The overall number of 'issues' which crop up on a regular basis have been minimal and most have been taken care of before they blossomed into full blown problems. The Board took a vacation as well and will have our next regular meeting in August.

Communication is not a four letter word

As any relationship specialist will attest to, communication is the key. This holds no different truth when interacting with your HOA. If you received a Deed Restriction violation notice...maybe the trim on your house or a gutter needs fixing or a trashcan is visible from the street....please don't just ignore the letter. I can assure you more will follow and financial penalties will as well. Violation letters give a timeframe before the next inspection to fix the problem. If it is something like a trashcan in view, move it to an appropriate location and that's it.

If something requires more attention (or investment), odds are it will require more time. Please notify Randall Management (RMI) that you are in receipt of the letter and plan to address the problem. They try to make a note on the account for the inspector that the violation is in progress of being repaired and to re-inspect on a provided date. A fair response might be that you plan to get several estimates and have the work completed by the end of the month. If you need more time, please ask. But be reasonable. Asking for 8 months will probably not be approved.

If communication breaks down somewhere in the process, please let the Board know. We have hired RMI to tend to matters such as these and at times, given the volume of work, mistakes happen. The Board tries to admit and rectify mistakes so that we can move on and get other matters in the community addressed.

Pool Season is Nearing its End

The Pool will close weekdays starting August 16th, but will remain open weekends until Labor Day. At the end of the pool season, we will be evaluating the 2010 pool season and start planning for 2011. One change we anticipate is opening the pool before Memorial Day weekend...maybe a weekend or two since the weather seems to warrant the change. 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


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


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
