It's Only Natural...

When I look back to a year ago, I have some "not so pleasant" memories. I was in the middle of a shingles outbreak. Unfortunately for me, it was not my first, and it was definitely worse than my first experience with shingles. When I had it several years ago, although the pain was pretty intense, the rash was mild and it only lasted about three weeks. This time, I was not as fortunate. The rash was worse and the pain was excruciating! It lasted for six weeks and I still had some burning sensation in the nerve for a few months after that.

Chicken pox and shingles are both caused by the varicella-zoster virus. After having chicken pox, usually at a young age, the virus stays inactive inside certain nerve cells. It can reactivate years later as a shingles infection (herpes zoster), usually in people who are under a lot of stress and/or have a weakened immune system. The entire outbreak can last from three to six weeks, but in some cases, post-herpetic neuralgia can occur and the pain can continue for months or even years after the rash and blisters have healed.

If you ever suspect that you have shingles, see your doctor as soon as possible. There are antiviral medications that can help shorten the duration of the rash, decrease the pain and reduce the risk of post-herpetic neuralgia, but you must start the medication within 72 hours of the outbreak to get the maximum benefits.

There are also some natural supplements that can be taken. L-lysine, an essential amino acid with antiviral properties and Monolaurin, an antiviral supplement may shorten the duration, reduce the risk of post-herpetic neuralgia and also prevent the replication of shingles. In addition to these supplements, I drank a high antioxidant juice blend to help boost my immune system.

As far as the painful rash, I used Terrasil, an all-natural ointment that I ordered online. It lessened the discomfort and my doctor even

commented on how quickly my rash was healing. Using a topical cream that contains capsaicin (a substance in hot peppers) is another suggested treatment for relieving shingles pain. It blocks pain signals from nerves just under the skin.

Try to eat foods that have a high Lysine content like meats, eggs, cheese and milk. Eat a lot of pears and drink pear juice; they are rich in antiviral caffeic acid and are recommended for shingles. Avoid chocolate, nuts, seeds and grains. These are high in Arginine and may counteract the benefits of Lysine. Also try to avoid sugar in your diet.

Speaking from experience, any added stress can increase the pain that you are already experiencing, so avoiding stress and getting plenty of rest and relaxation are key factors for quicker healing.

There is a shingles vaccine to reduce the risk of getting shingles and post-herpetic neuralgia, however, it is only recommended for people that are 60 years and older. Always research any special health considerations and possible side effects and discuss them with your doctor before getting vaccinated.

I recommend that everyone get proper nutrition for a strong immune system and find ways to relieve stress on a regular basis for good health and especially to help reduce your risk of getting shingles.
