



#### Pecan Rolls

#### MIX:


1 cup brown sugar 2 TB dark corn syrup ½ cup melted butter Divide among 18 muffin cups Sprinkle with 2/3 cup pecans

#### SIFT TOGETHER:

3 cups sifted all-purpose flour 41/2 tsp. baking powder 1 tsp. salt 1/3 cup of sugar

Cut in ½ cup of shortening, add 2 slightly beaten eggs and 2/3 cup of milk. Stir to blend and turn out on lightly floured surface, kneading 8 to 10 times. Roll into 15 x 12 x 1/4 inch rectangle pan. Brush with 2 TB butter, sprinkle with 1/4 cup sugar and 1 tsp. ground cinnamon. Roll as for jelly roll, seal edge, and cut into 3/4 inch slices. Place slices cut side down in each muffin cup. Bake at 375° for 20-25 minutes.

#### What Can You Do **About Soliciting** In The Neighborhood?

Many communities are ripe targets for solicitors – for a variety of reasons. While the Association has no real control over soliciting activities, we have tried to discourage solicitors from marketing in our community by placing "no soliciting" signs in common areas.

The reason that we cannot prevent soliciting is that the streets and roadways within the community are public access ways owned and maintained by the county. This means that no person or persons may be prevented from entering the community. Of course, if an individual or individuals are in the process of breaking the law, the Sheriff or other law enforcement officer can take immediate action.

Your Association recommends the following actions that every owner can take to discourage unwelcome soliciting in the community:

- Report all suspicious persons to the Sheriff's Department and request the deputies on duty be made aware of your concerns.
- Promptly remove all flyers left on your front or garage door.
- Promptly report to the Post Office all flyers left on the mailboxes.
- Refuse to make use of solicitors' offers and refuse to patronize any company being marketed in this manner.
- Notify the managing agent of any companies presently soliciting so that letters can be sent advising them of this policy of not permitting door to door soliciting (they will be reminded of the community newsletter and/or the Green Sheet as marketing options).
- Individual homeowners have the ability to place a small "No Trespassing/No Soliciting" sign at the entry to their homes. Should a solicitor continue to leave flyers, the homeowner then has the authority to file charges against the Solicitor/Company for trespassing on private property.

#### **Harvest Bible Church**

Jesus healed a crippled man who had been so for 38 years (John 5:1-15), and He did so on the Sabbath day. Why? Because He is God, and as God works to uphold the universe and care for His creation, so too did Jesus that Sabbath day when He healed a lame man.

Jesus did not claim to take the place of God or to be an alternative to God, but when He called God His own Father, the Iews saw this as a man equating himself with God. And that was slanderous to God in their eyes—a crime which deserved death. The Jews, however, should have recognized Jesus for His works or at least given Him the benefit of the doubt, for Isaiah had prophesied 750 years prior: "Behold, your God will come...then the eyes of the blind will be opened, and the ears of the deaf will be unstopped. Then the lame will leap like a deer..." (Isaiah 35:3-6). Here was Jesus doing all that the prophets had written that the Messiah would do, like causing the lame to walk, yet they rejected Him!

Mark's Gospel records that Jesus informed the Jewish scribes that He had authority to forgive sins in Mark 2:5, then He backed up this claim by telling a lifelong paralytic to "rise, take up your pallet and go home" (Mark 2:10, 11). The reaction of the scribes is telltale as to what Jesus was actually saying about Himself, for they said, "Why does this man speak thus? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?" (v. 7). The answer is Jesus!

The Jews were seeking all the more to kill [Jesus], because He not only was breaking the Sabbath but also was calling God His own Father, making Himself equal with God (John 5:18).

The personal name for God in the OT is Yahweh—the I AM (cf. Ex. 3:14), sometimes dubbed Jehovah, and it is signified in the English text as LORD. So sacred was this name that devout Jews would not even pronounce it. To the Jews, nothing else was to be worshiped, served, or sacrificed to (Exod. 20:5). Isaiah wrote, "Thus says YHWH ... I am the first, and I am the last; and besides Me there is no God" (44:6). Again, "I am YHWH, that is my name; and my glory will I not give to another, neither my praise unto graven images" (Isa. 42:8; cf. 48:11). Yet note that Jesus called Himself the "first and the last" in Revelation 1:17-18; 2:7.

Given this, it makes sense as to why the words of Jesus were offensive to the Jews. After all, the very things that God claimed for Himself, Jesus of Nazareth also claimed. Note that Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd" (John 10:11), yet the Old Testament declared

"the Lord is my shepherd" (Ps. 23:1). Jesus claimed to be judge of all men (John 5:27), but God said, "For there I will sit to judge all the nations round about" (Joel 3:12). Jesus said, "I am the light of the world" (John 8:12) whereas Isaiah said, "the Lord will be unto you an everlasting light, and your God your glory" (60:19). In John 17:5 Jesus claimed to share God's eternal glory, yet God said, "I will not give My glory to another" (Isa. 42:8). Still, Jesus spoke of Himself as the coming "bridegroom" (Matt. 25:1)—the way God is depicted in the OT (cf. Isa. 62:5; Hos. 2:16). In the Book of Revelation Jesus said, "I am the first and the last" (1:17)—the same words God used to declare that there was no other God besides Him (Isa. 42:8). Clearly, the light that God shone upon the world in the Old Testament is indeed Jesus in the New Testament (cf. John 8:12).

