

Cool temperatures and wet weather couldn't dampen the spirits of the Cavalier Nation as hundreds of local and area fans lined Main Street at the Hill Country Galleria in Bee Cave for the LT Parade of Champions held January 16, 2011.

Hosted by the City of Bee Cave and the Galleria, the parade honored the Lake Travis High School volleyball and football state championship teams. On November 20, 2010, the Lady Cavs swept the Brenham Cubettes to capture the school's first-ever Class 4A state championship. On December 18, 2010, the LT Cavs defeated the Denton Ryan Raiders at Cowboys Stadium, earning the school's fourth consecutive Class 4A football state title.

Elected officials including Sen. Kirk Watson, Rep. Paul Workman, Travis County Commissioner Karen Huber, City of Bee Cave Mayor Caroline Murphy, City of Lakeway Mayor Dave DeOme, and Village of The Hills Mayor Doug Lindgren were in attendance and delivered special greetings, proclamations and resolutions recognizing the teams and their accomplishments.

The parade began with a special rendition of the National Anthem performed by country music star and Lake Travis resident Jack Ingram.

#### Lake Travis Reads Ben Rehder

The local "One Book, One Community" program LAKE TRAVIS READS has chosen to feature award-winning Central Texas author Ben Rehder for its fourth annual program. "One Book, One Community" is a national program created by the Center for the Book in Washington, D.C., and adopted by communities around the nation. Our version, called Lake Travis Reads, is sponsored by the libraries and Friends groups of Bee Cave Public Library, Lake Travis Community Library and Spicewood Community Library.

The goal of LAKE TRAVIS READS is to bring the community together to read and discuss a shared book or body of work by a single author. This year, the steering committee selected author Ben Rehder whose wickedly funny mysteries are set in nearby Blanco County. His most recent novel, Holy Moly, features televangelist Peter Boothe who decides to build a mega-church on the banks of the Pedernales River. When a fossil is unearthed on the construction site, a massive cover-up begins. "Combining sophisticated prose

with down-home Texas crime, he leaves no part of Texas life untouched," writes Library Journal. The Austin Chronicle calls Rehder's work, "weird and wickedly funny."

Ben Rehder's other novels include Buck Fever (2002), Bone Dry (2003), Flat Crazy (2004), Guilt Trip (2005), and Gun Shy (2007). He was nominated for the Edgar Award for Best First Novel (Buck Fever) and has a day job in the advertisement business. His next book, The Chicken Hanger, will be published by TCU Press.

As part of LAKE TRAVIS READS BEN REHDER, book clubs at all three libraries will host discussions of his novels. Check with your local library for dates and titles. "An Evening with Ben Rehder" will conclude the 2011 LAKE TRAVIS READS with an appearance by the author at Bee Cave Public Library on Wednesday, February 9, 2011 at 7 p.m. The event is free and open to the public.
