#### **Development Update**

#### SUBDIVISION DEVELOPMENT

Taylor Woodrow Communities recently completed development on the final 39 90' wide lots in the Santaluz gated neighborhood for Drees Custom Homes and Highland Homes. Stop by the Drees and Highland model homes in Santaluz for more information on the available homesites, including many lots backing to greenbelts. Also, development is underway on the final 47 - 80' homesites in Emerald Ridge and the final 20 – 60' lots in Mediterra for Taylor Morrison Homes. These lots will be completed in phases between December and late February. Additional phases are planned to start construction in early 2011 based upon builder home sales in existing neighborhoods.

Custom lot sales continue in The Bluffs on south Quinlan Park Rd., Bellagio Estates on Lake Austin, and in the newest phase of the golf community, Shoreview Overlook, at the end of University Club Drive. For more information on these custom homesites and all other builder neighborhoods in Steiner Ranch, you may contact the Welcome Center at 266-5833.

#### **COMMERCIAL/MIXED-USE DEVELOPMENT**

Quinlan Crossing Development at Quinlan Park Rd & RM 620 — Property Development Centers (PDC), a commercial/retail developer, is nearing completion on their City/County development permit for the Quinlan Crossing retail/office project at the southwest corner of Quinlan Park Rd and RM 620 that will be anchored by an upscale Randall's grocery store (Mixed Use #1A on Master Plan Map). The developer is negotiating with additional anchor tenants for this site but has not announced any specifics.

Taylor Woodrow Communities continues to receive interest from various developers for the remaining mixed-use development sites in Steiner Ranch. Vintage Fine Homes has completed city/county site plan approvals to build approximately 20 patio homes on Tract #18 along Steiner Ranch Blvd. across from the Monterone apartments. With the slow down in the local housing market they still have not announced a timeframe to begin construction on this site. Also, pre-leasing continues on the retail/office mixed use development on Tract #4 at the southwest corner of Quinlan Park Rd and Steiner Ranch Blvd. There is no new information on the status of the Longhorn Canyon or Fairways at Steiner Ranch condominium communities. More information on these and other mixed-use sites will be available in the future as development plans progress.

#### **Trails Update**

The HOA will be helping restore the trails after the big rain event washed out some stream crossings. Also with the big rains the plants have grown up. Remember you can always stomp down or cut off big plants which encroach on the approved trail. DIY trail maintenance: If you see a branch hanging over the trail where it could be hazardous, just bring a hand saw on your next trip and cut it off. Note that any other cutting is never allowed in the greenbelts. Only your HOA is allowed to make trail repairs or reroutes - see below.

We are forming teams to help design the labels to go on all the trail signs. Like to solve puzzles? Contact us.

Is your favorite trail in need of repair or in need of better sign locations? If you see a problem on the trails, call the HOA at 266-7553 or visit http://www.steinerranchhoa.org under "Report A Problem." Be specific about the location on the trail, the problem you see, your ideas for a solution, and your contact information.

Construction of any kind is not allowed on the greenbelts or along trails. Your HOA dollars are wasted paying for labor to remove structures such as forts, and the responsible parties are subject to fines. If you see any construction, take a picture and contact the HOA. Recently a resident was injured when he fell against one of the T-posts which have been installed in some of our older trails. Please be careful around these T-posts as we work to remove them from the trail system.


Only the HOA is authorized to create trails in Steiner Ranch. Unfortunately, someone has been cutting down trees in our greenbelt trying to make rogue trail. These are not authorized trails and are actually dangerous routes. We don't wish to spend your HOA money trying to close and re-vegetate rogue trails. Instead, we want to hear from those who want new trails because we are actively looking at routes within Steiner to expand our trail system. Would you like to help us plan new trails? Contact your trails committee to get involved or come to the next Trails Committee meeting on Thursday Nov. 11 at 7:30PM at Bella Mar. All residents are welcome to attend. A trail signage project team is now forming: We are designing a system of labels for our trail sign posts. To get connected here and volunteer your design skills, contact the trails committee at (512) 632-0162.