One of the most explicit claim of Jesus to be God occurs in John 8:58 where He said to the Jews, "Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I am." And lest anyone doubt the meaning of His words, note the Jews' reaction to this as they picked up stones to kill him (cf. 10:31-33). When Jesus called Himself "I AM," He took God's name! Thus, Jesus was either slandering God's name, or He was God. It's no wonder then that no one can come to God except through Jesus Christ. It is an exclusive faith because it is the Truth. Yet it is open for everyone who will believe. Thus, it's not exclusive at all but is for all.





#### **TIME MANAGEMENT & EXERCISE:**

Making the Most of Our Time By Sarah S. Jordan, MS

(This is Part II from Sarah's series on "Tools for a Healthy Lifestyle.")

Do you wish that you had more time? I would venture to guess that almost everyone would say, "Yes!" In today's world, we seem to be taking on more than ever and rarely finding the time or energy that we deserve to focus on our health and the health of our family. The important thing is to always keep trying and to value health as a consistent priority in our lives.

In Part I of this series, we identified commitment as the first tool for living a healthy lifestyle. To begin, a commitment to healthy living should be made, and the next step is to evaluate our time and schedules in order to identify realistic ways to fit in more movement and exercise.

I have become very aware of the importance and benefit of exercise for physical and mental strength in my life's journey of being a fitness director, business owner, and most of all, in becoming a mother. I have also realized that any exercise is better than none! Finding time to exercise is challenging, and the key is to make every minute count. If baby is napping and mom has just 15 minutes to exercise, those 15 minutes can equal big improvements in weight control and energy levels over time. If work has required us to sit at our computer all day, just getting up for 20 minutes of outdoor activity or stepping onto a cardio machine might just change our day and stress levels completely!

Here are a few tips for making the most of your workout time.

Increase your intensity. If the duration of workout is short, intensity should be high.

Include intervals! On an elliptical machine, set resistance to something that feels challenging (not easy), but something you are able to push through without compromising your form. Do three-minute intervals. Minute 1: Somewhat easy / recovery. Minute 2: 75% of your fastest speed. Minute 3: Sprint! Repeat several times. 21 minutes of intervals (followed by a cool down) is an incredible workout!

Add a 60-second interval to your walk. Power walk for three minutes and then jog or do walking lunges for one minute. Repeat several times. The interval challenges different muscle groups and adds a new element to your routine.

Find something that allows you to get cardio and strength training in one hour. I started a group exercise class format at UT and Pure Austin called Dynamic Strength, and people love it! Participants get their strength training, but they also get cardio intervals, flexibility, and relaxation too! Total body workout.

And most importantly, remember that ANY exercise is better than none. Even if you just have 15 minutes, take it. Your body and mind will thank you.

Good time management is key in so many areas of life. We have all heard the saying; "Time is of the essence." Let's take a moment, evaluate our time, and see how we can incorporate more movement into our lives. What is your essence? You have the power to make it great!

You've been looking forward to Thanksgiving dinner all year — turkey, mashed potatoes, cranberry sauce, and pumpkin pie. Mmm-mmm! But after you finish that second helping of turkey with gravy, you start to feel a little sleepy.

As your Uncle George starts to explain why eating turkey makes people so tired, you suddenly feel like curling up in front of the TV and napping until next Thanksgiving. But is gobbling up all that turkey really to blame?

#### THE USUAL SUSPECT: L-TRYPTOPHAN

Not exactly. Here's why: Turkey meat contains a lot of an amino acid called L-tryptophan (say: eltrip-teh-fan). Amino acids are the "building blocks" for the proteins that make up our muscles and other important parts of our bodies. (L-tryptophan is just one kind of amino acid — there are many different kinds of amino acids in the foods we eat.)

When we eat foods that contain L-tryptophan, this amino acid travels in the blood from the digestive system and later enters the brain. The brain then changes the L-tryptophan into another chemical called serotonin (say: sare-uh-toh-nin). Serotonin calms us down and helps us sleep.

But scientists now know that L-tryptophan can really only make a person tired right away if it is eaten or taken by itself without any amino acids. And the protein in turkey contains plenty of other amino acids!

#### **BLAME IT ON BLOOD FLOW**

Most scientists think that there's a different reason why eating a special meal might make you drowsy. Eating a big Thanksgiving dinner causes increased blood flow to the stomach (needed to help digest the meal) and less blood flow to the brain.

#### **AVOIDING DROWSINESS**

So just how do you avoid that sleepy feeling on Turkey Day?

- Eat small, healthy meals (try to limit junk foods) throughout the day before you sit down for your big meal — don't starve yourself in anticipation of the feast to come.
- Have small portions of foods that are part of your Thanksgiving meal (including whatever veggies are on the table).
- Drink water and take breaks while you are eating to see how full you've become.
- Stop eating once you're full there will always be leftovers tomorrow.
- Finally, take a walk outside afterward to digest your meal. This will make you feel better than crashing on the couch.

Follow these tips and have a Happy Thanksgiving — gobble, gobble!
