Update on CenterPoint Energy Power Outages

If you were home in Fairfield on Thanksgiving evening, you are aware of the power outage for homes on the west side of Mason Road and north of Cypresswood Drive. The power in this area remained off for about 45 minutes. This outage seemed to be the "straw that broke the camel's back" as there have been far too many power outages in Fairfield. It seems the norm is to have to reset clocks at least once a week which are caused by frequent power dips or outages. As a result of the latest failure, the HOA board requested AMI to contact our power provider. CenterPoint Energy sent two representatives to our December 7 board meeting to discuss the problem of continuity of power service to our community.

The CenterPoint reps explained that they have been well aware of the problems and

have been diligently looking for the causes of the outages. On Thanksgiving, they were able to locate a cable termination that failed causing the outage of the circuit supplying power to the area west of Mason Road. It was quite surprising that this equipment termination was not in Fairfield, but near US290 and Kickapoo Road. Fairfield is served by three 34.5 kV circuits from CenterPoint substations. The area east of Mason Road is on a circuit fed from a Barker Cypress substation. The commercial area at the front between US290 and Cypresswood Drive is on another circuit. The area to the west of Mason Road including the Outlet Mall is fed from a Hockley substation.

CenterPoint Energy feels that the latest repair should put an end to the repeated outages and voltage dips we have experienced.

This is not to say that there are still the potential power failures caused by new issues. On very windy days, tree branches blowing up against power lines can cause the circuit to trip. Animals such as squirrels climbing on the overhead lines can cause power outages. There is also the potential for end of life equipment failure as insulation breaks down or connections become contaminated.

It is important that we report power failures to CenterPoint at 713-207-2222 when they occur. If you notice a street light outage, CenterPoint Energy can be contacted at: CenterPointEnergy.com/outage for the street light repair.

ARCHITECTURAL APPLICATIONS

Now that the Holidays are over you may be considering making modifications, changes or additions to your home. Please be reminded that anything that alters the exterior appearance of your home or your property, front or back, i.e., pool, basketball goal, play equipment (including trampolines), patio cover, storage building, play houses, satellite dish, etc. must have your Association's prior written approval before construction or installation may begin.

- If you're building something that has a roof and/or sides, i.e., patio cover, storage building, you will need to include the following along with your application: materials including roofing, dimensions, height (measured from ground to peak), width and length, and a copy of your lot survey indicating the proposed location and a side view

elevation drawing. Remember, metal, plastic, etc. are not permitted.

- If you plan to install play equipment, please include a copy of your lot survey showing the proposed location, the dimensions of the equipment (height, width and length) and color of the tarp.
- If you're painting your home, please include a sample of the color(s) you wish to use.
- Basketball goals....include a copy of your recorded lot survey indicating the proposed location where you wish to keep the goal.
- If you're planning to build a pool, please contact AMI for the information required.

Keep in mind that applying for all improvements, modifications or additions is

a requirement set forth by your Governing Documents and is not an "FYI" procedure. Applications are official documents that must receive your Association's written approval before any work commences. By not doing so you risk your changes not being in compliance and the cost to modify the change.

It's a real easy process and takes no time at all to adhere to your governing documents. You can apply by U.S. Mail, fax (713-932-6059) or email (ami@amitx.com) or via Fairfield Village's website www.fairfieldvillage.org – whichever is easiest for you. An application as well as your Governing Documents can be obtained on line.

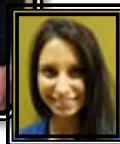

What Can You Do About Soliciting In The Neighborhood?

Many communities are ripe targets for solicitors – for a variety of reasons. While the Association has no real control over soliciting activities, we have tried to discourage solicitors from marketing in our community by placing "no soliciting" signs in common areas.

The reason that we cannot prevent soliciting is that the streets and roadways within the community are public access ways owned and maintained by the county. This means that no person or persons may be prevented from entering the community. Of course, if an individual or individuals are in the process of breaking the law, the Sheriff or other law enforcement officer can take immediate action.

Your Association recommends the following actions that every owner can take to discourage unwelcome soliciting in the community:

- Report all suspicious persons to the Sheriff's Department and request the deputies on duty be made aware of your concerns.
- Promptly remove all flyers left on your front or garage door.
- Promptly report to the Post Office all flyers left on the mailboxes.
- Refuse to make use of solicitors' offers and refuse to patronize any company being marketed in this manner.
- Notify the managing agent of any companies presently soliciting so that letters can be sent advising them of this policy of not permitting door to door soliciting (they will be reminded of the community newsletter and/or the Green Sheet as marketing options).
- Individual homeowners have the ability to place a small "No Trespassing/No Soliciting" sign at the entry to their homes. Should a solicitor continue to leave flyers, the homeowner then has the authority to file charges against the Solicitor/Company for trespassing on private property.

