



one Saturday morning, I really had not thought through
exactly how I was going to get the boxes out of my truck
and inside to the service window.

When I backed-in, 3 men all going their separate ways, just so happened to be passing me by. In my very best Scarlet O'Hara voice I said "Excuse me gentlemen...Can you please help me get these heavy boxes inside?" as I batted my eyes and oozed my best southern charm. Of course it worked! These strangers got them all inside and then left.

I stood in line filling out the arduous paperwork required to mail anything overseas. When it was my turn at the window, I realized for the first time that all the windows were open. This NEVER happens.

Anyway, I go up and present my paperwork and look the man in the eye and tell him all these boxes are mine and have to be weighed. I am 5'2". The counter hits me mid chest. At this point I cannot begin to fathom how I am going to lift anything on the counter. So I bend down and put my arms around the first box like I expect a miracle to happen. Suddenly it does! The box moves, but it is not me. A man stepped out of line and lifted it for me. A complete stranger!

Of course the box was too heavy and had to be lightened. We began removing shoe boxes. My heart sank as I realized that I had no other boxes to put them in. Oh well! What the Girl Scouts don't know.... Then we had to pull and move every box with the same results. A lady (another stranger) passed by asking where I got the boxes. I told her thinking she wanted some for herself. She wondered if perhaps Wal-Mart or Home Depot might have them. I told her probably so. She returned about 15 minutes later with a case of boxes and roll of packing tape. Several other people stopped and began packing the boxes. I was stunned! Reality hit after the 3 box was processed. We had only collected

about \$400 for shipping. Already the bill was over \$300 and we were not even half way done. I knew there was enough money to cover the check, but that would mean less money for the event next month. I told this to the postal worker. By now we are pals. It has been over an hour since I came to the window. The post office is generally noisy. At the very moment I told him about the money issue, it fell silent. The next thing that happened was nothing short of God calling His warriors to actions. People I had never met nor would I probably ever meet again starting bringing me money. It was truly overwhelming. Strangers were behind me working on the boxes, strangers were bringing me supplies, and strangers were bringing me money.

Just when I thought that it couldn't get any more surreal, a young woman sees me writing the address in black marker on the side of the last box. She walked over and pointed asking if that was going to the unit I had just printed. I said yes. Tears filled her eyes when she said "My husband is in that unit! He will get one of these!" Then the tears came to my eyes. I looked around and realized that the entire post office was watching this unfold with tears in their eyes. It was at this moment that I understood the "Family of God" is all around me all the time. Not just when I am in church or with loved ones. Now "going postal" has an entirely new meaning to me!

What Can You Do **About Soliciting** In The Neighborhood?

Many communities are ripe targets for solicitors – for a variety of reasons. While the Association has no real control over soliciting activities, we have tried to discourage solicitors from marketing in our community by placing "no soliciting" signs in common areas.

The reason that we cannot prevent soliciting is that the streets and roadways within the community are public access ways owned and maintained by the county. This means that no person or persons may be prevented from entering the community. Of course, if an individual or individuals are in the process of breaking the law, the Sheriff or other law enforcement officer can take immediate

Your Association recommends the following actions that every owner can take to discourage unwelcome soliciting in the

- Report all suspicious persons to the Sheriff's Department and request the deputies on duty be made aware of your concerns.
- Promptly remove all flyers left on your front or garage door.
- Promptly report to the Post Office all flyers left on the mailboxes.
- Refuse to make use of solicitors' offers and refuse to patronize any company being marketed in this manner.
- Notify the managing agent of any companies presently soliciting so that letters can be sent advising them of this policy of not permitting door to door soliciting (they will be reminded of the community newsletter and/or the Green Sheet as marketing options).
- Individual homeowners have the ability to place a small "No Trespassing/No Soliciting" sign at the entry to their homes. Should a solicitor continue to leave flyers, the homeowner then has the authority to file charges against the Solicitor/Company for trespassing on private property.







A large crowd followed Jesus because they saw the signs He was performing on those who were sick (John 6:2).

Are miracles possible? I believe a scientific investigation of God's existence is necessary in order to validate Jesus' miracles. After all, if there is no God, then there is no such thing as miracles, for everything would simply have a naturalistic explanation. Of course science concerns observing that which is and drawing conclusions based on what can be observed. Hence, only a fool would conclude that the Eternal God does not exist. At the very least, the evidence to the contrary is absurd, for how could anything exist unless something eternal first existed? So since it is apparent that the Eternal God exists, then the opposite of a theistic universe must be false. Thus, all atheistic and agnostic faiths are wrong—Hinduism, Buddhism, etc. That leaves three monotheistic religions: Islam, Judaism, and Christianity. And since mutually exclusive religions cannot all be true, only one of these three can actually be true.

Logically speaking, there cannot be more than one God because God is infinite, and only one infinite being can exist. For more than one God to exist, they would have to differ in some way. And if they differ, then one lacks something that the other one has. And if one being lacks something the other one has, then the one lacking is not infinite because an infinite being, by definition, lacks nothing.

Thus, there can be only one infinite Being. And an infinite Being, having created the universe, can have no limits and is thus capable of performing miracles.

