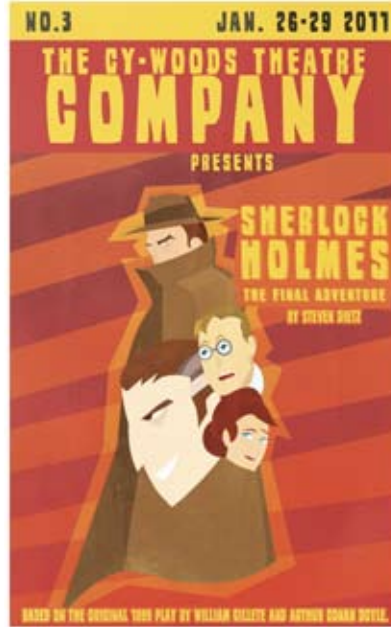

available beginning in January at [www.cwtc.net](http://www.cwtc.net) and at the door. Seating will be limited. Join us for this very special and mysterious experience!

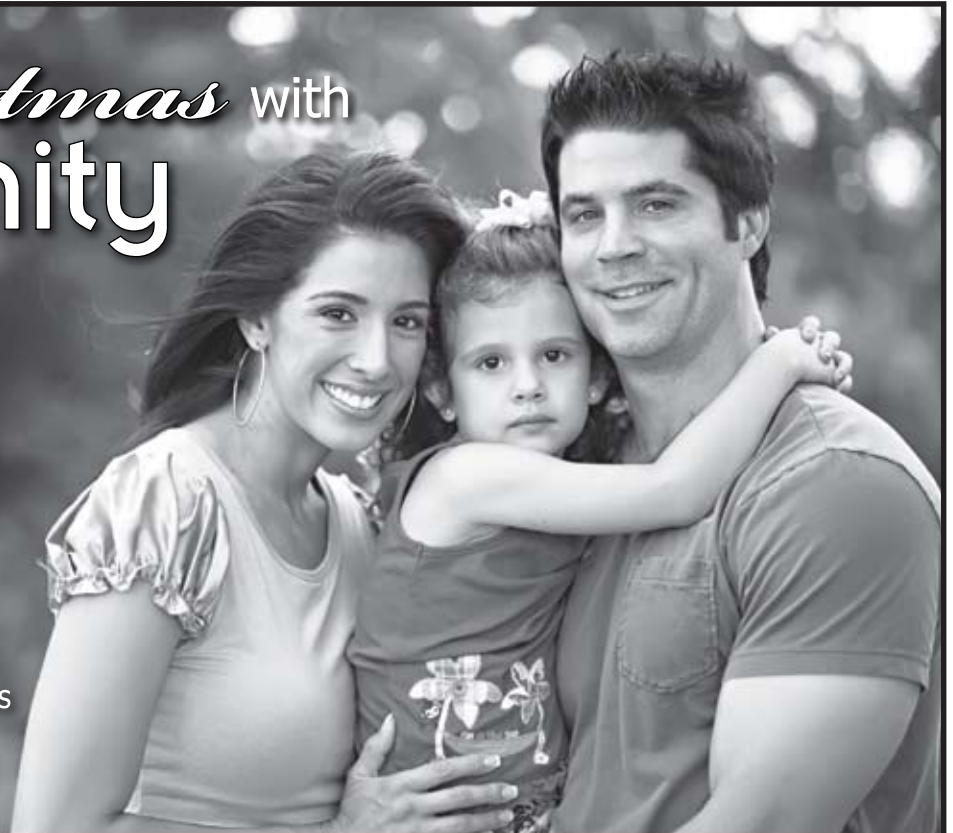

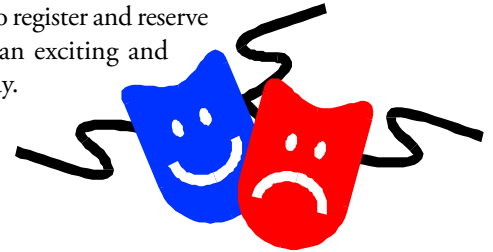
## Cypress Woods HS Thespan Troupe No. 7050

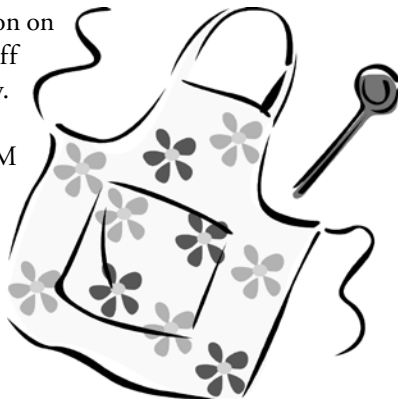


## Chili Cookers Wanted!

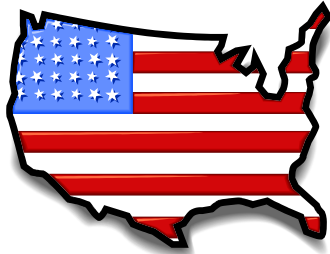
