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



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## **Trails Update**

Mountain bikers and hikers share the trails marked "okay for bikes" in Steiner Ranch. Bicyclists should slow down when passing or overtaking hikers on the trail, as the IMB etiquette indicates. To a hiker, a bike even going slowly looks a little dangerous, so bikers please slow down when meeting hikers. DIY trail maintenance: If you see a branch hanging over the trail where it could be hazardous, just bring a hand saw on your next trip and cut it off. Note that any other cutting is never allowed in the greenbelts. Only your HOA is allowed to make trail repairs or reroutes - see below.

We are forming teams to help design the labels to go on all the trail signs. Like to solve puzzles? Contact us.

Is your favorite trail in need of repair or in need of better sign locations? If you see a problem on the trails, call the HOA at 266-7553 or visit http://www.steinerranchhoa.org under "Report A Problem." Be specific about the location on the trail, the problem you see, your ideas for a solution, and your contact information.

Construction of any kind is not allowed on the greenbelts or along trails. Your HOA dollars are wasted paying for labor to remove structures such as forts, and the responsible parties are subject to fines. If you see any construction, take a picture and contact the HOA. Recently a resident was injured when he fell against one of the T-posts which have been installed in some of our older trails. Please be careful around these T-posts as we work to remove them from the trail system.

Only the HOA is authorized to create trails in Steiner Ranch. Unfortunately, someone has been cutting down trees in our greenbelt trying to make rogue trails. These are not authorized trails and are actually dangerous routes. We don't wish to spend your HOA money trying to close and re-vegetate rogue trails. Instead, we want to hear from those who want new trails because we are actively looking at routes within Steiner to expand our trail system. Would you like to help us plan new trails? Contact your trails committee to get involved or come to the next Trails Committee meeting on Thursday February 10 at 7PM at Bella Mar. All residents are welcome to attend. A trail signage project team is now forming: We are designing a system of labels for our trail sign posts. To get connected here and volunteer your design skills, contact the trails committee at (512) 632-0162.

If you see any rogue trail cutting or including motorcycles anywhere on the trails or in the parks, take a picture and call the Travis County Sheriff West Command at (512) 854-9728 and the HOA. Remember, your trails are private and are for your use, and your accompanied guests' use only.

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
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## Around Steiner



The Loop 360 bridge has a long history of engineering behind it. Before 1851 transportation in Texas was confined to boat traffic along the coast and the lower reaches of a few rivers, or to animal-drawn vehicles on the few and primitive roads to the interior. As railroads developed, river transportation declined, but the Gulf ports were built up. All the thirteen deepwater ports in Texas today have artificial harbors dredged in relatively shallow areas. The port of Houston is fifty miles from deep water and was made possible in 1925 by dredging of the Houston Ship Channel. The second railroad west of the Mississippi River, the Buffalo Bayou, Brazos and Colorado Railway, was in Texas. The twenty miles running west from Harrisburg were begun in 1851 and put into service in 1853. By 1862 engineers had built some 492 miles of track, largely in the Gulf Coast area. Stimulated by grants of state land, a new era of railroad construction began about 1870, reaching a peak of 1,669 miles built in the year 1881 and 1,096 miles in 1882, at which time grants ceased. The 17,078 miles of track in Texas in 1932 declined to 15,586 miles by 1949, when several branch lines were abandoned because of highway competition.

Highways had a humble beginning. An

early specification of the Republic of Texas called for a road thirty feet wide with tree stumps not to exceed twelve inches high. Under state law counties were responsible for all early highway work, but they naturally built more local roads than highways. In cities pavements were gradually introduced: creosoted wood blocks in 1875, asphalt in 1897, brick in 1899, and concrete about 1910. But most pavements were limited to city streets or highways near large cities until the Highway Department was established in 1917. By 1950, the department had developed 33,648 miles of paved highways. In 1945 the department began the construction of farm-to-market roads, and the building of expressways within all the larger cities began in 1949. By 1970 - 1980, Texas had the largest mileage of interstate highways in the United States and had a total highway system second to none in the nation. Approximately 70,000 miles of highway, the backbone of the state's transportation system provided good access to markets and facilitated technical growth.

Railroads and highways also need bridges, which are a product of structural engineering. The first bridge across the Brazos, the Waco Suspension Bridge, used Roebling wire rope, iron from New Jersey, and three million locally produced bricks. It was completed in 1870. Subsequently, John A. Roebling used similar cable for the Brooklyn Bridge in New York. The Houston Street viaduct (Dallas, 1911) and Paddock viaduct (Fort Worth, 1914) served as prototypes for similar concrete arch viaducts across the growing western United States. Other notable bridges are the Rainbow Bridge at Port Arthur and the Pecos High Bridge, a railroad bridge. After 1950 the Texas Highway Department achieved national recognition for applications with composite steel-concrete girders, pre-stressed concrete, expressway-interchange structures, and segmental construction of bridges. Research facilities at UT Austin and Texas A&M University contributed to the success of these innovative bridge systems. Noteworthy steel bridges in Texas include bridges across the ship channels in Corpus Christi and Beaumont, the bridge over the Colorado River on the Capital of Texas Highway (Loop 360) in Austin, and a bridge across the Devils River canyon, which appeared to be much deeper before Amistad Reservoir was impounded. ## **Steiner Stars Summer League Swim Team Registration**



The Stars swim team will hold online Returning Family registration for the Red and Blue competition teams from March 7th through March 21st. The Red and Blue teams' competitive swim seasons will run from May 9th through July 9th, with practices and some meets held at the Bella Mar lap pool. During the summer, Red practices by age group from 7:30 am to 12:30 pm, Tuesday through Friday; Blue practices from 2:30 pm - 6:30 pm, Monday through Thursday. If you'd like to join Stars Red or Blue, new family registration will be held on Friday, April 1st from 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm at the Bella Mar Community room. The Stars must set a limit of how many swimmers are enrolled per age group according to our competition circuit rules and available practice space, so please check our website prior to New Family registration to determine if there are spots available for your swimmer before you attend registration.