Now since the Bible reveals that there is only one God (Deut. 6:4-9)—and one of the ways He has communicated His being is through the special avenue of miracles, which are unexplainable phenomena witnessed by God's created beings, they should be believed. Of course many through the centuries refute them. Benedict Spinoza (1632-1677) objected to miracles, saying, 1) Miracles are violations of natural laws; 2) natural laws are immutable; 3) it is impossible to violate immutable laws; 4) thus, miracles are impossible. Note that #3 uses circular reasoning in defining natural laws as immutable. For since the universe had a Creator, and the creation itself is a miraculous and unrepeatable, how can Spinoza's idea of natural laws being immutable be true? It can't. In reality, natural forces are muted every day from an airplane interrupting the course of gravity to a baseball being hit into the air with a bat.

Likewise, David Hume (1711-1776) objected to miracles, saying, 1) Natural law is by definition a description of a regular occurrence;

2) a miracle is by definition a rare occurrence; 3) the evidence for the regular is always greater than that for the rare; 4) a wise man always bases his belief on the greater evidence; 5) thus, a wise man should never believe in miracles. Note that since #3 is a false premise, Hume's conclusion is wrong. Once again, consider the universe which occurred only once and it unrepeatable. Or consider one who wins the lottery. Both events have occurred, and both are rare. But regardless, both happened! Even David Hume's own birth happened only once, but he had no trouble believing that.

So, rejecting miracles for the traditional reasons confuses believability with possibility. If evidence exists for a miracle, then probabilities for it not occurring cannot negate it. Rather than evaluating the veracity of the evidence for each miracle claim, we cannot rule out miracles in advance simply because we think there is uniform experience against them. And although miracles are rare events, they must not be negated simply because of such. After all, if they occurred more often, they would cease to be miracles, and miracles are by definition rare.

So, since logically speaking miracles have occurred, then they are possible. And because Jesus performed miracles, then He alone is God. A Jesus without miracles is simply another man, and man is far too sinful to save us. Only God can save, and He does so through faith in Christ.





Never too early to screen kids for high blood pressure

Children with high blood pressure may not feel sick or experience serious symptoms like adults, but if the condition goes untreated it could cause serious damage to their overall health later in life, said a pediatric hypertension specialist from Baylor College of Medicine.

"The good news is that we do not see heart attacks and strokes in children as a result of high blood pressure," said Dr. Daniel Feig, associate professor of pediatrics - renal at BCM. "The bad news is that the blood pressure will continue to go up and could cause permanent damage to the heart and kidneys. Without intervention childhood hypertension almost always results in hypertension in adulthood."

Beginning at age 3, children should be screened for high blood pressure at their annual check up, Feig said. If it is high, he or she will be asked to return a week later to see if the high readings persist.

If the child has elevated readings in three consecutive visits, he

or she should have an evaluation for the cause of hypertension and risk of organ injury.

Diet and exercise modifications are common treatments for high blood pressure, but if this is insufficient, there are a variety of antihypertensive medications that have been tested and proven to be safe in the short- and long- term.

Teach kids to enjoy holiday treats in moderation

Cookies, chocolates and other treats seem to be within arm's reach from Halloween to the end of year. But according to experts at Baylor College of Medicine, the holidays are no excuse for parents to let kids overeat and divert from their normal eating routine.

"You have to keep meals and snacks under some control no matter what day of the year it is," said Dr. Karen Cullen, associate professor of pediatrics at the USDA/ARS Children's Nutrition Research Center at BCM

Be sure children are not overindulging on treats and therefore skipping regular meals, she said. Save holiday treats for scheduled snacks or after-meal deserts, and be sure that they are an appropriate portion size.

"One of the good things about the cookies, chocolates and breads that you receive as gifts is that you can freeze them for later use," said Cullen.

Kids learn from watching their parents, so parents should be good role models. Parents should continue to serve regular balanced meals and snacks and eat with their children.

Exercise does the elderly body good

Exercise can't stop the aging process, but experts at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston say that for the elderly, whether it's weight training, walking, swimming or biking, 30 minutes of exercise three to five times a week is a good prescription for aging. "It's never too late to start exercising," said Dr. Robert Roush, an associate professor of medicine-geriatrics at BCM. "Being physically active and exercising regularly can help prevent or delay some diseases and disabilities as people age."

Loss of muscle mass typically begins in the 30s or 40s. As muscles shrink, fat cells take their place and that leads to a slowdown in

metabolism and weight gain even if caloric intake and expenditure remains the same.

"Any type of movement can be considered exercise, but resistance weight training has been shown to be the best way to reduce the loss of lean muscle," Roush said.

Early detection of glaucoma can save eyesight

Annual eye exams should include screenings for glaucoma, even for younger adults, because early detection can prevent long-term damage to sight, said ophthalmologists at Baylor College of Medicine.

"The biggest problem with glaucoma is that it's a silent disease, a 'sneak thief of sight," said Dr. Silvia Orengo-Nania, professor of ophthalmology in the Baylor Eye Clinic at BCM. "You could have visual damage occurring over time and not know it. Once damage occurs, it is irreversible and you will not be able to get any vision back that you have lost. This is why screening early is critical."

Glaucoma usually occurs when increased pressure in the eye slowly destroys the optic nerve, damaging your ability to see, Orengo-Nania said. Approximately 2 million people in the United States are visually impaired by glaucoma. It is one of the leading causes of blindness. Treatment can help slow down, but not reverse impaired vision, Orengo-Nania said.
