Pool Reminder

Non-Swimmer Safety

Please remember, all non-swimmers must be within arm's reach of a caregiver. When present, the lifeguards are here to oversee the general safety of everyone enjoying the pool. It remains the parent/caregiver's responsibility to keep non-swimmers within arm's reach, use Coast Guard approved flotation devices, use swim diapers (if children are not potty-trained) and monitor the diaper frequently, and address their own child's behavior.

In addition, please remember that arm "floaties" are NOT a life saving device. Other commonly used flotation devices that are NOT considered to be safe enough to protect younger kids in the water include inflatable tubes, air mattresses, rafts, inflatable seats and riders for babies and toddlers, swim rings, wave surf boards, and noodles.

These flotation devices can be fun in the water, but if your child does not know how to swim, be sure to use a Coast Guard approved life vest or life jacket at the same time. Again, please stay within arm's reach when your young child is in the water.

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

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Garage Sale Signs: Plum Creek HOA Rules and the City of Kyle Ordinance

A few residents at the Annual Meeting inquired about posting signs, specifically garage sale signs. So, here's a quick overview of the neighborhood deed restrictions and the city's ordinances pertaining to signage.

In Plum Creek

The Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (DCCR's) are the neighborhood deed restrictions, which are designed to create a desired look in Plum Creek and maintain high property values.

Regarding garage sale signs or any other sign from lost pets to a found bike, one would refer to DCCR 3.12, which reads


- 3.12 Signs. No sign or emblem of any kind may be kept or placed upon any Lot or mounted, painted or attached to any residence, fence or other Improvement upon such Lot so as to be visible from public view except the following:
- (i) For Sale or Lease Signs. An Owner may erect one (1) sign not exceeding ~' x 3' in area, fastened only to a stake in the ground and extending not more than three (3) feet above the surface of the ground advertising the property for sale or lease.
- (ii) Declarant's and Builders' Signs. Signs or billboards may be erected by the Declarant without approval of the Architectural

- Review Committee. Builders may erect signs or billboards only with prior written approval of the Architectural Review Committee.
- (iii) Political Signs. Political signs may be erected upon a Lot by the Owner. of such Lot advocating the election of one or more political candidates or the sponsorship of a political party, issue or proposal provided that such signs shall not be erected more than ninety (90) days in advance of the election to which they pertain and are removed within fifteen (15) days after the election. Such signs shall not exceed 2' x 3' in area, and must be fastened only to a stake in the ground and extending not more than three (3) feet above the surface of the ground.

Thus, garage sale signs and other signs (lost bike, etc.) are not allowed to be posted at the entrances, other common areas, or on other residents' property. For sale/lease and political signage must follow the rules above.

As with all DCCR's, they are subject to interpretation by the Architectural Review Committee (ARC), and pertaining to garage sales, the ARC will allow a sign to be placed on one's own lot for the duration of the garage sale only. If a sign of any sort is posted/placed/

installed anywhere other than one's own Lot, it is in non compliance with the DCCR's and will be removed and discarded. Also, a deed restriction violation (DRV) may be issued.

During the Community Wide Garage Sale, the HOA will place approved signs created by the HOA announcing the upcoming event in the neighborhood.

Signage other than Garage Sales, such as community events, church activities, PTA, etc., is only permitted if the sponsoring party requests and receives approval from the ARC and HOA Board prior to the event and/or placing the signs.

In the City of Kyle

The City of Kyle has additional ordinances pertaining to garage sale signs, which can be found in Sign Ordinance 576, Section 20, Part D at http://www.cityofkyle.com/documents/SignOrd576.pdf (C) Garage sale signs. The purpose of a garage sale sign is to announce the sale of household possessions.

- (1) Garage sale signs shall not exceed four (4) square feet. Signs shall be allowed for a maximum of seventy-two (72) consecutive hours no more than two (2) times per calendar year.
- (2) Single-family residential on-premises: One garage sale sign per street frontage shall be allowed, but only on the premises where

- the garage sale is being conducted and where there is an existing residential use.
- (3) Neighborhood-wide garage sales: Two garage sale signs per subdivision entrance shall be allowed for a neighborhood-wide garage sale sponsored by a homeowner's association (HOA). The garage sale sign may be off premises from where the actual garage sale is conducted, but the sign shall be located on property, including a street right-of-way, that is within the limits of the homeowner's association. The HOA must be registered with the City of Kyle.
- (4) Signs shall be placed at least twenty-five (25) feet from an intersection and a minimum of ten (10) feet from the curbline. Signs shall not be placed anywhere in the center median of a public or private street
- (5) No permit or fee shall be required for any garage sale sign.

Truly hope this article helps all residents understand any and all regulations surrounding signage in Plum Creek, especially pertaining to garage sales. Stay Current on Assessments to Reserve the Community Center

If you plan to reserve the Plum Creek Community Center, you must be current on your HOA dues. It is through our dues that we provide and maintain the great amenities we have available in Plum Creek, including the electricity and upkeep of the Community Center. If you are not current in assessments, you will lose your right to use these amenities, including the Community Center and swimming pools. Also, please remember, if you wish to use the pools, you must have a Rec Tag. The lifeguards are checking for Rec Tags at both pools and if you do not have one, you will not be allowed to enter. Thank you!





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History of the Claiborne Kyle Log House

Claiborne and Lucy Bugg Kyle married in 1829 in Tennessee and moved to Texas in 1844. Kyle, a former Senator from Mississippi, relocated to Texas after experiencing some financial hardships. In 1850, they built this massive log house on a bluff overlooking the Blanco River. With help from his farm workers, he built this log house of alternating courses of cedar logs and rock grouting, square notched at the corners and secured by wooden pegs.


The Kyle Log House is a most unusual type known as the "linear four-pen dog trot" and is the only one of this type left in Texas. The home has four rooms, each about 16 feet square and lined up with two on either side of the dog trot. It housed the couple, their eight children, and one adopted son.


It is listed in the Terry Jordan book Texas Log Cabins, and a picture and story appear in the book Nineteenth Century Homes. On September 22, 1980, the Blanco River Bluffs, Inc. deeded the Kyle Log House to Hays County. A Claiborne Kyle Log House Commission was appointed to direct the restoration and maintenance of the house. On May 28, 1981, the Claiborne Kyle Log House was placed on the National Register of Historic Places. A Texas Historical Marker was dedicated in 1982.

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
