TEAM MIZUNO VS TEXAS BARRACUDAS

The top half of the 10 and Under Platinum 'A' Division semifinals provided plenty of excitement between Team Mizuno Houston (Texas) and the Texas Barracudas (Cypress, Texas), with the Barracudas capping an amazing comeback in their last at-bat for a 7-6 win at the AAYBA World Series at Bakersfield Park.

The Barracudas trailed 6-0 after twoplus innings, but would score the final seven runs of the game to reach the Platinum 'A' Division title game. They will face SIII All Out (Corpus Christi, Texas) in the finals, set for 8 p.m. on Saturday.

"Our guys didn't get their heads down after being down early and we just kept fighting," said Texas Barracudas coach Mark Baker. "These kids have done such this summer and we're happy to be playing in the championship game."

Getting to that title game nearly forced extra innings, as Team Mizuno relied on some trickery to keep the Barracudas off the board in the last inning.

With the score tied at 6-6, the Barracudas appeared to have the game in hand with a leadoff double by Cowser to start the bottom of the sixth inning. However, Team Mizuno pitcher Cade Longmire, infielder John Gilbert and outfielder Logan Kliafus executed a perfect "Hidden Ball" trick to tag Cowser out at third base.

Despite the bad break, the Barracudas rallied with a two-out walk and a stolen base by Kyle Gough (2-for-3) to set up the winning run. Jacob Crawford then punched a single to right, with Gough beating the throw home to end the game.

"Jacob got the job done at the plate and Kyle just kept coming around the bases." Baker said.

While the Barracudas won at the end, it didn't look good early as Team Mizuno scored six straight runs in the opening three innings for a 6-0 edge.

John Clay drove in Ryan Neu with a groundout in the first inning for Team Mizuno, with two more runs coming in the second on a booming home run by Daniel Valderama and an RBI grounder by Logan Mostert to score John Gilbert.

The third inning saw three more score for Team Mizuno, with two of those coming on a single by Chance Canizaro to plate Ruben Aguirre and Neu.

But back came the Barracudas in the bottom of the third, cutting the deficit to 6-1 when Garrett Grier was hit with a pitch with the bases loaded to force in Cole Blanton.

Three more runs followed in the fourth inning, with Cowser and Gough ripping RBI singles to carry the frame. Cowser then scored from third on a wild pitch to cut the Team Mizuno lead to 6-4.

In the fifth inning, a Blake Wilson groundout and a sacrifice fly by Jason Michaels knotted the score at 6-6 and helped set up the wild final inning.

Wilson also got the win on the mound in relief, retiring 11 of the final 12 batters he faced and striking out three in four innings.

welcoming.







What Can You Do **About Soliciting** In The Neighborhood?

Many communities are ripe targets for solicitors – for a variety of reasons. While the Association has no real control over soliciting activities, we have tried to discourage solicitors from marketing in our community by placing "no soliciting" signs in common areas.

The reason that we cannot prevent soliciting is that the streets and roadways within the community are public access ways owned and maintained by the county. This means that no person or persons may be prevented from entering the community. Of course, if an individual or individuals are in the process of breaking the law, the Sheriff or other law enforcement officer can take immediate

Your Association recommends the following actions that every owner can take to discourage unwelcome soliciting in the community:

- Report all suspicious persons to the Sheriff's Department and request the deputies on duty be made aware of your concerns.
- Promptly remove all flyers left on your front or garage door.
- Promptly report to the Post Office all flyers left on the mailboxes.
- Refuse to make use of solicitors' offers and refuse to patronize any company being marketed in this manner.
- Notify the managing agent of any companies presently soliciting so that letters can be sent advising them of this policy of not permitting door to door soliciting (they will be reminded of the community newsletter and/or the Green Sheet as marketing options).
- Individual homeowners have the ability to place a small "No Trespassing/No Soliciting" sign at the entry to their homes. Should a solicitor continue to leave flyers, the homeowner then has the authority to file charges against the Solicitor/Company for trespassing on private property.

As you are aware, there has been a great deal of vandalism within Fairfield Village, all repaired at a cost to you, the homeowner. As the vandalism continues, and as the cost to make the necessary repairs and replacement increases, it also becomes necessary to increase your assessment.