If you see any rogue trail cutting or dangerous activity, including motorcycles anywhere on the trails or in the parks,

take a picture and call the Travis County Sheriff West Command at (512) 854-9728 and the HOA. Remember, your trails are private and are for your use, and your accompanied guests' use only.

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#### The Balcones Canyonlands Preserve and Steiner Ranch

The Steiner Ranch community has a unique neighbor, the Balcones Canyonlands Preserve (BCP). In January 2001, Steiner Ranch entered into a conservation easement agreement giving Travis County management of 819 acres of Steiner Ranch land that is part of the Balcones Canyonlands Preserve. Although the Hill Country of Central Texas is well known for its scenic views and spectacular wildflowers, the land is also home to eight federally endangered species and dozens of other rare species. This species diversity exists, in part, because of the region's unique ecosystem. Besides common animals such as white-tailed deer and raccoons, more secretive wildlife such as bobcats, ringtails and gray fox can occasionally be observed. Underground is a limestone honeycomb of caves, sinkholes and springs. Spiders, beetles and other creatures inhabiting these caves are found nowhere else in the world. Six of these are classified as endangered species. Still

deeper is the Edwards Aquifer that provides the main source of drinking water for more than 1.5 million people in Central Texas.

The Balcones Canyonlands Preserve is the result of a community-based effort to protect more than 40 endangered, threatened and rare species while allowing development to occur in western Travis County. It was established through a permit issued by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to the City of Austin and Travis County in 1996. When completed, the BCP will ultimately protect about 30,000 acres of prime habitat in western Travis County. Preserve tracts are owned by public and private entities including the City of Austin, Travis County, the Lower Colorado River Authority, the Nature Conservancy of Texas, the Travis Audubon Society and private landowners, making it one of the country's largest urban preserves. The managing partners have currently acquired and protect nearly 29,000

acres in western Travis County. Including the areas protected in Steiner Ranch, the Travis County-managed portion of the BCP is over 5000 acres.

The Hill Country's unique vegetation, including elms, oaks and Ashe juniper (or "cedar"), remained virtually untouched in much of western Travis County until the last several decades. Two federally protected migratory songbirds, the Goldencheeked warbler that depends on old-growth Ashe juniper woodlands and the Black-capped vireo, which prefers open, shrubby areas, thrived. However, due to Central Texas' explosive growth and the resulting habitat fragmentation, populations of these endangered birds have steadily declined.

Prior to development, the Steiner Ranch area contained habitat for these two avian species. Under the Balcones Canyonlands Conservation Plan (with agreement of

the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service), Steiner Ranch was issued a participation certificate that allowed construction to occur if land was set aside to be protected as mitigation for habitat lost to development. These protected lands on Steiner Ranch are managed by Travis County as part of the BCP.


Public Access: Because of the Preserve's delicate ecosystem in the Steiner Ranch area, access to the Steiner Ranch Preserve is limited to approved trails and access is granted only to Steiner Ranch residents and their guests. This will allow for the required protection, future habitat restoration projects, and ongoing research of the endangered species on the tract.

Other BCP tracts with public access include the County's Wild Basin and Hamilton Pool Preserves, the City of Austin's Emma Long Metropolitan, Bull Creek and St. Edwards Parks, and LCRA's Westcave Preserve.

Thank you for your help in protecting this Central Texas treasure.

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#### 2nd Semi-Annual Post Garage Sale Drop-Off HUGE SUCESS



#### Who Built the Anderson Mill?

John Scot Pickle came to Austin from Wythe County, Virginia along with his cousin William Pickle in the early 1850's. John settled in Austin, and Cousin Will settled in Leander. While in Austin John married Justina Emeline Rowzee, and the couple eventually had five children. Justina's family came from French Huguenot origins. Her father, James Smith, laid out the small town of Montopolis on the Colorado River. Motorists today cross the Montopolis Bridge in the general area of the old town.

In 1862, when John was 26 years old, both men went to Bastrop and joined the Confederate Army. Just over a year later, John came home with wounds suffered in conflict which took months to heal.