Registration for our developmental program, the Shooting Stars, will be held in mid-April. This program is for the swimmer who wants to become proficient in the four competition strokes, but may not be quite ready for a full slate of competitive swim meets. Shooting Stars will swim during the mornings at the John Simpson pool from July 19th through August 11th on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of those weeks. Registration for this program is online and first-come, first-served for each season.

All participants in the Stars Swim Programs must be in good standing with the Homeowners Association at the time of registration.

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



### NOTICE: Trash and Recycling Rate Increase

The Steiner Ranch Homeowners Associations provides trash and recycling services to homeowners through contracted services. The cost for these services has been consistently increasing over the last few years, but the Steiner Ranch Master Association has been able to absorb this by saving on cost in other areas. However, effective January 1, 2011 this increase has been passed on to the homeowner in the amount of \$15 semi-annually (\$30 annually) and has been reflected on this past January – June Master Assessment invoice.

If you normally have your bills paid through Automatic Bill Pay, then there is a possibility that you paid your HOA dues short by \$15. Please check that your Association invoice and the amount you paid in January are the same. If not, you can contact the Association Office at 512-266-7553 to clear up the balance due.

This increase did not affect the Steiner Ranch Residential Association homeowners (Plateau, Rocky Ridge, Chaparral, Mesa North, Valley at Eastridge, Summit at Eastridge or Hancock Hill) as your increase went into effect in 2010.

You can report the violation by simply going to our website, www.steinerranchhoa.org and click on the "Report a Problem" link. Anonymous reports will not be acted on, so please leave all requested information.

#### **Bulletin Board Posting Policy** Due to the small sizes of the community bulletin boards and the

Due to the small sizes of the community bulletin boards and the large numbers of residents wanting to post notices, the Boards of Directors for Steiner Ranch have adopted the following restrictions for the bulletin board postings:

- 1Bulletin boards are for resident postings only. Association notices have first priority.
- 2Notices are posted every Friday and will remain on the board for two (2) weeks. Notices must be submitted by 5:00pm on Thursday.

3Notices may not be larger than 5"x 7".

4Association notices are exempt from time and space restrictions.

- 5Notices must include either a Steiner Ranch subdivision name OR a Steiner Ranch telephone number.
- 6Commercial (for-profit) postings by adults are not permitted. (These include, but are not limited to, offers for in-home childcare, nannies, cleaning service, scrapbooking service, piano lessons, pet care, etc.)
- 7Commercial (for-profit) postings for youth (under 18 years) are permitted. Youth postings may be placed on the boards for no more than one (1) month per calendar year.

8All postings are approved at the Association Staffs discretion.


### **NOTICE:** John Simpson Pool Renovations

- 3. Include a scaled drawing showing plan and elevation views of the proposed improvements, modifications or alterations. Submittals must include samples depicting the proposed materials and colors to be used.
- 4. A lot survey (which the owner receives at closing) indicating the location of proposed improvements, and any applicable easements, setbacks, and elevation differences on lot.
- 5. Deposit check in the amount of \$500

## **CARROT CAKE**

A Carrot Cake that uses olive oil for Valentine's Day – yes and yes! Nothing says I love you more than something sweet that's actually good for you!

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

1 1/4 C olive oil 2 C brown sugar 1 t nutmeg 4 eggs 3 T dark molasses 1 t salt 3 C carrots, finely grated 2 C flour 2 t baking soda

### 1 T cinnamon 1 t ground cloves 1 C walnuts, chopped 1/2 C raisins 1/2 C golden raisins

#### **CREAM CHEESE FROSTING:**

2 pkgs. cream cheese, at room temperature 1/2 C butter, softened 1 t vanilla 2 - 2 1/2 C powdered sugar 2 T half and half (to thin, just in case)

**DIRECTIONS:** Preheat your oven to 350 degrees. Butter and flour 2 cake pans and set aside. In large mixing bowl, whisk olive oil and brown sugar together. Add eggs and molasses and mix well. Stir in carrots, flour, soda, spices and salt mixing well. Add nuts and raisins and stir until incorporated. Spoon into prepared cake pans and bake for 35 - 40 minutes or until a skewer inserted comes out clean and then cool.

In a separate bowl, beat together cream cheese and butter. Add powdered sugar 1/2 C at a time until the desired sweetness, adding a bit of half and half if necessary to thin. Frost cooled cake and enjoy!

In the photo below... I actually have 5 layers. I increased my recipe to an additional 3rd, baked 3 cakes and once cooled, split them. I didn't use the last half as the cake towered tall (though it was eaten).

Several residents have reported odors in the areas of Quinlan/ Steiner/University Club and Mulberry Creek/Latimer.


These odors are emanating from the WCID 17 wastewater recycling and composting complex up on the Hillside at Logan's Way. There are several possible sources of these odors at the complex and WCID 17 is ordering and installing equipment to systematically eliminate this problem in each of those areas. Some equipment is already in place and other equipment will be arriving and being installed this month and next month. Our goal is to completely eliminate odors outside the facilities, however, residents should be aware that maintenance operations such as cleaning wastewater pumping stations involve opening these facilities, and may cause occasional localized odors.
