Girl Scouts are Recycling & Keeping Houston Beautiful!

What can you recycle?

Lots of things can be recycled. Paper, cans, plastics, and glass can all be recycled. These are just some of the things the City of Houston recycles:

- Newspapers and magazines.
- Aluminum and steel cans.
 - A soda pop can is made of aluminum.
 - A soup can is an example of a can made of steel.
 - Empty aerosol cans are ok, too, because they are made of steel.
- Plastic soft drink and detergent bottles labeled with a 1 or 2.
- Glass jars and bottles.

It's especially important to recycle paper. Cans, plastics and glasses are each less than 10% of household waste. We throw away four times that much paper. Remember to store your recyclables in the garage or in some other safe, dry area. Keep collecting them until it's recycling day at your housewhen you set them out for curbside pickup or drop them off at a recycling center.

How do you prepare items for recycling?

Sort materials, rinse containers, and store in a safe, dry place. It's easy. With a little practice, it takes less than five minutes a day. Sort your materials and rinse any leftover contents from containers so your items won't begin to smell bad or attract ants and bees. Here is how the City of Houston wants you to sort materials and get them ready to recycle.

- Newspapers: place in paper bags, stack and store.
- Cans: empty, rinse and store.
- Plastic containers: empty, rinse, flatten and store.
- Glass containers: empty and rinse. Separate by color - clear, brown, and green. Store unbroken.
- Motor oil: drain and store in a sealed container.

How does Houston recycle?

The City collects all the recyclable materials we've talked about - and many more. The City of Houston offers several recycling opportunities which include:

- Curbside program
- Wood waste recycling
- Yard waste
- Neighborhood depositories
- Household hazardous waste
- Staffed recycling hotline
- Used oi
- Consumer drive-thru facility
- Christmas tree recycling
- Office paper recycling

The City of Houston has set up several programs to recycle many different types of materials. But it's people, not programs that make recycling work. We have to change the way we've been throwing things out for years. When we persuade everybody to recycle, and we all work together, recycling becomes more effective. It's up to each of us to make the effort.

So if you haven't been recycling, get started. And if you already recycle, keep saving things to reuse. Support anything that helps the environment and cuts down waste. Here is a case where everyday actions can have a direct and immediate impact on the world around us.

The answer to our garbage problem begins in our homes and at our curbside. Recycling starts with you. The City staffs a recycling hotline, call to find out what is recyclable, the proper way to dispose of trash, and where to take recyclables. The number is 713-837-0311.

Fairfield Residents Attend AquaPalooza in Austin


The 2010 Hurricane Season began on June 1, 2010, and will end on November 30, 2010. The experts are predicting a busier-than-usual hurricane season for 2010. If the early forecasts prove to be accurate, the 2010 hurricane season will stand in sharp contrast to the relatively mild 2009 season. In 2009, Hurricane Ike caused tremendous damage throughout the greater Houston area. A large portion of the damage inflicted by the Hurricane was caused by uprooted or fallen trees.

In preparation for Hurricane season, we should make our trees more wind resistant by removing diseased and damaged limbs, and strategically remove limbs throughout the canopy. This provides less wind resistance in a storm when the wind can blow through the tree. Keep overhanging branches on homes to a minimum, and check for trees entangled in power lines.

Native trees such as Live Oak, Cypress, and Red Maple do survive hurricanes better than non-natives. In high winds, Palms will bend, but not always break. Since they originated in the tropics and sub-tropics, their trunks have adapted to hurricanes. Although fronds will be damaged in a storm, most Palms including Chinese Fan, Majesty, and Pygmy Dates will recover. Queen Palms are the exception due to very low wind tolerance.

We all live extremely busy lives out here, and when storms approach it could be too late to thin out or take care of that dead tree that has been there for a while Take some time to care for your trees and they will thank you in many ways.

Didn't I Just Pay This in January???

Most homeowners have received the 2010 Fairfield Village assessment notices. This is for the master association whereas the assessment in January was for your individual neighborhood. The amount due is \$520.00.

Unfortunately, the amount has increased from last year. This increase is necessary due to a deficit caused by an increase in the Northwest Harris County Regional Water Authority pumpage fees for the 4 wells in Fairfield Village. The community irrigates from the lakes. Fairfield Village doesn't pay for the water itself but does pay to pump the water.