John was a contractor, house builder, house mover, carpenter and cabinetmaker. John built the Anderson Mill in its original location, which is now under the level of Lake Travis. Readers should note that the current Anderson Mill site is quite a distance up the hill from its original location by Sandy Creek. As a cabinetmaker, John excelled at craftsmanship, which only skill and plenty of time can afford. An example of this is a piece popular at the time, called a "what not." It had five tiered shelves with turned spindles and typically held a family's china and other valuables. At least one of these survives in the family today. 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

Texas Disposal Systems (TDS) has assumed all responsibilities for the Trash and Recycling. The primary benefit will be the implementation of a Single Stream Recycling system that will be picked up every other week on the same day as your trash service (See schedule below) and will use roll out cans with lids. 

#### **Holiday Decoration Rules**



As you plan your outside decor for the upcoming holidays, please observe the following Steiner Ranch rule regarding holiday decorations on the exterior of your property (this rule does not apply to the inside of your homes):

Holiday decorations (excluding Christmas) may be put out up to fourteen (14) days in advance of the holiday in question. Decoration must be removed no later than seven (7) days after the holiday. Christmas decorations may be put out beginning November 1st and must be removed by January 15th.





# ARCHITECTURAL MODIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

So you've decided to do some improvements or make changes to the outside of your home.....what do you do now?

- 1. Complete the Architectural Modification form (owner only)
- 2. Include any addendum forms such as for a pool or deck
- Include a scaled drawing showing plan and elevation views
  of the proposed improvements, modifications or alterations.
  Submittals must include samples depicting the proposed
  materials and colors to be used.
- 4. A lot survey (which the owner receives at closing) indicating the location of proposed improvements, and any applicable easements, setbacks, and elevation differences on lot.
- 5. Deposit check in the amount of \$500

You must submit for ANY changes to the outside of your home including fences, decks, landscaping designs, pools, playscapes, etc.


#### Playscape Structure Submittal

If you are thinking about getting the kids a playscape, don't forget that it will need to be reviewed to the Architectural Committee first. Things you should keep in mind when selecting a playscape:

- Must be constructed with a lumber that resists rotting and deterioration, i.e. redwood or treated lumber.
- Canopies on the playscape must be a solid color, preferably green or earth tone.
- Setbacks for playscapes are to be no less than 5' from each property line.
- Views of the playscape must be minimized from public streets and adjoining units.

Once you've decided on the playscape and location, complete the Architectural Modification form and include the requested items (i.e. photo of playscape, description of materials to be used, etc.) along with the required \$500 refundable deposit check to the Association for review by the Architectural Committee.

#### From the Association Office

#### **SPEEDING**

#### Please Slow Down!

Speeding has become a MAJOR problem in our community. Whether on the public roads or behind the gates in the private neighborhoods, speeding violations are on the increase. Also on the increase is the number of accidents on the roads.

Speeding can result in accidents, injuries and far worse. The Association receives many complaints on a regular basis. The solution is simple – PLEASE SLOW DOWN. Everyone at one time or another is guilty but the solution is simple. Think about your neighbors, think about the kids and think about safety and PLEASE SLOW DOWN.

Please help us keep Steiner Ranch beautiful and SAFE by not speeding!

#### **Tenant/Occupant Registration Requirement**

Do you lease your home?

There are over 3,600 occupied homes in Steiner Ranch, but not all are occupied by the actual homeowners. Some homeowners, for various reasons, rent or lease their home to tenants/ occupants, and that is when challenges arise for the Community Associations Office staff. There are certain notification requirements placed upon the Association by the governing documents of Steiner Ranch. These notifications include but are not limited to:

- Semi-annual assessment statements
- Annual meeting notifications
- · Deed restriction violation notices
- General correspondence

Not having a homeowner's absentee or offsite address for the notifications mentioned above can, unfortunately, cause fines or other fees to be charged to a homeowner's account for failure to pay assessments on time or for failure to correct violations on the property within a specified timeframe. When tenants/occupants are registered at the Community Associations Office, the Association has the homeowner's absentee address on file and is able to send all the required notifications directly to the homeowner.

Having tenants/occupants registered also helps to protect the homeowner and his/her Steiner Ranch property. If the Association discovers that a tenant/occupant is not properly maintaining the landscaping or has caused some other violation on the property, a notice is sent to the homeowner informing them of the violation and a copy of the notice is sent to the tenant/occupant. Quickly correcting violations helps to ensure individual property values are maintained at their highest level.

