## LETTER FROM YOUR SHADOW CREEK RANCH - ONSITE MANAGER

Please be advised that all homeowner who have received a letter in regards to restoring your lawn have been granted an extension till February 2011. Here are some tips that will help your lawn stay healthy & green throughout -Winter Season-

- 1. Raking your leaves will allow the air and light to flow through your lawn properly.
- 2. Once grass becomes dormant, you can lower your cutting height to one inch for warm-season grass and two inches for cool-season grass. Leaving longer than two inches may trap moisture, setting up your lawn for disease to develop in spring.
- 3. It's okay to leave a little mulch and clippings or leaves in lawn, but not a blanket JUST A SPRINKLE. Mulch can cause Nitrogen to return to soil over winter and spring.
- 4. Give your lawn some breathing room. Your lawn may have become impacted over the summer with heavy use. This can restrict movement of air and water, and any lawn fertilizer you apply won't be able to penetrate the soil if it's compacted. Aerating your lawn in late fall will give it a chance to breathe. You can rent a good aerating tool for about \$100.00, or you can pay a lawn maintenance service to do it for you for about the same price, without the hard work (still hard work, but for someone else).
- 5. If you still have sparse patches by winter, seed bare areas. Cooler weather will allow the seeds to germinate without weeds encroaching. Aeration will improve germination. Your lawn should fill in before the ground freezes.
- 6. To strengthen your lawn and prepare it for its come back in spring, apply a sustained-release Nitrogen lawn fertilizer by mid-to-late November. Just because your lawn is asleep, doesn't mean it should be starved. With cooler soil, nutrients break down slower. You want to use a sustained-release product to be sure your lawn gets the nitrogen it needs as well as the phosphorous, potassium, and partially blended sulfate required for quicker green-up in the spring. There is a Scott's fertilizer made especially for winterizing. Use a fertilizer spreader for even results.
- 7. Give your lawn one last good dose of water. This will help activate the lawn fertilizer.
- 8. Drain your sprinkler lines and close down your system. This will avoid a frozen and broken water pipe. In the event of a dry winter, use your garden hose to give a light sprinkling to your lawn every three weeks or so, just enough to keep it moist.
- 9. While your lawn becomes dormant, weeds still have a funny way of cropping up. If this is a problem, apply a broadleaf weed control product to your lawn. Grab weeds as they crop up whenever possible throughout the winter.

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## **Brazoria County Municipal Utility District No. 26**

As you know, Brazoria County Municipal Utility District No. 26 and Brazoria-Fort Bend County Municipal Utility District No. 1, otherwise known as the MUDs, gave their residents the chance to decide whether they were for or against the issuance of park bonds for development of the Shadow Creek Ranch Regional Sports Park (Park) at the intersection of Shadow Creek Ranch Parkway and Kingsley Drive, in coordination with the City of Pearland. Neither MUD received the required "for" votes to proceed with the issuance of bonds. As a result, the MUDs may not issue bonds to build the first phase of the Park sooner than originally planned by the City. We appreciate the interest and voter participation from the residents of Shadow Creek Ranch. The vote counts were:

## MUD 26: MUD I: For 711 (48.27%) For 364 (48.53%) Against 762 (51.73%) Against 386 (51.47%)

As a reminder, the City of Pearland operates our water and sewer system and provides garbage collection services. If you have any questions about your service, please call the City of Pearland at (281) 652-1603.

MUD 26 generally meets every first Tuesday at 11:00 a.m. at the offices of Allen Boone Humphries Robinson LLP, 3200 Southwest Freeway, Suite 2600, Houston, Texas 77027. Agendas for each meeting are posted at the Emerald Village Recreation Center, 11814 N. Clear Lake Loop, Pearland, Texas 77584, and at the Brazoria County Courthouse at least 72 hours before every meeting, and the Board of Directors invites all members of the public to attend its meetings. Please contact (713) 860-6436 if you need confirmation of a Board meeting.






### **Homeowner Tip**

As the end of the year approaches many homeowners will be reviewing their many policies to see what changes need to be made if any. One that is very important would be homeowners insurance. According to www.homeinsurance. com in the state of Texas the average homeowner pays \$895 a year to insure their home. That is a little higher than other parts of the United States, and it appears to be a significant part of Americans yearly budget. One aspect that may be overlooked by many is what town class is your neighborhood classified as? For many the thought never crossed their mind because your insurance agent didn't share that with you. A neighborhood's town class is defined by how close the home is in proximity to fire hydrants, fire departments and what kind of technology (pieces of equipment) do the fire departments with regard to aiding them with their day to day task. The fire department is responsible for registering its facility with the state board of insurance. In many areas the fire department may not be doing their due diligence and homeowners suffer the consequences. Once the information is received the state board of insurance can update their information and work to keep rates down. The lower the town class rating, the lower that part of your policy will be. Therefore, when insurance agents are working with homeowners they will have the most current and most beneficial town class rating available to homeowners. If a homeowner goes from a town class rating of 5 to a rating of 10 that could mean a \$250 increase and I know I could use my \$250 for something else.