There was also a transfer of costs from the neighborhood associations to the Master association that accounted for \$8.00 of the \$25.00 increase. The neighborhood associations had no increase for 2010, but the Master association is now paying some of the shared pool costs that were paid by the neighborhoods in prior years.

It is now possible to pay your assessment by credit card or E-check. Please visit www.amitx.com and click on 'Payment Options.'

2' x 3' in size and are supported by thin metal stakes.


Your Governing Documents address signage issues and allow for the following types:

What Can You Do **About Soliciting** In The Neighborhood?

Many communities are ripe targets for solicitors – for a variety of reasons. While the Association has no real control over soliciting activities, we have tried to discourage solicitors from marketing in our community by placing "no soliciting" signs in common areas.

The reason that we cannot prevent soliciting is that the streets and roadways within the community are public access ways owned and maintained by the county. This means that no person or persons may be prevented from entering the community. Of course, if an individual or individuals are in the process of breaking the law, the Sheriff or other law enforcement officer can take immediate

Your Association recommends the following actions that every owner can take to discourage unwelcome soliciting in the community:

- Report all suspicious persons to the Sheriff's Department and request the deputies on duty be made aware of your concerns.
- Promptly remove all flyers left on your front or garage door.
- Promptly report to the Post Office all flyers left on the mailboxes.
- Refuse to make use of solicitors' offers and refuse to patronize any company being marketed in this manner.
- Notify the managing agent of any companies presently soliciting so that letters can be sent advising them of this policy of not permitting door to door soliciting (they will be reminded of the community newsletter and/or the Green Sheet as marketing options).
- Individual homeowners have the ability to place a small "No Trespassing/No Soliciting" sign at the entry to their homes. Should a solicitor continue to leave flyers, the homeowner then has the authority to file charges against the Solicitor/Company for trespassing on private property.

GOLF CARTS, ATVS, DIRT BIKES

As you are aware, there has been a great deal of vandalism within Fairfield Village, all repaired at a cost to you, the homeowner. As the vandalism continues, and as the cost to make the necessary repairs and replacement increases, it also becomes necessary to increase your assessment.

Vandalism includes the operation of a *Golf Cart, ATV, or a Dirt Bike* on common areas (including sidewalks) or greenbelts. The Sheriff will be notified of anyone seen driving these vehicles. *Should the person(s) be under age, the Association will legally pursue the legal guardian for all damages incurred.*

Your Association has spent thousands of dollars, your dollars, repairing sidewalks, gazebos, entry markers, irrigation, ruts, etc., and now it's time to make this stop.

If you see anyone suspicious, by all means contact the Sheriff on the non-emergency number (713-221-6000) and report the incident. Thank you.

An AMI representative drives through each neighborhood once per month and sends violation (or gentle reminder) letters based on what is observed on that day. If you are aware of an unkempt property (possibly vacant or a foreclosure) once per month is not sufficient to stay on top of yard issues. "For Thou didst form my inward parts; Thou didst weave me in my mother's womb. I will give thanks to Thee, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are Thy works, and my soul knows it very well" (Psalm 139:13-14).

What if you were to stumble upon a wristwatch in an open field? Would you conclude that it naturally grew there? Or would you conclude that there was a watchmaker, and someone dropped it there? It is this illustration that drives the question of God's existence by design.

Observational evidence teaches that intricate design points to a designer—from paintings to cars to watches. Like the universe, these effects must have had a cause. As the design becomes more intricate so does the designer. Naturally speaking, one can observe dams built by beavers, but when one considers the Hoover Dam no sane person can conclude that it formed naturally. The same is true for the great works of literature. A million monkeys with laptop computers (another special design in itself!) could not ever produce a piece of literature worth reading, but a human author can compose a great work through careful thought and design in a short time.

Of course there are simple patterns in nature like those found in snowflakes and quartz crystals. Likewise, pebbles in a stream can be seen to have various patterns of erosion. But if one were to find a sentence etched in the side of a mountain or an arrowhead in the stream, these findings would point to something beyond that which is natural, namely a designer.

Thus, when one observes the universe they see careful and intricate design. There are various forces working together that sustain the design and life that exists on earth. Each one benefits the other, and if one were to break down then the whole system would break down.