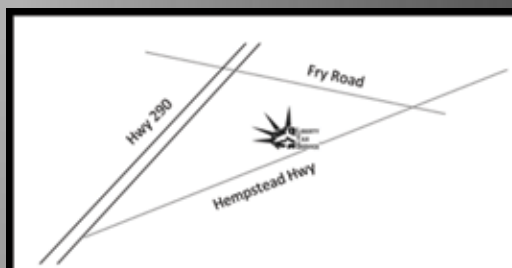

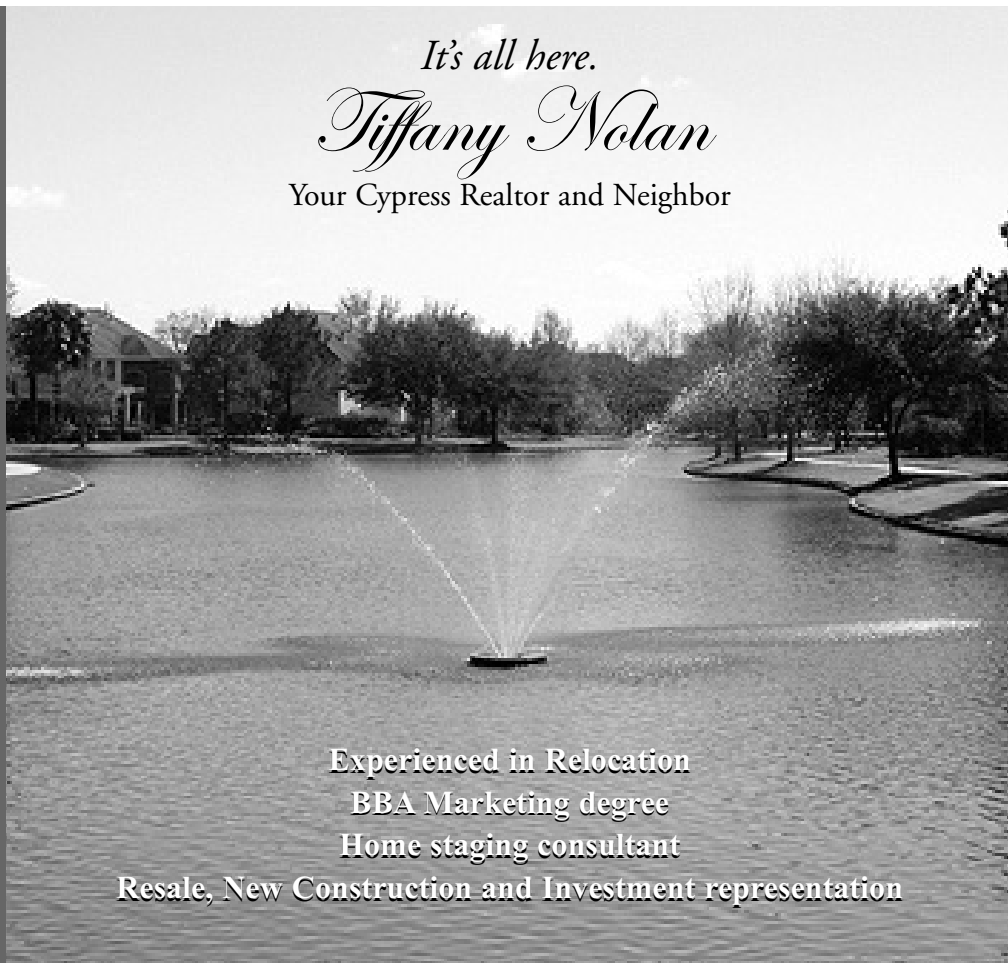



Harvest Bible Church

He who speaks from himself seeks his own glory; but He who is seeking the glory of the One who sent Him, He is true, and there is no unrighteousness in Him (John 7:18).

Today's Church is big business. Seminarians are being trained not to be pastors but CEOs of large churches. They are trained in how to grow churches and are keenly aware of all the tricks of church growth. Of course the larger the church, the more prestige and money that comes with the job. Minimize the Bible, amp up the music, fill the youth rooms with games along with the latest fads, and what you've got is a "successful" church—at least in the eyes of the ignorant and biblically illiterate self-professed "Christians." These churches typically contain little to no Scripture and very few, if any, people who live a life of holiness unto the Lord. They, like their pastors, tend to be self-seeking, seeking God only for what He can do for them.

