Home for a Hero Eagle Springs Welcomer Home Its Newest Residents!

While most of Houston was slowing down in the last days before Christmas, residents of Eagle Springs and many others in the Humble community worked extra hours to make sure it would be the holiday of a lifetime for a wounded war hero and his family.

With dozens of Eagle Springs residents cheering them on, Purple Heart recipient Eusebio Collazo, his wife Karla, and 1-yearold daughter Gabriella received the keys to

a new four-bedroom, three-bathroom Lennar home, located on a corner homesite in Eagle Springs. The patriotic key presentation ceremony took place Dec. 21st.

Newland donated the Eagle Springs home site and Lennar provided the home. A host of other companies and individuals also pitched in to make this an unforgettable day for the Collazos. Spark Energy donated a year of free electricity, Rooms To Go provided four rooms of furniture, and GE gave a washer and dryer.



The Collazos' new home was made possible through the efforts of the Houston-based Helping a Hero program, which provides specially adapted homes for qualifying service members who have been injured in duty in the war on terror.

A retired Marine sergeant, Collazo survived serious injuries in a mortar attack in Iraq, during his second tour of duty in 2005. He continues to undergo treatment at the

Houston VA Hospital for ongoing leg pain, post-traumatic stress disorder and traumatic brain injury.

The morning's events were a blend of patriotism and holiday spirit, beginning with more than a mile of American flags leading visitors and news media to the home site.

After the Pledge of Alliance was recited, Helping a Hero chairman Meredith Iler sang a rousing version of the national anthem, with help

from young students from the Kids R Kids daycare center in Eagle Springs.

Next, Newland senior vice president Alan Bauer welcomed the Collazos on behalf of all Eagle Springs residents. "We thank you for your honor and your service to our country," Bauer said. "It is our fond hope that you will develop many long friendships here at Eagle Springs, and that you will enjoy the amenities and schools along with your beautiful new home."



Representatives of area congressmen Ted Poe and

Gene Green each presented Collazo with a United States flag that had been flown over the Capitol.

Because Collazo is a huge football fan, Houston Texans owner Cal McNair was selected to present the symbolic key to the home, along with a football signed by Texans players.

Eagle Springs' residents were asked to contribute gift cards to help make the Collazo's first Christmas in the community even more special. Over \$1,000 in gift cards were collected in just a few days, and they were presented to the family by resident Steven Humphrey, who also served in the Navy.

After the key ceremony concluded, the Collazos invited their new neighbors in for a tour of their new home. Lunch was donated by Chick-Fil-A, and the Lake Houston Women's Council of Realtors chapter served refreshments.

As many residents know, Eagle Springs no longer participates in the Atascocita Joint Security Contract as we have in the past. We now have our own Security Contract (aka Contract Deputy Patrol Program) which is a joint effort between ESCA, MUD 106, and MUD 290. Our new contract will provide us with five Deputy Patrol Officers plus a Patrol Supervisor. Sgt. Bloomfield will oversee our new contract; however we have not lost Sgt. Lekas entirely, he will oversee all the Atascocita area contracts. Many residents attended our January meeting to hear about the new contract and meet Sgt. Bloomfield. We look forward to working with him during the coming year.

Relay For Life

The American Cancer Society's Relay for Life is a life-changing event that gives everyone in communities across the globe a chance to celebrate the lives of people who have battled cancer, remember loved ones lost, and fight back against the disease. At Relay for Life, teams of people camp out at a local high school, park, or fairground and take turns walking or running around a track or path. Each team is asked to have a representative on the track at all times during the event. Because cancer never sleeps, relays are overnight events of up to 24 hours in length.

Relay for Life began in 1985 when Dr. Gordy Klatt, a colorectal surgeon in Tacoma, Washington, ran and walked around a track for 24 hours to raise money for the American Cancer Society. Since then, Relay for Life has grown from a single man's passion to fight cancer into the world's largest movement to end the disease. Each year, more than 3.5 million people in 5,000 communities in the United States, along with additional communities in 19 other countries, gather to take part in this global phenomenon and raise much-needed funds and awareness to save lives from cancer.

Anyone can participate in Relay for Life. Friends, families, neighbors, classmates, sports teams, etc. Form your own team or join an existing team. No matter who you are, there's a place for you! The only requirement to participate in Relay for Life is a \$10 registration/commitment fee per person, due upon registration.

Constable's Corner

For those of you who I have yet to meet, my name is Sgt. Charles "Chuck" Bloomfield with the Harris County Constables Office Pct 4 and I am the Supervisor assigned to the Eagle Springs Community. The Deputies and I look forward to assisting you in maintaining the continued safety and security of the Eagle Springs Community. I encourage you as citizens to assist your local law enforcement by contacting the Harris County Constable Office Pct 4 Dispatch line at (281) 376-3472 to report any illicit or questionable activity within the Eagle Springs Community.

This month I have included an excerpt

from the U.S. FBI national web site addressing concerns of Child Internet Predators.

Following is a list of potential clues and behaviors that may indicate that your child may be at risk online:

- Your child spends large amounts of time on-line, especially at night.
- You find pornography on your child's computer.
- Your child receives phone calls from men you don't know or is making calls, sometimes long distance, to numbers you don't recognize.
- Your child receives mail, gifts, or packages from someone you don't know.
- Your child turns the computer monitor off or quickly changes the screen on the monitor when you come into the room.
- Your child becomes withdrawn from the family.
- Your child is using an on-line account belonging to someone else.

What should you do if you suspect your child is communicating with a sexual predator online?

- Consider talking openly with your child about your suspicions. Tell them about the dangers of computer-sex offenders.
- Review what is on your child's computer. If you don't know how, ask a friend, coworker, relative, or other knowledgeable person. Pornography or any kind of sexual communication can be a warning sign.
- Use the Caller ID service to determine who is calling your child. Most telephone companies that offer Caller ID also offer a service that allows you to block your number from



appearing on someone else's Caller ID. Telephone companies also offer an additional service feature that rejects incoming calls that you block. This rejection feature prevents computer-sex offenders or anyone else from calling your home anonymously.

- Devices can be purchased that show telephone numbers that have been dialed from your home phone. Additionally, the last number called from your home phone can be retrieved provided that the telephone is equipped with a redial feature. You will also need a telephone pager to complete this retrieval.
- This is done using a numeric-display pager and another phone that is on the same line as the first phone with the redial feature. Using the two phones and the pager, a call is placed from the second phone to the pager. When the paging terminal beeps for you to enter a telephone number, you press the redial button on the first (or suspect) phone. The last number called from that phone will then be displayed on the pager.
- Monitor your child's access to all types of live electronic communications (i.e., chat rooms, instant messages, Internet Relay Chat, etc.), and monitor your child's e-mail. Computer-sex offenders almost always meet potential victims via chat rooms. After meeting a child on-line, they will continue to communicate electronically often via e-mail.

Should any of the following situations arise in your household, via the Internet or on-line service, you should immediately contact your local law enforcement agency.

- 1)Your child or anyone in the household has received child pornography;
- 2) Your child has been sexually solicited by someone who knows that your child is under 18 years of age;
- 3) Your child has received sexually explicit images from someone that knows your child is under the age of 18.

If one of these scenarios occurs, keep the computer turned off in order to preserve any evidence for future law enforcement use. Unless directed to do so by the law enforcement agency, you should not attempt to copy any of the images and/or text found on the computer.
