

National Night Out October 5, 2010 6:00-9:00 PM

National Night Out, sponsored by the NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF TOWN WATCH, is a neighborhood crime and drug prevention event that occurs annually on the first Tuesday in August (IN TEXAS NNO 2010 IS IN OCTOBER) and is celebrated in every city, town and village in the US. THE RECIPE BOX

Carrabba's Chicken Bryan

4 chicken breasts olive oil
2 oz. goat cheese (sliced from a log works best)
salt and pepper lemon butter sauce (see below)

LEMON BUTTER SAUCE:

 t. butter
 t. garlic, finely chopped
 t. yellow onion, finely chopped
 stick (1/4 lb.) cold unsalted butter, cut into small cubes
 Kosher salt
 Pinch of white pepper Season chicken on both sides with salt and pepper. Dab with olive oil. Grill chicken until cooked to a minimum internal temperature of 165 degrees.

Then place one slice of goat cheese on top of each breast and continue to cook until warm. Place lemon butter sauce in a saute pan over medium-low heat; add sundried tomatoes and basil. Heat gently until hot but do not overheat or sauce will break. When goat cheese is warm, place chicken on warmed plate and spoon sauce on top. Delicious when served with side of pasta and tomato sauce and/or fresh salad.

What To Do If You Smell Gas

Once you've determined it's not from a family member or the dog....natural gas has no odor so CenterPoint Energy adds a harmless, unpleasant smelling odorant so you can recognize it.

- 1. Leave immediately! Do not use electric switches, telephones or cell phones or anything that could cause a spark.
- 2. Go to a safe location in a neighbor's home or some other building. Call the CenterPoint Energy Gas Leak Hotline at 1-888-876-5786. Never assume someone else has reported the leak. Alert your neighbors.
- 3. Never try to repair a natural gas leak yourself. Leave all repairs to a trained technician.

If you live or work near a natural gas pipeline (and many of us do!), stay safe by being able to recognize signs of a potential pipeline emergency:

- 1. Persistent bubbling in standing water, discolored vegetation, a pool of liquid on the ground, a dense white cloud or fog, a slight mist or ice or unexplained frozen ground near a pipeline area.
- 2. Hearing a "hissing" sound coming from a pipeline.
- 3. Smelling an unusual odor such as petroleum or rotten eggs.

Eat your breakfast. It's the most important meal of the day! Why are parents always saying that?

Breakfast

Ready

Well, imagine you're a car after a long night of sleeping, your fuel tank is empty. Breakfast is the fuel that gets you going so you can hit the road.

What Should You Eat?

Any breakfast is better than no breakfast, but try not to have doughnuts or pastries all the time. They're high in calories, sugar, and fat. They also don't contain the nutrients a kid really needs. And if you have a doughnut for breakfast, you won't feel full for long.

Just like with other meals, try to eat

- a variety of foods, including:
- grains (breads and cereals)
- protein (meats, beans, and nuts)
- fruits and vegetables
- milk, cheese, and yogurt

Here are some breakfast ideas. First, the traditional ones:

- eggs
- French toast, waffles, or pancakes (try wheat or whole-grain varieties)
- cold cereal and milk
- hot cereal, such as oatmeal or cream of wheat (try some dried fruit or nuts on top)
- whole-grain toast, bagel, or English

muffin with cheese

- yogurt with fruit or nuts
- fruit smoothie, such as a strawberry smoothie

And now some weird (but yummy) ones:

- banana dog (peanut butter, a banana, and raisins in a long whole-grain bun)
- breakfast taco (shredded cheese on a tortilla, folded in half and microwaved; top with salsa)
- country cottage cheese (apple butter mixed with cottage cheese)
- fruit and cream cheese sandwich (use strawberries or other fresh fruit)
- sandwich grilled cheese, peanut butter and jelly, or another favorite
- leftovers (they're not just for dinner anymore!)

Skipping Breakfast

Some kids skip breakfast because they sleep too late or because they think it's a way to stay thin. But skipping breakfast doesn't help people maintain a healthy weight. In fact, someone who skips breakfast tends to eat more calories throughout the day.

If you find yourself skipping breakfast because you're too rushed, try these quick breakfasts. They're easy to grab on the way out the door or can be prepared the night before:

- single servings of whole-grain, lowsugar cereal
- yogurt
- fresh fruit
- · whole-grain muffin
- trail mix of nuts, dried fruits, pretzels, crackers, and dry cereal

Need More Convincing?


Just in case you need more evidence that eating breakfast is the way to go, kids who don't eat breakfast are less able to learn at school, get less iron (an important nutrient) in their diets, and are more likely to have a higher body mass index (BMI), which is a sign they may be overweight.

On the other hand, kids who eat breakfast do better in school, are more likely to participate in physical activities, and tend to eat healthier overall. So tomorrow morning, don't run out the door on an empty stomach. Fuel up with a healthy breakfast!