If one were to take a single DNA molecule, which is the building block of all life, they would find the same amount of information as is found in a single volume of an encyclopedia! Now, no one who found an encyclopedia in an open field would conclude that it got there by chance. Anyone with a brain would know that some intellect created it. So why is it that when skeptics today find living creatures, which are composed of millions of DNA-based cells, they conclude that there is no Creator and that they evolved by chance? Even the late Carl Sagan is quoted as saying, "The information content of the human brain expressed in bits is probably comparable to the total number of connections among neurons—about a hundred trillion...If written out in English, say, that information would fill some 20 million volumes, as many as in the world's largest libraries. The equivalent of 20 million books is inside the heads of every one of us. The brain is a very big place in a very small space... The neurochemistry of the brain is astonishingly busy, the circuitry of a machine more wonderful than any devised by humans." But to Sagan it wasn't "devised" by God but through chance and evolutionary processes.


Evolutionists like Sagan have great faith, for most of them will object to the design argument and simply conclude that chance is responsible for the design of the universe. Problem is, the argument for God's existence from the observable design has nothing at all to do with chance which is nothing more than a word for odds that reveal man's ignorance. Repeated observation (scientific method) reveals intelligent causes, and this is what science is all about—repeated observation, not chance. Thus, the skeptic who thinks science debunks God and Christianity is actually ignoring science which points directly to a Designer! But for the sake of argument, even if chance was responsible for the created order, the odds are far higher that there is a Designer. One scientist figured the odds for a one-cell animal to emerge by pure chance at 1 in 1040000 (that's a 1 with 40,000 zeros behind it!). And that's just a one-cell animal! The odds become infinitely higher for a human being to emerge by chance which would of course demand a man and a woman to perpetuate the species. It sure takes a lot of faith to believe in evolution!



Tips and Juidelines

How Should You Prepare For Power Outages?

- In the event of severe weather, such as a hurricane, power outages are likely to
- For widespread power outages, CenterPoint Energy has a restoration process by priorities that will be followed in the event of a major storm.
- When a major storm is forecast, all customers should plan to be without power for an extended amount of time following landfall.
- If someone in your home depends on electricity for life-sustaining equipment, you need to make other arrangements. Evacuation would be a good option.
- Turn off your electricity at the circuit breaker if you evacuate and expect flood water to approach your home.
- Unplug sensitive electrical appliances, such as TV and computers.
- Maintain line clearance from trees and weak limbs.
- What should you do following a major storm or hurricane?
- Limit calls to CenterPoint Energy during the first few days to only true emergencies.
 CNP's technology indicates locations in the case of widespread power outages.
- The company's first priority in restoring service is to key facilities vital to safety,

- health and welfare, such as hospitals, water treatment plants and public service facilities. Second priorities are the major lines and circuits that will restore power to the greatest number of customers in the shortest amount of time. Third priority, we repair transformers, which typically serve 10 customers and finally fourth priority, we repair individual electric service drops to homes.
- Restoration times can vary for severe weather event. Under CenterPoint Energy's restoration process, your neighbor's power may be restored before yours if there is a problem with your individual service drop.
- Stay away from low-hanging or downed power lines. Treat all downed power lines as if they are energized. Report lowhanging or downed power lines to (713) 207-2222.
- Avoid standing water energized power lines could be submerged in the water.
- If you have evacuated and want to check your home for electric service, please do not call CenterPoint Energy in the first few days following the storm. Instead, we suggest: leave your answering machine activated and call your house to check if it picks up, call neighbors, monitor the news, and check website CenterPointEnergy.com for general outage information.

- Do not connect generators directly to wiring in a house or building without having a licensed electrician disconnect the wiring from CenterPoint Energy's service. It can create a safety hazard for CenterPoint Energy's lineman.
- Never run generators indoors or in a garage. Gasoline-powered generators can produce carbon monoxide, and the odorless fumes can be deadly.
- What should you do if your electrical outlets are covered with water or you have damage to weatherhead or other electrical facilities?
- Contact a licensed electrician before turning on the main circuit breaker.
- Check your weatherhead, which connects the overhead power line to your home or business. Any weatherhead problems will need to be repaired by your electrician prior to CNP restoring service. (Your electrician should obtain all permits required prior to you contacting CNP for a work order.)
- Any submerged appliances or equipment will need to dry for at least one week and be checked by a qualified repair person prior to being turned on.
- Once all repairs have been made to your electrical equipment, then contact your provider and they will issue a work order to CenterPoint Energy to begin work and restore your service.

 - Have a spelling bee or trivia contest. Bring index cards to write down words or questions.


