





## <u>Around Fairfield</u> **FROM THE WHITE HOUSE** *What is going on in Fairfield?*

**FAIRFIELD SPORTS** – Unless your family has young children, you may not be aware of all the sports activities available in our community. In this past year well over 2500 youth have participated in Fairfield sports. The breakdown for the various sports is as follows:

Youth ages 4 to 13 play Baseball and Soccer. Youth 6 to 14 play Basketball. The ages for Volleyball are 6 to 13. A new Softball field, named HOPE FIELD, has been built with the support of Team Tiara, a breast cancer awareness group. This field is located to the west of the existing baseball fields. The coaches for our youth sports are now required to go through background checks to ensure we have the very best individuals guiding our youth. Fairfield Sports Association meetings are at 6:30 PM on the first Sunday of each month at the Lakeside Trails meeting room. These meetings are open to the public.

**CHAPPELL RIDGE SUBDIVISION** – Have you noticed the improvements in many of the Chappell Ridge cul-de-sacs? The older mail boxes have been cleaned up and painted. . Please refrain from

taping signs to the mail boxes as this was the major reason the paint was missing or pealing from these boxes. Some of the pine trees in the cul-de-sacs have been removed. If the existing pine trees or live oaks in the area near the mail box were being overcrowded, we felt it best to open the area for better primary tree growth. Additional ground cover has been added in the cul-de-sacs to cover any bare spots.

### CYPRESSWOOD AT MASON ROAD (NW CORNER)

- In November 2010, this partially completed shopping center that has been a community eyesore was sold by Citibank, which acquired the property via foreclosure, to a Houston-based buyer. The new owner, Radler Enterprises, Inc., has actively owned, rehabilitated and developed quality commercial real estate in the Houston area since 1989. Radler undertook a complete forensic analysis of the project and is currently working to complete the retail center to 2011 standards. The project is scheduled to be completed this year. ## LEASH LAW

Animals that are not properly restrained pose a threat to all our residents. While you may know your pet is friendly, an animal running at someone who is walking by is very scary for that person. Many children are afraid of animals and become frightened, which could result in the child getting hurt trying to avoid the animal.

Harris County Animal Control advises, "All dogs and cats must be kept under restraint while in the unincorporated areas of Harris County, Texas. The custodian of a dog or cat is not authorized to have, harbor or keep any unlicensed dog or cat, nor to allow any dog or cat to become a stray."

## Restraint is defined as "the control of a dog or cat under the following circumstances:

1When it is controlled by a line or leash not more than six (6) feet in length, if the line or leash is held by a human being, who is capable of controlling or governing the dog or car in question

2When it is within a fully enclosed vehicle

3.When it is on the premise of the custodian and the animal does not have access to sidewalk or street.

While it may be nice to have your animal out on the front yard while you work or play, it is against the law, unless the animal is properly restrained.

Lets all help keep our community a safe and comfortable place for all our residents by being responsible pet owners. This will not only protect anyone who may be walking or bicycling in the area, but also the pet owner who could be held legally responsible or possibly sued for failing to properly restrain their pet.

## What Can You Do About Soliciting In The Neighborhood?

Many communities are ripe targets for solicitors – for a variety of reasons. While the Association has no real control over soliciting activities, we have tried to discourage solicitors from marketing in our community by placing "no soliciting" signs in common areas.


The reason that we cannot prevent soliciting is that the streets and roadways within the community are public access ways owned and maintained by the county. This means that no person or persons may be prevented from entering the community. Of course, if an individual or individuals are in the process of breaking the law, the Sheriff or other law enforcement officer can take immediate action.

Your Association recommends the following actions that every owner can take to discourage unwelcome soliciting in the community:

- Report all suspicious persons to the Sheriff's Department and request the deputies on duty be made aware of your concerns.
- Promptly remove all flyers left on your front or garage door.
- Promptly report to the Post Office all flyers left on the mailboxes.
- Refuse to make use of solicitors' offers and refuse to patronize any company being marketed in this manner.
- Notify the managing agent of any companies presently soliciting so that letters can be sent advising them of this policy of not permitting door to door soliciting (they will be reminded of the community newsletter and/or the Green Sheet as marketing options).
- Individual homeowners have the ability to place a small "No Trespassing/No Soliciting" sign at the entry to their homes. Should a solicitor continue to leave flyers, the homeowner then has the authority to file charges against the Solicitor/Company for trespassing on private property.









## **Harvest Bible Church**

For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life (John 3:16)... The "for" in v. 16 explains vv. 14-15 which say that "all who believe" in the Son of God, whom God lifted up, will have eternal life. Those who gain eternal life are "all who believe," and the word "believe" is a present participle showing continuous action—literally, "those who are believing." Belief isn't just a one time event but an ongoing reality that, if genuine, never ceases.

The explanation has to do with what God did and why. What He did was "love" (Greek agape) the world-a word that points to volitional and unconditional love as an action as opposed to a feeling of sentimentality. The Greek word agape is a past tense verb in this context, and the Greek form (aorist) is one of "snapshot" action, like a photo. Thus, God's love to the world is seen in a snapshot photo, as it were, when Christ died on the cross.

