November HOA *Meeting Highlights*

- Due to the Thanksgiving holiday falling on the last Thursday of the month in November, November's HOA meeting was moved to December 2.
- Nine homeowners joined the board members for the November meeting.
- President, Julie Dubros, introduced our new PCMI coordinator, Margie Naranjo. Khara Mathews will no longer be managing the Willowbridge/Stonebridge account.
- Several homeowners voiced concern over the new tennis court program and the program's ability to judiciously reserve court time for homeowners. The board is looking into online reservation applications that will allow reservations on a first come; first serve basis and will allow a limited number of reservations at one time.
- We had two homeowners volunteer to be on the Tennis Committee.
- Board member, Robert Logsdon, is evaluating irrigation cycles and consumption in an attempt to better understand the system and eliminate inefficiencies.
- The corner rounds along Willowbridge Park Blvd were once again a topic of discussion. Some rounds look healthy while others are not so healthy. It appears the rounds that look unhealthy are located on corners where irrigation is not available. The board continues to struggle with ways to better maintain the corner rounds.
- New board member, Patrick Smith, has been discussing enhancements to the pool program with our pool maintenance group, Texas Aquatics. A couple of the ideas included a tag program that would allow the lifeguards and fellow swimmers to identify less experienced or non-swimmers. Another program includes swim lessons. These are just a couple of the offered programs discussed.
- Patrick also submitted revised ARC guidelines for the board to review. The board agreed to a few changes and will vote on the revised guidelines once a final document is presented.

NEW TENNIS TAGS

We have new tennis tags for Willowbridge Residents. Four tags will be distributed per family; two resident tags and two guest tags. We only have two courts therefore a large family may not be able to play all at once. Tennis players must wear tags while playing on courts. This will help identify who should and should not be on our courts.



- Residents will receive two green "member" tags and two "white" guest tags that have identical numbers on both of the tags.
- Every guest must be accompanied by a resident host and wear the white tag that has the host member's number.
- Any resident who allows another player to use their tag agrees to forfeit their tennis court rights for twelve months.
- If a guest plays with a guest tag without being accompanied at the courts by the member, the white guest tag will be confiscated indefinitely.

To reserve the courts on-line, please visit the neighborhood website. The HOA wants to ensure that all residents have equal opportunity playing time on the courts. Community Garage Sale Fun and Profitable---A Form of Recycling by Walter Griffin

A garage sale, also known as a yard sale, rummage sale, tag sale, attic sale, moving sale, or junk sale, is an informal, irregularly scheduled event for the sale of used goods by private individuals. Typically the goods in a garage sale are unwanted items from the household with the home owners conducting the sale. The goods are sometimes new, likenew, or just usable, offered for sale because the owner does not want or need the item, to minimize their possessions, or to raise funds. Popular motivations for a garage sale are "Spring Cleaning" or the owner's move to a new residence, to even getting some well-earned spending money. The sales venue is typically a garage, driveway, carport, front yard porch, or occasionally, the interior of a house.

Staples of garage sales include old clothing, books, toys, household knickknacks, lawn and garden tools, sports equipment, and board games. Larger items like furniture and occasionally home appliances are also sold. Garage sales occur most frequently in suburban areas on good-weather weekends, and usually have designated hours for the sale. Buyers who arrive before the hours of the sale to review the items are known as "Early Birds;" they often are professional restorers or resellers. Such sales also attract people who are searching for bargains or for rare and unusual items. Bargaining, also known as haggling, on prices is routine, and items may or may not have price labels affixed. Some people buy goods from these sales to restore them for resale.


