. Getting a bigger hard drive simply gives you more storage. A Terabyte hard drive can hold the equivalent of 1,000 copies of the Encyclopedia Britannica. No one listen to all their music at the same time, or looks at all their photos or movies at the same time – we take what we want from "storage" and use the particular item at the time we want to. That takes us to memory.

Memory is made up of small chips inside your computer. They work kind of like an old calculator. Turn off the power and it goes blank. Turn on the power and you start filling it all over again. Memory is what your computer uses when it's actually working on something. The processor inside your computer (probably by AMD or Intel) is what actually does the thinking. Because memory chips are MUCH faster than your hard drive, the computer pulls what it needs at the time into memory FROM the hard drive.

Let me put it into non-computer terms. You have a wall in your office filled with filing cabinets filled with papers; this is your hard drive. You have a desk that you work at that's 3 feet wide and 2 feet deep; this is your memory. YOU are doing the thinking and working with the papers; this is your processor. What happens when you have more papers to work with than desk space? You start shuffling papers around, maybe putting them into stacks and moving stacks around – this slows getting your actual task done. If you had a bigger desk, you wouldn't waste time shuffling papers. This is where more memory comes into play.

So deleting files from your hard drive doesn't speed up your computer any more than throwing away papers in your filing cabinet helps you get the task at your desk done.

When your computer wants to use more memory than it actually has, it does what we do when we get more information than we can remember – write it down! We use paper; the computer uses the *(Continued on Page 59)*

hard drive. To "add" to its memory, the computer uses unused space on the hard drive to "extend" its memory. The problem with this is writing to the hard drive is MUCH slower, your computer slows down. The solution, close programs that are running you don't need OR buy more memory. The good news? Memory is cheap! Sites like www.crucial.com will peek inside your computer, tell you what you have inside and what you can upgrade with. The Windows Task Manager will tell you how much of your memory you're using. If you're using 80% or more, you'll be noticing a dramatic decrease in speed. Installing memory isn't hard in most computers, but if you're not comfortable call a professional.

Goodbye Windows 2,000! On July 13th, 2010, all versions of Windows 2000 and Windows XP RUNNING SERVICE PACK 2 will reach the end of support. Microsoft will no longer be updating these products. If you have a system running Windows 2000, it's time to move that machine up to XP. If you're still running Service Pack 2 in XP, you need to download Service Pack 3 to continue getting updates. Go to http://www.update.microsoft.com/microsoftupdate to get Service Pack 3, or consider upgrading to Windows 7. Windows XP with Service Pack 3 will continue to be supported by Microsoft through April 8, 2014.

### Gardening in the Hill Country

Spring is in full swing with bright green mornings full of sunshine and bird song. Area garden centers are bursting with eager gardeners loading carts with compost, flowers and landscape supplies. While riding the energy of the season to beautify your yard, keep in mind a few things that will help the garden flourish through spring and summer.

Healthy soil supports a healthy landscape. Dedicate energy every year to improving your soil, and you will be richly rewarded with better blooms, improved water efficiency, and fewer disease problems. Work compost into garden and flower beds, and top-dress established areas and lawns with compost. Compost improves soil quality, and reduces or eliminates the need for fertilizer.

Water your garden efficiently and effectively. Although some watering is necessary to sustain gardens in the Hill Country, many people water too much! Over-watering wet or shallow soil results in weakened or diseased plants as well as runoff (water and money down the storm drain). For our thin and clay Hill Country soils,  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch, twice per week is the maximum amount you should need to water--even during the heat of summer. During spring and fall,  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch once per week is plenty.

Watering between dusk and dawn further increases the effectiveness of the water you use by reducing evaporation and increasing the amount of water that makes it to plant roots.

Twice per week summer watering is good for landscapes and also good for water supply. Over 60 percent of residential water is used on landscapes in the summer, resulting in water treatment plants experiencing peak demands. Efficient watering reduces the need to built new water treatment plants.

The City of Austin requires their customers to water no more than twice per week watering schedule effective May 1 through September 30. LCRA encourages all of its retail customers to follow Austin's schedule. The watering schedule is as follows:

#### Odd Addresses: Wednesday And Saturday Even Addresses: Thursday And Sunday Commercial And Hoa Common Areas: Tuesday And Friday

Healthy soil and efficient watering will assure that the vibrant flowers in your shopping cart at the garden center thrive in your yard throughout the growing season. Be sure to consider using native and adapted plants that are drought tolerant. ### **Getting Muscles**

Ever wish you could be as muscular as a superhero or your favorite professional athlete? Well, the big muscles you're thinking about aren't possible for kids. Superheroes, of course, aren't real, and professional athletes are grown-ups, whose bodies are different from kids' bodies in many ways.

Boys, especially, might wish for bigger muscles, but their bodies can't build that kind of grown-up muscle until they're older. On the bright side, both boys and girls can do a lot to build strong, healthy muscles. Let's find out how.

#### **Playing Makes Muscles**

It sounds too simple, but it's true. Playing, running, jumping, and riding your bike can make your muscles stronger. Any physical activity you like to do - from dancing to playing football - can make you stronger. Why? Because you're using your muscles when you do it.

#### Eat Strong

What should you eat if you want strong muscles? You might think you need a lot of foods that contain protein (such as meat and eggs) or foods that contain iron. But there's no one magical food that helps build muscles. Your muscles - and your entire body - will be strong and healthy if you eat a variety of nutritious foods.

#### Should You Pump Iron?

Some kids want to lift weights so they can look bigger and stronger. But lifting weights won't produce big muscles in kids who haven't gone through puberty yet, and lifting heavy weights can be dangerous to kids' muscles and tendons.

With supervision from a coach or trainer, kids can do some light weight lifting or exercise with resistance bands (large rubber bands). This kind

of exercise can improve muscle tone, meaning a kid's muscles will be leaner and stronger, but not really bigger.

Push-ups, sit-ups, and chin-ups also help build strong muscles. But so can plain old running, jumping, and climbing. Get the message? More play time means stronger muscles. Now that's something to get pumped up about!