Vandalism includes the operation of a *Golf Cart, ATV, or a Dirt Bike* on common areas (including sidewalks) or greenbelts. The Sheriff will be notified of anyone seen driving these vehicles. *Should the person(s) be under age, the Association will legally pursue the legal guardian for all damages incurred.*

Your Association has spent thousands of dollars, your dollars, repairing sidewalks, gazebos, entry markers, irrigation, ruts, etc., and now it's time to make this stop.

If you see anyone suspicious, by all means contact the Sheriff on the non-emergency number (713-221-6000) and report the incident. Thank you.

FLASHING RED LIGHT

As you have probably noticed the street light on Mason Road at Maple Village and also Mason Road at Chappell Knoll have been flashing red pretty frequently. These lights are maintained by a division of Harris County who are notified each time the light begins flashing.

If you see the light flashing please take a moment to call Harris County at 713-881-3210 and advise them of the location and cross street. The telephone is manned 24/7 either by a real person or an answering machine and the message is then relayed to the technician.

Harvest Bible Church

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do (1 Peter 2:8)... Those who reject Jesus are the ones who stumble. They disobey the word, and the word is the gospel—that which brings new life (cf. 1:23-25; cf. 3:1). Those who do such simply refuse to submit to Christ's Lordship. And all those who would stumble over Christ will by default disobey the gospel message which demands submission to Christ. So because of sin, all the disobedient are destined to stumble over the Stone (Jesus) put in front of them to stumble over. Confusing?

The verb destined often refers to what God has appointed to occur in Scripture (Acts 1:7; 13:47; 20:28; 1 Cor. 12:18, 28; 1 Thess. 5:9; 1 Tim 2:7). It is not, however, the same root word from predestined, chosen, or elect. God does not actively destine people to reject Christ as He predestines some to receive Christ. Nowhere in Scripture is this said. He does, however, appoint judgment on all unbelievers (John 3:18, 36; 8:24; 2 Thess. 1:6-9; Heb. 3:19; 4:11). And He judges them as a consequence for failing to love Christ and for rejecting him. As Paul told the Corinthians, "If anyone does not love the Lord, he is to be accursed" (1 Cor. 16:22).

Although the Bible teaches that God chooses some for salvation, it never teaches that God chooses the rest for condemnation. On the

contrary, unbelieving man knows about God but has suppressed the truth of God which He has given to all humans to know right and wrong (cf. Rom. 1:18-32; 2:14-16). Thus, unbelievers are responsible for their own demise and cannot blame God. The antithesis of God's election for salvation is not election for condemnation, for condemnation is what all humans rightly deserve for their sins. God's election of some is merely a demonstration of His mercy towards those whom He foreknew. Thus, God will be glorified for both His mercy toward the elect and His justice toward those who reject Him. His is all in all.

It should be mentioned here that God is the cause of all things. Note some OT passages on this issue: "Is it not from the mouth of the Most High that both calamities and good things come?" (Lam 3:38). "When a trumpet sounds in a city, do not the people tremble? When disaster comes to a city, has not the Lord caused it?" (Amos 3:6). "I form the light and create darkness, I bring prosperity and create disaster; I, the Lord, do all these things" (Isa 45:7). But God is never said to be responsible for someone not choosing Him.

The Bible clearly reveals that God is sovereign and thus in control of all things. From the decrees of kings (Prov. 21:1) to every turn of the dice (Prov. 16:33; cf. Isa 46:9-11). Even the most heinous and

sadistic act in human history—the murder of Jesus of Nazareth, was an act predestined by God Himself to save those who believe in Him (Isa. 53:10; Acts 2:23; 4:27-28).

Many claim to be Christians today, but with so many versions of Christianity today, we must discern through two inseparable ways: by whether you have trusted in Christ first and foremost, and secondly by how you love Christ. Some become Christians similar to the way they get married. They marry each other without truly knowing each other, and they fail to know each other because they don't ask enough meaningful questions about each other or spend enough time together. So too with some professed Christians. They place their lives in God's hands (seemingly), but they don't really know God at all. They don't know that bad things will indeed happen to "good" people. They don't know about all the difficult doctrines of Christ or that in the end unbelievers truly do go to hell for unbelief. So, they divorce Christ by punting the faith. True Christianity entails truly knowing Christ and then loving him unconditionally. Have you examined Christ from the Scriptures and not according to your man-made rendition of him? If you haven't you will be very disappointed in the god of your own making.





Tool #1: Commitment... A Rhyme & A Reason


