TREES IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD

I think that I shall never see a poem lovely as a tree – Joyce Kilmer (1886-1918).

One of the most precious resources in the Villages of NorthPointe is the trees that are a part of our community. Preservation, and replacement when necessary, is a key component in keeping our community beautiful to us and to prospective residents. Our commitment as a community to preserve and maintain our trees was to add a line item in our annual budget.

Chaparral Management Company, working with our developer, contracted with Teakwood, our landscape company, to replace over seventeen (17) dead or dying trees in the common areas. The identified trees were around the NorthPointe Terrace lake and along the path in the common area in Section 12. Twelve (12) new oaks and five (5) forest pansy redbuds were planted in these two areas.

A contract was also let to remove the dead or dying pines throughout the common areas. Six (6) trees were removed from NorthPointe Terrace and NorthPointe Bend in mid April and twenty-four (24) more dead or dying pines were removed from various common areas around the subdivision in August. Unfortunately, this is going to have to be a continuous process over the coming years due to age of the pines and infestation of the pine bark beetle.

Take a walk around the community some evening and see if you can spot the new trees. The redbuds should put on quite a show each Spring and Fall!


COMPASS CORNER

As for the local markets, things are still somewhat slow on the Real Estate front but improving. David Weekley reports that new home sales are averaging between 4-6 per month which isn't great, but it's still progress. Section 15 of Villages of NorthPointe is starting to shape up as the roads go in, so homes will start very soon. This is the section over on the north side of the new lake and should be open for "bidness" in the first quarter of 2011. Update on the little apartment complex by "Kids Laughing and Learning"...final approval is being given on permits so construction should start soon. If you will recall, this is a modest 42 unit complex on Eganville.

The request shows a 200 unit complex...and quite frankly, while the MUD could certainly use the additional tax base, as a resident I am really not interested

in seeing this project take place. I think we'd all rather see a Kroger/ HEB/Randall's center go in that location instead. Unfortunately our desires don't always mesh with reality. I would like your feedback on this issue as it will be up to the MUD district to work out the infrastructure details and it is imperative that everyone be in the loop. The Architectural Control Committee for the Association (the "ACC") is charged with the responsibility per the Association By-Laws to grant or withhold architectural review approval of all changes in the design of a property after original construction. If you plan any modification, alterations or enhancements to your property, you must first submit written request to the "ACC." A copy of the form required is available on the neighborhood website at www. villagesofnorthpointecai.com .

Please submit your written requests to Chaparral Management. The average turn around time for review and approval is usually less than two (2) weeks. By following this simple procedure, the curb appeal of the neighborhood will continue to be an asset to the community. Thanks in advance for your cooperation.