In the Bible, from the very beginning, back in Genesis 3, the powers of evil attempted to twist God's words and lead mankind down the road to a self-seeking mentality by corrupting the words of God and twisting them. Even today the same corruption exists in false teachers.

So the question is, what are the characteristics of these false teachers today and those who would lead well-meaning people astray? From

the words of Jesus in John 7:18, we can see at least two distinctive qualities of false teachers. First, a false teacher "speaks from himself." He/she does not preach or teach from the Bible, although they may scatter a few verses around in order to make their man-made points. In other words, they make up their own authority and speak from their own intellect, usually with a published book to back up their self-proclaimed authority (cf. Jer. 14:14; 23:16, 21, 26, 32; 27:15; 28:15; 29:9, 31; Neh. 6:10-12; Ezek. 13:2, 6).

The second distinctive of a false teacher is that he "seeks his own glory." The Old Testament prophets denounced these, calling them "prophets who divine for money" (Micah 3:11). Isaiah spoke of them those who neglected their flock in order to feed themselves (56:11). The Apostle Paul characterized them as "slaves of their own appetites" (Rom. 16:18) "who suppose that godliness is a means of gain" (1 Tim. 6:5). These are guilty of "teaching things they should not teach for the sake of sordid gain" (Titus 1:11). The Apostle Peter warned that by their greed they misuse people (2 Pet. 2:3) because "they have a heart trained in greed... having followed the way of Balaam, the son of Beor, who loved the wages of unrighteousness (2 Pet. 2:14-15; cf. Jude 11). Note today's preachers who seem only to care about the mighty dollar!

Today's preacher is too often out only for himself/herself, and they will move onward to other churches only to further themselves, not Christ's Church. Too often, they honor themselves and do what they do to be noticed by others. They are "those who desire to make a good showing in the flesh" (Gal. 6:12). Like the wicked Diotrephes in 3 John 9, they love the places of prominence. Their entire goal is to be honored and noticed by men with their mega-church.

Jesus was just the opposite. He never sought His own glory but the glory of God the Father (John 5:41; 8:50). He did not come to be served but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many through His death on the cross (Matt. 20:28). Whereas today's false teacher is materialistic and living in the largest of homes, Jesus had nowhere to place his head (Luke 9:58). Likewise, false teachers are self-seeking CEOs of churches, but Jesus "got up from supper, and laid aside His garments...taking a towel...and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with a towel" (John 13:4-5). He was willing to model the lowliest of service!

In the end, Jesus was rejected by the religious leaders. While He sought to glorify God, they sought glory only for themselves. Who is your preacher like? Jesus? Or one of them?

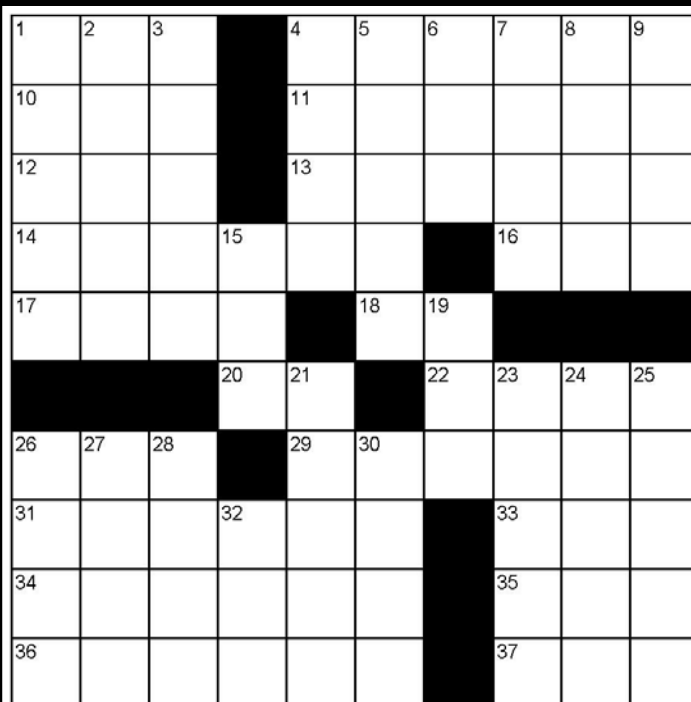

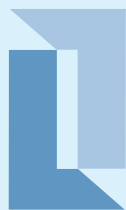