Due to the challenges that arise as a result of rented and leased homes, the Association REQUIRES registration of all tenants/occupants in Steiner Ranch. In order for a tenant/occupant to receive access to the Steiner Ranch facilities, the homeowners must register the tenants/occupants via the Tenant/Occupant Registration Form, provide a copy of front page of the lease agreement and complete the Facilities Use Agreement. Once these forms are on file in the Community Associations Office, the Association will issue a "Facility Tag" to the tenants/occupants so they may enjoy all the facilities Steiner Ranch has to offer. Without the Facility Tag, tenants/occupants will not be able to enter any of the locked facilities, which include the pools, tennis courts and the Lake Club.

Please be aware that Tenant/Occupant Registration forms must be completed by the homeowner and the responsible tenant/occupant. Forms signed by a property manager or other non-homeowner will not be accepted unless a power of attorney form is also submitted naming the managing agent or other non-homeowner as authorized to sign legal documents on behalf of the homeowner.

The Tenant/Occupant Registration form is available at the Community Associations Office and online at www.steinerranchhoa.org. There is a \$50.00 tenant/occupant registration fee that must be submitted with the completed Tenant/Occupant Registration form in order for the Association staff to process the registration.






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### **VANDEGRIFT HIGH SCHOOL SWIMTEAM**

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



# Conserve Water in the Winter and Save Money Year-Round!!

WCID 17 averages household water usage during the months of November, January and February (months when outdoor irrigation is used very little) to determine the residential wastewater bill amount for the following year. Minimizing your water usage during these months will result in a lower wastewater bill every month. WCID 17 wastewater is charged at a base rate of \$20.00 per month, plus \$1.75 per 1000 gallons of the winter average usage. This rate is evaluated and changed annually each October, so you may be seeing a change in your rate this month, based on last year's usage.



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# Financial Focus: Long Term Care can Deplete Assets



Yearly long term care costs have increased to over \$75,000 in 2010 since Genworth Financial's Cost of Care surveys began in 2004. This increase represents a 4.5 percent compound annual growth rate over that period. And 75% of Americans have no long term care plans. We have found that "self-insuring" for a future long-term health care event can deplete even large family estates in just a few years. While not everyone needs long term care insurance, every family should have a long term care plan.

A recent survey from Genworth Financial's 2010 Cost of Care Survey found the average national cost of care for nursing homes, assisted living facilities and in the home has steadily increased over the past four years and has reached new highs that exceed most household incomes in the U.S. The rising costs of long term care may, therefore,

present difficulties for many Americans should they need to pay for long term care out of their own pockets.

If given the choice between care in a facility such as a nursing home or an assisted living facility and care at home, 75% of national poll respondents said they would prefer care at home. In contrast to facilitybased care, rates charged by home care providers for "non-skilled" services have remained relatively flat over the past five years. For example, whereas the national hourly private pay median rate charged by a licensed home health agency for a home health aide was \$17.50 in 2005, the 2010 hourly rate has only slowly crept up to \$19. The historical compound annual growth rate for this type of care service has been only 1.7 percent over a five-year period. Home care rates have remained flat in part because of increased competition among agencies and the availability of unskilled labor, and by avoiding costs associated with maintaining stand-alone health care facilities.

The trend in pricing among Assisted Living Facilities has changed considerably. Over the last decade, Assisted Living Facilities have continued to adapt to the wide range of care needs presented by our growing elder population. Many facilities now provide services to residents who need continual care or supervision – while still providing a lower level of care to healthier individuals. As the range of services becomes broader, so does the range of monthly costs.

According to the survey, the average national cost in 2010 of a single year in a private nursing home room is \$75,190. To put this into context, one year in a private nursing home room costs nearly one and a half times the average full 4-year college degree, making a single year in a nursing home 46 percent more expensive.

With so many Baby Boomers heading into retirement, it's critical that long term care planning be integrated into every adult's retirement strategy. Paying for just a few years of long term care out of pocket can very easily deplete an entire life's savings and retirement. Not planning ahead can also limit the variety of choices available, such as the ability to live independently at home with assistance from a home health aide. 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


