



5th Annual Cy-Fair VFD Fire Fest Sat Oct 9th



The Cy-Fair Volunteer Fire Department would like to welcome the community to our fifth Annual "Fire Fest" on Saturday, October 9th, 2010 from 10:00 to 02:00 p.m. The event will be held at Cy-Fair Station 11 (18134 West Road, Cypress, TX 77433) behind Lone Star College just west of Barker Cypress. Fire Fest allows the community a glimpse into the life of a fire fighter by providing demonstrations on vehicle fires, vehicle extrications, landing the Life Flight helicopters, and even canine search and rescue. Children can get an up-close look at the fire trucks, play with an actual fire fighting hose, and help put out simulated fires. Families can see some history about each station through story boards depicting the evolution of our fire department. Want to take a picture with a firefighter? No problem, we have that too. New this year will

be demonstrations extinguishing fires using home fire sprinklers and fire extinguishers.

For those interested in joining the ranks of volunteer firefighting we will have a booth set-up to provide details and answer questions on what it takes to be a volunteer firefighter. We will also be showing a short video, providing applications, and giving directions to one of our twelve stations.

The Cy-Fair VFD provides emergency services to residents in the Harris County Emergency Services District #9 located in Northwest Harris County. We currently operate from twelve community based fire stations covering 156 square miles and over 385,000 citizens.


What Can You Do **About Soliciting** In The Neighborhood?

Many communities are ripe targets for solicitors – for a variety of reasons. While the Association has no real control over soliciting activities, we have tried to discourage solicitors from marketing in our community by placing "no soliciting" signs in common areas.

The reason that we cannot prevent soliciting is that the streets and roadways within the community are public access ways owned and maintained by the county. This means that no person or persons may be prevented from entering the community. Of course, if an individual or individuals are in the process of breaking the law, the Sheriff or other law enforcement officer can take immediate action.

Your Association recommends the following actions that every owner can take to discourage unwelcome soliciting in the community:

- Report all suspicious persons to the Sheriff's Department and request the deputies on duty be made aware of your concerns.
- Promptly remove all flyers left on your front or garage door.
- Promptly report to the Post Office all flyers left on the mailboxes.
- Refuse to make use of solicitors' offers and refuse to patronize any company being marketed in this manner.
- Notify the managing agent of any companies presently soliciting so that letters can be sent advising them of this policy of not permitting door to door soliciting (they will be reminded of the community newsletter and/or the Green Sheet as marketing options).
- Individual homeowners have the ability to place a small "No Trespassing/No Soliciting" sign at the entry to their homes. Should a solicitor continue to leave flyers, the homeowner then has the authority to file charges against the Solicitor/Company for trespassing on private property.



GOLF CARTS, ATVS, DIRT BIKES

As you are aware, there has been a great deal of vandalism within Fairfield Village, all repaired at a cost to you, the homeowner. As the vandalism continues, and as the cost to make the necessary repairs and replacement increases, it also becomes necessary to increase your assessment.

Vandalism includes the operation of a Golf Cart, ATV, or a Dirt Bike on common areas (including sidewalks) or greenbelts. The Sheriff will be notified of anyone seen driving these vehicles. **Should** the person(s) be under age, the Association will legally pursue the legal guardian for all damages incurred.

Your Association has spent thousands of dollars, your dollars, repairing sidewalks, gazebos, entry markers, irrigation, ruts, etc., and now it's time to make this stop.

If you see anyone suspicious, by all means contact the Sheriff on the non-emergency number (713-221-6000) and report the incident. Thank you.


Works of A.R.T. = "Authentic Radical Transformation"