What did God love? The world-which includes both God's created order and His created peoples (1:10). Jews would have struggled greatly over this truth. They believed that God was loving but that He only loved them! Yet since God is love, it makes no sense that His love be confined to any one people, although His wrath is

on those who fail to love Him. His entire essence is love, so all that He does for mankind—the pinnacle of His creation—is loving.

The English text says that God "so" loved the world. But the Greek text is literally, in such a manner, expressing means not emotion. It isn't that God was "so" in love with the world, but that He loved the world "in such a manner" so as to send His Son. Sentimentalism is absent.

How did God love the world? By giving His "only begotten Son"-Jesus Christ. "Only begotten" simply means "unique" and does not imply that God has only one son, for He gives life to all. He has only one unique Son, Jesus Christ. This is similar to Abraham, who had a plurality of sons but only one unique son, Isaac, through whom God's promises are fulfilled. And as Abraham was willing to sacrifice his unique son in obedience to God, Christians will do well to recognize the incalculable cost God paid to show His love for the world by sending His one and only Son. Yes, God loved the world in the loftiest way conceivable, by sending His Son.

The theology of John 3:16 is not simply that God loved the world by giving His Son. He did it for a purpose... that all who believe in Him shall not perish but have eternal life. True belief, however,

isn't a simple recognition of Christ's death, for the devil knows all about that; rather, true believe concerns a lifestyle of trusting in Christ. Those who do will die physically of course, but then they will live eternally with their loving God. All others will "be destroyed" eternally (cf. 2 Thess. 1:9). Why? Man is born sinful and rebellious, and everyone who evaluates his life knows this. God wills no one to hell, but man's freewill chooses it every time. Thus, it is God's love that overcomes man's depraved will-like a drowned man washed up on a beach—and brings him to life spiritually by causing him to be born anew (1 Pet 1:3). Instead of God just overlooking the saved man's sin, in His love He paid the penalty for that sin by dying on the cross. Thus, the love of God is manifested in His actions through His Son Jesus who has offered eternal life to all who believe-to all who trust in Him and submit to Him alone as God.

Rejecting God does not mean spitting in His face; it simply entails rejecting Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. Certainly God's love is a major theme throughout Scripture, but so too is judgment and wrath upon all those who refuse to trust in God through His Son Jesus Christ.





# When It's Just You in an Emergency

"Mom!" you yell down the stairs. "Where's my math book? I can't find it and the bus is coming! Please help me ... it's an emergency!"

It is kind of an emergency with the bus coming and all, but what about a medical emergency? That kind of emergency is usually more serious. If you don't have your math book or miss the bus, that would be bad. But a medical emergency means someone needs care from a doctor right away. Let's find out the right thing to do.

## QUICK THINKING: WHAT WOULD YOU DO?

Liz and her little brother Jamie are out for a walk. Jamie decides to race ahead down a very steep hill. He's running pretty fast when he suddenly trips. Over and over he falls, rolling down the hill at high speed until he's sprawled out on the sidewalk at the bottom.

Liz rushes to her brother's side, hoping that he's OK.Then she sees some blood on the pavement. And Jamie isn't moving at all. What should she do? First things first: Liz should call for help right away.

Calling for help is the most important thing a kid can do in an emergency. If you are going to be the one making the emergency phone call, here's what to do:

- Take a deep breath to calm down a little.
- Tell the operator there's an emergency.

- Say your name and where you are (the exact address if you know it).
- Explain what happened and how many people are hurt. (The operator will need all the information you can provide, so give as many details as you can.)
- Stay on the line until the operator says it's OK to hang up.

After calling for help, your first thought might be to rush over to the person who's injured. But stop and look before you do. Make sure the scene is safe. If it's not, wait in a safe spot until a grown-up or an emergency team arrives.

If the scene is safe, and as soon as Liz is sure someone is calling 911 – or she has called it herself – she could return to her brother and wait until help arrives. (She shouldn't move her brother at all because he could have a neck or other bone injury. Moving someone who has that sort of injury can make it much worse.) She can help him feel calm by being calm herself.

#### IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

The best way to handle an emergency is to be prepared for one. Knowing what to do ahead of time can help you stay in control so that you can help. Here are some suggestions on how to be ready to help in an emergency:

When you are outdoors, make sure you are in an area where you can call out for help even if you don't have a phone with you.

- Know how to dial 911 or your local emergency number. In most areas in the United States, it's 911.
- If you have one, carry a cell phone or know how to use your parent's cell phone.
- Learn first aid. Look for basic first-aid classes with your local Red Cross, theYMCA orYWCA, the Boy or Girl Scouts, 4-H clubs, your local hospital, and other organizations. Or ask your school nurse to have a first-aid class just for students in your school.

It's scary to think about someone getting hurt. But the truth is that accidents can and do happen. They happen when people are being careless and careful. Sometimes, kids are the ones who get hurt. Sometimes, grown-ups get hurt. Either way, it's good to know what to do if someone needs emergency medical help. Even though you're a kid, you can make a big difference by doing the right thing.
