## NATIONAL NIGHT OUT

HPWBANA encourages all streets/ blocks to celebrate National Night Out on Tuesday, October 5, 2010 with other neighborhoods throughout Austin.

'National Night Out' is designed to heighten crime awareness and general support in crime-fighting efforts.

On October 5, 2010, from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., residents in neighborhoods throughout Austin and across the nation are asked to turn on their porch lights, lock their doors and spend the evening outside with their neighbors, police officers, firefighters and EMS paramedics. Events such as cookouts, block parties and neighborhood walks will all occur simultaneously throughout the city and nationwide.

APD will make every effort to have a 1st responder stop by each party that is registered by the deadline date of September 10, 2010.

# BLOCK CAPTAINS NEEDED FOR NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

TRAINING SESSION: AUGUST 28, 2010, 9:00 a.m. at The Crenshaw's Cottage

# **UPDATE: TRAFFIC** CALMING PROJECT FOR PERRY LANE AND BIG BEND

I have been in communication with City of Austin regarding the commencement of the project. The new start date is set as July 21, 2010. Removal of the existing speed bumps on Perry lane will take place first then the installation of the new speed cushions will begin. The process involves saw cutting out a section of pavement and then placing the new speed cushions in. Normally the construction crew can install about 6 cushions a day which would be about a week and a half of work. However, it may take longer due to the fact that the existing speed bumps will be removed first.

The traffic circle is currently being designed by the city engineer, and the design should be complete by July 14. The gateway design has not begun yet as the city is still discussing engineering issues with its proposed location. I will continue to keep the neighborhood updated as installation of the circle and the gateway become final.

# Recipe of the Month Chicken Cordon-Bleu

### Ingredients

8 small boneless, skinless chicken breasts

8 thin slices ham

8 slices Swiss cheese 1 egg salt & pepper

1/4 C white wine <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> - <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> C sour cream parsely, minced

½ C margarine

2 C bread crumbs, with Parmesean cheese

#### Directions

Flatten chicken breasts with meat clever or mallet. Place slice of ham and cheese on each chicken breast. Roll up and secure with string. Dip chicken in egg and roll in seasoned bread crumbs. Heat butter in skillet. Brown breasts. Reduce heat and cook until done, about 30 minutes. Remove breasts. Add wine and sour cream to drippings. Mix. Add parsely. Put chicken back in wine sauce. Heat and serve.

Feathers were everywhere. White peacock feathers. This was the scene on the street in front of Mayfield Park and Preserve early June. The preserve manager reported that a white peahen had been struck by a


car and taken to Austin Wildlife Rescue (http://austinwildliferescue. org/). The peahen needed surgery to stitch up a 6 inch gash. Peacocks are a common and welcome sight in the general area of 3505

W 35th Street as they wander Mayfield Park and Preserve, Laguna Gloria and the Westwood Country Club. People speeding in that area are also common so it was not really a surprise that something

was hit and injured, nor was it the first time a peacock was hit by a car. Hopefully people will notice the newly posted peacock signs and children crossing signs and be more careful.

The peacocks freely roaming the grounds of Mayfield are a favorite feature. They are most often the first thing park visitors look for when they arrive at the park. Children and adults just love them. The Mayfield peafowl flock is very well taken care of by a band of volunteers led by Ann Eby, a resident in our neighborhood. These dedicated volunteers ensure the peacocks are fed great quality food every day (grains, fruits, vegetables) and have fresh water to drink. Ann has been caring for the Mayfield peacocks for about 15 years now. That is a lot a daily feedings. To all these volunteers – Thank You!




### **OAK WILT DISEASE**

Oak wilt is a very real and very important concern among Texas landowners. Oak wilt, caused by the fungus Ceratocystis fagacearum, is one of the most destructive tree diseases in the United States. The bad news is that it occurs in over 60 Texas counties and will never completely disappear. The good news is that with some basic knowledge about how and why oak wilt spreads, you can take steps to help prevent infections on your land.

The oak wilt fungus kills by clogging the water conducting system of the tree. All oaks are susceptible to oak wilt to varying degrees. Live oaks are probably the most obvious victims of the disease because they die in the largest numbers, mainly because of their interconnected root systems that allow the rapid spread of the fungus. And infected trees often die within 6-12 months. But how do they get it? From red oaks.



Red oaks are extremely susceptible and often die within a few weeks of apparent symptoms. Red oaks act as breeding grounds for the fungus. Under the right conditions, fungal mats under the bark often create cracks in the bark and emit a fruity odor. Tiny, sap-feeding Nitidulid beetles are attracted to these mats and feed on them, gathering fungal spores as they do. When the beetles find a fresh wound on another oak they feed on the sap and transmit the spores, infecting the tree. This is how

new infections are created in live oaks.

Interestingly, red oaks often do not exhibit any clear symptoms besides pale and brown leaves during an unusual time of year. The tree dies shortly thereafter.

Since the disease only spreads in two ways and new infections are only established by beetles feeding on wounded oak trees, by taking precautions you can help prevent the spread of oak wilt. Fungal mats tend to form during mild, spring-like weather, when beetles are most abundant. You should avoid pruning oaks during these times to reduce the chance of infection. Winter and hot summer are good times to prune your trees, while spring is the worst time for these activities, even though it may be the nicest time to work outside. No matter when you prune, you should always immediately paint your cuts or any wounds on your oak trees with pruning paint or standard latex paint. Contaminated beetles may be present at any time and painting will prevent them from feeding on the sap from fresh wounds.

Tree health, age, and size have no impact on susceptibility to oak wilt so you should always paint cuts on oaks, no matter how healthy they are. Importantly, if you hire a tree service, insist that they clean all their saws and cutters with a bleach solution before working on your trees. 
